(4) Trailers and caravans, when drawn by a motor vehicle and having a greater width or height than such motor vehicle, and motor caravans, motor omnibuses and motor waggons shall be provided with two distinguishing lamps fitted at least two feet higher than the headlamps and exhibiting bright blue coloured lights in the direction that the vehicle is proceeding or is intended to proceed, so as to indicate that the vehicle is one as described aforesaid, such lights to be fastened one on each side of the vehicle so that the distance between the blue lights is as nearly as practicable the overall width of the vehicle. The lamps shall be so fixed as to show the width of such vehicle hereinbefore-mentioned and to give an unobstructed view of the lights to other users of the road.

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to that type of motor wagon commonly known as a utility truck.

Between West Australian Branch, Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Bantocks Ltd., W. O. Johnston & Sons, and others as per schedule attached, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Metropolitan Shop Butchers' Award" and shall replace clauses 17 to 24, both inclusive, and subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of Schedule I of Award No. 10 of 1939 as

amended by Orders No. 52 of 1943, 91 of 1945, 119 of 1945, 13 (64) of 1946, 60 (62) of 1947, 155 of 1948, and 306 of 1948.

## 2.—Arrangement.

This Award is arranged as follows:—

## 3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of 30 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

## 4.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of two (2) years, commencing from the 26th day of June, 1950.

## 5.—Copy of Award.

A copy of this Award under glass shall be kept by each employer in each shop, store or factory, in some position accessible to all workers.

Provided that where an apprentice is 21 years or over at the commencement of the fifth year he shall be paid the full basic wage, and that when an apprentice becomes 21 years in the course of his fifth year he shall be paid the basic wage for the period following his 21st birthday.

Provided further that the foregoing proviso shall not apply where the apprenticeship has been revived under the Re-establishment and Employment Act, 1945, and the apprentice is in receipt of the tradesmen's rate through Government supplementation.

## (d) Casual Workers—

Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of twenty per cent. (20%) in addition to the rates prescribed for the class of work performed.

## 7.—Mixed Functions.

A worker shall be paid the higher rate if engaged on a higher classification for more than three and a half (3½) hours per day for Monday to Friday, or two and a half (2½) hours on a Saturday, but if engaged on a higher classification for less than three and a half (3½) hours Monday to Friday, or two and a half (2½) hours on a Saturday, he shall then be entitled to payment at the higher rate only for the time so employed.

## 8.—Weekly Hands.

The employment shall be weekly and a week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate the engagement, or a week's wages paid in lieu of same; such notice may be given before 12 o'clock noon on any day. Provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent an employer summarily dismissing a worker for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

## 9.—Casual Workers.

Except as hereinafter stated any casual worker starting at any time during the day shall be paid full rate for that day, being for the purpose of this clause not less than seven (7) hours for any day Monday to Friday, or five (5) hours on a Saturday, and casual rates shall be paid unless the worker shall have been notified by the employer before 5 p.m. on the day of engagement that he is to be employed as a permanent hand, but in the event of any casual hand who has been engaged to start at an arranged starting time not reporting himself for duty at that time, he shall be paid only for the hours worked.

## 10.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer. An employer shall give at least four (4) weeks' notice to a worker of the date that he requires him to commence his annual leave.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(f) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

## 11.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (g) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only or less, unless he produces to the employer, if requested, a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

## 12.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall provide a time and wages record, to be kept where the worker or workers usually commence work, in which each worker shall enter his starting and finishing times each day and such entries shall be signed by the worker each day.

The employer shall keep a record showing—

- (a) the name of each worker;
- (b) the occupation of each worker;
- (c) the time worked by each worker;
- (d) the wages and overtime paid therefor.

Such records shall be open for inspection by the secretary of the Union, or such other person authorised in writing by the president of the Union, during working hours in any day, and the official making the inspection shall be entitled to take a copy of any entries in the time and wages record.

## 13.—First Aid.

Each employer shall keep at his shop, or factory, or at each, if more than one, a first aid equipment, containing the following:—

- 3 sterilised dressings for fingers.
- 3 sterilised dressings (assorted sizes, one for hand, one for feet and one large size).
- 1 tube or pot nng vitamin ata (V.P. 48).
- 6 assorted roller bandages.
- 2 ozs. iodine.
- 2 ozs. sal volatile.
- 1 triangular bandage.
- 1 reel adhesive tape, 2in.
- Eye drops and brush.
- 1 enamel or kidney dish, 8in.
- Medicine glass.
- A.P.C. tablets (24).

## 14.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 15.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the General Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

## 16.—Apprentices.

(1) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every four or fraction of four journeymen employed.

(2) Where an employer or manager usually and customarily works at the trade, he may be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of this clause.

(3) The period of apprenticeship shall be five years: Provided, however, that in the case of youths who have already had experience in the industry, this period may be reduced, with the consent of the Court, or by agreement with the Union, as to the allowance to be made out of the said period of five years for the experience previously gained in the industry.

(4) Apprentices may be taken to general butchering and smallgoods making. Where in any shop the operations of general butchering and smallgoods making are carried on by the employer, he shall undertake to teach both to the apprentices.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, if through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may, with the occurrence of the apprentice and his guardian, be suspended for a period agreed upon, or, if no such agreement be arrived at, may, with the consent of the Board of Reference, be cancelled by the employer.

This provision shall be deemed to be included in all contracts of apprenticeship now existing and also in all future contracts entered into.

## 17.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints, for the purpose of the Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, as prescribed by the regulations. There is assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

## 18.—Definitions.

“Shop” shall comprise retail butchers’ shops and the manufacture and/or delivery of smallgoods, and includes shops selling or handling fresh, chilled, or frozen meat in less quantities than a quarter of beef or a carcase of mutton, lamb, veal or pork.

“First shopman”—In every shop where one or more shopmen are employed one shall be classed as first shopman. Provided, however, that where a manager is employed who works in the shop, he shall be considered as first shopman.

“Smallgoodsman” shall mean one who actually performs the work of preparing, manufacturing, or making up from meat smallgoods, except sausages known as butchers’ sausages, but shall not mean or include the employer or the manager of any shop, or the member of any firm, and in shops where only one smallgoodsman is employed, he shall be classed as first smallgoodsman.

“Cutting cart hand” shall mean one who takes out meat in bulk and cuts and sells it from the cart or motor.

“Salter” shall mean one who is employed the greater portion of his time in salting and curing meat.

“General butcher” shall mean one employed cutting up meat, serving in shop, or doing rounds and cutting meat or general work of a butcher, or who is assisting in a smallgoods factory.

## 19.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week’s work. No working day shall consist of more than eight (8) hours and the working hours each day shall be consecutive with the exception that one (1) hour shall be allowed off for lunch on the days Monday to Friday.

(b) The starting and ceasing time shall be mutually arranged between the employer and the worker, in the absence of agreement the Registrar shall decide.

(c) Subject to clause 20, all work shall be performed within the limits of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 6.30 a.m. to 11.30 a.m. on Saturday, and no worker shall be on or shall be allowed on the premises before 7 a.m. Monday to Friday, or 6.30 a.m. on Saturday, or after 5.5 p.m. Monday to Friday, or 11.45 a.m. on Saturday. Provided that in departmental stores this subclause shall be deemed to have been complied with if any worker covered by this Award has ceased work and is not on that portion of the employer’s premises set aside for the preparation or retailing of meat.

(d) The hours of workers employed exclusively in smallgoods factories may be so arranged as to permit of longer hours being worked from Monday to Friday to permit of earlier cessation on Saturday.

## 20.—Overtime.

(1) Work shall not be allowed outside the limits of clause 19, except in cases of urgent necessity, for the purpose of—

- (a) supplying military hospitals, military camps, military depots, and shipping;
- (b) supplying State institutions whose contracts are open to public tender; and
- (c) a breakdown of the refrigerating plant, which necessitates the worker handling the meat contained in the chambers attached thereto;
- (d) placing the meat in the refrigerator, for a period not exceeding fifteen minutes.

(2) Overtime is permissible, within the limits set out in Clause 19: Provided that the Union is notified by the employer that he intends to work one or more of his workers overtime. Such notice need not be given when the overtime is worked to meet the case of the unforeseen absence of any worker owing to accident or sickness.

When notice is given by telephone or otherwise orally, it shall be confirmed by written notice to the Union within twenty-four (24) hours of overtime commencing.

The notice signifying intention to work overtime shall state the day or days upon which overtime is to be worked and the names of the men who will be working overtime.

(3) The rates of overtime for work done under this clause shall be:—For the first two hours, time and a half; thereafter double time. When a worker has left the premises and is recalled to work under this clause he shall be paid at least two hours at ordinary pro rata rates. Work performed on Sundays or holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time with a minimum payment of two (2) hours.

(4) In any establishment where it is necessary to attend to the refrigerator at times not within the ordinary hours, it shall be permissible for a worker to do so on terms arranged with the employer and approved by the secretary of the Union.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:—

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this sub-clause.

(6) When a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working after the usual finishing time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with a suitable meal or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof.

## 21. Holidays.

(a) The following days, or days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 20 hereof, be observed as close holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year’s Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Union Picnic Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) When Christmas Day falls on Saturday, Sunday or Monday and Boxing Day is observed on Monday or Tuesday, work may be done on Boxing Day from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer’s establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

## 22.—Adjustment of Rates.

In accordance with section 126 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, the basic wage prescribed in this Award shall, from time to time, automatically become increased or decreased so that it conforms to and is in parity with the basic wage as last determined by the Court: Provided that in the case of infirm or aged workers or apprentices, in respect to whom a lower basic wage may have been prescribed, such increase or decrease shall be pro rata to such lower rate of wage.

## 23.—Carters.

Carters of all classes in this section shall feed and water horses used at or in connection with the shop or shops where no groom is kept.

Provided that each carter shall perform the work in rotation, and, where only one is employed, he shall be entitled to each alternate holiday, Saturday afternoon and Sunday, off duty. Double time shall be allowed off duty during the week for all work done on Saturday afternoon, Sundays, and holidays under this clause or double pay for work so performed.

## 24.—Board and Lodging.

No employer shall board or lodge any of his workers, excepting members of his family, on his business premises.

## 25.—Travelling Expenses.

All reasonable travelling expenses incurred by any casual worker travelling to and from work shall be refunded by the employer; the same to apply to any worker sent from one shop to another.

26.—Managers.

This Award shall not apply to managers.

For the purpose of this clause a manager shall mean—

- (a) a person who attends to managerial duties who is in charge of the establishment, and/or who directs and supervises operations in connection with that shop, and who may do butchering work; and
- (b) who works under a written contract of service with his employer under which, in addition to any other provisions, he is entitled to a salary of eleven pounds (£11 Os. 0d.) per week and is also entitled to receive a month's notice before his services may be dispensed with, except in the case of misconduct.

A copy of the Agreement of Service shall be lodged with the Registrar. The employer and the manager shall be jointly responsible for the lodgment of the Agreement of Service with the Registrar.

27.—Tools of Trade and Clothing Allowance.

An allowance for tools of trade and clothing shall be made at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week to adult employees required on cutting and/or boning and one shilling (1s.) per week to all other adult employees. Apprentices shall be paid an allowance for clothing and tools as follows:—

28.—Delivery of Meat.

It shall be an offence against this Award for persons other than those covered by this Award to be permitted to deliver meat to householders. No apprentice shall be permitted to effect any delivery of meat to householders.

29.—Apprenticeship Regulations.

The Court's Standard Apprenticeship Regulations, 1941, shall form part of and be embodied in this Award, with the following exceptions:—

- 1. Regulation 37 (Lost Time).

A new paragraph (c) to be added to this clause:—

(c) An apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

- 2. Delete Regulation 40.

- 3. Re-number Regulations 41 to 46 inclusive so as to read 40 to 45 inclusive.

I certify pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, that the foregoing is a copy of the agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.
