Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1948.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1948, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 10; and whereas Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch), of 168 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 10, and, having duly made application under and in accordance with the said Act and the regulations made and in force thereunder for exemption from the operation of the said section, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to workers employed by it, and has deposited or has duly arranged for the deposit at the Treasury of securities, to wit Commonwealth Treasury Bonds to the value of five thousand pounds (£5,000) issued in relation to the Third Victory War Loan, charged with all payments to become due by it under such liability aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Conneil and in exercise of the power conferred by section 10 of the said Act doth hereby exempt the said Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) from the operation of section 10 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1948, for the period of two years commencing on the 25th day of January, 1949.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Water Boards Act, 1904, that for every water area constituted under that Act there shall be a water board constituted by the Governor by Order in Council; and whereas it is enacted by section 3 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, that the Governor may revoke any Order in Council made before or after the commencement of the said lastmentioned Act, for the constitution of a water board under the Water Boards Act, 1904-1947, aforesaid, and dissolve the water board constituted pursuant to any Order so revoked; and whereas by an Order in Council dated the 26th day of August, 1914, and published in the Government Gazette on the 28th day of August, 1914, the Governor, acting in exer-

(f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912·1941, of Western Australia, this seventeenth day of December, 1948, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust of the one part, and the Federated Clerks' Union Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees of the Fremantle Harbour Trust engaged upon clerical work and not provided for by any other Agreement or Award.

2.—Definitions.

"Officer" shall mean any member of the clerical staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

"Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust in office for the time being.

"Union" shall mean the W.A. Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Industrial Union of Workers.

3.-Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be:-

- (a) Administrative Staff.—Thirty eight (38) hours shall constitute the week's work and the ordinary hours of duty shall be seven (7) hours thirty-six (36) minutes daily from 8.30 a.m. to 5.6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch.
- (b) Handling and Custody of Cargo Staff.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute the week's work, and the ordinary hours of duty shall be eight (8) hours daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch.
- (c) Storeman.—Forty (40) hours shall constitute the week's work, and the ordinary hours of duty shall be eight (8) hours daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for hunch.
- (d) (1) The Commissioners may require any officer to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such officer shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (2) The Union or officer or officers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to, or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (3) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Commissioners.

4.—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean and include all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty, and shall be paid for as follows:—

- (a) All such time worked between 5.6 p.m. and midnight on any of the days Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at the rate of time and a half, provided that an officer called back after the usual finishing time shall be paid a minimum of two hours at the appropriate rate.
- (b) All such time worked between midnight and the usual starting time, at the rate of double time, with a minimum payment as for four hours, except where the period of duty commences at or within four hours of the usual starting time, when the payment shall be for the actual time worked.
- (c) All time worked on Saturdays between the ordinary starting time and noon shall be paid for at the rate of time and half with a minimum payment as for two hours.
- (d) All such time worked between noon and midnight on Saturdays, at the rate of double time with a minimum as for two hours.
- (e) All such time worked on Sundays and holidays, at the rate of double time with a minimum as for four hours.
- (f) Overtime shall not be paid for unless such work is authorised by the manager or the secretary of the Commissioners,

5.-Meal Allowance.

In addition to the overtime prescribed in clause 4, a meal allowance of 2s. 6d. shall be paid to each officer in the following circumstances:—

- (a) Where an officer is required to remain on duty after the usual finishing time and is so detained on duty for a period exceeding one hour on any working day.
- (b) Where an officer is required to commence duty earlier than two hours prior to the usual starting time on any day, or is not allowed a period of one hour and a half after the usual finishing time before being required to resume duty on any working day.
- (c) Where an officer is required on duty on other than a working day and commences at or before 12 noon or 5 p.m. or on Saturday at or before 5 p.m. and continues on duty until or beyond 1.30 p.m. or 6.30 p.m. respectively; provided that the actual period of duty in either case exceeds two hours.

Should a vacancy occur in any grade as prescribed in clause 6 of the Agreement, such vacancy shall be advertised by notice on the office notice board and in such other manner as the Commissioners may deem fitting and appointment to such vacancy shall, where practicable, be made from officers already in the service of the Commissioners. Any officer may have the right of appeal to the Commissioners against any such appointment.

8.-Higher Duties.

Officers required to relieve temporarily in positions outside their own classifications will be entitled to be paid the minimum of the position being relieved.

9.—Public Holidays.

All gazetted holidays and picnic day shall be observed as public holidays.

10.-Annual Leave.

All officers shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for two weeks in each calendar year, as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners.

11.—Long Service Leave.

All officers shall be entitled to long service leave as though within the appropriate provision of the regulations of the Commissioners. Any officer who resigns or is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least 12 months next prior thereto shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of resignation or retirement.

$14. {\bf --Engagement}.$

- (a) The engagement of any officer, other than one in a temporary or relieving capacity, shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side, excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be instantly dismissed or suspended, and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.

- (c) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1941, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.
