WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1943 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Albany Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Albany, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

## IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 80 of 1947.

Between The Perth, Fremantle, and Midland Junction Undertakers' Assistants and Cemetery Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Karrakatta Cemetery Board and the Fremantle Cemetery Board, Respondents.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court; now therefore the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

## Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

## 1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the respondents named in Schedule A hereof and to the workers employed by the said respondents following out the vocations prescribed in Clause 10 of this Agreement.

## 2.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O. Perth.

## 3.—Term.

This Agreement shall apply for a period of three (3) years from its date, subject to the right of either party to amend same in pursuance of the provisions of the Act.

## 4.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(b) Such hours shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive and between 8 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

(c) Not more than one (1) hour shall be allowed for a meal to be taken between 12 o'clock noon and 1 p.m.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause the weekly working hours shall be reduced to forty (40) per week from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the 1st January, 1948. Such hours may be worked in five or five and one half days at the option of the employer. The starting and finishing times shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and his workers.

## 5.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in Clauses (4) and (6) work done before or after the prescribed starting or finishing times or beyond eight (8) hours on any day Monday to Friday inclusive, or beyond four (4) hours on Saturday shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement —

(i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Agreement or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

## 6.—Saturday Afternoon Work.

Except as provided in Clause 10, where work is performed by a grave digger or Crematorium Attendant after 12 o'clock noon on Saturday such workers shall be paid One Pound (£1) for each Saturday afternoon worked: Provided that when the work to be performed consists merely of finishing off a task, overtime rates as prescribed in Clause (5) shall be paid: Provided further that if the time occupied in finishing off a task interferes materially with the workers' afternoon off duty, the sum of One Pound (£1) shall be paid.

## 7.—Sunday and Holiday Work.

(a) All work done on Sunday shall stand alone and be paid for at a flat rate of One Pound (£1) for each Sunday, plus ordinary time for the actual time worked with a minimum ordinary time payment for two (2) hours.

(b) All workers (including Casual Workers) required to work on the days named in subclause (a) of Clause (8) shall be paid at the rate of double time for all time worked on any such day: Provided that where a grave digger is required to dig a grave during the morning of any of the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) of Clause (8) and fill same in after the funeral ceremony during the afternoon of the same day, he shall be paid at the rate of double time with a minimum payment as for five (5) hours.

## 8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 5 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

(j) Regular grave diggers or Crematorium attendants who are required to stand by for duty on the holidays mentioned in subclause (a) of this clause shall not receive any payment for the time they are required to stand by for duty, but shall have three (3) paid holidays added to the Annual Leave prescribed in subclause (e) of this clause.

## 9.—Exhumations.

(a) For each body lifted the sum of two pounds (£2) shall be paid provided that this shall not apply to stillborn exhumations where the sum of ten shillings (10s.) shall be paid for each body lifted.

(b) In the case of two or more workers being required to perform the tasks referred to in subclause (a) of this clause, the prescribed amounts shall be equally divided.

A worker called upon to perform higher duties for which a higher rate is prescribed than that which such worker is in receipt of, shall be paid the higher rate for such time as the worker actually performs such higher duties.

## 11.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wages than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

## 12.—Watering by Juniors.

The maximum size of watering cans to be carried in the case of juniors under 18 years of age shall not exceed one which contains two and one half (2½) gallons and 18 years of age and over—three (3) gallons.

## 13.—Oilskin Coats.

Each Board shall supply to grave diggers and truck drivers oilskin coats for their use in the performance of their duties in winter months.

## 14.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of Casual Workers, one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service: Provided that an employer may at any time summarily dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to receiving such notice.

## 15.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his office a record containing:—

(i) The name of each worker employed by him and to whom this Agreement applies,

(ii) The class of work performed,

(iii) The hours during which the worker is employed and the wages, overtime and allowances paid to such worker.

(b) Such Record may be inspected at any time during working hours by the Secretary of the Union or other authorised person.

(c) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the correct posting of the record daily.

## 16.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid in the employers' time at times mutually agreed upon between the workers and their respective employers.
