## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 287.

## Tin.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 287.

## Revocation.

2. Commonwealth Prices Regulation Order No. 3147 published in the *Commonwealth Government Gazette* on the 5th day of November, 1947, is hereby revoked.

## Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Prevailing margin” means, with regard to tin metal, the margin for any particular quality, quantity or shape or in respect of any particular term or condition of sale that existed between the price of £710 per ton and the particular vendor's selling price on the 25th day of August, 1950, of tin metal of that particular quality, quantity or shape or sold under that particular term or condition of sale;

“tin” means virgin tin metal.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I hereby fix the maximum price at which tin may be sold by any person to be £800 per ton, plus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on 25th day of August, 1950, was greater than £710 per ton or minus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on the aforesaid date was less than £710 per ton as the case may be.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which tin specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person

Prices Control Order No. 288.

## Scrap Copper.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 288.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 198 is hereby revoked.

## Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which scrap copper may be sold by any person to be £185 per ton.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which scrap copper specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 289.

## Copper Bars, Blocks, Ingots and Pigs.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 289.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 263 is hereby revoked.

## Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“prevailing margin” means, in relation to copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs, the margin for any particular quality, quantity, or shape, or in respect of any particular term or condition of sale, that existed between the price of £140 per ton and the particular vendor's selling price on 31st December, 1948, of copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs of that particular quality, quantity or shape, or sold under that particular term or condition of sale.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs may be sold by any person to be £215 per ton, plus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on 31st December, 1948, was greater than £140 per ton or minus the prevailing margin where that person's selling price on the aforesaid date was less than £140 per ton, as the case may be.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which copper bars, blocks, ingots and pigs specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
