Prices Control Order No. 177.

Rubber Garden Hose.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 177.

Revocation.

2. Commonwealth Prices Regulation Order No. 2997, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on the 11th day of July, 1947, is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, "Perth metropolitan area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

Maximum Retail Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any type or description of rubber garden hose specified in the first, second and third columns of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by any person whose place
 (b) of business is situated in the Perth metropolitan area—the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule;
 - (b) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated outside the Perth metropolitan area—the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule, plus one halfpenny per foot.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

5. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail, rubber garden hose the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by subparagraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed with rubber garden hose shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods and as to be properly associated with such goods.

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any rubber garden hose specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 178.

Plain Flour, Whole Wheatmeal and Standard Wheatmeal.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:---

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 178.

Revocation.

Definitions and Interpretations.

2. Prices Control Order No. 96 is hereby revoked.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-

- "Metropolitan Area" means the area served by the railway from South Beach and Fremantle to Midland Junction, and Perth to Caunington:
- "for cash" means in relation to any sale, that payment is made-
 - (a) where the purchaser's premises are within 20 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store—within seven days of delivery; or
 - (b) where the purchaser's premises are beyond 20 miles and within 100 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store-within ten days of delivery; \mathbf{or}
 - (c) where the purchaser's premises are more than 100 miles from the flour mill or the seller's store—within fourteen days of delivery; or
 - (d) where the buyer's premises are situ-ated North of Carnarvon—by the first postal mail following the re-
- ceipt of the goods; "purchaser's railway station or siding" means the railway station or siding most easy of
- access to the purchaser's premises; "North-Western port" means any port in West-ern Australia North of the 26th parallel of
- South latitude; "Whole wheatmeal" means the product made by grinding sound wheat, and which contains in
- "their natural proportions all the constituents of the cleaned grain; "standard wheatmeal" means wheatmeal milled or pounded so as to contain the gristed pro-duce of cleaned and sound wheat mixed with

- duce of cleaned and sound wheat mixed with wheaten flour in the proportion of 30 parts of the latter to 70 parts of the former; 'short ton' means 2,000 lb. 'long ton' means 2,240 lb. 'wholesale' means in relation to plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal that such plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal is sold to the purchaser for the purchaser
- for the purpose of re-sale; "retail" means in relation to plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal that such
- wheatmeat and standard wheatmeat that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;
 "Shark Bay area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal part show the Pari-
- ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Shark Bay;
 "Carnarvou area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Carnarvon;
 "Broome area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Broome. office at Broome;
- "Onslow area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Onslow; "Port Hedland area" means that portion of the
- "Port Hedland area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Port Hedland;
 "Roebourne area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of ten miles from the principal
- post office at Roebourne; "Derby area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Derby;
- "Yampi area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Yampi;
- "Wyndham area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Wyndham;
- "'Marble Bar area'' means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Marble Bar;

- "Nullagine area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of twenty miles from the principal post office at Nullagine;
- "Wittencom Gorge area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Wittencom Gorge;
- "Nooukaubah area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Noonkanbah;
- "Fitzroy Crossing area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Fitzroy Crossing;
- "Hall's Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Hall's Creek;
- "Turkey Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle hav-ing a radius of three wiles from the principal post office at Turkey Creek.

Sales by Millers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal may be sold by millers to be—

- (a) when sold for delivery in the Metropolitan Area and delivered on buyer's premises or delivered to buyers elsewhere than on buyer's premises in bags or other contain-ers of approximately 150 lb. weight— £16 13s. 3d. per short ton;
- (b) when sold for delivery elsewhere than in the Metropolitan Area and delivered in the interpolation Area and delivered in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lb. weight to buyers at mill door, at mill store or mill siding or railway station, or to buyers on buyer's premises at Albany, Rockingham and Spearwood—the appropri-ate price as specified in the First Schedule to this Order to this Order.

Provided that except for sales ex mill door these prices shall apply only for sales in truck lots of six long tons;

- (c) when sold for delivery and delivered in less than truck lots of six long tons at any than truck lots of six long tons at any railway station or siding other than the mill siding in bags or other containers of approximately 150 lb. weight—the appro-priate mill siding price as specified in the First Schedule to this Order plus rail freight chargeable for the transportation of the flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal from the mill siding nearest to the purchaser's railway station or siding;
- (d) when sold for loading on ship at Fremantle or Geraldton and for delivery at any North-Western port in bags or other con-tainers of approximately 150 lb. weight— the price at Fremantle or Geraldton as the case may be in accordance with the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order for delivering of Fremewite or Gera Order for deliveries at Fremantle or Geraldton (as the case may be), plus loading charges actually incurred at Fremautle or Geraldton as the case may be, plus freight payable on the cousignment;
- (e) when sold for delivery in lots of less than one short ton-the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order, plus-
 - (i) a margin at the rate of 10s. per short ton for sales of lots of less than 1 short ton but of not less than 1 half ton;
 - (ii) a margin at the rate of 15s, per short ton for sales of lots of less than 1 half short ton.
- (f) When sold for delivery in the class or kind of containers specified in the First Column of the Second Schedule to this Order, the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order, plus the margin thereon at the rate specified opposite each such class or kind of container respectively in the Second, Third or Fourth Columns of the Second Schedule to this Order.

Provided that the prices specified in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be subject to 5s. per short ton discount for cash.

Wholesale Sales-other than by Millers.

5. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal may be sold by wholesale, other than by a miller to be—

- (a) for quantities of one short ton or more-the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (b) for quantities of less than one short ton the price paid or payable for such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal by the wholesaler seller plus transportation charges (if any) actually incurred by the wholesale seller in placing such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal in the wholesale seller's store, plus the margins specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.

Sales by Retail.

6. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which plain flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) In places South of the 26th parallel of South latitude-
 - (i) for sales in bags—the price paid or payable for such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal by the retail seller plus transportation charges (if any) actually incurred by the retail seller in placing such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal in the retail seller's store plus the margin specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order;
 - the margin specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order;
 (ii) for sales in quantities less than 25 lb.—the prices specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.
- (b) In places North of the 26th parallel of South latitude-
 - (i) for sales in bags—the price paid or payable for such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal by the retail seller in placing such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal in the retail seller's store plus the margins specified for the respective areas in the Fifth Schedule to this Order;
 - (ii) for sales in quantities less than 25 lb.—the prices specified for the respective areas in the Fifth Schedule to this Order.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a maximum price is fixed by notice in writing to any person in relation to any flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which such flour, whole wheatmeal and standard wheatmeal may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948. Prices Control Order No. 179.

Floor Coverings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 179.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 85 is hereby revoked.

Application.

3. Nothing in this Order shall apply to plain and marbled feltex, teprac, feloura, bisonia, underfelt and other similar felt products manufactured by Felt & Textiles of Anstralia Limited.

Definitions.

4. In this Order, nuless the contrary intention appears-

- "foor coverings" means floor coverings of all descriptions whatsoever (other than of rubber), including carpets, linoleums and substitutes, floor rugs, runners, floor mats and matting, felt and paper nuder bases;
- "cost" means-

(a) in relation to floor coverings imported by the seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Anstralia—the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount, together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3% per cent. of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and % of one per cent., respectively), duty

and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the West Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods.

(b) in relation to floor coverings not imported by the seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia the purchase price paid or payable for that floor covering after deduction of any trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount, plus packing charges and cartage actually incurred, and the cost in transporting (if any), such floor coverings from the point of delivery to the seller's premises and attributable to such floor coverings and recorded on an invoice delivered in relation thereto.

For the purpose of this subparagraph, "cost in transporting" means freight charges, provided that where more than one freight service operates, the lowest freight rate only shall be allowed.

Maximum Wholesale Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which floor coverings specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Order may be sold by any person by whole-sale to be the sum of—

- (i) the cost of that floor covering;
- (ii) $12\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of such cost.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which floor coverings specified in the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by wholesale to be the sum of....

- (i) the cost of that floor covering;
- (ii) 15 per centum of such cost.

Maximum Retail Prices.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which floor coverings specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by retail to be the sum of—

- (a) the cost of such goods;
- (b) sales tax paid or payable;
- (c) (i) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, or floor coverings purchased by the retail seller at a manufacturer's price—35 per centum of (a) and (b); or
 - (ii) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a wholesaler---30 per centum of (a) and (b).

8. I fix and declare the maximum price at which floor coverings specified in the Second Schedule t_0 this Order may be sold by any person by retail to be the sum of—

- (a) the cost of such goods;
- (b) sales tax paid or payable;
- (c) (i) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, or floor coverings purchased by the retail seller at a manufacturer's price—40 per centum of (a) and (b); or
 - (ii) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a wholesaler-33 per centum of (a) and (b).

- (b) sales tax paid or payable;
- (c) (i) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, or floor coverings purchased by the retail seller at a manufacturer's price-42½ per centum of (a) and (b); or
 - (ii) in respect of floor coverings purchased by the retail seller from a wholesaler-33¹/₃ per centum of (a) and (b).

Application for Maximum Prices in Certain Cases.

10. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where any person has purchased any floor coverings from a seller by retail outside the Commonwealth of Australia, that person shall not sell such floor coverings unless and until he has made a written request to the Commissioner to fix the maximum price in respect of such floor coverings, and the Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

11. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail any goods, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by subparagraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods and as to be properly associated with such goods.

Discounts.

12. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a seller of floor coverings by wholesale or by retail has customarily allowed any difference in price—

- (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
- (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of floor coverings; or
- (c) in respect of sales of floor coverings under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment,

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of those floor coverings shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons or of such quantities or under such conditions or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which floor coverings specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

The First Schedule.

Linoleum of a higher grade than "C" grade.

The Second Schedule.

Linoleum and linoleum substitutes of all grades other than those specified in the First Schedule to this Order, felt and paper under bases.

The Third Schedule.

All floor coverings covered by this Order other than those specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Order.

Prices Control Order No. 180.

Bran, Pollard, Ground Wheat, Branato, Pollato and Flaky Bran.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:-

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 180.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 39, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 58, is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears-

- "short ton" means 2,000 lb.;
- "long ton" means 2,240 lb.;

"bushel" means 20 lb.;

- "North-West port" means any port in Western Australia North of the 26th parallel of South latitude:
- "wholesale", means in relation to bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran, that such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran is sold to the purchaser for the purposes of resale, and "wholesale" shall also be deemed to apply to sales to users who purchase at each delivery a total of not less than one short ton;
- "retail" means in relation to bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;
- "for cash" means in relation to any sale that payment is made as follows:---
 - (a) Where the purchaser's premises are within 20 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store—within seven days of delivery; or
 (b) where the purchaser's premises are be-
 - (b) where the purchaser's premises are beyond 20 miles and within 100 miles of the flour mill or the seller's store within 10 days of delivery; or
 - within 10 days of delivery; or
 (c) where the purchaser's premises are more than 100 miles from the flour mill or the seller's store—within 14 days of delivery; or
 (d) where the buyer's premises are situated
 - (d) where the buyer's premises are situated North of Carnarvon—by the first postal mail following the receipt of the goods;
- goods; "Shark Bay area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Shark Bay;
- "Carnarvon area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Carnarvon;
- "Broome area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Broome;
- "Onslow area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Onslow;
- "Port Hedland area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Port Hedland;
- "Roebourne area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of 10 miles from the principal post office at Roebourne;

- "Derby area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Derby:
- "'Yampi area'' means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Yampi;
- "Wyndham area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Wyndham;
- "Marble Bar area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Marble Bar;
- "Nullagine area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of 20 miles from the principal post office at Nullagine;
- "Wittenoom Gorge area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Wittenoom Gorge;
- "Noonkaubah area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Noonkanbah;
- "Fitzroy Crossing area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Fitzroy Crossing;
- "Halls Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Halls Creek;
- "Turkey Creek area" means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Turkey Creek.

Sales by Millers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran, pollard, flaky bran, ground wheat, branato and pollato may be sold by wholesale by millers to be-

- (a) delivered at mill door, ex mill store, or at mill siding-
 - (i) in respect of bran or pollard—£10 2s.
 9d. per short ton;
 - (ii) in respect of flaky bran—£10 12s. 9d. per short ton;
 - (iii) in respect of ground wheat, branato or pollato—£13 19s. 9d. per short ton;
- (b) delivered in truck lots of six long tons at any railway station or siding other than the mill siding—
 - (i) in respect of bran or pollard—the appropriate price per short ton specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order;
 - (ii) in respect of flaky bran—the appropriate price per short ton specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order for bran or pollard, plus 10s. per short ton;
 - (iii) in respect of ground wheat, branato, or pollato—the ppropriate price per short ton specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order;
- (c) delivered in less than truck lots of six long tons at any railway station or siding other than the mill siding—the maximum price specified in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, plus the rail freight chargeable for the transport of the bran, pollard, flaky bran, ground wheat, branato or pollato, as the case may be, from the mill siding nearest to the purchaser's railway station or siding;

- - (i) In respect of bran or pollard—£10 2s.
 9d. per short ton; in respect of flaky bran—£10 12s. 9d. per short ton; in respect of ground wheat, branato or pollato—£13 19s. 9d. per short ton.
 - (ii) Cost of cartage from rail to wharf actually incurred but not exceeding 5s. per short ton.
 - (iii) Wharfage, loading and other charges actually incurred at port of shipment, and
 - (iv) sea freight payable on the consignment:

Provided that where such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran is sold in quantities of not less than six long tons, the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be subject to a reduction of 5s. per short ton for cash.

Other than Wholesale Rates.

5. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran may be sold by wholesale other than by a miller to be the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of subparagraphs (a) or (b) of paragraph 4, as the case may be, for the sale of those goods by wholesale by a miller, plus the following margins:—

- (a) For delivery ex store or on rails, or otherwise except to purchaser's premises—10s. per short ton.
- (b) For delivery to the purchaser's premises-15s. per short ton.
- (c) In places North of the 26th parallel of South latitude—the price at Fremantle or Geraldton, as the case may be, in accordance with the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order for sales at Fremantle or Geraldton (as the case may be), plus transportation and loading charges actually incurred by the wholesale seller in delivering such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran to the purchaser, plus margin at the rate of 15s. per short ton.

Sales by Retail.

6. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran may be sold by retail to be---

- (a) in places South of the 26th parallel of South latitude—the price paid or payable for such bran or pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran, by the retail seller, plus transportation charges actually incurred by the retail seller, but not exceeding 5s. per ton, in placing such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran in the retail seller's store, plus the margins specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (b) in places North of the 26th parallel of Sonth latitude—the price paid or payable for such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran by the retail seller, plus transportation charges actually incurred in placing such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran in the retail seller's store, plus the margins specified in the Third Schedule of this Order.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a maximum price is fixed by notice in writing to any person in relation to any bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran, the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which such bran, pollard, ground wheat, branato, pollato or flaky bran may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
