## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 297.

Meat.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 297.

2. Prices Control Order No. 283 is hereby amended by omitting from the Third Schedule thereto the following words and figures:—

## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 297.

Cooked Meats and Smallgoods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 298.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 272 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this order and the schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- (a) "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

- (b) "South-West Land Division" means the South-West Land Division as defined in the Land Act, 1933-1938, but not including the "Perth Metropolitan Area" as defined in this paragraph;

- (c) "beef sausages" means sausages manufactured from chopped beef, mutton, lamb, or veal, or any other mixture thereof.

Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale, delivered to retail seller's premises or free on rail or free on board, to be the prices specified in the second column of such schedule.

Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the schedule to this order may be sold by retail to be—

- (a) for sales in the Perth Metropolitan Area—the prices specified in the third column of such schedule;
- (b) for sales in the South-West Land Division the prices specified in the fourth column of such schedule;
- (c) for sales outside the Perth Metropolitan Area or the South-West Land Division the prices specified in the fifth column of such schedule.

Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every trader who sells or has for sale by retail, any of the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the schedule to this order, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this order for the sale by him of those goods.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this order, I declare the maximum price at which any cooked meats or smallgoods specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Prices Control Order No. 299.

## Scrap Lead.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantine Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following order:—

## Citation.

1. This order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 299.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 77 is hereby revoked.

## Definitions.

3. In this order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“battery” means a scrap lead acid type electric storage battery;

“scrap lead” means scrap lead other than pig lead and includes a battery as defined in this paragraph or parts thereof.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which scrap lead may be sold to be the price specified in the schedule to this order.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I declare the maximum price at which scrap lead specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
