To His Honour, Judge C. H. Book, of Melbourne, Victoria:

I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby amend the Commission dated the 17th day of November, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 19th day of November, 1948, and given by me to Your Honour, by inserting after paragraph 2 of the subject matter of the Inquiry to be made by you a further paragraph as follows:—

2A. Whether any motor spirit ration tickets or Police Department petrol were used in connection with a journey from Perth of a motor car in which the Commissioner of Police was a passenger when proceeding to a Police Conference in 1947 at Brisbane, and if so, whether and to what extent there was, in relation to the use of such tickets or petrol—

- (a) anything wrongful or improper on the part of the Commissioner;
- (b) any falsification of Police Department records; or
- (c) any obstruction by the Commissioner or any member of the Police Force of officers of the Liquid Fuel Control Board in this State in or arising out of investigations by such officers.

And the said Commission shall be read and construed accordingly.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO GOVERNMENT CHEMICAL LABORATORIES.

Assays and Analyses.

(1) Assays, analyses, and physical tests will be made of any Western Australian raw material or manufactured product by the Director, when not unduly interfering with official work subject to the prepayment of the fees set out in the accompanying Schedule and the conditions laid down in Regulations (3) and (4).

(2) Reductions of the usual fees will be allowed under certain conditions, viz:—

(a) For a number of samples submitted by the one person at the one time for identical treatment:—

Five to ten (inclusive) .. 20% reduction.
Eleven or more 25% reduction.

A special reduced fee may be charged where the extra work involved in a number of samples is so small as to warrant a special fee.

(b) One-third rates will be charged for waters and agricultural materials to persons who provide evidence that they are bona fide farmers, market gardeners, orchardists, graziers (name owner or occupier, location number of site of sample, etc.) and that the investigation is needed for the proper conduct of their business as such.

(c) Free assays and mineral determinations will be made of West Australian ores taken from ground not held under gold mining lease or mineral lease, provided the exact locality where the specimen was found is disclosed.

(3) All samples for examination must be addressed to the Director, Government Chemical Laboratories, Adelaide Terrace, Perth, and must be marked on the outside with the name and post town of the sender, and on the inside with a distinctive mark on each separate sample. A letter must be sent at the same time setting forth the reasons why the sample has been submitted, and enclosing the prescribed fee.

(4) The Director reserves the right to refuse to make any particular examination on the ground of—(1) the laboratories being already too fully occupied to accept more samples; (2) the sample being unsuitable for the purpose; or (3) any other good and sufficient reason. It also reserves the right of publishing after the expiration of twelve months, the result of any assay or other investigation made at the public expense.

Incorporated conducted by the said Union; (3) a nominee of the Minister who shall not be a member of the Public Service. If any question arises in which the interests of the high school member of the said Board are involved and the Board is to decide such question, then and in any such case a deputy member shall be elected to take the place on the said Board of the high school member. The election of the deputy member shall be by a ballot conducted by the said Union of its high school members.

2. All intersystem traffic is carried subject to the Railways Acts and By-laws of the Commissioners of each System.

3. The minimum charges shown are the minimum charges to be imposed unless it is cheaper to charge the sum of each System's local rates and minima.

4. The foregoing intersystem rates include transfer charges at stations where break of gauge occurs, Albany excepted, also covering and lashing charges for all rates shown. A special charge may be imposed for the transhipment of traffic, when the cost of such transhipment exceeds the rate quoted above; the charge to be not less than the actual cost of transhipment.

(f) Counting Charges at Albury.—A charge of 10d. per ton (minimum 10d. per consignment) will be made at Albury by the New South Wales Railway Department for counting goods, charged at rates less than class 1 in the New South Wales classification, in transit between Interstate stations. Counting charges shall not apply to a single package.
