### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947, the Governor may by proclamation, whenever in the interests of the natives he thinks fit, declare any municipal district or town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the said area at Mount Lawley, more particularly described in the schedule hereto, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

### Schedule.

Prohibited Area, Mount Lawley.

All that area at Mount Lawley bounded by lines starting from the Western intersection of Walcott and Beaufort Streets, and extending North-Easterly along the North-Western side of the latter to its intersection with the North-Eastern side of First Avenue; thence South-Easterly along that side to its junction with the South-Eastern side of Farnley Street; thence South-Westerly along that side to its junction with the South-Western side of Walcott Street; and thence North-Westerly to the starting point.
