PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 303.

Hand Knitted and Hand Crocheted Woollen Goods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 303.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“maker-up” means, in relation to the supply of any service of making up woollen goods, a person who makes up those goods from woollen yarn furnished to him by some other person for such purpose, whether or not any trimmings are supplied by that maker up;

“manufacturer” means, in relation to the sale of any woollen goods, a person who manufactures those goods from his own woollen yarn, and, where trimmings are used, that person’s own trimmings;

“trimmings” means, in relation to any woollen goods, any buttons, ribbons, linings, ornaments, fasteners, etc., but does not include sewing threads used for the purpose of joining together woollen goods, the components of which have been knitted or crocheted separately;

“woollen goods” means, any declared goods which have been hand knitted or hand crocheted from woollen yarn.

Maximum Rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any maker-up may supply the service of making up any

woollen goods to be the allowance per ounce specified in the First Schedule to this Order according to the ply or description of the woollen yarn used multiplied by the number of ounces of yarn contained in such goods, plus, in relation to any trimmings supplied by that person, the price paid or payable for such trimmings.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any woollen goods manufactured by any person, may be sold by that manufacturer to be:—

(a) In respect of sales by wholesale—the allowance per ounce specified in the Second Schedule to this Order according to the ply or description of the woollen yarn used, multiplied by the number of ounces of yarn contained in such goods, plus, in relation to any trimmings supplied by that person, the price paid or payable for such trimmings.

(b) In respect of sales by retail—the allowance per ounce specified in the Third Schedule to this order according to the ply or description of the woollen yarn used, multiplied by the number of ounces of yarn contained in such goods, plus, in relation to any trimmings supplied by that person, the price paid or payable for such trimmings.

Maximum Prices in Certain Cases.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which woollen goods may be sold by any person who has sold or supplied woollen yarn to a maker-up to be made up into such goods for that person to be the sum of—

(a) the allowance per ounce specified in the First Schedule to this Order according to the ply or description of the woollen yarn used multiplied by the number of ounces of yarn contained in such goods, plus, in relation to any trimmings supplied by that person, the price paid or payable for such trimmings;

- (b) the price paid or payable or the maximum wholesale selling price whichever is the lesser, of the woollen yarn used;
- (c) $33\frac{1}{3}$ per centum of (a) and (b).

Variation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any woollen goods, or the maximum rate at which the service of making up any woollen goods specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may respectively be sold or supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
