PROBATE (NON-CONTENTIOUS COSTS) RULES, 1949.

The Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Albert Asher Wolff, the Honourable James Leonard Walker, and the Honourable Lawrence Walter Jackson, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1949, and in the Administration Act, 1903-1949, and of every other power them in this behalf enabling, make the following rules which shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

1. These rules may be cited as The Probate (Non-contentious Costs) Rules, 1949.

2. The charges set forth in the First Schedule hereto may be paid and allowed out of the estate of any deceased person for professional services rendered by any practitioner in connection with performing such of the services detailed in the Second Schedule hereto as shall be requisite in the case in connection with the grant of or resealing in Western Australia of Probate or Letters of Administration (with or without the Will) or an Order to administer where no contention has arisen, and except as otherwise hereinafter provided in this order, no further costs in respect of such services shall be allowed as a charge against the estate.

3. In addition to the charges mentioned in the First Schedule, there shall be paid and allowed for the cost of engrossing and collating any Will and making any copy required by the Registrar for the purpose of being recorded, and one certified copy (if required) the sum of 2s. 6d. a folio for every folio of the Will in excess of the first five.

4. In addition to the aforesaid charges, the charges set out in the Third Schedule hereto may be paid and allowed out of the estate (as an increment to the scale set forth in the First Schedule hereto) if the Probate, Letters of Administration, Order to administer or re-sealing is obtained by a practitioner who has no office in the City of Perth and employs a practitioner in Perth as his agent to obtain such Probate, Letters of Administration, Order or re-sealing.

5. The charges set forth in the First and Third Schedules hereto do not include disbursements necessarily made, nor any costs of and incidental to the preparation, passing and satisfaction of requisitions (including the obtaining, submission and lodging of valuations and vouchers, and attendances in connection therewith or arising out of any question or dispute as to duties) in connection with the statement of assets and liabilities required under the Administration Act, 1903-1943, or under the Estate Duty Assessment Act, 1914-1942, of the Commonwealth, and the payment of any duties assessed under either or both of such Acts.

6. Any additional charges which the practitioner may be entitled to make and be paid for services in connection with any of the matters mentioned in or covered by all or any of the preceding paragraphs and not included in the Second Schedule hereto shall be in accordance with the scale laid down in Appendix N to the Rules of the Supreme Court as varied from time to time, and any bill of costs in respect of such additional charges prepared in accordance with the scale laid down in such Appendix as varied from time to time may be taxed if required by the executor or administrator or by the Master, and in such event the Rules and Practice of the Supreme Court for the time being in force relating to the taxation of bills of costs shall apply, so far as practicable, to bills of costs presented for taxation pursuant to this paragraph.

Engrossing and collating Foreign Grant and Will (where the Will does not exceed five folios and the first five folios where the Will does exceed five folios) for registration on re-sealing, and one certified copy (if required).

Preparing the motion for Probate, Administration Order to Administer, or Re-sealing.

Attendance at the Court—

- (a) to file the Motion, Will and Affidavits;
 (b) to ascertain grant made;
 (c) to ascertain and pay duty and fees, and to uplift Grant and Certificate.

Preparing notice to creditors and copies and attendances to have same settled and advertised.

General Order.

THE LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1948.

WE, the Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Albert Asher Wolff, the Honourable James Leonard Walker, and the Honourable Lawrence Walter Jackson, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, and we the undersigned, being a majority of the Members of the Barristers Board constituted and appointed under the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1948, do hereby order as follows:—

1. That the following remuneration shall be allowed to legal practitioners for the items of business hereinafter mentioned, in lieu of the remuneration heretofore allowed in respect of such items of business.

Instructions.

(Note.—The item “Instructions” includes the initial attendance when instructions are taken and all work done in or towards completion of the transaction, except such work as is specifically covered by the ensuing items. When a transaction is not completed, such proportion of the fee for instructions shall be allowed as is reasonable in the circumstances.)

- (a) For instructions to act for—
- (i) a purchaser on a sale or other disposition for valuable consideration of real and/or personal property;
 - (ii) settlor or trustees, or both, on a settlement of real and/or personal property;
 - (iii) donor or donee, or both, on a gift of real property, chattels, real or mixed realty and personalty—

(b) For instructions to act for a mortgagee, grantee, or chargee on a mortgage, bill of sale, hire purchase agreement, charge, or other security over real and/or personal property—a sum calculated on the amount secured at the same rates as are provided in paragraph (a) hereof:

Provided—

- (i) in computing the amount secured there shall be excluded that portion thereof which is secured by any already existing collateral security prepared by the same legal practitioner after the date of the commencement of this order and within one year prior to the instructions;
- (ii) in the case of a security for an annuity the advance shall be deemed to be the total amount of the annuity to be paid if for a fixed term up to a maximum of twelve times the annual rate, or twelve times the annual rate if terminable on a life.
- (c) For instructions to act for a lessor on a lease of real and/or personal property—a sum calculated at the following rates:—

And provided further that the maximum rent on which the allowance shall be calculated shall not exceed twelve times the annual rent.

(d) For instructions to act for a vendor, mortgagor, grantor, hirer, chargor or lessee in a matter covered by paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) hereof, one-half of the amount therein allowable to the other party's solicitor, as the case may be. Where the same legal practitioner acts for both parties, he shall be allowed both charges.

(e) In other cases not covered by (a), (b), (c) or (d) above, a charge may be made for instructions as may be reasonable having regard to the skill and responsibility involved, the value of the property in question, the complexity of the transaction, and other circumstances of the case.
