WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Bunbury Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been resumed for a street or way within the Municipality of Bunbury, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, between the hours of 12 noon and 3 o'clock in the morning on each and every day for a period of 12 months as from 1st January, 1950.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of the Southern Ocean bounded by lines starting from the Eastern extremity of the Twelve Mile Reef, situate about 10 miles Easterly from Hopton, and extending Northerly, to an indication post situate on the high water mark of the said ocean; thence Easterly about five chains along the said mark to a second post; thence Southerly, to the Western extremity of the Thirteen Mile Reef; and thence West-erly, to the starting point. (Plan 432/80.)

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1065/49.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor-in-Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower

the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.  
Fremantle District.  
Reticulation Area No. 21.

A pumping station comprising a reinforced concrete sub-structure with brick and tile superstructure, an 8¼-inch diameter reinforced concrete rising main, 15-inch, 9-inch and 6-inch diameter sewers, with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith between South Street and "B" Street, Fifth Avenue and "A" Street, as shown in green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7352.

This Order-in-Council shall take effect from the 30th day of December, 1949.

HOSPITALS ACT, 1927-1948.

Big Bell Hospital Board—Resolution.

P.H.D. 228/41. Ex. Co. No. 2842.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1948, a Board may itself establish and manage a Medical Fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or similar benefits; and may, by by-laws, provide for the regulation and control of such Fund; and whereas a Medical Fund has been established by the Board of Management of the Big Bell Hospital: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1948, does hereby amend the by-laws for the regulation and control of the said Medical Fund published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th July, 1941, in the manner set forth in the schedule hereunder.

The abovementioned by-laws are amended as follows:—

By-law 2 is amended by inserting before the word "The" occurring in line 1 the letter (a), and inserting a new paragraph (b) as follows:—

(b) No subscription shall be deemed necessary during the period a subscriber has been certified as unfit for work by the Medical Officer of the Fund, provided that such period does not exceed a maximum of six months.

##### Regulations Restricting the Use of Electricity in an Emergency.

1. When and as often as an emergency arises, the following shall apply:—
  - (a) No person shall consume or cause to be consumed, use, or cause to be used any electricity supplied from the Commission's main generating station at East Perth, by or through any supply authority, for the following purposes, and between the following hours:—
    - (i) Radiators.—For the purpose of supplying electrical energy to any radiators, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., from Monday to Friday of each week, except any radiators used for industrial or commercial process work, or any radiator used in a registered private or public hospital for the use of patients.
    - (ii) Lighting.—Business or commercial premises or any shop, or for the purpose of lighting more than one-third of the lighting points in any one room or place containing three or more lighting points, or more than a total of one-third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of the total lighting points in any electrical installation, or more than one-third ( $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of the total wattage of any electrical installation, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., from Monday to Friday of each week:
 

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to any room or place where manufacturing processes are in operation.
    - (iii) Neon lights for advertising and for display purposes, or for the purpose of energising neon signs which are used for advertising or display purposes, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9.30 p.m. each day, from Monday to Friday of each week.
    - (iv) Shop windows, shop fronts, display windows, show cases, or for any external advertising or decorative sign, or for the purpose of lighting any form of electric lighting, such as a filament, neon fluorescent, or other gaseous lighting in any shop window, shop front, display window, or show case, or for any advertising or decorative sign, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 9.30 each day, from Monday to Friday of each week.
    - (v) Entrance Lights, Safety Lights, Watchmen's Lights.—For the purpose of lighting any entrance light, safety light, or watchmen's light, or any isolated place, at any time except that one light only may be used for each such purpose, and each lamp so used shall not exceed 60 watts.
  - (b) For the purposes of this regulation, an emergency shall be deemed to arise when any of the following events happen:—
    - (i) If through any mechanical or electrical defect, breakdown of machinery, or lack of coal supplies or other fuel, or any cause whatsoever, the Commission is unable to maintain a sufficient supply of electricity from the Commission's main generating station at East Perth, or by or through any supply authority to meet the requirements of all or any of its consumers.
    - (ii) On any prosecution under this regulation, the certificate of the Chairman that any of the events mentioned in paragraph (b) (i) have happened shall be evidence of the matter stated, unless the contrary is proved.
    - (iii) When and as often as an emergency arises, the Chairman shall notify the public by inserting a notice to that effect in a daily newspaper circulating throughout the State of Western Australia.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Delete regulation 23 and insert in lieu thereof the following as regulation 23:—

23. (1) On the 31st day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifty, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, the Returning Officer shall prepare separate electoral rolls for each of the following classes of persons, namely:—

- (a) Co-operative companies.
- (b) Manufacturers, other than co-operative companies.
- (c) Producers; and
- (d) Dealers.

The electoral rolls so prepared as aforesaid for such classes of persons, subject to such additions, amendments, or corrections thereof as the Returning Officer may deem necessary, shall be the electoral rolls to be used in connection with any election required to be held in connection with the appointment of a member.

(2) All persons whose names appear on the electoral rolls prepared by the Returning Officer in January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, for the aforesaid classes of persons shall be included, subject to these regulations without re-enrolling, in the respective electoral rolls to be prepared by the Returning Officer in accordance with paragraph (1) of this regulation.

2. Delete regulation 24 and insert in lieu thereof the following as regulation 24:—

24. (1) The said rolls, when prepared, shall be signed on each page or sheet thereof by the Returning Officer, and when so signed shall be the electoral rolls, subject to any additions, amendments, or corrections as the Returning Officer may have made or make, for use at the elections which may be subsequently held under the Act and these regulations.

(2) The signature of the Returning Officer shall be conclusive as to the correctness thereof save and except that the Returning Officer may add to or remove from any roll the name of any person which has been omitted from or inserted in such roll by error, or the name of any person who is no longer qualified to be enrolled thereon.

3. Delete regulation 26 and insert in lieu thereof the following as regulation 26:—

26. (1) Any person desiring to have his name enrolled on an electoral roll shall make application to the Returning Officer, in writing, in accordance with Form 16, 17 or 18 (as the case may require) in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Applications for enrolment shall be addressed to the Returning Officer and may be sent to or delivered at the address of the Returning Officer as advertised as aforesaid.

(3) On receipt of an application for enrolment on the electoral roll therein specified as provided for in subparagraph (1) hereof, the Returning Officer shall forthwith note the date and time of receipt of such application thereon and amend such electoral roll by adding thereto the name of the person applying for enrolment, and such other particulars in connection therewith as the Returning Officer may deem necessary.

(4) Where any application for enrolment is sent by post, but the postage thereon is wholly unpaid or insufficiently prepaid thereon, the Returning Officer shall refuse to accept such application, and the application shall be deemed not to have been sent or delivered to the Returning Officer.
