IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 76 of 1948.

Between The West Australian Hairdressers and Wig-makers' Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and Metropolitan Ladies Hairdressers' Industrial Union of Employers of W.A., Respondent.

WHEREAS an Industrial Dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court. Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Area.

This Award shall be limited to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from and including the 16th day of January, 1950, provided that any time after the expiration of twelve months, on the application of any person or party affected by its provisions the Court may alter, amend, or revise it in such a manner as the Court may deem fit.

3.—Definitions.

Two classes of labour only shall be employed in the industry, viz., seniors and apprentices.

(a) "Senior" means a worker who is in possession of a final certificate issued by the Court of Arbitration or who is registered under the provisions of the Hairdressers Registration Act, 1946.

(b) "Apprentice" shall mean a worker not less than fifteen years of age who is serving articles of apprenticeship, or who is employed in the industry with a view to becoming an apprentice.

(c) "Hairdresser" shall mean any person employed in ladies' hairdressing establishments performing the following work:—Head shaving, haircutting, hair removing, hair dressing, hair trimming, hair curling or waving, hair singeing, shampooing, wigmaking, hair working, hair dyeing, manicuring, face, neck or head massage, or other similar stimulative process or treatment of the hair, head, face or neck carried on, used, or employed in ladies' hairdressing salons, beauty parlours, or similar establishments, whether with or without the aid of any apparatus, appliance, preparation or substance.

(d) "Registered" shall mean any worker registered by the Hairdressers' Registration Board of Western Australia.

4.—Hours.

The hours of work shall not exceed forty (40) per week and shall be worked between 9.5 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on the first five days of the week and 9.5 a.m. and noon on Saturday.

A worker may, in order to complete the one operation in relation to any one customer on which he is engaged at the hour fixed for ceasing work, continue to work for a period not exceeding one (1) half-hour after the hour so fixed for ceasing work for that day.

Provided a worker continuing to work as aforesaid shall start work one (1) half-hour or such shorter period later than the usual starting time on the following working day.

5.—Overtime.

Overtime shall not be worked except as provided in clause 4.

6.—Meal Hours.

Every worker shall be entitled to one (1) hour for a meal between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

No worker shall work or be required to work so as to lose or be deprived of any meal time or part thereof, or work for longer than four and one-half (4½) hours without such a meal time.

7.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu thereof shall be observed as paid holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, and on these days no work shall be performed.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive week's leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

8.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages payable shall be as follows:—

Provided that a worker, notwithstanding that the term of apprenticeship shall have expired shall continue to receive the wages payable in the last year of apprenticeship until such worker is in possession of a Final Certificate issued by the Court of Arbitration.

(d) The wages payable to males engaged in ladies' hairdressing establishments shall be those prescribed in the Award covering male hairdressing establishments.

(e) No person carrying on the business of ladies' hairdresser shall let any chair or cubicle in his shop to any other person for the purpose of the business of a hairdresser.

(f) No employer shall employ any worker on a commission basis, or in any other manner than prescribed by this Award.

9.—Apprentices.

(a) The provisions of the Court's 1941 Standard Apprenticeship Regulations with the exception of the second paragraph of clause 31 are hereby embodied in and form part of this Award.

(b) The term of apprenticeship shall be five (5) years. A probationary period of three (3) months previous to being indentured shall be lawful; such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(c) Apprentices shall be instructed in their trade at their employer's place of business and/or the Hairdressing Department of the Perth Technical College and in no other place.

10.—Tools of Trade.

Seniors shall provide their own tools of trade which shall be kept in a workmanlike condition. Employers shall provide other workers with all tools of trade. Subject to fair wear and tear, worn tools shall be replaced. Lost or wilfully damaged tools shall be made good by the worker.

11.—Premiums.

No person shall directly or indirectly request or permit any other person to pay or give, or shall receive from any person, any premiums, bonus, consideration or payment for employing or teaching, or purporting to employ or teach such person, or any other person, any of the callings to which this Award applies.

12.—Proportion.

(a) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in the industry shall be in the proportion of one (1) to every one (1) senior hairdresser employed by him.

(b) Where the employer or any partner, or manager regularly works at the trade such persons shall be counted as senior hairdressers for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices to be allowed.

(c) Subject to the approval of the Apprenticeship Board appointed under the Apprenticeship Regulations, an apprentice in the fifth (5th) year may be counted as a senior for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices to be allowed.

13.—Engagement.

Employment shall be on a weekly basis and terminated by one (1) week's notice given by either party, provided that any worker may be summarily dismissed by his employer for misconduct or refusal to obey orders.

14.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be kept and entered up a book containing—

(a) the name of each worker;

- (b) the class of work performed;
- (c) the hours worked each day;
- (d) the wages paid to each worker;
- (e) the ages of apprentices.

Such book shall be open for inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union not more than once in each week during the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

15.—Uniforms.

In the event of a worker being required to wear a special uniform or costume, such special uniform or costume shall be provided by and laundered at the employer's expense provided an overall shall not be regarded as special uniform or costume. Employers shall provide apprentices with overalls but the laundering of such overalls shall be the responsibility of the worker.

16.—Sick Pay.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of 1/12th of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the services of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of, or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

17.—Preference to Unionists.

(a) In this clause the term "unionist" means a worker who is a member of the Union of Workers and the term "non-unionist" means a worker who is not a member of the union.

(b) Unionists shall be given preference of employment and an employer who employs a non-unionist commits a breach of this Award if during such employment there are unionists competent to do the work and available and ready to perform it.

(c) Unionists shall offer themselves for employment by members of the employers' union in preference to non-members and a unionist who seeks employment by a non-member commits a breach of this clause in seeking such employment while the labour requirements of the members of the employers' union remain unfilled.

(d) It shall not be a breach of this clause for an employer to continue to employ a non-unionist who was in his employ at the date of this Award but the employment of the non-unionist shall cease not later than twenty-one (21) days from such date unless in the meantime the worker becomes a unionist.

(e) If during the continuance of this Award the union, or the majority of the members of the union, shall be concerned in or take part in anything in the nature of a strike or the union by any device whatsoever hampers or restricts the admission of bona fide worker as a member, the benefit of this clause shall ipso facto cease and determine.

(f) If any employment subsist or continue to subsist in breach of this clause both the employer and the worker concerned shall be liable to a penalty for the breach.

18.—Staff Room.

The employer shall provide a suitable room or accommodation for workers in which to change and keep their clothes while on duty.

19.—Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award shall be kept in a conveniently conspicuous place in the staff room of the employer's premises.

20.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

21.—Registration.

No worker shall be employed in the industry as a hairdresser other than those registered by the Hairdressers Registration Board of Western Australia.

This Award shall be known as the Local Governing Bodies' (City of Perth—Senior Officers) Award.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the officers employed by the City of Perth who are engaged in the classifications described in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

4.—Area.

This award shall have effect over the area comprised within the boundaries of the City of Perth.

5.—Term.

The term of this award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof, subject to the right of any party to the award to apply to the Court for a review of the provisions of this award subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1948.

6.—Hours of Duty.

(a) (i) The hours of duty shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive; one hour shall be allowed for lunch which shall be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.; provided that this subclause shall not apply in special cases where different hours are stipulated.

(ii) Where an officer is required to attend at Committee or Council meetings by the Council such time of attendance shall be considered as part of his ordinary duties.

(b) Any officer supervising other employees of the Council shall work the same hours as the employees they supervise.

7.—Overtime.

(a) Officers may be required to perform public duty beyond the usual hours, whenever it is necessary to bring up arrears of work, or to meet any temporary pressure of business.

(b) Payment for overtime shall be at the discretion of the Council.

(c) Overtime if paid for shall be at the following rates:—

- (i) Time and a quarter for the first five hours of overtime during the Monday to Friday period in any week.
- (ii) Time and a half for overtime in excess of five hours during the Monday to Friday period.
- (iii) Time and a half for overtime worked on Saturday mornings.
- (iv) Double time for overtime worked on Saturday afternoons, Sundays and public holidays.

8.—Salaries.

(a) The minimum salaries payable under this Award shall be as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto.

(b) The annual increments set out in Schedule "A" shall take effect as from the 1st November in each year.

(c) All salaries shall be paid at least once a month.

(d) Provided that, subject to clauses 9 and 10 of this Award the Council may fix the commencing salary of an officer appointed to any position classified in the Schedule hereto at any amount within the salary range prescribed therein for such position.

9.—Transfer of Officers.

When an officer is transferred to a position carrying a higher classification, he shall suffer no reduction in salary, and shall be considered in the year of service in such higher position with a salary at least equal to or next above the salary he was in receipt of at the time of the transfer.

10.—Officers Acting in Higher Capacities.

When an officer is temporarily executing the whole of the duties of a position carrying a higher salary than that in which he is usually employed for a continuous term of three (3) calendar months or longer, he shall be paid during the whole time he is performing such duties at least the salary attached to such higher position for the year of service which will give him a salary next above that which he is receiving in the lower capacity.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any other officer under the control of the officer temporarily executing higher duties as specified above.

11.—Promotions.

In the event of the promotion of any officer whose conditions of service are regulated under the provisions of Award No. 131 of 1949 to any position classified under this Award, such officer shall be deemed to be in the year of service as set forth in the Schedule entitling him to the salary and classification next above the salary he was receiving prior to such promotion.

12.—Resignations or Dismissals.

Appointments under this Award shall be subject to three (3) months' notice on either side for officers with over three (3) years' service, and one (1) month's notice in other cases.

13.—Holidays.

All State Government holidays shall be observed and paid for, except in the case of those officers who are required to supervise workers working under other Awards, who shall be allowed such holidays as may be due to the workers under their control.

In addition to the foregoing, officers shall, after the completion of one year of service, be allowed three (3) weeks' annual leave, exclusive of intervening public holidays.

Officers may, with the approval of the Council, be permitted to allow their annual leave to accumulate up to and including a period not exceeding three (3) years.

In the event of any officer resigning his position, all holidays accrued shall be paid for.

14.—Sick Pay.

In the event of absence from duty on account of sickness, officers shall receive pay as follows, viz.:—

Over three years' service: Three months' full pay and three months' half pay in any one year.

Under three years' and over one year: Two months' full pay in any one year.

Under one year and over six months: One month's full pay in any one year.

All officers absent through sickness must report such absence forthwith, and, if absent for more than two (2) days at any time, must furnish satisfactory medical certificates as to the nature of the illness and the necessity for leave of absence.

For the purpose of this clause, "in any one year" shall mean from 1st November to the 31st October.

15.—Preservation of Existing Rates and Conditions.

No officer who, at the date of this Award, is in receipt of a salary, rate of pay, or other remuneration, or more holidays, and other benefits than are herein provided, shall have his pay, remuneration, holidays, or benefits reduced as a consequence of this Award.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Brickyard (House-brick) Award, 1949.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed in the manufacture of house bricks (except firebricks and tapers bricks) who are not eligible to join another industrial union.

4.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing from the beginning of the first pay period after the date of resumption of work in 1950.

6.—Contract of Service.

One day's notice on either side shall (with the exception of waste sand and bag boys, in whose case one week's notice shall be required) be necessary to terminate the engagement of all workers: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, for misconduct, or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

7.—Minimum Engagement.

Except as provided in Clause 8, any worker engaged under the terms of this Award shall be paid a minimum of three (3) hours' pay.

8.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

9.—Hours.

Except as otherwise provided in this Award, the following shall apply:—

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute the ordinary week's work.
- (b) The ordinary day's work shall not exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (c) The hours of work, except where shifts are worked shall be performed as follows:—Monday to Friday inclusive between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

Provided that, at the option of the employer, the forty (40) hours may be worked in five and a half (5½) days, in which case the number and spread of hours of work shall be on Monday to Friday inclusive as prescribed above, and on Saturday, shall not exceed four (4) hours to be worked between 7 a.m. and 12.15 p.m.

10.—Overtime.

(a) Except in the case of shift workers, work performed beyond the number of ordinary working hours in any day, or beyond forty (40) hours in any one week, or before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be deemed to be overtime.

(b) In the case of shift workers all work performed outside the rostered hours of duty shall be deemed to be overtime.

(c) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(d) Work performed on Sunday and on the holidays prescribed by clause 21 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Provided that this shall not apply to burners who shall only be paid at the rate of double time for work performed on the holidays prescribed by Clause 21 (a) hereof.

(e) Workers under the age of eighteen (18) years shall not, as far as practicable, be called upon to work between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m.

(f) As far as practicable when overtime is worked, any worker who is called upon to work such overtime shall not, as far as practicable, be called upon to work the class of work that is required to be done during the time that such overtime is worked.

(g) Notwithstanding anything contained herein—

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime and such worker shall work the overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) Any organisation party to this Award, and/or a worker or workers covered by this Award, shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or be concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with (i) above.
- (iii) The provisions of this sub-clause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

11.—Shift Work.

Where two (2) or more shifts in any one day are worked, the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement, the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

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13.—Mixed Functions.

(a) A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher rate than his usual rate of pay shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for the period that he is actually engaged upon such work.

(b) A worker called upon to do work carrying a lower rate than his usual rate of pay, for less than one half of a day, shall be paid for such work at his usual rate of pay.

14.—Piecework.

(a) An employer may make a contract with a drawer for payment by results by piecework.

(b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a drawer of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours at least the minimum time rate of pay recognised by custom for such week's work: Provided that, where a drawer works part of a full week at piecework rates and part at time rates, he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under such piecework rates, plus the proportionate amount which he is entitled to receive at time rates of pay recognised by custom for drawers.

(c) A drawer working under any system of payment by results shall receive at least the time rate of pay recognised by custom for drawers.

(d) In the event of any dispute regarding piecework rates occurring and remaining unsettled between the employer and the drawer, the employer or the Union may refer such dispute to the Board of Reference.

15.—Open Kiln Burners.

(a) Ten (10) hours shall constitute a night's work, starting at 7 p.m. and finishing at 6 a.m., one hour during that period being allowed for meals. Any time so worked shall not count in the week's work.

(b) All burners employed on full night shift shall be kept on until after the last complete feed on that night. Burners working on broken shifts shall be paid one (1) hour in addition to the actual time worked at the conclusion of the last feed.

(c) Not less than two (2) men shall be employed on kilns containing up to fifty-five thousand (55,000) bricks, when in full fire.

(d) On kilns containing over fifty-five thousand (55,000) bricks and up to seventy-five thousand (75,000) bricks when in full fire, not less than three (3) men shall be employed.

(e) On kilns containing over seventy-five thousand (75,000) bricks when in full fire, not less than four (4) men shall be employed.

(f) An ordinary burner shall not be allowed to work on one kiln for more than two (2) nights in one (1) week, such two (2) nights not to be consecutive.

(g) No burner shall be called upon to attend to more than one (1) full kiln per night, when steaming.

(h) Work performed on a Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half and on Saturday at the rate of time and a quarter. Such work shall be confined to work connected with burning only. Firewood shall only be unloaded when it is required for a kiln then burning.

(i) All firewood, stopping and daub required at night shall be provided in proximity to the kilns.

(j) When more than three (3) burners are employed at night, one shall be placed in charge and paid as head burner.

(k) It shall be optional for a worker to refuse to wheel up a checker after having been employed as a burner on the previous night.

16.—Hoffman Kiln Burners.

(a) Coal landings shall not be less than three (3) feet wide and shall be railed.

(b) The hours of burners shall not exceed one hundred and sixty-eight (168) in twenty-eight (28) consecutive days, and shall be rostered so as not to exceed forty-eight (48) in any one period of seven (7) consecutive days in the four weekly period.

(c) Burners performing work on Sunday shall be paid time and a half for such work and have one clear day off in each week.

(d) Where a head burner is employed he shall, when necessary, supervise the work of the other burners on other shifts. He shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per week extra, and this extra payment shall be regarded as payment for the extra work involved by such supervision.

(e) All workers employed oiling machinery in pressed brickyards shall be paid an additional half hour's pay per day at ordinary rates for performing such work.

(f) All waste and other material required for cleaning shall be supplied by the employer.

(g) Piecework rates for drawers shall be on truck or at stack.

(h) All work performed by burners on shifts other than day shift shall be paid for at the rate of five per cent. (5%) extra on the prescribed rate of pay.

17.—General.

(a) Except where rubber tyred vehicles are used plates or planks shall be provided for all wheelers wheeling into the kiln in all places except where the ground to be wheeled on is hard.

(b) Where a powder monkey has to break material for six (6) or more workers in a pressed yard, he shall have an assistant, who shall be paid at the labourer's rate of pay.

(c) It shall be optional on the part of the employer to provide oilskins.

(d) Hot water showers shall be provided for workers working in or about the kilns.

(e) The foregoing sub-clause (d) shall not be enforceable for the first twelve (12) months of the operation of this Award.

18.—Payment of Wages.

(a) All wages shall be paid on the job within twenty (20) minutes of the close of the day's work at least once a fortnight.

(b) When a worker is discharged, or leaves his employer legally, at or before the usual time, he shall be paid all wages due to him within one day of ceasing work.

19.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

20.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided, that subject to sub-clause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in sub-clause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

21.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to Clause 10, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Union Picnic Day (commencing 1947 to be held on same day as Building Trades Picnic Day), Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to sub-clause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

22.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing:—

- (a) The name of each worker to whom this award applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the hours worked each day by him;
- (d) the wages (and overtime, if any) paid to him;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union not more than once weekly, between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

23.—Posting of Award.

Notices relating to meetings in connection with the Union shall be allowed to be exhibited in each yard. A printed copy of the conditions of this Award shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in each yard.

24.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference consisting of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award, the functions of:—

- (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award, or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

I certify pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
