PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 199.

Dry Cleaning.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 199.

Revocation.

2. Commonwealth Prices Regulation Order No. 912, published in the *Commonwealth Government Gazette* on 26th day of January, 1943, as amended by Commonwealth Prices Regulation Order No. 1418, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on the 27th day of January, 1944, is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“dry cleaning” includes dry cleaning, wet cleaning, spotting, rain spotting and pressing.

Maximum Rates—Dry Cleaning.

4. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of dry cleaning any type of garment or apparel specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order to be the rate specified in the second column of such Schedule opposite each such type of garment or apparel.

Records to be Kept.

5. Every person, and every agent of such person, who supplies any service of dry cleaning, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or under the

provisions of this Order, shall keep a record of each such service supplied containing the following particulars:—

- (a) Name and address of the person to whom the service is supplied.
- (b) Number and description of garments or apparel.
- (c) Nature of the service, and
- (d) Rate charged for each garment or item of apparel for such service.

Exhibition of Maximum Rates.

6. Every person, and every agent of such person, who supplies or offers to supply any service of dry cleaning, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the maximum rate fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply of each such service, and such notice shall be in the form of the Schedule to this Order. Such notice or notices shall be exhibited in such a place or places in his place of business and shall be prepared in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating conducting any business at such place of business.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any service of dry cleaning specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 196.

Female Hairdressing Rates.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantine Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 196.

Maximum Rates.

2. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the services specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be supplied by any person to be those rates specified in the second column of the said Schedule opposite each such service.

Exhibition of Hairdressing Rates.

3. Every person who supplies any of the services set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the maximum rates fixed by or under this Order for the supply by him of each such service for which a maximum rate is fixed, in the form approved by the Commissioner. Any such notice shall be deemed to be in a form approved by the Commissioner if it otherwise conforms to Regulation 49 of the Regulations.

Variation of Maximum Rates.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which any of the services set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order and specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Prices Control Order No. 197.

Copper Bars, Blocks, Ingots and Pigs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 197.

Revocation.

2. The Commonwealth Prices Regulation Orders specified hereunder, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on the date referred to in each case, are hereby revoked.

- No. 694, the 22nd day of May, 1942, as amended by—
- No. 2187, the 9th day of August, 1945;
- No. 2569, the 13th day of June, 1946, and
- No. 2971, the 27th day of May, 1947.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“prevailing margin” means, in relation to copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs, the margin for any particular quality, quantity, or shape, or in respect of any particular term or condition of sale, that existed between the price of £140 per ton and the particular vendor's selling price on 31st December, 1948, of copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs, of that particular quality, quantity, or shape, or sold under that particular term or condition of sale.

Maximum Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs may be sold by any person to be £170 per ton, plus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on 31st December, 1948, was greater than £140 per ton or minus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on the aforesaid date was less than £140 per ton, as the case may be.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 198.

Scrap Copper.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 198.

Revocation.

2. The Commonwealth Prices Regulation Orders specified hereunder, published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on the date referred to in each case, are hereby revoked:—

- No. 854, the 2nd day of November, 1942, as amended by—
- No. 2166, the 30th day of May, 1947, and
- No. 3146, the 5th day of November, 1947.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which scrap copper may be sold by any person to be £150 per ton.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which scrap copper specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
