WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the Road Districts Act, 1919-1943, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for building, that the area allotted to any building and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by proclamation as the minimum area to be allotted to any building in the locality (defined in the proclamation) in which such building is to be erected; and whereas a proclamation was issued under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 11th September, 1942, page 876, fixing an area of not less than half an acre as the area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith in the Mundaring Road District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to vary the said area as fixed by the said proclamation and in lieu

thereof to provide for the minimum area to be allotted to any building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house and of the open space exclustively belonging thereto in the locality forming part of the Mundaring Road District to be as follows:--

(1) The minimum area to be allotted to any building outside the gazetted or defined townsite shall be half an acre.

(2) The minimum area to be allotted to any building located within any gazetted townsite shall be not less than a quarter of an acre.

(3) The minimum areas prescribed in (1) and (2) shall not apply to any subdivisions of lesser areas reshall not apply to any subdivisions of lesser areas re-corded as lots on any plan or diagram deposited in the Office of Titles prior to the date of proclamation: Pro-vided that no building shall be erected on any lot or area less than 6,000 square feet where such area has been established by survey and Titles Office plan or diagram prior to the date thereof. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the said proclamation of the 11th September, 1942, and doth

proclamation of the 11th September, 1942, and doth by this proclamation declare:-

(1) The minimum area to be allotted to any build-ing outside the gazetted or defined townsite shall be half an acre.

(2) The minimum area to be allotted to any building located within any gazetted townsite shall not be less than a quarter of an acre.

(3) The minimum areas prescribed in (1) and (2) shall not apply to any subdivisions of lesser areas recorded as lots on any plan or diagram deposited in the Office of Titles prior to the date of this proclamation: Provided that no building shall be erected on any lot or area less than 6,000 square feet where such area has been established by survey and Titles Office plan or diagram prior to the date hereof.



6.—Overtime.

Delete sub-clause (b) of this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:---

(b) If the Minister requires an employee to work on Sunday, such employee shall be paid at the rate of double time, except in the case of watchmen, who shall take such day as an ordinary shift day.

7.--Holidays.

Delete this clanse and insert in lieu thereof the following :---

7.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Minister after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the Department.

(b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to his having completed a period of twelve months' continuous service, in which case should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund to the Minister the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service.

(d) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays; provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.

(ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the conrse of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.

(f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.

(g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them; provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Minister of his right to retain such workers at work during the close down period as may be required.

(h) Workers regularly working for the Government North of South Latitude 26 shall be allowed to accumulate annual leave for two (2) years, subject to the convenience of the Department.
