PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1949.

Prices Control Order No. 304.

Seed Potatoes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

- 1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 304.
 - Revocation.
 2. Prices Control Order No. 166 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "approved seed potatoes" means potatoes approved as suitable for seed by a duly authorised officer of the State Department of Agriculture;
 - "certified seed potatoes" means potatoes accepted by a duly authorised officer of the State Department of Agriculture, as certified seed potatoes;
 - "cost of transport" means cost of transport by rail (or, if rail transport is not available, any other service which is available), but does not include any cost of transport which is not recorded on an invoice delivered by the seller, or in the case of sales by retail, on an invoice delivered to the retail seller;
 - "'primary wholesaler' means any person who purchases seed potatoes from a grower, or the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board, or any person who sells seed potatoes on behalf of a grower or the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board;
 - "secondary wholesaler" means any person who purchases seed potatoes from a primary wholesaler for resale;
 - "seed potatoes" means potatoes sold under permit from the Western Australian Potato Marketing Board for use as seed potatoes;
 - "sale by retail" means a sale by retail of less than 112 lb. weight;

- "cost into store of the seller by retail" means the sum of the following:--
 - (a) The price paid or payable by the retail seller for the seed potatoes computed on the basis of the full weight of the seed potatoes, bag and any earth contained therein, and without any allowance for waste.
 - (b) Cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to conveying the potatoes from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller's store.

Sales by Growers.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the class or kind of seed potatoes specified in the first column of the schedule to this order may be sold by growers to be—
 - (a) where delivery is made at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises—the price. set out in the second column of the said schedule opposite each such class or kind;
 - (b) where delivery is made at the seller's premises —the price set out in the third column of the said schedule opposite each such class or kind;
 - (c) where delivery is made at any other point—the price set out in the third column of the said schedule opposite each such class or kind plus the cost actually incurred by the seller in transporting such seed potatoes from his premises to the point of delivery by him:

Provided that to the prices specified in this paragraph may be added an amount equivalent to any early digging or storage premium payable by the West Australian Potato Marketing Board upon ware potatoes at the time of sale of the seed potatoes.

Sale by Primary Wholesaler.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the class or kind of seed potatoes specified in the first column of the schedule to this order may be sold by a primary wholesaler to be the sum of—
 - (a) the price paid or payable by the primary wholesaler, or the maximum price fixed by paragraph 4 of this Order, whichever is the lesser;

- (b) cost of transporting the seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the primary wholesaler to the point of delivery by the primary wholesaler; and
- (c) margin at the rate of 15s. per ton.

Provided that where the purchase price is not paid by the purchaser within 30 days from the time of delivery of the seed potatoes by the primary wholesaler, the price fixed by this paragraph may be increased by 10s. per ton.

Sales by Secondary Wholesaler.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any class or kind of seed potatoes may be sold by a secondary wholesaler to be the sum of—
 - (a) the price paid or payable by the secondary wholesaler for the seed potatoes;
 - (b) cost of transport of the seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the secondary wholesaler to the point of delivery by the secondary wholesaler; and
 - (c) margin at the rate of 10s. per ton.

Provided that where the purchase price is not paid by the purchaser within 30 days from the time of delivery of the seed potatoes by the secondary wholesaler, the price fixed by this paragraph may be increased by 10s. per ton.

Sales by Retail.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail to be the cost into store of the seller by retailer plus 35 per centum thereof.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

8. Every person who sells or has for sale seed potatoes by retail shall exhibit a prices card setting forth his selling price in relation to each lot of such potatoes displayed so as to properly associate such price with the lot of potatoes to which that price applies.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any seed potatoes specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 305.

Potatoes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following order:—

Citation.

1. This order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 305.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 157 as amended by Prices Control Order No. 256 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "cost into store of the seller by retail" means the sum of the following:—
 - (a) The price paid or payable by the retail seller for the potatoes computed on the basis of the full weight of the potatoes, bag and any earth contained therein and without any allowance for waste;
 - (b) cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to conveying the potatoes from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller's store.
 - "cost of transport" means any cost of transport which is recorded on an invoice for the potatoes delivered to the retailer seller;
 - "potatoes" means potatoes other than seed potatoes sold under permit from the Western Australian Potato Market Board;
 - "Perth metropolitan area" means all that part of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, at Perth.

Sales by Growers.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by growers to be— $\,$
 - (a) delivered ex railway truck, Perth Metropolitan Area, £20 5s. per ton;
 - (b) for deliveries at places other than the Perth Metropolitan Area, Kalgoorlie, Boulder or Geraldton, £20 5s. per ton at grower's siding, plus the cost of transport actually incurred by the grower and properly attributable to conveying the potatoes from the grower's railway station or siding to the point of delivery to the purchaser;
 - (c) delivered ex railway truck at Kalgoorlie, Boulder or Geraldton, £21 15s. per ton.

Sales by Wholesale—Deliveries within Perth Metropolitan Area.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by wholesale by any person other than a grower for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the sum of—
 - (a) £20 5s. per ton or the purchase price paid or payable by the wholesale seller whichever is the lesser;
 - (b) margin at the rate of 25s. per ton:

Provided that, if the seller at the request of the purchaser delivers the potatoes from his store—

- (a) to a railway station or siding—the price fixed by the foregoing provisions may be increased by 5s. per ton;
- (b) to the premises of the purchaser—the price fixed by the foregoing provisions may be increased by 10s. per ton.

Sales by Wholesale—Deliveries outside Perth Metropolitan Area.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which potatoes may be sold for delivery other than in the Perth Metropolitan Area by wholesale by any person other than the grower to be the sum of—
 - (a) £20 5s. per ton or the purchase price paid or payable by the wholesale seller, whichever is the lesser;
 - (b) cost of transport actually incurred by such wholesale seller and properly attributable to conveying the potatoes by rail from the loading station to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises, and
 - (c) a margin of-
 - (i) for sales of truck lots where the purchase price is paid within 30 days of date of delivery, 10s. per ton; or
 - (ii) for sales of truck lots where the purchase price is not paid within 30 days of date of delivery, 15s. per ton; or
 - (iii) for sales of less than truck lots, 25s. per

Provided that if the seller at the request of the purchaser delivers the potatoes from his store to the premises of the purchaser, the prices fixed by the foregoing provisions may be increased by 10s. per ton.

Sales by Retail-Specified Quantities.

- 7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail to be-
 - (a) in respect of sales within the Perth Metropolitan Area of the quantities specified in the second schedule to this order—
 - (i) the price specified therein according to the the cost into store of the seller by retail set out in the first column of that schedule; or
 - (ii) the price specified for such quantities in the first schedule; whichever is the lesser;
 - (b) in respect of sales in any place other than the Perth Metropolitan Area of the quantities specified in the second schedule to this order the prices specified therein according to the cost into store of the seller by retail set out in the first column of that schedule.

Sales by Retail-Unspecified Quantities.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail in any quantity other than the quantities specified in the first and second schedules to this Order, to be a price which bears the same proportion to the maximum price fixed for 28 lb. of potatoes by the provisions of subparagraphs (a) or (b) of paragraph 7 of this order, as the quantity bears to 28 lb.

Sales by the Bag.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by wholesale by the bag to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this order for the sale of 149 lb. of potatoes or the maximum price so fixed for the sale of the potatoes actually contained in the bag, whichever is the lesser.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

10. Every person who sells or has for sale potatoes by retail shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth his selling price in relation to each lot of potatoes displayed by that person anywhere upon such place or places of business, in the following manner, that is to say by exhibiting a prices card specifying the selling price applicable to each lot of such potatoes, displayed so as to properly associate such price with the lot of potatoes to which that price applies

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I declare the maximum price at which any potatoes specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold for delivery by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.

Onions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 308.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 164 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

- 3. In this order and the schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of twelve miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

- "cost per cwt. into retailer's store" means the sum of the following—
 - (a) the price per cwt. paid or payable by the retail seller for the onions computed on the basis of the full weight of the onions and bag and without any allowance for wastage;
 - (b) cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to conveying the onions from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller's store;
- "cost of transport" means any cost of transport which is recorded on an invoice for the onions delivered to the seller;
- "Grade I onions" means sound onions of similar varietal characteristics, weighing from 2 to 6 oz. each, free from abnormal doubles, root growths, sprouts, dirt or other foreign matter and blemishes caused by disease, insect injury or sunburns and free of peeled onions;
- "Grade II onions" means onions of similar varietal characteristics, weighing from 2 to 6 oz. each and free from wet or dry rots, dirt or other foreign matter, including onions in which peeled onions and slight blemishes can be removed by the ordinary process of peeling without appreciable increase in waste over that which would occur if the onions were perfect;
- "Large onions" means onions of similar varietal characteristics which comply with the standard of Grade I except that the onions shall weigh over 6 oz. each;
- "Picklers" means sound onions complying with the standard of grade I and weighing less than 2 oz. each;
- "Out of grade onions" means onions which do not conform with Grade I or Grade II or large onions or picklers.

Sales by Growers.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions of the grade or kind set out in the first column of the first schedule to this order may be sold by the growers to be—
 - (a) where delivery is made at the grower's premises—the price specified in the second or third column of that schedule opposite each such grade or kind;
 - (b) where delivery is made to the purchaser's premises in the Perth Metropolitan Area—the price specified in the second or third column of that schedule opposite each such grade or kind, plus one shilling per cwt;
 - (c) where delivery is made at any place in the Perth Metropolitan Area other than the purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second or third column of that schedule opposite each such grade or kind plus one shilling per cwt. but less the cost of transporting such onions from the point of delivery to the purchaser to the purchaser's premises;
 - (d) where delivery is made outside the Perth Metropolitan Area at any place other than the grower's premises, the sum of
 - (i) the price specified in the second or third column of that schedule opposite each such grade or kind, and
 - (ii) the cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to transporting such onions from the grower's premises to the point of delivery to the purchaser.

Sales by Wholesale.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions of the grade or kind set out in the first column of the first schedule to this order may be sold by a wholesale seller other than a grower to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales in the Perth Metropolitan Area, the sum of—
 - the price specified in the second or third column of the first schedule to this order opposite each such grade or kind plus one shilling per cwt;

the price paid or payable plus the cost of transport, if any, actually incurred in and properly attributable to transporting such onions from the point of delivery to the wholesale seller to the wholesale seller's premises, whichever is the lesser.

- (ii) a margin at the rate of 2s. 3d. per ewt. if sold ex wholesale store or at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ewt. if delivered free on rail or at the rate of 2s. 9d. per ewt. if delivered to the purchaser's premises.
- (b) in respect of sales outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, the sum of—
 - (i) the price specified in the second or third column of the first schedule to this order opposite each such grade or kind or the price paid or payable, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) the cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to transporting the onions from the grower's premises to the wholesale seller's premises;
 - (iii) a margin at the rate of 2s. 3d. per cwt.;
 - (iv) the cost of transport, if any, incurred in and properly attributable to transporting the onions from the wholesaler seller's premises to the point of delivery to the purchaser.

Provided that where the wholesale seller buys in bags containing more than 56 lb. of onions and sells such onions in bags containing 56 lb. or less, the price fixed by the provisions of this paragraph may be increased by 3d. per cwt.

Sales by Retail.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by any person by retail to be-
 - (a) in respect of sales within the Perth Metropolitan Area—4d. per lb. or the price specified in the second column of the second schedule to this order according to the cost per cwt into retailer's store set out in the first column of that schedule, whichever is the lesser;
 - (b) in respect of sales in any place other than the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified in the second column of the second schedule to this order according to the cost per cwt. into retailer's store set out in the first column of that schedule.

General.

- 7. If any onions, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the provisions of this order, are sold in containers, such maximum price shall be deemed to be fixed for the sale of those onions together with such containers.
- 8. Onions contained in any one parcel of onions shall be deemed to comply with the standard of a grade specified if at least ninety-five per centum thereof by weight comply with that standard.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

9. Every person who sells or has for sale onions by retail shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth his selling price in relation to each lot of onions displayed by that person anywhere upon such place or places of business in the following manner,

that is to say by exhibiting a prices card specifying the selling price applicable to each lot of such onions displayed so as to properly associate such price with the lot of onions to which that price applies.

Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this order, I declare the maximum price at which any onions specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold for delivery by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.
