PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 187.
Hessian and Liverpool Twill Cloth.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 187.
2. Prices Control Order No. 23 is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph 3 thereof the definition of "landed cost" and inserting in its stead the following:—

"landed cost" means in relation to the sale of any hessian or Liverpool twill cloth by any person, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount, together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3¼ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and ⅓ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods).

Prices Control Order No. 188.

Retail Prices of Groceries.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 188.

2. Prices Control Order No. 158 is hereby amended—

(a) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the maximum prices appearing in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of such Schedule opposite the items specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order, and inserting in their stead the maximum prices specified in relation to the said items in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of the lastmentioned Schedule;

(b) by omitting from the Schedule thereto the items specified in the first column and the prices for such items specified in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of the Second Schedule to this Order;

(c) by inserting at the end of the Schedule thereto the items specified in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order, and the maximum prices for such items specified in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth columns of such lastmentioned Schedule.

(a) in relation to the sale of any hand tools imported by the seller from a source outside Australia, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of $3\frac{3}{4}$ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and $\frac{3}{8}$ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods);

(b) in relation to the sale of any hand tools not imported by the seller from a source outside Australia—the purchase price paid or payable for those hand tools after deduction of any trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount, plus packing charges and cartage actually incurred, and the cost in transporting (if any) such hand tools from the point of delivery to the seller's premises and attributable to such hand tools and recorded on an invoice delivered in relation thereto.

For the purpose of this subparagraph—

"cost in transporting" means freight charges, provided that where more than one freight service operates, the lowest freight rate only shall be allowed.

(a) the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of $3\frac{3}{4}$ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and $\frac{3}{8}$ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store, or from wharf to bond, of such goods);

(b) five per centum of (a).

"landed cost" means in relation to the sale by retail of imported mattresses and bedding, by any person, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of $3\frac{3}{4}$ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and $\frac{3}{8}$ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods).

Meat Meal and Bone Meal.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 192.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 98 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“prevailing price” means, in relation to the sale of any meat meal or bone meal by any person, the price at which that person sold meat meal or bone meal of that class or kind on the 20th day of May, 1949, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no such sale was made by that person on that date upon substantially the same terms and conditions, then the last preceding date upon which such a sale was made by that person upon substantially the same terms and conditions;

“cost into store of the seller by retail” means the price paid or payable for the meat meal or bone meal plus the cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to conveying the meal from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller’s store.

Maximum Wholesale Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meatmeal or bone meal may be sold by any person by wholesale to be the prevailing price.

Maximum Retail Price.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat meal or bone meal may be sold by any person by retail to be the sum of—

- (a) the purchase price paid or payable by the seller by retail;
- (b) the cost of transporting the meat meal or bone meal from the point of delivery to the seller by retail to that retail seller’s store;
- (c) the margin specified in the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost into store of the seller by retail and the quantity sold.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any meat meal or bone meal specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

- (a) in relation to kitchenware imported by the seller from a source outside Australia, the aggregate of—the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount together with inland carriage, outside packing, London Office or forwarding agents’ commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3¼ per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and 3/8ths of one per centum respectively) duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, customs entry and customs agents’ charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods).

- (b) in relation to kitchenware not imported by the seller from a source outside Australia—the purchase price paid or payable for that kitchenware after deduction of any trade discount but before deduction of any cash discount, plus packing charges and cartage actually incurred, and the cost in transporting (if any), such kitchenware from the point of delivery to the seller’s premises and attributable to such kitchenware and recorded on an invoice delivered in relation thereto. For the purpose of this subparagraph “cost in transporting” means, freight charges, provided that where more than one freight service operates the lowest freight rate only shall be allowed.
