Prices Control Order No. 603.

Cartage Rates—Wheat, Oats, Other Grains or Cereals, Chaff, Potatoes and Superphosphate.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 603.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 314 is hereby revoked

Maximum Rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the service of transporting by road, including loading and unloading, any of the following goods, that is, wheat, oats, or other grain or cereals, or potatoes, chaff, superphosphate or other inorganic fertiliser, for the distances specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be supplied, to be the rates set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite each such distance. Provided that if the person to whom such service is supplied, assists or supplies, assistance in the loading of those goods, the maximum rates

fixed by the provisions of this paragraph shall be reduced by an amount calculated at the rate of 1s. per ton.

Back Loading.

- 4. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the service of transporting by road, superphosphate or other inorganic fertiliser as "back loading" for the distances specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be supplied to be the rates set out in the third column of the Schedule to this Order opposite each such distance.
- (b) For the purpose of this Order and the Schedule thereto, the expression "back loading" means in relation to the transporting by road superphophate or other inorganic fertiliser, that such transporting is on a return journey in a vehicle, the last delivery by which was of wheat, oats, or other grain or cereal, or potatoes or chaff, to within five miles of the place from which such fertiliser is so transported.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a maximum rate is fixed by notice in writing to any person in relation to any service of transporting by road, wheat, oats, or other grain or cereals, or potatoes, chaff, superphosphate or other inorganic fertilisers, the maximum rate for which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which such service may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 604.

Definition.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

Maximum Retail Prices.

- 3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any type or description of rubber garden hose specified in the first, second and third columns of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Perth Metropolitan Area—the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule;
 - (b) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated outside the Perth Metropolitan Area—the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule, plus one half-penny per foot.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

4. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail, rubber garden hose the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

Dry Cleaning.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 605.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 199, as amended by Prices Control Orders Nos. 242, 286, 306, 347 and 402, is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

"dry cleaning" includes dry cleaning, wet cleaning, spotting, rain spotting and pressing.

Maximum Rates—Dry Cleaning.

4. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of dry cleaning any type of garment or apparel specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order to be the rate specified in the second column of such Schedule opposite each such type of garment or apparel.

Records to be Kept.

5. Every person, and every agent of such person, who supplies any service of dry cleaning, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or

under the provisions of this Order, shall keep a record of each such service supplied containing the following particulars:—

- (a) Name and address of the person to whom the service is supplied.
- (b) Number and description of garments or apparel.
- (c) Nature of the service, and
- (d) rate charged for each garment or item of apparel for such service.

Exhibition of Maximum Rates.

6. Every person, and every agent of such person, who supplies or offers to supply any service of dry cleaning, a maximum rate for the supply of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the maximum rate fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply of each such service, and such notice shall be in the form of the Schedule to this Order. Such notice or notices shall be exhibited in such a place or places in his place of business and shall be prepared in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating conducting any business at such place of business.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

- 7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order—
 - (i) I declare the maximum rate at which any service of dry cleaning specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person;
 - (ii) where any notice in writing fixing any maximum rate for the service of dry cleaning was given in pursuance of any Order which was by virtue of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950, in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Order, that notice in writing shall be deemed to have been given under this Order and shall continue in full force and effect.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 607.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 516 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

Maximum Prices—Cement Tiles, Cement Ridgecaps, Cement Shell Ends, Cement Apex Pieces.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the types or descriptions of cement tiles, cement ridgecaps, cement shell ends and cement apex pieces specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order, and of the colours specified in the second column of that Schedule may be sold in the Perth Metropolitan Area by any person to be the price set out in the third column of the Schedule opposite to each such type or description and colour.

Maximum Rates—Supply of Cement Tiles, Cement Ridgecaps, Cement Shell Ends and Cement Apex Pieces, and the Fixing or Construction therefrom of Roofs.

5. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of supplying cement tiles, cement ridgecaps, cement shell ends and cement apex pieces of any of the colours specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order and from such cement tiles, cement ridgecaps, cement shell ends and cement apex pieces, fixing or constructing a roof for any building upon any building site situated within the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the rate specified in the second column of such Schedule opposite such colour set out in the first column of that Schedule. Provided that the rate so specified shall include the supply of all cement, battens, nails and wire used in the fixing or constructing of any roof.

Delivery of Invoices or Dockets.

- 6. Any person who sells any cement tiles, cement ridgecaps, cement shell ends or cement apex pieces shall deliver with the cement tiles, cement ridgecaps, cement shell ends or cement apex pieces an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—
 - (a) His name and place of business.
 - (b) The name and address of the purchaser of the goods.
 - (c) The date of sale of the goods.
 - (d) A full description and quantity of each item of goods sold.
 - (e) The price charged for each item of goods sold.
 - (f) The total amount charged for each item of goods sold.

Variation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice.

- 7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order—
 - (i) where in any notice in writing to any person in pursuance of this paragraph, a maximum price is fixed in relation to the sale of cement tiles, cement ridges, cement shell ends and cement apex pieces, or a maximum rate is fixed for the service of supplying cement tiles, cement ridges, cement shell ends and cement apex pieces, and from such cement tiles, cement ridges cement shell ends and cement apex pieces, the fixing or construction of roofs for buildings, I declare the maximum price at which such specified goods may be sold,

- or the maximum rate at which such specified service may be supplied, to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person;
- (ii) where any notice in writing fixing a maximum price or rate, for any of the goods or services covered by this Order was given in pursuance of any Order which was by virtue of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950, in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Order, that notice in writing shall be deemed to have been given under this Order and shall continue in full force and effect.
