WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James
TO WIT. } Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

TO Emanuel Horace Rosman, Esq., of Lyric House, Murray Street, Perth, Chartered Accountant:

I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you the said Emanuel Horace Rosman to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon—

(a) Whether and to what extent (if any) there should be an extension of the existing municipal boundaries of the municipalities of Bunbury, Busselton, Collie or Northam.

(b) The effect of any such extension on the municipalities and road board districts respectively concerned (including their respective finances and future operations) and on the well-being and finances of their respective inhabitants.

(c) The wishes and view-points of the municipal councils and road boards concerned.

(d) Whether and to what extent the best interests of the State generally and the probable future development of the municipalities and districts concerned support or detract from the desirability of any such extension.

(e) Generally the advantages and disadvantages of any such extension and the consequences or probable consequences thereof.

(f) Any other matter incidental to or arising out of any of the foregoing subject matters which you, with the approval of the Minister for Local Government, should consider it expedient to inquire into and report upon.

And I declare that you shall by virtue of this Commission be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission and of the Chairman thereof under that Act.

And I hereby request you as soon as reasonably may be to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 166 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1946, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops, either generally or in any specified locality or district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operations of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1946, on Wednesday, the 24th day of December, 1947, from one o'clock in the afternoon to six o'clock in the afternoon, within the Merredin Shop District, in so far as the said Act applies to the closing time of shops situated within the Merredin Shop District.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James
TO WIT. } Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, that "Vermin" means and includes any animal, bird or insect mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act and such other animals, birds or insects the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals, birds or insects are added to the said Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosiccapilla," commonly known as "Galah," shall be "vermin" for the purposes of the said Act within the boundaries of the Quairading Vermin District: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation add to the Third Schedule to the Vermin Act, 1918-1942, the name of the bird of the parrot or cockatoo species "Kokatoe Rosiccapilla," commonly known as "Galah," and declare that this Proclamation shall apply and have effect only in that portion of the State which is comprised within the boundaries of the Quairading Vermin District as constituted under the said Act.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 4 of the Mining Tenements (War Time Exemptions) Act, 1942, it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation revoke any Proclamation previously issued under the

said section 4 relating to the waiving or postponing of the payment of rent on any mining tenement which is prescribed and payable under the Mining Act, 1904-1945, and the exempting of the holder of any mining tenement from his obligation under the Mining Act, 1904-1945, to observe, comply with or perform any conditions relating to such mining tenement: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamations dated the 5th day of March, 1943; 4th day of June, 1943; 3rd day of September, 1943; 29th day of October, 1943; 28th day of January, 1944; 19th day of May, 1944; 11th day of August, 1944; 17th day of November, 1944; 9th day of February, 1945; 27th day of April, 1945; 20th day of July, 1945; 26th day of October, 1945; 15th day of February, 1946; 17th day of May, 1946, and 19th day of July, 1946, in so far as the said Proclamations waived the payment of rent and/or exempted the holders of the mining tenements mentioned in the Schedule hereunder from compliance with the labour covenants relating to such mining tenements.

PUBLIC TRUSTEE ACT, 1941-1947.

IT is hereby notified for the information of ex-servicemen who have been classified as suitable and sufficiently experienced (or suitable but requiring only eight weeks' intensive training) that a further quota of twenty wheat and/or sheep farms has been made available for selection under the Land Act 1933-1946 and the War Service Land Settlement Agreement Act, 1945, and the regulations appertaining thereto.

Applications must be lodged at the office of the Department of Lands and Surveys on or before the 23rd December, 1947. 203A. No motor vehicle shall be licensed for a greater gross load than that prescribed for its class set out in the Tenth Schedule to these regulations, having regard to the type of vehicle, axle springs, tyre pressure and loads on any tyre, or axle as set out in the said schedule.

Provided that, with the permission of the Minister, on such route or routes as the Minister may specify, and with such speed limits over bridges and other conditions as may be imposed, the permissible gross load as prescribed may be exceeded on such route or routes.

203B. Every owner of a motor vehicle shall, when making application to license such motor vehicle, give the following particulars of such vehicle:—(a) Number of axles; (b) axle spacing dimensions; (c) whether wheels dual or single.

3. By inserting a new Division under Part V. to be numbered Division 8 as follows:—

Division 8.—Maximum Overall Length of Vehicles.

203C. No person shall drive on any road a vehicle the overall length of which exceeds that prescribed hereunder:—

(i) In the case of rigid vehicles the maximum length including any projecting parts or load carried shall not exceed 31 feet, except in respect of passenger buses for which the length including any projecting parts or load carried may be 33 feet.

(ii) The maximum length of articulated vehicles including any projecting parts or load carried shall be 45 feet, provided that any rigid portion of the vehicle including any projecting parts or load on such portion shall not exceed the maximum length prescribed for a single rigid vehicle.

(iii) The overall length of truck and trailer combination shall not exceed 45 feet.

Provided that the Minister may, under special circumstances and on such conditions as may be imposed, approve of the carriage of long loads such as poles, pipes, pipes or girders, under permit, for specified routes and/or specified journeys.

203D. No person shall upon any road drive:—(a) Any articulated vehicle towing any other vehicle or a trailer; (b) any other motor vehicle towing more than one other vehicle or trailer.

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to that part of the State North of a parallel of latitude passing through the township of Northampton.

4. Regulations Nos. 38 (b), 139, 143, 178 (a) (b) (c) (d), 181, 208, 230, 231 and 287 are hereby repealed.

5. Regulation 229 (3) (ii) (f) is amended by deleting the word "door" in lines three and five and in the first line to the proviso thereto and inserting, in each case, the word "exit" in lieu thereof.

These regulations may be cited as the Milk Act, 1946, Regulations No. 3, and shall be read as one with the Milk Act, 1946, Regulations No. 1, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st February, 1947, and numbered 1 to 11 inclusive, and the Milk Act, 1946, Regulations No. 2, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 18th day of July, 1947, and numbered 12 to 33 inclusive.

2. Part VII. of the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1935, Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of May, 1933, and the *Government Gazette* on the 7th day of February, 1936, and the Fourth Schedule thereto are hereby repealed, and the following regulations and the Third Schedule hereto are inserted in lieu thereof:—

PART III.

Appeals.

34. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Board and desirous of appealing therefrom under the provisions of section 32 or section 35 of the Act shall lodge notice of appeal in the Form No. 25 in the Third Schedule to these regulations together with a statement of the grounds of the appeal, with the Minister, and serve a copy of such notice and of the statement of the grounds of the appeal on the Board at its office within 21 days after the appellant has been informed of the decision against which he desires to appeal.

The Minister shall cause to be sent to the appellant and the Board notice of the date, time and place fixed by him for the hearing of the appeal which date shall be not less than ten days from the service of such notice. If either party neglects to appear on the date and the time fixed for hearing the appeal, the Minister may—

(a) where the appellant fails to appear dismiss the appeal;

(b) where the Board fails to appear, hear the appeal or adjourn it to some other date.

On the hearing of the appeal the appellant shall open his case, but shall not raise any ground of appeal other than those contained in the statement served with his notice of appeal.

3. Part II. of the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1935, Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1933, and the Third Schedule thereto as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th day of July, 1944, are hereby repealed and the following regulations inserted in lieu thereof:—

Compensation Fund.

35. (a) Every licensed dairyman shall contribute to the Compensation Fund an amount of $\frac{1}{8}$ d. per gallon of milk, and $\frac{1}{8}$ d. per gallon of cream sold by him.

(b) Every licensed milk vendor and every person holding a license to treat milk shall contribute to the Compensation Fund an amount of $\frac{1}{8}$ d. per gallon of milk, and $\frac{1}{8}$ d. per gallon of cream sold or treated by him as the case may be.

36. The said contributions shall be paid at or within ten days after the end of every calendar month, and shall be based upon the amount of milk and/or cream produced, sold or treated during the preceding calendar month.

4. Part XI. of the Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1935, Regulations as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of September, 1934, the 7th day of February, 1936, the 12th day of June, 1936, and the 24th day of November, 1939, and the Fourth Schedule thereto, are hereby repealed, and the following regulations and the Fourth Schedule hereto are inserted in lieu thereof:—

PART V.

Election of Members of the Board.

37. The first election of elective members of the Board shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Board and thereafter in the same month in each alternate year.

38. Nominations for the positions of two members of the Board as representatives of the dairymen shall be called for by advertisement in three consecutive issues of a daily newspaper published in Perth.

39. Candidates for one of the positions shall be nominated by dairymen who are duly licensed under the Milk Act, 1946, to carry on business in the Metropolitan Dairy Area and the South-West Coastal Dairy Area.

40. Candidates for the other position shall be nominated by dairymen who are duly licensed under the Milk Act, 1946, to carry on business in any Dairy Area outside the Dairy Areas mentioned in regulation 39.

41. Nominations shall be in writing on forms similar to the appropriate form in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations, and must be signed by two dairymen who will, if they still hold their respective licenses, be qualified under the provisions of section 15, subsection 2 of the Milk Act, 1946, to vote at the election in respect of which the nomination is made. The form must also be signed by the candidate himself as evidence of his consent to stand for election.

42. Nominations for elections shall be in the hands of the returning officer not later than noon on a date twenty-one days before the date on which the election is to be held.

43. The scrutiny and count of all ballot papers as required by the regulations hereinafter contained shall be made at the office of the Board, and the result of the election shall be declared in the manner hereinafter specified.

44. If only one candidate is nominated by dairymen of the areas defined in regulation 39 he shall be declared elected by the returning officer on the date appointed for the holding of the election.

45. If only one candidate is nominated by dairymen of the areas defined in regulation 40 he shall be declared elected by the returning officer on the date appointed for the holding of the election.

46. If more candidates than one are nominated by dairymen of the areas defined in regulation 39 the returning officer shall prepare ballot papers on which shall be printed in alphabetical order the names of all candidates nominated by such dairymen.

47. If more candidates than one are nominated by dairymen of the areas defined in regulation 40 the returning officer shall prepare ballot papers on which shall be printed in alphabetical order the names of all candidates nominated by such dairymen.

48. The ballot papers so prepared shall be posted or delivered by the returning officer at least fourteen days before the date appointed for the holding of the election to every elector of the areas defined in regulations 39 or 40, as the case may be, who is qualified to vote for candidates nominated by dairymen of that class.

49. Every elector shall vote on and by the ballot paper so forwarded to him by writing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes and, if there are more than two candidates, he shall place the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names, so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

50. After recording his votes every elector shall place his ballot paper in a plain envelope, which shall be sealed by the elector and enclosed unmarked in another envelope, addressed to the returning officer. The signature and license number of the elector shall be written inside the last-mentioned envelope, in spaces which shall be provided for the purpose. The envelopes shall be supplied by the Board.

51. All envelopes containing ballot papers shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer at the office of the Board at its address in Perth, and shall be in the hands of the returning officer not later than noon on the date appointed for the holding of the election. Every envelope posted as aforesaid shall be properly stamped, and if it is not so stamped the returning officer may refuse to accept the ballot paper therein contained.

52. The Board shall, on or before the date appointed for the holding of the election, appoint a returning officer and two scrutineers, who shall not be members of the Board.

53. As soon as possible after noon on the date of the election the returning officer shall open all envelopes (except the sealed envelopes containing ballot papers) in the presence of the scrutineers, and shall check the signatures and license numbers of the electors.

54. If the returning officer is satisfied that an elector is duly qualified to vote, and that his signature is genuine, he shall hand the sealed envelope containing the ballot paper to the scrutineers, who shall place it, unopened, with all other similar envelopes containing ballot papers submitted by dairymen of the same class in a ballot box provided for the purpose. Separate ballot boxes shall be used for the ballot papers submitted by the dairymen of each class.

55. When all the signatures and numbers have been checked as aforesaid, the scrutineers shall remove all the sealed envelopes from each ballot box, and count the votes appearing on the ballot papers therein contained, using the preferential system of counting in the same manner as it is for the time being adopted and used in connection with the election of members of the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia.

56. If it appears to the scrutineers or either of them that any ballot paper is informal, they shall submit the ballot paper to the returning officer who may accept or reject it, and whose decision shall be final.

A ballot paper shall be informal:—

(a) if the elector has not in casting his votes complied in every respect with the preceding regulations; or

(b) if the ballot paper has upon it any mark or writing which in the opinion of the returning officer will enable any person to identify the elector; or

(c) if it does not indicate the elector's vote.

57. The returning officer shall keep a record of the number of informal votes.

58. As soon as the counting is complete the returning officer shall declare the candidate in each class who obtained the greatest number of votes (counted as aforesaid) to be elected, and shall report the result in writing to the Chairman of the Board, and shall, as soon as possible after the making of the aforesaid declaration, cause the names of the successful candidates to be advertised in the *Government Gazette*.

59. (a) If and whenever it becomes necessary to hold an election for the purpose of filling a vacancy in the office of an elected member of the Board, nominations for the vacant position shall be called for as soon as possible after the vacancy occurs.

(b) Candidates for the vacant position shall be nominated by dairymen of that one of the classes mentioned in regulations 39 and 40 to which the dairymen belonged who nominated the member whose office became vacant.

(c) Nominations shall be in the hands of the returning officer not later than noon on a date twenty-one days before the date on which the election is to be held.

(d) Regulations 41 to 58 inclusive shall apply mutatis mutandis to elections held under this regulation.

60. Candidates elected shall assume office on the day following the publication of their names in the *Government Gazette* as the successful candidates.

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION ACT, 1946.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Hairdressers Registration Regulations" and shall apply only to the area defined in section 3 of the Act and shall not apply to the persons mentioned in Section 4 of the Act.

2. These regulations shall be divided into Parts and Divisions as follow:—

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

PART II.—OFFICERS OF THE BOARD.

PART III.—EXAMINATIONS.

PART IV.—REGISTRATION—

Division 1—Registration of Hairdressers.

Division 2—Registration generally.

Division 3—Nomination of Principals.

PART V.—SAFETY IN HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS.

PART VI.—FEES.

PART VII.—SUPPLEMENTARY.

Schedule—Forms.

3. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Act” means the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946;

“approved” means approved in writing by the Board;

“approval” has a corresponding interpretation;

“Board” means the Hairdressers Registration Board of Western Australia;

“hairdresser's shop” means any place wherein or whereon hairdressing is practised;

“Inspector” means an authorised officer of the Board appointed for the purpose of inspecting the premises of a hairdresser's shop and of enforcing the provisions of the Act and these Regulations;

“Registrar” means the Registrar appointed by the Board pursuant to section 7 of the Act;

“Schedule” means Schedule to these Regulations.

4. Hairdressing for the purposes of the Act and these regulations is divided into three classes as follows:—

(1) Men's hairdressing which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring of the hair or beard of any male person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

The expression “Men's Hairdresser” in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

(2) Ladies' hairdressing (inclusive), which comprises dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, colouring of the hair of the head of any female person, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

The expression “Ladies' Hairdresser (Inclusive)” in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

(3) Ladies' hairdressing (limited), which comprises dressing, cleansing, cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing of the hair of the head of any female person whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

The expression “Ladies' Hairdresser (Limited)” in these regulations means a person qualified to perform all of the operations of this class of hairdressing.

5. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted as follows:—

(1) Meetings—the Board shall meet at such times and places as the Board decides, and the Registrar shall convene a meeting at any time when so directed by the Chairman.

(2) Notice—not less than three days' notice of any meeting shall be given to every member of the Board by letter directed to such address as he shall from time to time furnish to the Registrar.

(3) Order of Business—the order of business shall be as follows:—

(a) Minutes of last meeting;

(b) Correspondence;

(c) Consideration of applications for registration;

(d) Consideration of reports and recommendations of examiners of candidates for registration;

(e) Miscellaneous business.

Provided that the Board may at any time vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

(4) Cheques—Cheques shall be signed by the Registrar and any one member of the Board.

(5) Documents—Documents requiring to be signed by the Board shall be signed, for and on behalf of the Board, by the Registrar, or as may be directed by the Board.

6. The fees to be paid to the members of the Board including the Chairman shall be one guinea (£1 1s 0d.) for each meeting attended provided that no person shall receive more than twenty-five pounds (£25) in the aggregate in any one financial year.

PART II.—OFFICERS OF THE BOARD.

7. The duties of the Registrar shall be—

(a) to act as Secretary to the Board, and to carry out the directions of the Board and all such duties as pertain to that office;

(b) to receive all moneys due to the Board and pay same into an account known as “The Hairdressers Registration Board of Western Australia” account, kept with such bank as the Board may from time to time determine, and to submit to the Board monthly statements showing the receipts and payments for the past month. He shall prepare the financial statement required by subsection (6) of section 14 of the Act.

(c) to keep registers, in the Forms No. 1 and No. 2 prescribed in the schedule, of such persons as may be approved by the Board for registration, and to record the class or classes of hairdressing in which registration has been approved.

(d) to issue certificates and badges of registration in the prescribed Forms Nos. 3, 4 and 5 and for the appropriate class or classes.

If the Registrar, by reason of absence on leave or ill-health is unable to perform the duties required to be performed by him by the Act or regulations, the Board may appoint an acting Registrar who shall during such incapacity or absence of the Registrar perform the duties of the Registrar.

8. For the purpose of enforcing the Act and these regulations, the Board may appoint one or more inspectors. The Board may terminate the appointment of any inspector by giving one month's notice, in writing, under the hand of the Registrar of the Board, save in the case of misconduct or breach of his duties, when no period of notice shall be required.

9. In any area in which any of the provisions of the Act or these regulations is in force any inspector may at any time when hairdressing is in progress or is usually carried on, enter into and upon the premises of a hairdresser's shop for the purpose of examining whether any of the provisions of the Act or these regulations is being contravened.

For that purpose he may require any person on such premises who is performing any of the functions of a hairdresser to produce his certificate and/or badge of registration for inspection, or to establish to the satisfaction of the inspector that he is an apprentice. Any person refusing or failing to comply with any such request shall be guilty of an offence.

PART III.—EXAMINATIONS.

10. For the purpose of satisfying itself as to the qualifications of any applicant for registration, whether as principal or employee, the Board may—

(a) conduct theoretical, practical, and/or oral examinations in any class or classes of hairdressing;

(b) require any applicant for registration not subject to the provisions of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946, to present himself for any such examination.

11. Any person who wishes to present himself for examination shall make application therefor to the Board in the Form No. 6 prescribed in the Schedule to these regulations.

The subjects of the examinations shall, in the following cases, be selected by the Examiners from the following:—

(a) In the case of a candidate for registration as a Men's Hairdresser—dressing, cleansing (shampooing), cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, of the hair or beard of any male person and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(b) In the case of a candidate for registration as a Ladies' Hairdresser (inclusive)—dressing, curling, permanent waving, marcel curling and waving, water waving, cleansing (shampooing), cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing, bleaching, tinting, or colouring of the hair of the head of any female person and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(c) In the case of a candidate for registration as a Ladies' Hairdresser (limited)—Marcel curling and waving, water waving, dressing, cleansing (shampooing), cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing or the hair of the head of any female person, and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

12. (1) A candidate for registration as a Men's Hairdresser must pass in dressing, cleansing (shampooing), cutting, shaving, trimming, singeing and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

A candidate for registration as a Ladies' Hairdresser (inclusive) must pass in curling, permanent waving, Marcel curling and waving, water waving, cutting, bleaching, tinting and colouring, and the use for any of such purposes of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

A candidate for registration as a Ladies' Hairdresser (limited) must pass in cutting, Marcel curling and waving, and water waving.

(2) To obtain a pass in any compulsory subject a candidate must obtain 65 per cent. of the marks allotted in that subject.

(3) To obtain a pass at the examination a candidate must, in addition to passing in the compulsory subjects, obtain an aggregate of 60 per cent. of the marks allotted in all the subjects of the examination which are not compulsory.

(4) A candidate may pass fully at any examination or may gain credit for any subject passed provided a pass is obtained in all subjects at not more than two successive examinations.

(5) A candidate for registration as a Ladies' Hairdresser (inclusive) who passes only in cutting, Marcel curling and waving and water waving, and in the non-compulsory subjects of that examination obtains 60 per cent. in the aggregate of the marks allotted shall be registered as a Ladies' Hairdresser (limited).

13. (1) A hairdresser registered in respect of the prescribed class "Ladies' Hairdressing (limited)" who wishes to qualify by examination for registration in the prescribed class "Ladies' Hairdressing (inclusive)" shall be required to submit himself for examination in and to pass only in the subjects of curling, permanent waving, bleaching, tinting and colouring, with the use of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, when a hairdresser, who has been registered by the Board in respect of any prescribed class (or classes) of hairdressing, passes the examination (or examinations) prescribed by the Board entitling him to be registered in respect of a further class (or classes) he shall be entitled, on payment of the prescribed fee for the issue of a fresh certificate, to be registered in respect of such additional class (or classes) without further proof of training.

14. (1) After each such examination each examiner shall submit to the Board a list showing the numbers of the candidates and the number of marks obtained in each subject by each candidate.

(2) The Board after considering the examiner's reports shall announce a pass list by publication of the successful candidates' numbers in the press.

(3) At the close of each examination the examiners shall report briefly the causes of failure whether in one or more subjects.

When in the opinion of the examiners there is an unusually high percentage of failures at an examination, the examiners shall make a report on the matter to the Board.

15. (1) Examinations of candidates for registration as hairdressers of any prescribed class of hairdressing shall be held at such times and at such places as the Board shall determine, and applications by candidates for examination shall be in the hands of the Board not later than fourteen days prior to the date on which the examination is to be held.

(2) There shall be paid to each examiner the sum of ten shillings and sixpence for examining each candidate for registration or additional registration as a hairdresser. Provided that in no case shall any such examiner be paid less than a guinea and a half a day.

PART IV.—REGISTRATION.

Division 1—Registration of Hairdressers.

16. (1) Every person claiming to be entitled to be registered under section 12 of the Act shall make application in the appropriate Forms Nos. 7 and 8 prescribed in the Schedule.

(2) Every such application shall set out the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing in respect of which registration is sought, and whether the applicant applies for registration as a principal or employee, and shall be verified by a statutory declaration.

17. Every application under subsection (1) (b) and (1) (d) of section 12 of the Act shall include particulars of the course of training served and the examination or examinations passed.

18. (1) If an applicant applies for registration under subsection (1) (c) of section 12 of the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946, he shall state in his application in reference to his hairdressing experience during the seven years immediately prior to the commencement of the Act—

(a) the nature of the work upon which he has been engaged, and the length of time so engaged;

(b) the place or places where the work was performed; and

(c) (if he seeks registration as an employee) the names and addresses of the persons by whom he was employed.

(2) He shall, in addition to the statements contained in such application, forward such further evidence of his bona fides and qualifications as may be required by the Board.

Division 2—Registration Generally.

19. There shall be paid to the Board in respect of each registration and certificate the fees set out in Part VI. of these regulations.

20. (1) When the Board has granted registration of a hairdresser, the Registrar shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, issue to the applicant a certificate and badge of registration in the appropriate forms in the Schedule.

(2) The certificate and badge shall remain the property of the Board, and shall be given up on demand by the Registrar on loss of registration by the holder.

(3) The badge shall at all times when the person to whom it is issued is actually engaged in performing the duties of a hairdresser, be worn on the lapel of the outer garment of such person in such a manner as to be clearly visible.

21. The owner or occupier of every hairdresser's shop shall exhibit and keep exhibited in such prominent position as will enable it to be read from the principal entrance of such shop a placard in the appropriate Form No. 9 in the Schedule issued by the Board, stating the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing in respect of which he and/or his then employees (if any) are registered.

22. Every hairdresser who—

(a) being registered as a principal, becomes an employee; or

(b) being registered as an employee, becomes a principal—shall immediately—

(1) notify the Board of the fact;

(2) apply for a certificate of registration in accordance with his altered status; and

(3) forward to the Registrar his current certificate and the fee for the issue of a new certificate corresponding to his altered status.

23. Every hairdresser, whether a principal, or employee who has obtained registration shall, upon changing his or her name or address, forthwith notify the Board of the fact and furnish the new name and address for entry in the Register of Hairdressers.

Division 3—Nomination of Principals.

24. (1) Upon all premises in which the business of hairdressing of any prescribed class or classes is carried on there shall be present and in control of the hairdressing carried on in such premises during business hours at least one person who is registered in respect of the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing carried on in such premises and who for the purpose of the Act shall be the principal of the business.

(2) Within 12 months of the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations the owner or proprietor of every hairdressing business shall nominate a principal or principals (as the case may require) in respect of each premises in which such owner or proprietor carried on business, and shall within the period aforesaid notify the Board of such nomination in the Form No. 10 in the Schedule hereto, setting forth the full name and address of each principal so nominated.

(3) If a principal so nominated ceases to act as principal, such owner or proprietor shall within seven days notify the Board of the fact and furnish it with the particulars required by these Regulations in respect of the principal appointed in his place.

(4) This Part of these Regulations shall not apply in the case of a business—

(a) of which the owner or proprietor thereof or one of the owners or proprietors thereof is during business hours in direct personal control as a principal and as a principal is registered in respect of the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing practised in connection with the said business;

(b) wherein only one registered hairdresser is practising on the premises.

PART V.—SAFETY IN HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS.

25. (1) All electrical wiring, internal fittings and appliances shall be installed in accordance with the Electricity Act, 1945, the Regulations thereunder, and the Rules as laid down by the Standards Association of Australia.

(2) The owner or occupier of any hairdresser's shop wherein any electrical installation or appliance is connected otherwise than in accordance with the requirements of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Whilst any electrical apparatus, fitting or appliance is applied to any person in any hairdressing saloon for any purpose connected with the practice of hairdressing, there shall always be at least one attendant in constant close attendance upon such

Drive 3 shall consist of apple and strychnine poisoning. Drive 4 shall consist of fumigating and burrow destruction and any winter poisoning necessary.

MOUNT MARSHALL VERMIN BOARD.

Vermin Act, 1919, Part VII., Sections 94-96.

ALL owners and occupiers of holdings within the Mt. Marshall Road District are hereby warned that under the above Act it is compulsory to carry out the destruction of rabbits on their holdings.

The Board further directs that an intensive poisoning drive shall commence on the 1st January, 1948, and continue until 30th April, 1948. The method to be adopted shall be as follows:—A furrow not less than four miles in length shall be drawn on each holding of 1,000 acres or less, in which poisoned baits must be laid not less than four feet apart once every three weeks during the above period. Owners or occupiers of holdings over 1,000 acres will be required to do additional mileage of poisoning at the rate of four miles per 1,000 acres, calculated in proportion to the area held over 1,000 acres.

Non-compliance will entail immediate prosecution without warning.

GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS ACT, 1904-1939.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendments, as set forth in the Schedule hereunder, to the by-laws made under and for the purposes of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1939, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th October, 1920, and amended from time to time thereafter.

The abovementioned by-laws are amended as follows:—

1. By adding after by-law 44, a new by-law, as follows:—

"44A. No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle upon or along any wharf, pier, or jetty, controlled by the Commissioner, where the driving of such vehicle is prohibited by public notice displayed on such wharf, pier or jetty. Any person guilty of a breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds."

2. By-law 81 (*Gazette* 20/6/1930) is amended:—

(a) By inserting after the word "on" in the first line of the first paragraph the words "piers, wharves or jetties and approaches thereto controlled by the Commissioner, or."

(b) By inserting after the word "at" in the third line of the second paragraph the words "piers, wharves or jetties, or."

(c) By inserting after the word "meeting" in the fourth line of the said second paragraph the word "boats."

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall, for service prior to 1st January, 1947, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Award applicable before that date, and for service subsequent to 1st January, 1947, in accordance with the provisions of this amendment.”

7.—Wages.

Delete the words “Holiday pay Allowance—5s. 2d.” and insert in lieu thereof “Holiday pay Allowance—5s. 8d.”

15.—Holidays—Payment for Work done on Sundays and Holidays.

Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

“(a) All workers (including casual workers) required to work on any Sunday, or the days observed as New Year’s Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day or Boulder Cup Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, shall be paid double time rate for all time worked on any such days: Provided that Kalgoorlie Cup Day and Boulder Cup Day shall alternate each year; only one race holiday shall be taken each year.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer’s establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks’ leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months’ continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker’s period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month’s continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week’s pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (c) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The quantum of annual leave to be allowed to a worker shall for service prior to 1st September, 1946, be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Award applicable before that date, and for service subsequent to 1st September, 1946, in accordance with the provisions of this amendment.

(j) For the purpose of this clause ‘double time rate’ shall be the rate which is payable to the worker on any ordinary working day (including all allowances) multiplied by two (2).”
