### PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 504.

Firewood—Kalgoorlie-Boulder Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 504.

#### Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 355 is hereby revoked.

#### Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, "the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 10 miles from the principal Post Office at Kalgoorlie.

#### Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which firewood of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area to be—

- (a) where delivery is made at the purchaser's premises—the price specified therein; or
- (b) where delivery is not made at the purchaser's premises—the price specified in subparagraph (a) hereof, less 3d. per cwt. in each case.

#### Delivery of Invoices or Dockets.

5. Every person who sells firewood by retail in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area shall deliver with such firewood an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business.
- (b) The name and address of the purchaser of that firewood.
- (c) The date of sale of that firewood.
- (d) A description of the firewood sold.
- (e) The weight of the firewood sold.
- (f) The price per ton or per cwt. at which that firewood is sold.

#### Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area, firewood of any kind or variety, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in the form of a price list and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of that firewood.

#### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which firewood specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the Kalgoorlie-Boulder area by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Prices Control Order No. 505.

## Second-hand Woolpacks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 505.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 255 is hereby revoked.

## Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“second-hand” means in relation to the sale of any woolpack, that such woolpack has been used once as a container of wool, and is branded on one side only;

“wholesale merchant” means, in relation to the sale of any second-hand woolpack, a person who purchases a second-hand woolpack and who repairs and reconditions such second-hand woolpack and sells those goods by wholesale;

“retail trader” means, in relation to the sale of any second-hand woolpack, a person who purchases a repaired and reconditioned second-hand woolpack, and sells, or offers for sale those goods by retail.

## Maximum Prices—Unrepaired and Reconditioned Woolpacks.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand woolpack, which has not been repaired or reconditioned, to be 22s. each, delivered free on rail or free on board.

## Maximum Prices—Sales of Repaired Reconditioned Woolpacks.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand woolpack, which has been repaired and reconditioned, may be sold, delivered free on rail or free on board, to be—

- for sales by a wholesale merchant—25s. each;
- for sales by a retail trader—25s. 9d. each.

## Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which second-hand woolpacks specified in a notice in

pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Prices Control Order No. 506.

## Second-hand Bags and Sacks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 506.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 106, as amended by Prices Control Orders Nos. 121, 268, 300, 330 and 498, is hereby revoked.

## Definitions and Interpretations.

3. (i) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“cost of transport” means, in relation to any sale of second-hand bags or sacks, the cost of transport (if any) by rail or by boat incurred by the seller in transporting the goods from the point of delivery to him, to his store, and recorded on an invoice or docket delivered in relation thereto;

“the Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“once used” means, in relation to any sugar sack, wheat sack, barley sack or rice sack, a sack which has been only once previously used as a container for sugar, wheat, barley or rice, as the case may be, and has not been used for any other purpose;

“second-hand” means used;

“‘A’ licensee” means a person who was, prior to the 7th day of February, 1946, the holder of an “A” license issued pursuant to the Commonwealth Control of Second-hand Jute Goods Order dated 26th September, 1942, and published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* dated 9th October, 1942;

“‘B’ licensee” means a person who was, prior to the 7th day of February, 1946, the holder of a “B” license issued pursuant to the Commonwealth Control of Second-hand Jute Goods Order dated 26th September, 1942, and published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* dated 9th October, 1942;

(ii) Any bag or sack sold by any person, other than an “A” licensee, which when reconditioned would conform to any of the descriptions of bags or sacks specified in the Schedule, shall, for the purpose of this Order, be deemed to be of that description at the time of such sale.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand bag or sack of a description specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold to be—

- for sales by any person whose place of business is in the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified opposite that description of bag or sack in the Schedule to this Order;
- for sales by any person whose place of business is outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, the sum of—

- (i) the price paid or payable by that person for that bag or sack, or the maximum price specified in the fourth column of the Schedule to this Order for the sale of that description of bag or sack by an "A" licensee, whichever is the lesser;
- (ii) margin at the rate of 6d. per dozen; and
- (iii) cost of transport.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any second-hand bags or sacks specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Delivery of Invoices.

6. Every person who sells second-hand bags or sacks shall deliver with those goods an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

- (a) Date of sale.
- (b) Name of purchaser.
- (c) Address of purchaser.
- (d) Quantity of bags or sacks sold.
- (e) Full description of bags or sacks sold.
- (f) Price at which those goods are sold.

New Bran or Chaff Bags.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 507.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 315, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 331, is hereby revoked.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new bran or chaff bags may be sold to be 62s. per dozen, plus a margin at the rate specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which new bran or chaff bags specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 508.

Onions.

Sales by Retail.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 508.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 496, is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

"cost per cwt. into retailer's store" means the sum of the following—

(a) the price per cwt. paid or payable by the retail seller for the onions computed on the basis of the full weight of the onions and bag and without any allowance for wastage;

(b) cost of transport actually incurred in and properly attributable to conveying the onions from the point of delivery to the retail seller to that retail seller's store;

Provided that cost of transport shall not be allowed unless it is recorded on an invoice for the onions delivered to the seller;

"point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of onions, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges passed to the purchaser from the person from whom such onions were purchased;

in this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears, "onions" means onions grown in or outside Australia.

Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by any person by retail to be the price specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order according to the cost per cwt. into the retailer's store set out in the first column of that Schedule.

## Exhibition of Price Tickets.

5. Every person who sells or has for sale onions by retail shall exhibit a notice or notices setting forth this selling price in relation to each lot of onions displayed by that person in the following manner, that is to say, by exhibiting a prices card specifying the selling price applicable to each lot of such onions displayed so as properly to associate such price with the lot of onions to which that price applies.

## Variation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any onions specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.
