PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950. Prices Control Order No. 612.

Furniture.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 612.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 515 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, the expression— $\!\!\!\!$

"furniture" means-

- furniture of all kinds and descriptions. domestic ice boxes and domestic ice chests;
- "cost," in relation to any furniture, means the amount paid or payable by the seller by retail for that furniture, plus any expenses actually incurred by that seller and recorded in his books of account for finishing, fitting, or completing the manufacture of the furniture, but not including any expenses incurred in the packing or transport of that furniture.

Application for Maximum Prices.

4. Any person who manufactures any article of furniture shall not sell that furniture unless and until that person has made a written request to the Prices Control Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which that furniture may be sold and the Prices Control Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

Maximum Retail Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any article of furniture may be sold by any person by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by retail of furniture by the manufacturer of such furniture, the price fixed by notice in writing to that manufacturer in pursuance of paragraph 4 of this Order;
- (b) in respect of sales by any person other than a manufacturer, the sum of—
 - (i) the cost to the retail seller of that furniture, or
 - an amount equal to the maximum price fixed in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order to the manufacturer of such furniture for sales other than by retail of that furniture in a finished, completely manufactured condition,

whichever is the lesser;

 (ii) Commonwealth Sales Tax paid or payable in respect of that furniture at a rate not in excess of 8¹/₃ per centum;

- (iii) an amount equal to $37\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of (i) and (ii);
- (iv) Commonwealth Sales Tax paid or payable in relation to that furniture at any rate in excess of 8^{1/3} per centum:
- (v) the amount for packing actually charged by the manufacturer to the retail seller;
- (vi) where the retail seller has incurred any costs in transporting such furniture_
 - (a) from from any place within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth, to premises of that retail seller outside that radius, or
 - (b) from any place within a radius of 5 miles from the principal post office of any place other than Perth, to premises of that retail seller outside that radius, or for insurance charges during transit as aforesaid_
 - an amount equal to the cost of transport and insurance so incurred.

Records to be Kept of Purchases.

6. Any person who sells or offers for sale by retail any article of furniture shall keep in relation

- (a) A serial entry number.(b) The name of the manufacturer from whom purchased. (c)
- The manufacturer's invoice number and date.
- (d) A full description of the article of furniture.
- (e) The purchase price paid or payable.
- (f) Sales tax, if any, charged thereon. (g) Any other costs, including finishing,
- (g) Any other costs, incruting polishing, etc.
 (h) The total cost.
 (i) Any other charges, cartage, freight, insurance, packing.
- (j) The maximum retail selling price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order.

Delivery of Invoices or Dockets.

7. Any person who sells any article of furniture shall supply an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:-

- (a) His name and place of business.(b) The name and address of the purchaser of that furniture.
- (c) The date of sale of that furniture.
- (d) A full description of the article sold.
 (e) The price charged for such article of furniture.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

8. Any person who sells or offers for sale by retail any article or suite of furniture shall attach retail any article of suite of furniture shall attach to that furniture for display in relation to that furniture, a ticket or label setting forth his retail selling price for that furniture, and the serial entry number as required to be recorded by that person pursuant to paragraph 6 of this Order. I hereby approve of the following form for the ticket or label reformed to in this neurograph.

ticket or label referred to in this paragraph:-

A separate price card of a minimum size of sin by 3in specifying the price of each such article or suite so as properly to associate such price with each article or suite of furniture and so as to be clearly legible by any person viewing or inspecting the furniture.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order-

(i) I declare the maximum price at which any article of furniture specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person;

(ii) where any notice in writing fixing the maximum price of any furniture was given in pursuance of any Order, which was by In pursuance of any Order, which was by virtue of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950 in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Order, that notice in writing shall be deemed to have been given under this Order and shall continue in full force and effect.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 613.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 348, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 360, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- "Albany" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Albany;
- 'Bunbury" bury" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Bunbury;
- "Busselton" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Busselton;
- "Esperance" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Esperance.
- "Geraldton" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Geraldton;
- "Mandurah" means all that area comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Mandurah;
- "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;
- "cutlet" means the de-scaled fiesh of a fish retaining a portion of the back-bone, and includes also the de-scaled fiesh of a fish from which all bones have \mathbf{not} been removed;
- "fillet" means the de-scaled fiesh of a fish from which the head and all bones have been removed;
- "fisherman" means any person licensed under the Fisheries Act, 1905-1940, of the State of Western Australia to catch fish.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Fishermen.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a fisherman for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of factor. opposite to each such variety of fish.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which (2) I have an declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a fisherman for delivery in Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Gerald-ton or Mandurah, to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish, less one penny per pound weight weight.

Maximum Wholesale Prices for Sales other than by Fishermen.

(1) I fix and declare the maximum price at b. (1) I HX and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery in Albany, Bunbury, Bus-selton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the price set out in the third column of that Schedule opposite to each such variety of fish, less one penny per pound weight. less one penny per pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale by a seller other than a fisherman for delivery outside the Perth Metro-politan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esper-ance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the sum of—

(a) the maximum price fixed by subparagraphs (1) or (2) of this paragraph, as the case may be, for the sale of that fish for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, whichever is nearest the point the fish were first brought to land;
(b) one paper pair and pair that a first and the first brought for land;

(b) one penny per pound weight of that fish.

Maximum Prices-Sales by Auction.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by auction to be the maximum price fixed by the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order.

Maximum Retail Prices. 7. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth or seventh columns respectively appearing to sixth or seventh columns respectively, opposite to each such variety of fish, according to whether the fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Albany, Bunbury, Bussel-ton, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be—

- (a) in the case of uncleaned or cleaned fish (other than in cutlets or in the form of fillets), the price set out in the fourth or fillets) are price set out in the fourth or fifth columns, respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, less one penny per pound weight;
- (b) in the case of cutlets of fish, the price set out in the sixth column opposite each such variety of fish, less one and one-half pence per pound weight;
- (c) in the case of fillets of fish, the price set out in the seventh column opposite each such variety of fish, less two pence per pound weight.

(3) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has been transported through the Perth Metro-politan Area may be sold by retail outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Esperance, Geraldton, or Mandurah, to be the sum of—

- (a) the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth or seventh columns respectively, opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third, or fourth columns of the Second Schedule, according to the distance by rail from the Perth Central Railway

Station to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business.

(4) I fix and declare the maximum price at which fish of any of the varieties specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order which has not been transported through the Perth Met-ropolitan Area may be sold by retail outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, Albany, Bunbury, Bus-selton, Esperance, Geraldton and Mandurah, to be the sum of the sum of-

- (a) the price set out in the fourth, fifth, sixth seventh columns respectively, of the or First Schedule to this Order opposite each such variety of fish, according to whether that fish is uncleaned or cleaned, or is in cutlets or in the form of fillets; and
- (b) the amount per pound set out in the second, third, or fourth columns of the Third Schedule to this Order, according to the distance by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the wholesale seller's place of business, to the railway station or siding nearest the retail seller's place of business is the retail seller's place of business. place of business.

Delivery of Invoices.

8. Every person who sells other than by retail any fish for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall deliver with that fish an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business.
- (b) Name and address of the purchaser of that fish.
- (c) The date of the sale of that fish.
- (d) The class of that fish, described according to the classes of fish specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (e) The total weight of each class of fish sold.
- (f) The price per pound at which the class of fish is sold.

Exhibition of Prices.

9. (1) Every person who sells, or has for sale, by retail, fish, shall exhibit in his place of busi-ness, or if he has more than one place of busi-ness, in each of his places of business, a notice setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) Retail selling prices of each lot or variety filleted or in cutlets, which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at such place or places of business; and
- (b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

(2) (a) The approved form for the safe of that lish. (2) (a) The approved form for the notice or notices in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price card or cards, specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and total price in relation to each such lot or variety of fish, whether cleaned, uncleaned, filleted or in cutlets, offered for sale as aforesaid, which properly asso-ciates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish of fish

(b) The approved form for the notice or notices in relation to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish shall be in such form as otherwise complies with regula-tion 49 of the Regulations.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 614.

Revocation.

 $2.\ Prices\ Control\ Order\ No.\ 526$ is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. (a) In this Order and the Schedules hereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- "Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;
- "Carnarvon area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Carnarvon;
- "Derby area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of six miles from the principal post office at Derby;
- "Onslow area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Onslow;
- "Port Hedland area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Port Hedland;
- "Roebourne area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 10 miles from the principal post office at Roebourne;
- "Marble Bar area" means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at Marble Bar;

(b) "Beef sausages" means sausages manufactured from chopped beef, mutton, lamb, or veal, or any other mixture thereof.

(c) "Nearest railway station" means the railway station or siding nearest to the retail seller's place of business, by the shortest railway route from the Perth Railway Station.

Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale, delivered to retail seller's premises or free on rail or free on board, to be the prices specified for those goods in the second column of such Schedule.

Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the first column of the Second and Third Schedules to this Order may be sold by retail in the areas specified herein to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Perth Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the second column of the Second Schedule;
- (b) in respect of sales by any person whose nearest railway station is situated at a distance not exceeding 150 miles from the Perth Railway Station, but excluding the Perth Metropolitan Area as defined in this Order, the price specified for those goods in the third column of the Second Schedule;
- (c) in respect of sales by any person whose nearest railway station is situated at a distance exceeding 150 miles, but not exceeding 250 miles, from the Perth Railway Station, the price specified for those goods in the fourth column of the Second Schedule;
- (d) in respect of sales by any person whose nearest railway station is situated South of the 26th parallel of South Latitude, and at a distance exceeding 250 miles from the Perth Railway Station, the price specified for those goods in the fifth column of the Second Schedule;

- (e) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Carnarvon area, the price specified for those goods in the second column of the Third Schedule;
- (f) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Onslow area, the price specified for those goods in the third column of the Third Schedule;
- (g) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Port Hedland area, the price specified for those goods in the third column of the Third Schedule;
- (h) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Roebourne area, the price specified for those goods in the third column of the Third Schedule;
- (i) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Marble Bar area, the price specified for those goods in the fourth column of the Third Schedule;
- (j) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated in the Derby area, the price specified for those goods in the fifth column of the Third Schedule;
- (k) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated North of the 26th parallel of South Latitude, but is not situated in any of the areas specified in subparagraphs (e) to (j) of this paragraph—the price specified for those goods in the sixth column of the Third Schedule.

Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every trader who sells or has for sale by retail any of the cooked meats or smallgoods specified in the Schedules to this Order, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those goods. [3 December, 1951.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this $\operatorname{Order}_{\longrightarrow}$

- (i) I declare the maximum price at which any cooked meats or smallgoods specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person;
- (ii) where any notice in writing fixing a maximum price for any of the goods covered by this Order was given in pursuance of any Order which was by virtue of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1950, in force immediately prior to the commencement of this Order, that notice in writing shall be deemed to have been given under this Order and shall continue in full force and effect.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 615.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 589 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedule thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

- (a) "goods specified" means any of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order;
- (b) "Kalgoorlie areas" means all those areas of Western Australia comprised within a radius of three miles from the principal post office at each of the following towns:—Kalgoorlie and Boulder;
- (c) "oz." means a fluid ounce or ounces, as the case may be;
- (d) (i) "small 5 oz. glass" means any glass or similar container, containing less than 5 oz.;
 - (ii) "5 oz. glass" means any glass or similar container, containing 5 oz. or more, but less than 8 oz.;
 - (iii) "8 oz. glass" means any glass or similar container, containing 8 oz. or more but less than 10 oz.;
 - (iv) "10 oz. glass or pot" means any glass or similar container, containing not less than 10 oz.;
 - (v) "bottle" means a reputed quart (26
 fiuid oz.);
 - (vi) "half-bottle" means a reputed pint (13
 fiuid oz.);

- (vii) "nip" means a bottle containing not less than $6\frac{3}{5}$ fluid oz.;
- (viii) "demi-nip" means a bottle, containing not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ fluid oz.;

Maximum Prices—Quantities Specified in

Schedule. 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any variety or quantity of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by retail in the Kalgorlie areas to be the price specified in that Schedule.

Quantities Not Specified.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person in quantities other than those specified in that Schedule, to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the next smaller quantity of such goods specified in that Schedule, or if there is no smaller quantity specified, then such price (calculated to the nearest downward halfpenny) as bears the same ratio to the maximum price fixed for the next higher measure or quantity as the quantity actually sold bears to the next higher quantity.

Sales in Dining-room or Lounge.

Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which any quantity of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person in any hotel dining-room or lounge in the Kalgoorlie areas to be the prices specified in the said Schedule, plus an amount equal to the difference between the hotel dining-room or lounge prices respectively charged by that person on 17th day of September, 1948, for any such goods, and the public bar prices charged by that person for such goods on such date: Provided that if in the case of any sale, by reason of the absence of records such difference between the hotel dining-room or lounge prices and the public bar prices on the 17th day of September, 1948, cannot be ascertained, the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply, and such sale shall be deemed to have been made in the public bar.

Exhibition of Maximum Prices.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail in the Kalgoorlie areas any goods, the maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in each of his bars, lounges, dining-rooms or other places at such place or places of business where such goods are sold or had for sale, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of such goods.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any goods, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which are specified in the notice given in pursuance of this paragraph, may be sold in the Kalgoorlie areas by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person.
