IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1947, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of three years as from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters at Yanchep beach commencing at a point on the foreshore one-half mile North-West of the North-Western corner of reserve No. 12439 and extending in a generally South-Easterly direction to a point on the foreshore one-quarter mile South-East of the South-Western corner of the said reserve, and extending seaward to a distance of one-half mile from the foreshore.

WHEREAS by regulation 2 of the Building Regulations contained in the Second Schedule of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1947, it is provided, in reference to buildings on any block of land laid out for such purpose, that the area allotted to any building, and the open space used in connection with such building shall together be not less than the area for the time being fixed by Proclamation as the proper area to be allotted to such building: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation declare that the proper area to be allotted to every building and the open space to be used therewith in the Greenough Road District shall be: contained in the Second Schedule of the Road Districts shall be :-

(1) For residential purposes—an area of ground of not less than one quarter of an acre.

(2) The minimum areas prescribed in (1) shall not apply to any subdivisions of lesser areas recorded as lots on any plan or diagram deposited in the Office of Titles prior to the date of this Proclamation: Provided that no dwelling house shall be erected on any lot or area of not less than 6,000 square feet where such area has been established by survey and Titles Office plan or diagram prior to the date hereof.

#### OPTOMETRISTS ACT, 1940-1947. Optometrists Registration Board. Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Optometrists Act, 1940-1947, the Optometrists Registration Board may make rules and may amend, repeal, and add to such may make rules and may amend, repeat, and add to such rules; and whereas rules were made, under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Govern-ment Gazette* on the 23rd May, 1941, the 20th June, 1941, the 4th May, 1945, and the 20th September, 1946, and cited as the Optometrists Registration Board Rules, 1941: Now, therefore, the Optometrists Registration Board doth amend the soid rules in the memory cat forth Board doth amend the said rules in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

#### The Schedule.

1. Part VII is amended by substituting for the heading "Examinations" the words "Students and Examinations.'

2. New rules to stand as rules 34b, 34c and 34d are inserted after rule 34a as follows :-

34b (1) Every person desiring to qualify for registration as an Optometrist through and by means of the course of study and training prescribed by rule 35 must first-

(a) satisfy the Board-

(i) that he has passed the preliminary examination prescribed by rule 34c and (ii) that he has arranged to be employed by a

registered optometrist during the four years of the course of study and training prescribed by rule 35, and

(b) be approved by the Board.

(2) The Board may in its discretion approve or refuse to approve any such person or may require him to submit further information or evidence as to his good fame and character and as to the matters set out in paragraph (a) of subparagraph (1) of this rule.

(3) In rules 34c, 34d, and 35 the word "applicant" shall mean a person who has fully complied with para-graph (1) of this rule. 34c (1) The prescribed preliminary examination shall

be the Matriculation Examination prescribed by the University of Western Australia for persons applying to be admitted to the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Science.

(2) An applicant who has not passed the subject of Chemistry at the Matriculation Examination or at the Junior Standard may be required by the Board to undertake such studies, attend such lectures and pass such examinations in that subject as the Board in its discretion may specify.

34d. Every applicant applying under these rules for registration as an optometrist shall pass the examina-tions in the subjects of the course of study and training prescribed by rule 35 before he may be so registered. Rule 35 is repealed and the following inserted in lieu thereof as rule 35:-

(3) The Board in its discretion may vary the order

which courses and examinations in the subjects prescribed for the third and fourth years under paragraph (1) of this rule shall be taken.



(k) No worker shall be called upon to work in a chamber with wet floors or dripping pipes, or where a leak of ammonia exists.

(1) Each chamber shall be provided with an alarm connected with the engine room.

(m) No worker shall be called upon to work in a chamber unless he be paid at least the minimum rate provided for such class of work.

(n) In lieu of the provision of gloves for chamber hands an allowance of ninepence (9d.) per week shall be paid to the workers. In the event of any increase or decrease in the present cost the parties if unable to agree to an amount may apply to the Board of Reference to determine it.

(o) When the existing difficulty as regards the supply of labour and material disappears the em-ployer shall provide for his workers, other than casuals, locker accommodation in the dressing-rooms or elsewhere, or in lieu thereof provide some system where clothes and belongings may be stored and kept by each such worker.

(p) Employers shall allow meal money at the rate (p) Employers shall allow meal money at the rate of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per meal when workers are called upon to work one (1) hour or later after their usual time of knocking off: Provided such worker cannot reasonably get home for their meals, and provided further that they have not been notified of such overtime on the day preceding the day on which they are required to work overtime.

#### INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT. No. 45 of 1948.

#### (Registered 15/10/48.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941," this 8th day of September, 1948, between The Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers (W.A. Branch) (hereinafter called the Union) of the one part and the Minister of Public Health and the Board of Management of the Royal Perth Hospital and the Board of Management of the Children's Hospital (Incorporated) of the other part witnesseth Hospital (Incorporated) of the other part witnesseth as follows :--

#### 1.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the staff of the Royal Perth Hospital, Fremantle Hospital and Children's Hospital, male and female, who are engaged on clerical work or as telephonists, with the exception of the following :-

Royal Perth Hospital: Manager, Secretary and Accountant;

Fremantle Hospital: Managing Secretary and Accountant:

Children's Hospital: Manager and Accountant; and generally any person classified as an administra-

tive, professional or technical officer.

#### 2.—Definitions.

"Officer" means any clerical worker or telephonist engaged on the staff of the Royal Perth Hospital or Fremantle Hospital or Children's Hospital, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

"Casual Employee" means a clerical worker or tele-phonist employed from day to day at a daily or weekly rate of pay. "Minister" means the Minister for Public Health

for the time being.

"Hospital Board" means the Board of Management of the Royal Perth Hospital, or the Fremantle Hos-pital, or the Children's Hospital (Incorporated).

#### 3.-Hours of Duty.

As from the date of signature to this Agreement the ordinary hours of duty shall be  $37\frac{1}{2}$  hours per week exclusive of Saturday afternoon and Sunday time with the exception of :-

Royal Perth Hospital:

Telephonists, whose hours of duty shall be worked on the basis of 75 hours per fortnight as may be rostered by the Hospital Board.

Storekeeper and Outpatients' Record Clerk, whose hours of duty shall be 40 per week. Fremantle Hospital:

Lodgekeeper and Orderly, whose hours of duty shall be 40 per week.

Provided that the week's work may in any case be worked in five days from Mondays to Fridays inclusive as may be arranged between the officers concerned and the Hospital Board.

#### 4.-Classification of Offices and Officers.

The classification of offices and officers and the fixing of salaries of officers shall be vested in the Hospital Board subject to the right of appeal as pro-vided in Clause 22 of this Agreement.

In making a classification under this Clause the Hospital Board shall classify an officer in either the Clerical or General Section according to the class of work required to be performed and shall adhere to the salary scales provided in this Agreement.

#### 5.—Basic Wage.

The basic wage hereinafter referred to shall be as determined from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, but at the date of operation of this Agreement was  $\pm 5$  12s. 9d. per week for males

of this Agreement was  $\pm 5$  12s. 9d. per week for males and  $\pm 3$  0s. 11d. per week for females. "Basic Rate" means in the case of male or female officers employed in the metropolitan area, the near-est  $\pm$  to the result obtained by multiplying the male or female basic wage respectively for that area as de-clared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, by fifty-two and one sixth (52 1/6th). At the date of operation of this Agreement the basic rate for males was  $\pm 294$  per annum and for females  $\pm 159$  per annum.

#### 6.-Male Junior Clerks (Clerical Section).

(b) Classes and grades beyond a margin of  $\pm 125$  per annum over the basic rate shall be those set out in Clause 12, sub-clause (a) of this Agreement.

(c) An officer who has been in receipt of a rate of pay equivalent to a margin of one hundred and twentyfive pounds  $(\pm 125)$  per annum over the basic rate for one year or more shall be paid an allowance of fourteen pounds (£14) per annum, provided that-

- i. in the case of a typist or clerk-typist she passes an examination in shorthand writing at the rate of 120 words and typewriting at the rate of 50 words per minute, respectively;
- ii. in the case of a machinist she passes an examination in bookkeeping and the operation of ledgerposting machines.

Such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position.

(d) An officer retained on the maximum of the automatic range for five (5) years and who is not in receipt of the allowance referred to in sub-clause (c) hereof shall be paid an allowance of fourteen pounds  $(\pounds 14)^{\circ}$  per annum: Provided that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position, or an officer refusing to accept promotion.

(e) If at any time an officer over the age of 21 years is appointed to the staff of any of the hospitals referred to in this Agreement then such appointment may be at a minimum rate of pay based either on wars of service in a clarical experiment in the Unexity. years of service in a clerical capacity in the Hospital Board's service or on age.

#### 13 .-- Casual Employees.

A person temporarily employed shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable in accordance with this Agreement to an officer on the staff of not more than equal efficiency should he or she be engaged on similar duties, provided that-

(a) A male adult temporarily employed in a clerical capacity, shall be paid on engagement an amount at least equivalent to the following rates:—

- i. Under the age of 23 years: the rate prescribed for age in Clause 7 sub-clause (a) of this Agreement.
- ii. Twenty-three years of age and over: the rate prescribed in Clause 7 sub-clause (a) of this Agreement for the third year of service.

(b) In no case shall the provisions of Clause 6 subclause (b), Clause 7 sub-clauses (c) and (d), Clause 9 sub-clauses (c) and (d), Clause 10 sub-clause (b), Clause 16 and Clause 22 of this Agreement apply in respect of a person so temporarily employed.

#### 14.-Variations of Classes and Grades.

The various salary rates set out in this Agreement shall be varied automatically to conform to any variations which may be made from time to time in the equivalent salary rates applying to officers under the Public Service Act 1904-1947. Any such variations shall apply from the date that the variations have effect in respect of officers employed under the Public Service Act 1904-1947.

#### 15.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the certification of the Manager or Managing Secretary as to good conduct, diligence and efficiency, officers classified in the classes referred to in Clause 12, sub-clause (a) of this Agreement shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of re-spective classes by annual increments according to the grades in such classes. In the case of all other officers progression from year to year shall be subject officers progression from year to year shall be subject to a similar certification.

#### 16.—Qualifications Allowance.

(a) A male adult clerical officer who obtains a Diploma of Commerce at the University of Western Australia, or passes the final examinations of a recog-nised Institute of Accountants, or Secretaries or Cost Accountants, or passes in five units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science or Law at the University of Western Australia, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Hospital Board, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of two hundred and thirty-seven pounds (4237) ber annum an allowance activitient. pounds (£237) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale.

(b) A male adult clerical officer who obtains a Degree at the University of Western Australia in Arts, Commerce, Science or Law, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Hospital Board, shall be paid-

- i. Whilst in receipt of a rate of pay not exceeding a margin of two hundred and sixty-five pounds (£265) per aunum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the second higher grade in the incremental scale;
- ii. whilst in receipt of a rate of pay exceeding a margin of two hundred and sixty-five pounds ( $\pounds$ 265) per annum, but not exceeding a margin of two hundred and seventy-nine pounds ( $\pounds$ 279) per annum, an allowance equivalent to the difference between his rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale.

(c) Provided that an officer who obtains more than one of the above qualifications shall only be entitled to payment of the allowance prescribed in either sub-clause (a) or sub-clause (b) hereof as the case may require, and no payments shall be made for more than one of the qualifications obtained.

#### 17.-Conditions of Service.

In all matters relating to the general conditions of their service, except as provided herein, officers bound by this Agreement shall be governed by the conditions, rights and privileges and obligations as are prescribed for public servants employed on the perm-anent staff under the Public Service Act 1904-1947 and the Regulations nade thereunder, all of which are deemed to have been inserted in this Agreement and binding on the Board and the Union: Provided that-

(a) For the purpose of determining long service leave entitlements, continuous service shall not in-clude any service prior to the following dates:---

Royal Perth Hospital: 17th November, 1931.

Fremantle Hospital: 26th May, 1939.

Children's Hospital: 26th March, 1941.

(b) The general conditions of service for casual employees shall be in accordance with those pre-scribed for persons temporarily employed under Section 36 of the Public Service Act 1904-1947.

(c) Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent the alteration of the Public Service Regulations in their application to the members of the Union employed by the Hospital Board if agreed to by both parties to this Agreement.

#### 18 .- Preservation of Accrued Rights.

(a) Nothing contained herein shall affect any rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to the date of operation of this Agreement.

(b) No officer shall as a result of this Agreement suffer any reduction in the total remuneration which he or she may have enjoyed prior to the date of the operation thereof.

(c) The requirements imposed by Clause 6, sub-clause (c) and Clause 8, sub-clause (b) as to the passing of a promotional examination before the advancement of male and female junior officers to the respective adult automatic ranges shall not apply to officers who were appointed prior to the date of this Agreement.

#### 19.-Recognition of Union.

All officers bound by this Agreement shall be mem-bers of the Union : Provided that any officer appointed, who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union, shall become a member within fourteen days.

#### 20.-Record Book.

A record shall be kept by the Hospital Board showing the names of each officer bound by this Agreement, the hours worked each day and the amount of salary received each pay. The said record shall be open to inspection by an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

#### 21.—References.

A reference shall be given to any officer of not less than three months' service containing all necessary information in regard to length of service and duties performed.

#### 22.-Rights of Appeal.

(a) An Appeal Board consisting of a chairman, mutually agreed between the parties to this Agreement and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by a member of the Union against a decision of the Hospital Board in respect of:—

- i. the title, classification, reclassification or salary of such member of the Union;
- ii. the interpretation or application of the provisions of this Agreement.

(b) The times within which written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the Hospital Board shall be as follows :-

- i. in the case of an appeal in respect of title, classification or reclassification, twenty-eight days after the publication of such title, classification or reclassification;
- ii. in the case of an appeal against any other mat-ter, twenty-eight days after the occurrence of the matter aforesaid.

(c) The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on all parties.

#### 23.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of three years commencing from the 26th March, 1948.

Provided that either party to this Agreement may after the 26th day of March, 1949, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, and if both parties agree, such Agreement may be amended by a supplementary Agreement which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 80 of 1948.

The Metropolitan and South-Western Between Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, Applicant, and The Colonial Sugar Refining Company Limited, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and Whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

#### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

#### 1.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years commencing as from the beginning of the first pay period after the date hereof.

#### 2.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area com-prised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

#### 3.—Definition.

"Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days. He shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in this Award upon an hourly basis.

4.-Hours of Work.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers.

(b) Workers employed on shift work shall work five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours, including crib time. All shifts shall rotate weekly: Provided that the foregoing hours may be altered at any time by agreement in writing between the parties. (c) Single shift workers shall work eight (8) hours

per day, exclusive of crib time, Monday to Friday inclusive.

(d) Shift workers may commence work at 11 p.m., in which case the hours worked from 11 p.m. to midnight on any Sunday or public holiday shall be paid for at ordinary rates and included as part of their ordinary shift work hours.

(e) In all cases of reckoning time of duty all time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

#### 5.—Overtime.

Except as otherwise provided :-

(a) For all work done outside the hours of duty on any day payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) When any worker is required to work over-time by reason of a relieving man not coming on duty at the proper time and failing to give at least three (3) hours' notice of his inability to attend, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the first two (2) hours after which his overtime rate shall begin to accrue. The employer shall be entitled to make a "pro rata" deduction for the time not worked in the case of the worker so failing to attend and give notice as aforesaid from any moneys due or becoming due to him.

(c) All time worked on Sundays and holidays prescribed in clause 5 hereof shall be paid for at double time.

(d) Where a worker is called on to work a quick shift he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter. A "quick shift" shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift before having had at least eight (8) hours off. (e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this

Award-

- i. An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- ii. No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or re-striction upon the working of overtime in ac-cordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- iii. This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

#### 6.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 6 (c) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a

or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and pay-ment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve

months' continuous service with such employer. (d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such

holiday observed as aforesaid. (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully

leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service. (f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual lcave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

clause. (i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 7.—Sick Pay.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsquent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(e) The margins set out in this clause include shift allowances.

#### 9.-Special Allowances

(a) If an engine driver also attends to an electric generator or dynamo exceeding ten (10) kilowatt capacity, he shall be paid an additional sum of ninc shillings (9s.) per week.

(b) Cleaners of boilers, enclosed hot water tanks. and other confined spaces: Any person engaged inside the gas or water space of a boiler, flue, or economiser or an enclosed hot water tank which when working is under pressure in cleaning or scraping work, shall be paid ninepence (9d.) per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay, as the case may be, whilst so employed.

#### 10.-Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is employed for four (4) hours or less on any day on work in a higher grade than his ordinary occupation, he shall be paid for the time so occupied at the higher rate. If employed for more than four (4) hours, he shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the shift.

#### 11.-Contract of Service.

(a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day.

(b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 7 hereof, as to payment for absence on account of illness. Where any absence extends for more than six (6) days, the employment shall be deemed to have terminated upon the expiration of the said six (6) days.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employers' machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

#### 12.-Meal Money.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in lieu thereof: Provided that such payment need not be made to a worker living in the same locality as his place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.
