WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardii, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Guildford Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been set apart for a street or way within the Municipality of Guildford, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor,

WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building, and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation declare that the proper area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith in the Geraldton Road District shall be:—

(1) For residential purposes—an area of ground of not less than one quarter of an acre.

(2) For shop or trade purposes—an area of ground having a frontage of not less than 18 feet between the centre of the side walls, with a minimum depth of 132 feet.

(3) The minimum areas prescribed in (1) shall not apply to any subdivisions of lesser areas recorded as lots on any plan or diagram deposited in the Office of Titles prior to the date of this Proclamation: Provided that no dwelling house shall be erected on any lot or area of not less than 6,000 square feet where such area has been established by survey and Titles Office Plan or Diagram prior to the date hereof.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (RESUMPTION OF LAND) ACT, 1945.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under section 16 of the Industrial Development (Resumption of Land) Act, 1945, has been pleased to amend the Industrial Development (Resumption of Land) Regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th December, 1946, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by inserting a new heading and new regulations to stand as regulations 23 and 24 after regulation 22 as follows:—

Purchase Price and Conditions of Sale of Dedicated Land.

23. Where the Governor elects to transfer or convey the freehold estate in any dedicated land to an applicant therefor, the purchase price of the land shall be fixed by the Minister on the recommendation of the Committee; such price shall represent the fair value of the land and shall include the cost of all improvements, subdivisions and surveys, if any, of the land to be transferred or conveyed.

24. Where the freehold estate in any dedicated land is to be conveyed or transferred by sale to an applicant therefor, the Minister may direct that the conditions detailed hereunder, or such of them as he may deem necessary, shall govern the sale:—

(1) The Minister shall enter into an agreement with the purchaser in regard to the sale and embodying the conditions of the sale therein.

(2) The purchase price shall be payable to the Minister at Perth.

(3) The purchase price shall be payable in full on demand or by equal annual instalments on a date in each year to be fixed by the Minister.

(4) Where, in any case, the purchase price is payable by instalments, the purchaser shall pay to the Minister a sum representing ten per centum of the purchase price on a date to be fixed by the Minister.

(5) Where the purchase price is payable by instalments the purchaser shall pay interest on the purchase price or so much thereof as shall remain unpaid from time to time at the rate of 4½ per cent. per annum calculated from a date to be fixed by the Minister and such interest shall be payable to the Minister on the dates fixed for payment of the instalments and shall be in addition to such instalments.

(6) The purchaser shall have the option at any time during the continuance of the agreement to pay off the balance of the purchase moneys together with interest accrued thereon and then due and owing by the purchaser to the Minister.

(7) Upon or at any time after the payment of the whole of the purchase price together with interest thereon as aforesaid, the Minister shall cause to be executed a good and valid transfer of the land in favour of the purchaser and shall cause to be issued in the name of the purchaser a Certificate of Title for the land transferred to the purchaser and all registration fees and costs in respect thereof shall be borne and paid by the purchaser.

(8) The purchaser shall pay to the authorities concerned all rates, taxes, assessments, rents and impositions rated, taxed, assessed or imposed on or against the land so transferred and which shall become due and owing to such authorities as from the date of the agreement.

(9) During the term of the agreement the purchaser shall keep and maintain the buildings and improvements, if any, erected on the land transferred to the purchaser in a good and substantial state of repair and condition (damage by fire, storm and tempest excepted) and shall permit the Minister or his duly authorised officer and/or servants and workmen at all reasonable times to enter upon the said land for the purpose of inspecting the same.

(10) The purchaser shall insure at his own expense in a reputable public insurance office and keep insured the buildings and improvements, if any, upon the land against damage or destruction by fire to the full insurable value thereof and shall produce to the Minister on demand the policy and certificates of renewal in respect thereof.

(11) If the purchaser shall fail to comply with the conditions of the agreement or shall fail to pay any of the stipulated instalments and interest on the day upon which the same shall become due the whole of the balance of purchase money and interest shall become immediately payable and recoverable by the Minister from the purchaser, without prejudice to any other rights or remedies of the Minister.

(12) Notwithstanding the provisions of the next preceding condition, if the purchaser shall fail to comply with any of the conditions of the agreement or shall fail to make due and punctual payments of the moneys agreed to be paid by him the Minister shall be at liberty without notice to rescind the agreement (whereupon the deposit and all other moneys which shall have been paid by the purchaser shall be forfeited to the Minister) and to resell the land, and the deficiency in price, if any, occasioned by such sale together with all costs and expenses attending the same shall immediately be made good by the purchaser and in case of non-payment of the amount of such deficiency, costs and expenses the same shall be recoverable by the Minister from the purchaser as and for liquidated damages.

(13) Where the same shall not be altered or modified by the conditions of the agreement the provisions of Table "A" of the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1946, shall apply to the agreement.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948, and the regulations for the time being in force thereunder, I Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 16.

Definitions.

2. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

"Albany" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Albany;

"Bunbury" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Bunbury;

"cutlet" means the desealed flesh of a fish retaining a portion of the backbone, and includes also the desealed flesh of a fish from which all bones have not been removed;

"Esperance" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Esperance;

"fillet" means the desealed flesh of a fish from which the head and all bones have been removed;

"fish" includes crayfish, or the flesh or any part thereof;

"fisherman" means any person licensed under the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, of the State of Western Australia, to catch fish;

"Geraldton" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Geraldton;

"Mandurah" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Mandurah;

"Perth metropolitan area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

Maximum Wholesale Prices.

3. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale for delivery in the Perth metropolitan area to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale for delivery in Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurah to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish, less one penny per lb. weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale for delivery outside the Perth metropolitan area, Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah to be the sum of—

(a) the maximum price fixed by this Order for the sale of that fish by wholesale for delivery in the Perth metropolitan area, Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurah, whichever is nearest the point the fish was first brought to land;

(b) one half penny per lb. weight of that fish to cover cost of ice, packing and delivery to rail; and

(c) ten per centum of (a).

Maximum Retail Prices.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth metropolitan area to be the price set out in the third, fourth, fifth or sixth columns, respectively, opposite to each such variety of fish according to whether the fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurah to be—

(a) in the case of uncleaned or cleaned fish (other than in cutlets or in the form of fillets), the price set out in the third or fourth columns, respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, less one penny per pound weight;

- (b) in the case of cutlets of fish, the price set out in the fifth column opposite each such variety of fish, less one and one half pence per pound weight;
- (c) in the case of fillets of fish, the price set out in the sixth column opposite each such variety of fish, less two pence per pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has been transported through the Perth metropolitan area may be sold by retail outside the Perth metropolitan area, Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the third, fourth, fifth or sixth columns, respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third or fourth columns of the Second Schedule, according to the distance by rail from the Perth Central railway station to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

(4) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has not been transported through the Perth metropolitan area may be sold by retail outside the Perth metropolitan area, Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the third, fourth, fifth or sixth columns respectively of the First Schedule to this Order opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third or fourth columns of the Third Schedule to this Order, according to the distance by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the wholesale seller's place of business, to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Every person who sells other than by retail any fish for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall deliver with that fish an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business.
- (b) Name and address of the purchaser of that fish.
- (c) The date of the sale of that fish.
- (d) The class of that fish, described according to the classes of fish specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (e) The total weight of each class of fish sold.
- (f) The price per lb. at which the class of fish is sold.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which fish of any variety specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Prices.

7. (1) Every person who sells, or has for sale, by retail, fish shall exhibit in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) Retail selling prices of each lot or variety of fish, whether it is cleaned, uncleaned, filleted or in cutlets, which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at such place or places of business; and

- (b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

2. (a) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding subparagraph in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price card or cards, specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and total price in relation to each such lot or variety of fish, whether cleaned, uncleaned, filleted, or in cutlets, offered for sale as aforesaid, which properly associates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish; and

(b) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding subparagraph in relation to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish, shall be such form as otherwise complies with regulation 45 of the Regulations.

I fix and declare the maximum price at which imported fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth metropolitan area to be the price set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which imported fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail outside the Perth metropolitan area to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order opposite each such variety of fish; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the distance by railway from the Perth Central Railway Station to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which imported fish of any variety specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Prices.

7. (1) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail imported fish, shall exhibit in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business a notice or notices setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) Retail selling prices of each lot or variety of fish which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at such place or places of business, and
- (b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

(2) (a) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price card or cards specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and the total price in relation to each such variety of fish offered for sale as aforesaid which properly associates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish, and (b) the approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph in relation to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish shall be such form as otherwise complies with regulation 45 of the Regulations.

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 14.

Revocation.

2. Commonwealth Prices Regulation Order No. 1692, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 4th day of September, 1944, as amended by Commonwealth Prices Regulation Orders—

No. 2062, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 23rd day of April, 1945, and

No. 3362, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on 22nd day of July, 1948,

is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply to the sale of one bag or more of seed potatoes.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“approved seed potatoes” means potatoes approved as suitable for seed by a duly authorised officer of the State Department of Agriculture;

“certified seed potatoes” means potatoes accepted by a duly authorised officer of the State Department of Agriculture, as certified seed potatoes;

“cost of transport” means cost of transport by rail (or, if rail transport is not available, any other service which is available), but does not include any cost of transport which is not recorded on an invoice delivered by the seller, or in the case of sales by retail, on an invoice delivered to the retail seller;

“primary wholesaler” means any person who purchases seed potatoes from a grower for resale, or any person who sells seed potatoes on behalf of a grower;

“secondary wholesaler” means any person who purchases seed potatoes from a primary wholesaler for resale;

“seed potatoes” means potatoes sold under permit from the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board for use as seed potatoes.

Sales by Growers.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the class or kind of seed potatoes specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by growers to be—

(a) where delivery is taken at the railway siding nearest the grower’s premises—the price set out in the second column of the said Schedule opposite each such class or kind;

(b) where delivery is taken at the grower’s premises—the price set out in the second column of the said Schedule, less the usual cost of conveying such seed potatoes from the grower’s premises to the railway siding nearest to such premises;

(c) where delivery is taken at any other place—the price set out in the second column of the said Schedule, plus the cost actually incurred by the seller in transporting such seed potatoes from the railway siding nearest the grower’s premises to the point of delivery by such grower.

Sales by Primary Wholesaler.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the class or kind of seed potatoes specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by a primary wholesaler to be the sum of—

(a) the price paid or payable by the primary wholesaler, or the maximum price fixed by paragraph 5 of this Order, whichever is the lesser;

(b) cost of transporting the seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the primary wholesaler to the point of delivery by the primary wholesaler; and

(c) margin at the rate of 8s. 6d. per ton, whichever is the lesser of such prices.

Sales by Secondary Wholesaler.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any class or kind of seed potatoes may be sold by a secondary wholesaler to be the sum of—

(a) the price paid or payable by the secondary wholesaler for the seed potatoes;

(b) cost of transport of the seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the secondary wholesaler to the point of delivery by the secondary wholesaler; and

(c) margin at the rate of 20s. per ton.

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a price is fixed by notice in writing to a person under this Order, I declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by such person, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
