# PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948.

Notice-Declaration No. 32.

Whale meat meal, namely, meal processed, manufac-tured or derived from the flesh, offal, bone or any part of the whale. Wheat, ground. Yeast Liquors and Tobacco. Ale, beer, lager, stout, porter and any mixtures thereof, or any mixtures thereof with aerated waters. Tobacco, manufactured. Cigarettes. Fuel and Ice. Briquettes. Charcoal. Coal, Coke. Firewood. Mallee roots. Ice. Fibres, Yarns, Threads and Fabrics. Blind, Holland. Canvas and duck. Carpet fabric. Cotton, artificial silk and silk threads used for domestic and manufacturing purposes, but not including cot-ton, artificial silk and silk threads used for the purpose of hand crocheting, knitting and embroidery. Fabrics of all kinds, whether knitted, lockstitched or woven including waterproofed or rubberised fabrics, but not including:--(a) Alpaca, mohair, lame or tinsel;(b) fabrics containing lame or tinsel; (c) plastic fabries not woven or knitted. Felts of wool or hair. Fibres, natural or synthetic. Haircloth. Hand knitting wool. Jute and hession piecegoods. Linen, flax, hemp or ramie sewing threads and twists. Plastic piecegoods woven or knitted and plastic coated fabrics. Rubber thread. Tape, waterproof or textile strip. Velvets, velveteens, plushes.

- (g) women's, maids', and girls' hosiery, other than those of wool or containing wool;
