WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 22nd July, 1948.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Constitution Act, 1889, it is made lawful for the Governor to fix the time and place for the holding of the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly; and whereas the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued until the 22nd day of July, 1948: now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Second Session of the Nineteenth

Parliament shall be holden for despatch of business on Thursday, the 22nd July, 1948, at the hour of 12 o'clock noon in the House of Parliament in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

At a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 17th day of June, 1948, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919-1947.
Formation of the Tammin Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 716/48.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, the Governor may sever any portion of a Road District therefrom, and constitute such portion a Road District; and whereas it is desirable to:—

1. (a) Sever from the Cunderdin Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule A hereto; (b) sever from the Kellerberrin Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule B hereto; (c) sever from the Wyalkatchem Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule C hereto.

2. Constitute the several portions so severed as aforesaid to be a new Road District, to be called the Tammin Road District.

3. Describe the boundaries of the Tammin Road District as set forth in Schedule D hereto.

4. Declare that the Tammin Road Board shall consist of five members.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby:—

1. (a) Sever from the Cunderdin Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule A hereto; (b) sever from the Kellerberrin Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule B hereto; (c) sever from the Wyalkatchem Road District that portion of the said district described in Schedule C hereto.

2. Constitute the several portions so severed as aforesaid to be a new Road District, to be called the Tammin Road District.

3. Describe the boundaries of the Tammin Road District as set forth in Schedule D hereto.

4. Declare that the Tammin Road Board shall consist of five members.

This Order in Council shall take effect on and from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

METROPOLITAN WEEKLY NEWSPAPERS
JOURNALISTS' AGREEMENT.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, this Third Day of March, 1948, (One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-eight) between The Western Press Pty., Ltd., Proprietors of the newspapers "The Sunday Times" and "The Mirror" of the one part and The Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia, a Union registered under the said Act, of the other part: Whereby it is agreed that the following rates and conditions shall govern employment with respect to the said newspapers.

This Agreement shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

The parties agree that the minimum weekly rates of pay shall be affected by any increase or decrease in the

basic wage as declared by the State Court of Arbitration.

This Agreement shall come into force on and be operative as from the 1st day of April, 1947, and shall continue in operation until the 31st day of March, 1950, and thereafter until a new Agreement is entered into between the parties.

Schedule of Salaries, Rates, Hours and Other
Terms and Conditions.

1.—Minimum Pay.

(a) The minimum weekly rates of payment to members, except where otherwise specifically directed, shall be:—

(b) Where the number of members is ten or more, one of those members shall be paid not less than the special A Grade rate of £16 10s.

2.—Classification of Members.

(a) "Classified members" or "classified staff" or "members of the classified staff" for the purpose of this division means members classified in accordance with this clause.

(b) The classification and proportions (as) in this clause provided shall apply only to members of the Metropolitan Journalists' Union of Workers of W.A.

(c) All members employed under this Division shall be classified by their employer in four grades. Classified minimum staff proportions shall be determined in accordance with the following table:—

and thereafter in similar manner.

The foregoing classification shall be for the purpose only of determining the minimum rates of pay to which members shall be entitled, and not for the purpose of controlling or regulating their qualifications or work, or duties to the employer.

(d) The exceptions are:—

(1) Editor-in-chief or managing editor, and chief of the general reporting staff (exclusively employed as such).

(2) Any other member the greater part of whose regular duties can be demonstrated to the Metropolitan Journalists' Union to place him in a position of executive authority equal or superior to that of any person exempted under (1).

(3) Casuals, cadets and contributors.

(e) Where the classification proportions specified in subclause (c) of this clause are affected by any staff alterations, those proportions shall be restored within eight weeks when an appointment is made from outside the office, and within four weeks when an appointment is made within the office.

(f) Members solely employed by the employers as country representatives or as district representatives shall be classified on the staff of the newspaper on which they are so employed.

3.—Cadets.

(a) "A cadet" for the purpose of this division means an employee who is constantly or regularly in training for journalism, or who substantially does the work of one in training for journalism, and who has not had four years' experience in journalism.

(b) Experience in journalism of a cadet shall be regarded as continuous notwithstanding that he may have been employed on more than one newspaper.

(c) Except with the consent in writing of the Union, which consent shall not unreasonably be withheld, not more than one cadet, whether a member or non-member, shall be employed to every six members or part thereof of the classified staff.

(d) The minimum weekly rates of payment to cadets, except where otherwise specifically directed, shall be:—

First Year	£2 15 0
Second Year	£3 15 0
Third Year	£5 0 0
Fourth Year	£6 7 0

(e) The period of cadetship shall not exceed four years. In exceptional circumstances the employer may, with the consent of the committee of the Union (which consent shall not unreasonably be withheld) continue to employ at the rate prescribed for a fourth year cadet, any cadet who has completed four years of cadetship. The period or periods for which such an arrangement is to operate shall be determined by the committee. If the cadet's services are terminated by the employer without lawful cause during such period or periods, he shall be paid the difference between the rate for a fourth year cadet and the rate for a D Grade member from the time of completion of his fourth year of cadetship to the date of such termina-

tion. If the cadet voluntarily leaves his employment during or after such period or periods, no extra payment shall be made.

(f) A cadet shall be fully and thoroughly taught and instructed in the profession of journalism according to a training syllabus to be agreed on between the Union and the respondents.

(g) The employer shall appoint one or more members to advise and instruct cadets in their daily work.

(h) The Editor-in-Chief shall arrange for journalists and others to give a series of suitable lectures to cadets.

(i) If a cadet is not proficient in shorthand and typewriting he shall attend shorthand and typewriting classes and, if necessary, be allowed to absent himself during ordinary working hours for this purpose.

(j) A cadet shall be permitted by his employer to absent himself during ordinary working hours for periods not exceeding a total of four hours in any week to attend shorthand and typewriting classes, lectures, classes, or examinations which apply to any specialised branch of journalism approved by the employer and the committee of the Union, and/or in subjects prescribed for the course of the Diploma of Journalism granted by an Australian University or other approved course.

(k) All lecture and other fees and the requisite books for the studies prescribed in the last preceding subclause shall be made available by the employer.

4.—Expenses.

(a) All members shall be paid reasonable out-of-pocket expenses incurred while on duty.

(b) Members engaged at Parliament shall be allowed the following minimum refreshment expenses: Luncheon, 3s. 6d.; dinner, 3s. 6d., with an additional 2s. when the work lasts until midnight; a further 2s. when the work lasts after 4 a.m.; and a further 3s. 6d. for breakfast if the work extends to 7 a.m.

(c) If a member is required to work on any night until such an hour that the ordinary means of transport to his home are not available, he shall be allowed the necessary expense of transport to his home.

(d) If a member's duty compels him to take more than one meal a day away from his home, the cost of any meal or meals in excess of one a day shall be paid for by the employer.

(e) A member who is appointed by an employer, or a number of employers acting conjointly, to a position in a town or State other than that in which he is regularly located, shall be paid first class fare plus reasonable travelling expenses for himself, his wife and his family. Where the appointment involves the transfer of storage of the member's furniture and effects, this shall be the employer's responsibility. The member's salary shall begin as soon as he is appointed and shall not cease unless he resigns or until he has had reasonable time to return to his original city or State. A member who resigns or is dismissed for misconduct while employed in another city or State shall not be entitled to his return fare nor to that of his wife and his family nor to any other return expenses. When a member is temporarily transferred, he shall be entitled to payment for all reasonable expenses for accommodation and travel.

(f) A woman member engaged on work requiring attendance in evening dress shall be provided with reasonable transport facilities.

(g) A woman member regularly engaged on work requiring attendance in evening dress or in special dress shall be paid a minimum dress allowance of £15 a year.

(h) A member shall be reasonably compensated for damage to his clothing and personal effects arising out of and in the course of his employment.

(i) When travelling by train, a member shall be entitled to first class fare and a sleeping berth if one is available.

(j) A member who, by arrangement with his employer, uses his own typewriter for office purposes shall be supplied with ribbons and have his machine maintained at the expense of his employer. The employer shall, as far as possible, provide adequate locker accommodation for the typewriters of members.

5.—Hours of Employment.

Day Work.

(a) "Day Work" for the purpose of this Agreement means work other than night work as defined in this Clause.

(b) The ordinary weekly hours of duty on day work shall be 40.

(c) In the weeks in which Christmas Day and Good Friday occur, the ordinary hours of duty on day work shall be 34, and the number of working days for each of those weeks shall be reduced by one.

(d) A member normally engaged on day work who is regularly required once or twice a week to work a shift extending beyond midnight shall, after five hours' continuous duty on that shift be granted a supper period of not less than 30 minutes.

(e) All classified members and cadets on day work shall be given two clear days (one of which may be Sunday) off duty in each week.

(f) Notice of any day or consecutive days off duty shall be given to a classified member or a cadet before he finishes work on the preceding day.

Night Work.

(g) "Night Work" for the purpose of this Division means employment the greater part of which is after 8 p.m. A member so employed on three or more nights in any week, or a member beginning duty at 4 p.m. or later on three or more days in any week, shall be regarded as a night worker for that week.

(h) In any week in which a member is engaged in night work (as defined in Clause 5, sub-clause (g)) he shall be paid at the rate prescribed for night work, i.e. 10s. more for each grade.

6.—Calculation of Time Worked.

(a) Except on a distant engagement as hereinafter provided a member's time shall count continuously from the time of entering upon duty (as defined in Sub-clause (b) of this Clause) until the time he signs off at the completion of the work for the day. When, however, a member is permitted one hour off for a meal, and in fact takes time off for such meal, the employer shall be entitled to deduct one hour from the total time. If the time permitted for a meal is less than one hour, no time shall be deducted. Not more than one hour shall be deducted in any day except on Saturdays when two meals may be deducted.

(b) "Entering upon duty" for the purpose of this Division means—

(1) Arrival at the office for the first time in the day to begin duty; or

(2) Beginning the first engagement, whichever is the earlier. A reasonable time shall be allowed in this case to cover the period required to reach the engagement from home.

Distant Engagements.

(c) "A distant engagement" for the purpose of this Division means an assignment requiring a member to spend one night or more away from the city in which he is regularly employed, provided the member has had a reasonable rest period during such night or nights.

(d) A distant engagement shall begin from the time of departure by a member from the city in which he is regularly employed and cease on the return of the member to that city or on completion of the assignment.

(e) Nine-twenty-fourths of the time spent on a distant engagement shall be reckoned as ordinary hours of duty with a minimum of nine hours for each period of 24 hours or portion thereof.

(f) If the nature of the distant engagement requires the member to be continuously at work on any day for more than 11 hours, all time worked in excess of 11 hours shall be reckoned as overtime in accordance with Clause 7 (b) of this Division. Time occupied in travelling shall be excluded.

(g) If a member engaged on a metropolitan assignment is called upon to begin a distant engagement on the same day, the calculation of the period of that day's duty shall begin at the time of entering upon duty for that day and shall continue until the time of departure from the city. Time on duty for the distant engagement shall then be calculated as provided for in Subclause (e) of this Clause.

(h) If a member is called on to resume work within 11 hours of completion of a distant engagement, he shall be paid overtime in accordance with Clause 7 (e) of this Division for all work done by him before the expiration of 11 hours.

(i) When a member is absent on a distant engagement for fewer than 80 hours, he shall not be given any of his weekly days off duty during his absence, but within seven days of his return. If not, he shall receive payment as provided for in Clause 7 (h) of this Division.

(j) When a member while on a distant engagement extending to 80 hours or more is not given his weekly days off duty, he shall be given them continuously, beginning within seven days of his return. If not, he shall receive payment as provided in Clause 7 (h) of this Division.

(k) A member on a distant engagement shall complete a time docket as provided in Clause 9 (e) of this Division.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Any amount paid to a member in excess of the minimum rate to which he is entitled under this Division shall not be regarded as a set-off against overtime worked. The hourly rate for overtime purposes shall be calculated by dividing the number of ordinary weekly hours of employment into the minimum rate for the member's grade.

(b) Daily overtime represents all time worked after the expiration of 11 hours from entering upon duty in any day and shall be adjusted as follows:—

(1) First three hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(2) Any overtime beyond three hours shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(3) Notwithstanding any other provision, it is agreed that on publishing day (Saturday and into Sunday morning where necessary) a member of the staff may be required to work up to 14 hours without the right to claim overtime, if not withstanding this long spread of hours, his weekly total does not exceed 40.

(4) It is agreed that members of the staff shall be rostered for work on publishing day. Each week three members of the staff shall work up to 12 hours and the remainder up to 14 hours. Wherever possible one or more of the remainder shall be booked off earlier.

(c) Insufficient break represents all time worked before the expiration of 11 hours from the completion of duty on one day and the resumption of duty—except during distant engagements—and shall be adjusted as follows:—

(1) If the break is less than eight hours, overtime shall be paid for at the rate of double time for all work done before the expiration of the 11 hours break.

(2) If the break is eight hours or more, overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for all work done before the expiration of the 11 hours break.

(3) If a member is called upon to resume duty within 11 hours of completion of a distant engagement, overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for all work done before the expiration of the 11 hours break.

(4) Time worked during any period of insufficient break shall not be included in the calculation of weekly hours.

(d) Weekly overtime represents all time worked in excess of 40 hours for day workers or the reduced total hours occasioned by time given off in lieu of overtime, but excludes time already paid for or adjusted under subclauses (b) and (c) of this clause. Weekly overtime shall be adjusted as follows:—

(1) First 6 hours may be allowed off duty in the next succeeding week in accordance with subclauses (e) and (f) of this clause. Any of this time not allowed off shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(2) Any overtime beyond 6 hours shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(e) The maximum number of hours which may be allowed off duty for overtime for any week shall be 9 made up by a total of 6 in excess of the prescribed weekly hours and 3 for work in excess of 11 hours in any day or days except publishing day in the preceding week.

(f) Time off:—

(1) When overtime liquidated by giving time off amounts to four hours or any multiple of four hours, it shall be given off in units of not less than four hours.

(2) Any period of less than four hours shall be given off in one block.

(3) When the overtime exceeds four hours and is less than eight hours, it shall be given off in not more than two units, at least one of which shall be of four hours.

(4) When the overtime exceeds eight hours, it shall be given off in not more than three units, two of which shall be of not less than four hours.

(5) When a member is to be given four hours, or more off duty for overtime worked, he shall be notified before he finishes work on the preceding day.

(g) Any time allowed off duty in lieu of overtime shall correspondingly reduce for that week the hours of 40 in the case of day work. All time worked in excess of the reduced total of hours for that week shall be reckoned as overtime and dealt with in accordance with subclause (d) of this clause.

(h) When a member is not given his weekly days or nights off duty, as provided for in Clause 5 of this Division, he shall be paid at the rate of double time for all work done on any such day with a minimum payment for four hours. This provision also applies to the additional day or night off duty in the weeks in which Christmas Day and Good Friday occur. When such time is paid for, it shall not be included in the weekly hours.

(i) All work done in excess of the reduced weekly hours of duty prescribed for the period in which Christmas Day or Good Friday occurs shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(j) Special overtime:—

(1) When a day worker is required to begin duty before 6 a.m. on three or more days in a week, daily overtime shall begin after the expiration of nine hours from the time of entering upon duty.

(2) Time worked and paid for under this subclause shall not be included in the calculation of weekly hours.

(k) In no circumstances shall the overtime involved in any of the foregoing subclauses be paid for more than once.

S.—Duty Book.

(a) If the Metropolitan Journalists' Union requests it, the employer shall keep a duty book, which shall be made up not later than 5.30 p.m. each day. Unless he has been notified before 5.30 p.m. on the preceding day by entry in the duty book, or otherwise notified in reasonable time beforehand, a member shall not be required to attend the office before 9.30 a.m.

(b) If an engagement is assigned to a member or an alteration is made in the duty book after the time prescribed in the preceding subclause, the member shall not be held responsible for covering such engagement or alteration of engagement unless he has been notified thereof in reasonable time.

9.—Time Book.

(a) Time books in the form agreed upon shall be made available by the employer in each newspaper office in places convenient for members to make the required entries. There should be a time book also in each branch office, and one in each place where a member or members are employed outside the city of publication.

(b) All members except country correspondents, contributors and members while on distant engagements, shall complete each day all entries in the time book. If an entry in the time book is not disputed within 24 hours, it shall be taken to be correct.

(c) A member who has been on a distant engagement shall complete within 24 hours of his return to the office for duty daily entries in the time book in accordance with his distant engagement docket, which shall be filed on his return. The docket shall be in the form agreed upon.

(d) A member employed in a branch office or outside the city of publication shall furnish his employer with the record of time and overtime entered for the week. Unless the record is furnished at the close of the week, it need not be recognised.

(e) All time books shall be open for inspection during any time in which members are on duty by any member of the Union authorised by the District Committee of the Union to make an inspection.

(f) An employer shall make available to any member of the Union authorised to make the inspection defined in the preceding subclause his records of payments made to members in respect of overtime.

10.—District Correspondents.

(a) "A district correspondent" for the purpose of this Division means a person from whom an employer regularly accepts reports of suburban news only, except when the district correspondent is employed outside his district in accordance with subclause (e) of this clause.

(b) A district correspondent shall be exclusively entitled to report, and shall be responsible for reporting all general events in the district allotted to him and any other events that he is directed by his employer to report. An employer shall be entitled to send a member of the classified staff into a district on an assignment, in which case the district correspondent shall be told beforehand.

(c) A district correspondent shall be paid liage for district work at the minimum rate of 2¼d. a line for published matter.

(d) A district correspondent shall be paid not less than £7 in any week for his district work on the liage basis prescribed in the preceding subclause.

(e) A district correspondent may be employed outside his district and shall be paid for such work, in addition to any payment due to him under subclauses (c) and (d) of this clause, at the rate of £1 for every 4 hours or part of 4 hours.

(f) A district correspondent shall be entitled to submit for publication special articles which, if accepted as such and published, shall be paid for at the minimum rate of 3d. a line in addition to his other weekly earnings.

(g) The weekly hours of duty of a district correspondent shall be 40 and he shall be given two clear days off duty in each week. Time worked in excess of these limitations shall be adjusted in accordance with subclauses 7 (d) and 7 (h) of this Division.

(h) When a district correspondent acts in that capacity in the same district for more than one employer, each employer shall be liable for proportion of the difference between the minimum payment prescribed in subclause (d) of this clause and the total amount actually earned. The proportion shall be determined according to the number of publishing days of each employer in each week.

(i) A district correspondent employed by more than one employer shall at once, and from time to time as necessary, notify each employer by whom he is employed of the fact and also by how many employers he is employed.

(j) A district correspondent shall truly inform each employer by whom he is employed what his earnings amount to other than as a district correspondent.

(k) When a district correspondent is instructed by an employer to supply a report for a paper, or papers, other than one owned by the employer instructing him, he shall be paid full liage rates by his employer for such matter published in all papers.

(l) When a district correspondent at the instruction of his employer covers an assignment that he would not be expected to cover in the ordinary course of his work, he shall be paid a fee of 5s. for each such special assignment, irrespective of whether any copy is obtained from it or accepted by the employer for publication. Should any copy from a special assignment be published, the district correspondent shall be paid the full amount of liage if it is greater than the fee of 5s.

(m) A district correspondent shall be paid reasonable out-of-pocket expenses incurred in gathering news in his district and in covering any special assignment.

11.—Casuals.

(a) "A casual" for the purpose of this Division means a person who is employed temporarily by the day or half-day upon work of a kind similar to that usually done by members of classified staffs as part of their duty.

(b) No individual casual shall be employed for more than 24 hours in any week or on more than 130 days in any year, except to take the place of a classified member absent from duty because of sickness or incapacity or on holiday leave.

(c) A District Committee of the Union may, by written consent, extend the limitations of casual employment provided for in the preceding subclause on receipt of a written request to do so from an employer.

(d) The minimum rates of payment for casual work, except as otherwise provided, shall be £1 for every 4 hours or part of 4 hours.

(e) Calculation of time worked shall be in accordance with Clause 6 (a) of this Division.

(f) A casual shall not be paid otherwise than by the day or half-day, except as provided in the following subclauses.

Sporting Work.

(g) Notwithstanding the provisions of this Clause, a casual may be employed to supply sporting matter at the following minimum rates:—

(1) When employed to supply sporting results only, he shall be paid the rate of 2¼d. a line, with a minimum of 7s. 6d. for each engagement. All additional relevant matter shall be paid for at the rate of 2¼d. a line.

(2) When employed to supply sporting matter other than as provided for in (1) hereof, he shall be paid at the rate of 2¼d. a line.

(3) The employer shall have the option of paying for sporting work on the lineage basis prescribed in (1) and (2) or at the rate of a half-day or day engagement prescribed in this clause.

(h) This clause shall apply alike to members and persons who are not members of the Union.

12.—Contributors.

(a) "A contributor" for the purpose of this Division means a person the nature of whose work does not qualify him to be a member of the classified staff, a cadet, a casual, a district correspondent or a country correspondent, but who, because of his special or technical knowledge, prepares for publication matter which does not involve his acting as if he were a person employed under any other provision of this Award. The function of a contributor as dealt with in this clause is limited to work which requires the application of special or technical knowledge. He shall not do work usually done by classified members, but if he writes occasional contributions (incidental to his special subject) not requiring the application of special or technical knowledge, this shall not constitute a breach of this clause.

(b) A person shall not be employed or paid as a contributor to do work of a kind usually done by members of the classified staff.

(c) A contributor shall be paid at the minimum rate of 2¼d. a line for all matter written by him and published. Headings, where written by the contributor, to be included in the lineage payment.

(d) Copy contributed by a classified member or a cadet and written in his own time shall, if published, be paid for at 3d. a line in addition to his weekly salary.

(e) All payments under this clause shall be made within a fortnight of receipt of account unless the contributor has agreed to a longer period. Rejected matter shall be returned as soon as practicable provided stamps are forwarded with M.S.S.

(f) Should a contribution be published not in the publication which accepted it, but in some other publication or publications, it shall be paid for by the employer who originally accepted it.

(g) Any matter accepted for publication and not published but used for broadcasting, shall be paid for at 2¼d. a line as if published.

(h) The provisions of this clause shall apply to all persons whether members of the Union or not.

13.—Country Correspondents.

(a) "A country correspondent" for the purpose of this Division means a member, except as provided in Clause 3 (f) of this Division, who is regularly employed to furnish news matter from a centre beyond the suburban boundaries of Perth.

(b) A country correspondent shall be paid the following minimum rates for copy written by him and published:—

(1) 3d. a line for special articles so marked by the writer and accepted as such.

(2) 2¼d. a line for copy other than special articles as defined in (1).

(c) Headings supplied by a country correspondent and published shall be included in the number of lines to be paid for.

(d) Accounts for country correspondents are to be submitted and paid for monthly unless by other mutual arrangement.

14.—Names to be Furnished.

(a) The names of all journalists, including cadets, casuals, and district correspondents, employed by the company, together with a statement as to the grade in which they are employed, shall be entered and, when necessary, added to or corrected by, or on behalf of the company, in a book to be kept by the company for the purpose.

(b) A copy of such entries shall, on application in writing by the Secretary of the Metropolitan Journalists' Industrial Union of Workers of Western Australia at any time be furnished by the company to any member of the said Union authorised in writing to receive it.

15.—Incapacity Pay.

(a) In each year of employment reckoned from the date of appointment to the staff, classified members, cadets and district correspondents, while absent through illness or incapacity, shall be paid incapacity pay weekly on the scale and subject to the conditions set out in this clause.

(b) Conditions:

(1) Illness or incapacity arising from any cause other than misbehaviour, wilful contribution or lack of reasonable care.

(2) Upon production of a medical certificate if required.

(c) Scale of Payments:—

Payments shall be made at not less than the following scale:—

(1) After the member has been employed continuously for 26 weeks: For the first four weeks at full pay, the second four weeks at half pay, and the third four weeks at quarter pay.

(2) After he has been employed continuously for five years: For the first eight weeks at full pay, the second eight weeks at half pay, and the third eight weeks at quarter pay.

(d) In the case of a district correspondent, "full pay" means the minimum weekly rate of £7 provided for in clause 11 (d) of this Division. If a district correspondent is employed by more than one employer, each employer shall be liable for an equal share of the incapacity pay.

(e) When an employer has made any other provision for incapacity pay, either in itself or in conjunction with any other contingency, that provision shall be substituted, in whole or in part, and either generally as to all his employees or as to any made by this clause. This shall be conditional upon the written consent of the Union and of the employer and the certificate of the Registrar of the State Arbitration Court that, in his opinion, the substituted provision is as beneficial to the members of the Union as the provision made in this clause.

(f) If in any particular case an employer is required by law to make any payment or compensation to a member who is ill, then to the extent of the payment or compensation actually made the provisions in this clause or any substituted provision shall abate.

(g) For the purposes of this clause the period or periods absent in 12 months, dating from the member's appointment to the staff, shall be regarded as cumulative and not as applying to separate illnesses and/or incapacity that may occur during the course of the 12 months.

(h) An employer shall not be liable for payment under the provisions of this clause to any member absent from duty as a result of an injury received from a specific form of recreation, hobby or exercise if the employer has given specific individual notification in writing to the member that, if he further indulges in that particular form of recreation, hobby or exercise, no liability in the case of injury arising therefrom shall attach to the employer. A general notification by circular or otherwise shall not exempt an employer from liability under this subclause.

16.—Compensation.

(a) An employer shall be liable to pay compensation:—

(1) To a member in the event of an accident arising out of or in the course of his employment and resulting in total permanent incapacity.

(2) To a member's dependants (if any) in the event of an accident to the member arising out of or in the course of his employment and resulting in death.

(b) Such payment shall be a sum equal to:—

(1) 12 months' pay for an A Grade member at the rate for that grade set out in clause 1 of this Division, or 12 months' pay at the special rate in A Grade if the member be so paid.

(2) 12 months' pay for a B Grade, C Grade or D Grade member at the rate for his grade as set out in clause 1 of this Division.

(3) 12 months' pay for a cadet at the rate set out in clause 4 of this Division for his year of cadetship.

(4) 12 months' pay for a district correspondent, or a casual, calculated on his average weekly earnings from the employer in the 12 months immediately before the accident or any shorter period that he may have been employed.

(c) Subject to the provision in subclause (d) of this clause the maximum liability of an employer in any one case shall be £900.

(d) If a member's death results from an accident, through air travel arising out of and in the course of his employment, the employer shall pay to the member's dependants (if any) double the amount of compensation specified for death in this clause with a maximum liability of £1,125 in any one case.

(e) In the event of temporary total incapacity of a member for journalistic duty as the result of an accident arising out of and in the course of that member's employment, the employer shall be liable for payment on the scale set out in the incapacity pay provisions of clause 16 of this Division, and in addition for payment of medical and hospital expenses incurred as a result of the accident. The maximum liability of an employer in any one case for medical and hospital expenses shall be £200.

(f) When an employer has made any other provision to meet his obligations under this clause, either in itself or in conjunction with any other contingency, that provision shall be substituted, in whole or in part, and either generally as to all his employees or as to any individual case, in place of the provisions for compensation made by this clause. This shall be conditional upon the written consent of the Union and of the employer and the certificate of the Registrar of the State Arbitration Court that in his opinion the substituted provision is as beneficial to the members of the Union as to the provision made in this clause.

(g) If in any particular case an employer is required by law to make any payment of compensation to a member who is incapacitated, then to the extent of the payment or compensation actually made the provisions in this clause or any substituted provision shall abate.

(h) Should any question arise as to who is a dependant or as to the liability to pay compensation, and/or should the amount of such compensation payable under the foregoing provisions be in dispute, such question shall be referred to a board consisting of one representative of the employer concerned, one representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon. The decision of this board shall be final.

(i) Failing mutual agreement as to the appointment of a chairman, the Registrar of the State Arbitration Court shall be empowered to make the appointment.

(j) The board shall meet within two months of the date of a request for a meeting by either side.

(k) In the case of death, the payment shall be invested, applied or otherwise dealt with as the board shall, in its discretion, direct for the benefit of the persons entitled to the payment.

17.—Holiday Leave.

(a) In every 52 weeks of employment and after 48 weeks from the annual date of appointment to the staff, all classified members, cadets and district correspondents shall be given four consecutive weeks' holiday on full pay irrespective of sick leave. They shall be paid for the four weeks in advance. This provision shall apply to all holiday leave falling due from 1st April, 1947.

(b) If a member of the classified staff, a cadet, or a district correspondent is discharged after 26 weeks' employment and before the completion of 48 weeks, he shall be entitled to proportionate leave on full pay at the rate of four weeks' holiday for 48 weeks' employment.

(c) If after 52 weeks (48 weeks of employment and four weeks of holiday) a member of the classified staff, a cadet or a district correspondent, leaves his employment, whether of his own accord or because he is dismissed, he shall be entitled to proportionate leave for the amount of his further service at the rate of four weeks' holiday for 48 weeks of employment.

(d) If a member of the classified staff, a cadet or a district correspondent leaves his employment of his own accord within 48 weeks of his appointment to the staff, he shall have no claim for holiday leave.

(e) When the annual holidays are fixed to begin on a Monday and the member has worked on the preceding Sunday, the holiday shall date from the Tuesday.

(f) Should Christmas Day or Good Friday fall during a member's holiday, the member shall be allowed an extra day's holiday, or be paid double rates for one day.

(g) In the case of a district correspondent "full pay" means the minimum weekly rate of £7 provided for in clause 11 (d) of this Division. If a district correspondent is employed by more than one employer, each employer shall be liable for a share of the holiday pay in proportion to the number of days worked for that employer.

18.—Termination of Services.

(a) After 26 weeks of employment, during which period one week's notice shall suffice, the employment of a classified member, a cadet, or a district correspondent shall not be terminated by either party unless the following period of notice of such termination shall have been given or, in the case of termination by an employer, payment made in lieu thereof:—

A Grade members, with 10 years' or more continuous service in one office	4 months.
A Grade members, after 12 months, but with less than 10 years' continuous service in one office	3 months.
A Grade members after 26 weeks, but with less than 12 months' continuous service in one office	2 months.
B Grade members	2 months.
C Grade members	1 month.
D Grade members	1 month.
District correspondents	3 weeks.
Cadets	2 weeks.

(b) If a newspaper ceases publication, the employer shall give members one month's notice of termination of their employment in addition to that provided in subclause (a) of this clause. In default, members shall receive payment in lieu of notice. Payments made in lieu of notice shall be made from week to week, and shall:—

(1) Cease if and when a member whose employment has been so terminated secures other employment in the same city at a rate not less than that paid to him immediately before the termination.

(2) Be proportionately reduced if and when a member whose employment has been so terminated secures other employment in the same city at a rate less than that paid to him immediately before the termination.

(3) Cease if and when a member whose employment has been so terminated secures other employment in another city at a rate not less than that paid to him immediately before the termination and when the personal travelling expenses to the city in which he has obtained employment have been paid by his former employer.

(4) Be proportionately reduced if and when a member whose employment has been so terminated secures other employment in another city at a rate less than that paid to him immediately before the termination and when the personal travelling expenses to the city in which he has obtained employment have been paid by his former employer.

19.—Duplicating Copy.

(a) When a member, by the direction of or with the knowledge or consent of his employer, furnishes by means of duplication copy intended for any other employer in the city in which he is employed, he shall receive payment for it at a minimum rate of 2¼d. a line.

(b) When the copy supplied by a member for the newspaper on which he is employed, or proof or duplicate of such copy is used by another newspaper, or is distributed by his employer for publication in another newspaper in the same city, this shall not constitute duplication of copy within the meaning of this clause.

(c) Dictation of his report by one member, at the direction of or with the knowledge or consent of his employer, to another member employed by another newspaper in the same city is duplication of copy within the meaning of this clause.

20.—Photographic Work.

A classified member, a cadet, or a district correspondent shall not be requested or instructed to do photographic work within the city of publication in the course of his regular employment. If a journalist is requested or instructed to take photographs outside the city of publication, he shall be paid a minimum of 10s. 6d. for each photograph published.

21.—Broadcasting

All time involved in broadcasting or in gathering or preparing matter for broadcasting by direction of the employer shall be treated as time worked in accordance with the provisions of this Division.

22.—Accommodation.

An employer shall provide every reasonable convenience and comfort for members employed by him. Details shall be agreed upon by the employer and the district committee of the Union. Failing agreement, the matter shall be decided by the Registrar of the State Arbitration Court or his deputy.

23.—Files for Reference.

An employer shall file in his office for one month after issue copies of each edition of the newspaper or newspapers published by him. The files shall be available for reference during office hours to members employed by him.

24.—Award for Reference.

A copy of this Agreement with any variations thereof shall be supplied by the Union to the employer and shall be placed in a convenient position in the reporters' room in each office for reference. The Union shall be responsible for supplying and replacing copies of the Agreement.

25.—Union Notice Boards.

The District Committee of the Union shall be permitted to erect a notice board in the reporters' room in a place approved by the employer and to place thereon notices of which the employer has approved.

26.—Male and Female Members.

All provisions of this Agreement shall apply equally to male and female members.

27.—Preference.

(a) It shall be a condition of the employment of a new member of the classified staff, of a cadet or of a district correspondent that he shall be a member of the

Metropolitan Journalists' Union at the time of his appointment, or he shall make immediate application for membership and shall become a member within three months (in the case of a cadet, within six months) from the date of his appointment unless within the said three months (in the case of a cadet within six months) he makes a statutory declaration that he has conscientious objections to doing so and forwards a copy of it to the secretary of the Union. For the purpose of this clause "a new member of the classified staff" shall include any person qualified by reason of the nature of the work done by him or assigned to him to be a member of the classified staff within the meaning of this Division.

(b) A member of the Union in employment before this Award came into operation shall remain a member unless he makes a statutory declaration of conscientious objection or leaves the profession.

(c) The Union shall not refuse membership to any eligible person who applies under subclause (a) of this clause.

(d) The making of a statutory declaration of conscientious objection by a member who is financially in arrears to the Union shall not exempt him from his obligation to remain a member.

(e) The secretary of the Union shall, from time to time forward to the chief of staff of each metropolitan newspaper a list of unemployed members who desire to cover sporting assignments or do casual work.

28.—Exceptional Circumstances.

(a) An employer or an employee may make application in writing to the Registrar of the State Arbitration Court for a certificate of the Registrar's opinion that, by reason of exceptional circumstances, the applicant ought to be exempted from the operation of some specific provision of this Agreement in relation to a particular case.

(b) If the application is not, in whole or in part, consented to in writing by the employer concerned and by the Union, no certificate shall be given.

(c) If the application is, in whole or in part, consented to in writing by the employer concerned and by the secretary of the Union, the Registrar, if he thinks the circumstances require the exemption or a more restricted exemption, but so far only as it is consented to, may certify his opinion accordingly.

(d) On the certificate being given, the provision to the extent so certified shall not apply to the applicant.

(e) If the Registrar is of opinion that an employer or an employee other than the applicant may be affected prejudicially or if an employer or an employee so requests, the Registrar shall, before certifying, give him an opportunity of being heard in opposition to the application.

(f) The certificate may at any time be cancelled by the Registrar if he thinks fit. Notice of cancellation shall be given by him to the person on whose application the certificate was given and thereupon the exemption shall cease.

29.—Travel by Air.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement, a member may decline to undertake an assignment if it necessitates carrying air service.

30.—Use of Office Cars.

A member shall not be called upon to drive an office-owned car on any assignment unless he is made exempt by his employer from financial liabilities coverable by ordinary insurance during the whole period he is in charge of the car.

31.—No Reduction in Grading Through Staff Reduction.

If at any time during the currency of this Award the classified staff is reduced in number, no member shall be down-graded for the reason that the smaller staff makes a lower grading possible.

32.—Relieving.

Any journalist or cadet temporarily taking the place of another of higher grade, shall, while doing so, be paid the higher rate: Provided that this does not apply to holiday or sick leave where the absent journalist or cadet is paid by the employer.

33.—Proof Reading.

No member shall engage in the work of a proof-reader except in the case of an emergency.

34.—Signing Work.

No member shall be compelled to sign for publication any matter which his office has instructed him to prepare.

35.—Shorthand Writers, Operators of News-Receiving Machines.

No news or copy received for publication by shorthand, telephone or dictaphone or by any other mechanical means, shall be prepared for the printer or in any other way prepared for publication except by a member employed under Clause 2 of this Division, or by a cadet or by a casual. The provision of this sub-clause shall not apply to cases in which the work performed is solely that of a typist.
