Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minincorporated insurance office approved by the Min-ister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for in-surance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all pay-ments to become due under such liability, the Gov-ernor may, by Order in Council, exempt such em-ployer from the operation of the said section 13: ernor may, by Order in Council, exempt such em-ployer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas McIlwraith McEacharn Limited of Scottish House, Phillimore Street, Fremantle, West-ern Australia, being an employer and as such sub-ject to the said section and having duly made application in accordance with the regulations made under the spid Act for exemption from the operaapplication in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act for exemption from the opera-tion of section 13 aforesaid, has proved to the satis-faction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the said Act as such employer and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit Commonwealth bonds for five thousands pounds, charged with all pay-ments to become due under its said liability: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the said Act doth hereby exempt McIlwraith McEacharn Limited aforesaid from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, for a period of two years commencing on 1912-1949, for a period of two years commencing on the 1st day of January, 1951.

THE Geraldton, Greenough, Northampton and Upper Chapman Vermin Boards, by virtue of sections 96 and 98 of the Vermin Act, 1919-1946, hereby order as follows:—

The owners and/or occupiers of all holdings, whether owned, rented or leased, within the whole of the Geraldton, Greenough, Northampton and Upper Chapman Vermin Districts, shall commence the work of suppressing and destroying rabbits on such holdings and on roads abounding or intersecting the same between the dates shown hereunder:—1st February, 1951, to 16th February, 1951 (inclusive).

The destruction must be done to the satisfaction of the Boards or their inspectors. Failure to comply with this order will lead to action being taken against all offenders.

Means to be adopted—Laying of poison baits in furrows, baits to contain any phosphoros or strychnine poisons, the breaking up of the burrows by ploughing or deep tyning and/or by fumigation. Trapping will not be recognised as an effective means of destroying or suppressing rabbits.

No employee shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a Medical Certificate unless the absence is for a period of three (3) days or more.

(e) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, sub-clause (b) hereof shall be deemed to have become operative as from the 1st day of January, 1950.
