Schedule.

(1) The whole of the waters of the Denmark River, and its tributaries, and that portion of the waters of Wilson's Inlet within a radius of half-a-mile from the month of the said Denmark River.

(2) The whole of the waters of the Hay River, and its tributaries, and that portion of the waters of Wil-son's Inlet East and South-East of a line drawn from the North-East corner of Plantagenet Location 1500 to the South-West corner of Plantagenet Location 3502.

(3) The whole of the waters (including tributaries) of Parry's Harbour.

(4) The whole of the waters of Bow River (near Irwin's Inlet).

(5) Wilson's Inlet (Denmark)—All that area of Wilson's Inlet near the Channel Entrance Westward of a line drawn in a generally Northerly direction from the North-Western corner of Plantagenet Location No. 1992 (on the Southern shore of the Inlet) to the South-Western corner of Plantagenet Location No. 5433 (on the Northern shore of the Inlet).

Fish.

IN pursnance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Act, 1948, and the regulations for the time being in force thereunder, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 20.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 16 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

'3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears-

- "Albany" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Albany;
- "Bunbury" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Bunbury;
- "cutlet" means the descaled flesh of a fish retaining a portion of the backbone, and includes also the descaled flesh of a fish from which all bones have not been removed;

- "Esperance" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Esperance;
- "fillet" means the descaled flesh of a fish from which the head and all bones have been removed;
- "fish" includes eray-fish, or the flesh or any part thereof;
- "Geraldton" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Geraldton;
- "Mandurah" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal Post Office at Mandurah;
- "Perth metropolitan area" means all that area comprised within a radius of twelve miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

Maximum Retail Prices.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varietics specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth metropolitan area to be the price set ont in the second, third, fourth and fifth columns respectively opposite to each such variety of fish according to whether the fish is uncleaned or cleaned or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton or Mandurch to be:-

- (a) in the case of uncleaned or cleaned fish (other than in entlets or in the form of fillets) the price set out in the second or third columns respectively opposite each such variety of fish according to whether that fish is un-clemed or cleaned, less one penny per pound weight;
- (b) in the case of cutlets of fish, the price set out in the fourth column opposite each such variety of fish less one and one half pence per pound weight;
- (c) in the case of fillets of fish, the price set out in the fifth column opposite each such va-riety of fish less two pence per pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has been transported through the Perth metropolitan area may be sold by retail outside the Perth metropolitan area, or outside Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah to be the sum of— Mandural to be the sum of

- (a) the price set ont in the second, third, fourth or fifth columns respectively opposite each such variety of fish according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set ont in the second, third or fourth columns of the Second Schedule according to the distance by rail from the Perth Central Railway Station to the railway station or siding nearest the re-tail seller's place of business.

(4) I fix and deelare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has not been transported through the Perth metropolitan area may be sold by retail outside the Perth metropolitan area, or outside Albany, Banbury, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandarah to be the sum of :---

- (a) the price set out in the second, third, fourth or fifth columns respectively of the First Schedule to this Order opposite each such variety of fish according to whether that fish is well-rest or is in outlets or in a is nucleaned or cleaned or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per ponnel set out in the second, third or fourth columns of the Third Schedule to this Order according to the dis-tance by rail from the railway station or sid-ing nearest the supplier's place of business, to the railway station or siding nearest the ratio collection states of husiness retail seller's place of business.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I declare the maximum price at which fish of any variety specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Prices.

6. (1) Every person who sells, or has for sale, by retail, fish shall exhibit in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the following particulars:-

- (a) retail selling prices of each lot or variety of fish whether it is cleaned, uncleaned, filleted or in entlets, which is from time to time dis-played or offered for sale at such place or places of business; and
- (b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

(2) (a) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price eard or eards, specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and total price in relation to each such

lot or variety of fish, whether cleaned, nucleaned, filleted or in entlets, offered for sale as aforesaid which properly associates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish; and

(b) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding sub-paragraph in rela-tion to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish, shall be such form as otherwise complies with regulation 45 of the Regulations.

"Appointments and Promotions of Officers to the General Division."

139. Except as hereinafter provided in these regulations, a person shall not be appointed or promoted to the position of Assistant Forester unless he has passed written examinations and practical tests in:---

(a) Clerical efficiency to the standard necessary for handling the work of a district office;

(b) Elementary forestry, with particular application to Jarrah and Karri forest regions, and in timber inspection, compass survey and other matters associated with general forestry practice in Western Australia;

(e) The application of the Forests Act, 1918, the Bush Fires Act, 1937, and the regulations thereunder.

140. An officer classified as Assistant Forester or Forester shall not be eligible for promotion until such time as he has passed more advanced examinations and tests as determined by the Conservator in the subjects specified in regulation 139, provided that failure to pass such examinations and tests shall not affect the continuance of the employment of any such officer on his existing classification.

141. The Conservator may exempt any officer from tests in any class of work on which such officer has been regularly employed for a period of more than twelve months and has given satisfactory service.

142. Examinations and tests will be held in the month of Angust cach year, and persons desirous of submitting themselves for such examinations and tests shall apply in writing not later than June the 30th in any year.

143. The Conservator may refuse permission to any officer to submit himself for the examinations and tests prescribed in regulation 139-

- (a) if he has not served three years in the Department on his existing elassification;
- (b) if within the preceding two years he has submitted himself for but has failed to pass the prescribed examinations and tests.

144. An officer, on successfully passing the prescribed examinations and tests, shall be listed as eligible for promotion as suitable vacancies occur, subject to good and diligent conduct and capacity to take responsibility and handle men to the extent required in any vacant position.

2. Under the aforesaid heading and after regulation 144 a new regulation to stand as regulation 145 is added as follows:—

145. Any person seeking appointment or promotion in forest regions other than Jarrah or Karri may be given special examinations and tests, having particular application to the forest types concerned including pine plantations but the successful passing of such examinations and tests shall not qualify such officer for appointment or promotion of vacancies occurring in Jarrah and Karri forest regions.
