#### Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. JAMES MITCHELL, Governor. [L.S.] By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

C.S.D. 106/47.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, that the Governor may by proclamation vary the trusts upon which moneys, securities for moneys (including lands) or goods are vested and may vest such moneys and securities (including lands) and goods and any part thereof in such person and for such charitable purposes as the Governor shall specify; and whereas by virtue of a proclamation made the 18th day of August one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, the lands described in the schedule hereto were vested in the Minister to be held upon the Trusts upon which they were held by the Ugly Men's Voluntary Workers' Association of Western Australia (Incorporated); and whereas the Minister now desires to vary the trust and to obtain authority to vest the moneys being the proceeds of the sale of such lands or any part thereof for charitable purposes as defined by the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that the trusts upon which the lands described in the schedule hereto are held by the Minister are hereby varied and that such lands are now vested in the Minister in trust for sale and that the moneys being the proceeds of the sale of the lands shall be vested for charitable purposes within the meaning of the Act.

## Health Act, 1911-1948. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 46 of the Health Act, 1911-1948, it is provided that a local anthority, in exercise of the powers conferred by Part III of the said Act, may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of different portions of its district defined for that purpose by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation, declare that the Goomalling Road Board, being the local health anthority for the Goomalling Health District, may make and levy rates of different amounts in respect of different portions of its district defined as follows:—

- (a) Goomalling and Jennachbbine Townsites.
- (b) The remainder of the Goomalling Road District as defined under the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948.

## The Fisheries Act, 1905-1949. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUS1 KALIA, TO WIT. JAMES MITCHELL, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

F.D. 2825/21, Ex. Co. 1612.

(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Anstralia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedules A, B and C hereto, for the term of 12 months from 28/7/50.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid, I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Anstralian waters described in Schedule D hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of Friday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Monday next following for the term of 12 months from 28/7/50.

(3) In pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Act aforesaid, I prohibit (a) the taking of all species of fish by means of nets, known as "pilchard nets" and "whiting nets," as defined in paragraphs (c) and (d), respectively, of the proclamation dated 24th October, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated 1st November, 1940, in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedule E hereto, from 1st October, 1950, to 31st March, 1951, both inclusive.

#### Schednles.

#### Schedule A.

The waters of Koombana Bay Sonth of a line drawn in a South-Easterly direction from the junction of the stone canseway and Bunbury jetty to a point marked by a post in Point McLeod, and the whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including its tributaries and its entrance channel from the sea) upwards to a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northernmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule B.

The whole of the waters of the Collie River and all its tributaries and all that portion of Leschenault Inlet lying within a radius of one-half mile of the Northernmost extremity of Bar Island.

#### Schedule C.

The whole of the coastal waters in the vicinity of Bunbury known as "Hungry Hollow," being those waters lying between the Westerly extensions of Clifton Street and Beach Road, in the Municipality of Bunbury, and within a distance measured rectangularly from the foreshore of one-half mile.

#### Schedule D.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northernmost end of Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the North-Eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from Turkey Point to the Northernmost end of the Turkey Point Channel, and thence to the North-Eastern corner of Leschenault Lot 1.

#### 2825/21, Ex. Co. No. 1612.

IN pursnance of the provisions of Section 19 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—That with respect to nets known as or called "meshing nets" for catching all species of marine fish, nets of 225 fathoms in length having meshes throughont of 24 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Koombana Bay and Leschenault Estuary, be lawful nets.

The paragraph (a) of the proclamation dated October 24, 1940 (published in the *Government Gazette*, November 1, 1940), is hereby revoked.

## Mandurah Road District.

### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. Governe [L.S.]

P.W. 675/50.

By His Excellency The Honourable Sir Jamea Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Dis-tinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes inter alia any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is thereby empowered, to declare by proclamation, to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas all that land, situate within the Mandurah Road District, more particularly described, defined and delineated in the schedule hereunder, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that laud situate within Mandurah Road District, more particularly described, defined and delineated in the schedule hereto, shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Mandurah" within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948.

#### Schedule.

#### Manduralı Townsite.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situate on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of lot 157 of Cockburn Sound Location 16, as shown on L.T.O. Plan 2086 and extending Easterly to and along the said boundary and onwards to the North-Eastern corner of lot 159; thence South-South-Westerly along the South-Eastern boundary of that lot onwards to the South-Eastern corner of lot 109 and again onwards to the South-Western side of Boundary Road; thence Westerly to the Easternmost corner of lot 72 as shown on L.T.O. Diagram 2680; thence South-Westerly along the South-Eastern boundary of that lot and ouwards to a point situate in pro-longation Easterly of the Southern boundary of Murray Location 58; thence Westerly to and along the Southern boundary of that location to the Western side of road No. 797; thence generally Northerly and Westerly along that side and that of Leighton Road to the latter's junction with Hall Street as shown on L.T.O. Plan 5651; thence West to the low-water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally Northerly and North-Easterly along that low water mark, across the entrance of Peel Inlet and continuing to the starting point. (Plan 380A/40, A1 and 2.)

## Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. JAMES MITCHELL, Governor. **FL.S.1** 

By His Excellency The Honourable Sir James Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Dis-tinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 3 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, that the said Act shall be in force only in such portions of the State as the Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare to be Districts for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the said Act shall be in force in that portion of the State which is comprised within the Collie Road District as constituted under and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and the district of the Municipal Council of Collie as constituted under and for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and that such portion of the State be proclaimed and declared to be a district within the meaning and for the purposes of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1941, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that portion of the State which is comprised within the Collie Road District as constituted under and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and the District of the Municipal Council of Collie as constituted under and for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, shall be and is hereby constituted a District within the meaning and for the purposes of the Abattoirs Act, 1909-1949, with the intent that the said lastmentioned Act shall have effect in such District and that such District may be known as or referred to as the Collie Abattoirs District.

The Land Act, 1933-1948. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 2943/50.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1948 it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 23110 for Recreation at Albany should be placed under the control of the Municipality of Albany as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Municipality of Albany as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid,

collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

#### The Land Act, 1933-1948. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 859/15.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1948 it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Conncil, without issning any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depastur-ing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserves 23111 and 23112 for Gravel at Maida Vale should be placed under the control of the Darling Range Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-men-tioned reserve under the control of the Darling Range Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof: for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case  $\pounds 5$  for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1149/48.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, provides that the Governor may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department) should be vested in Harold Johnston: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Harold Johnston and any persons appointed to act temporarily in his place, the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wages.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in the heads of departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily wage on water supply, sewerage and drainage works under the control of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department should be vested in various officers: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby further amends Schedule appended to the Order in Council gazetted on the 6th April, 1939, by the addition of the names of M. S. Lewis, R. C. Elliott, R. M. Hillman, E. Gervas, D. D. T. Montgomery, J. R. Le Mesurier and E. Clements, and of any person or persons appointed temporarily to act in place of such officer.

## Traffic Act, 1919-1949.

## Dandaragan Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 465/48.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Conncil, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1949, namely, that the Dandaragan Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

(1) Clause (b) of paragraph (vii) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting the passage of heavy or obstructive traffic over any specified road, either generally or during certain months of the year.

(2) Paragraph (xiv) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, imposing a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds or imprisonment not exceeding one month with or without hard labour for the breach of any by-law.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

## Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

#### W.C.B. 41/49.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act, to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas Cunning Smith & Mt. Lyell Farmers Fer-tilisers, Limited, of 133 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the said Act and as such is subject to the provisions of the said section 13 and, having made application in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the operation of the said section, has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act to pay compensation to all workers employed by it, and that it has deposited at the Treasurv securities, to wit, a fixed deposit receipt for five thousand pounds issued by the English, Scottish and Australian Bank, Limited, at Perth, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 13, doth hereby exempt Cunning Smith & Mount Lyell Farmers Fertilisers Limited of 133 St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, for a period expiring on the 30th June, 1952.
