### PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Notice—Declaration No. 38.

I, ARTHUR VALENTINE RUTHERFORD ABBOTT, Attorney General and Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1949, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 14 of the said Act and the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, do hereby revoke Declaration No. 36 dated the 24th day of March, 1950, made under the said Act, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of March, 1950, in so far as it relates to the goods specified in the Schedule to this Declaration No. 38.

Prices Control Order No. 261.

Boot and Shoe Repairs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 261.

2. Prices Control Order No. 205 is hereby amended by omitting from the Schedule thereto the maximum rates appearing in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh columns of such schedule opposite the items specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, and inserting in their stead the maximum rates

specified in relation to the said items in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh columns of the lastmentioned Schedule.

Prices Control Order No. 262.

#### Leather.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 262.

2. Prices Control Order No. 49, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 239, is hereby further amended by omitting the Schedule thereto and inserting in its stead the Schedule to this Order:—

(New Schedule—The Schedule to Prices Control Order No. 49, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 239, and now by this Schedule further amended.)

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 264.

New Cornsacks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner under the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 264.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 82, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 119, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, and the Schedules thereto, "Wholesale Merchant" means, in relation to the sale of any new cornsacks, a person who has purchased those cornsacks from the Australian Wheat Board.

Maximum Prices—New Cornsacks for Use as Containers of Wheat or Barley.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new cornsacks for use as containers of wheat or barley may be sold to be 39s. 9d. per dozen, plus a margin at the rate specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

Maximum Prices—New Cornsacks for Use other than as Containers of Wheat or Barley.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new cornsacks for use other than as containers of wheat or barley may be sold to be 39s. 9d. per dozen, plus a margin at the rate specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any new cornsacks specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
