PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 625.

Cartage of Bricks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 625.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 608 is hereby revoked.

Maximum Rates.—Cartage of Bricks.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of transporting bricks by road including loading and unloading, to be—

- (a) in respect of any distance not exceeding 5 miles—£1 17s. 6d. per thousand bricks;
- (b) in respect of any distance exceeding 5 miles, the sum of—
 - (i) £1 17s. 6d. and
 - (ii) 2s. 3d. for each mile in excess of 5 miles, per thousand bricks.

Provided that—

- (a) where any period of waiting in excess of 30 minutes occurs to the vehicle and its driver from the time of arrival at the load-

ing point to the time of commencement of loading such period of waiting is not due to any mechanical defect, breakdown or accident to the vehicle or due to any delay, fault or negligence on the part of the driver of the vehicle, an amount may be added to the rate fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order in respect of such period of waiting in excess of 30 minutes, calculated at the rate per hour specified in the Schedule to this Order according to the type of vehicle used;

- (b) if it is impracticable or unsafe to operate the vehicle employed in such transport at or adjacent to the place of delivery owing to the condition of the roadways, streets, lanes or ground at or adjacent thereto, then in respect of any period of waiting in excess of 30 minutes resulting to the vehicle and driver while suitable tracks are being made at the requisite site by the person or his agent to whom the bricks are being delivered, an amount may be added to the rate fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order in respect of such period of waiting in excess of 30 minutes, calculated at the rate per hour specified in the Schedule, according to the type of vehicle used.

Variation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

4. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum rate at which the service of transporting bricks by road specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 626.

Sandstone.

The Laying and Construction from Sandstone of Foundations for Dwelling-houses.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 626.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 517 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, "cubic yard" means—

- (a) in relation to sales of sandstone, 27 cubic feet;
- (b) in relation to the laying or construction of foundations for dwelling-houses, 16 cubic feet.

Maximum Prices—Sandstone.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which sandstone may be sold by any person for delivery to any building site situated in any of the municipal districts or road board districts specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order to be the price set out in the second column of that Schedule opposite the name of such municipal district or road board district.

Maximum Rates—Supply of Sandstone and the Laying or Construction therefrom of Sandstone Foundations.

5. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply the service of supplying sandstone and from such sandstone laying or constructing foundations for dwelling-houses upon any building site situated in any of the municipal districts or road board districts specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order, to be the rate, according to the average height of stone, set out in the second or third or fourth column of that Schedule opposite the name of such municipal district or road board district.

Provided that the rate so specified shall include the supply of all sand and lime used in the laying or constructing of any foundation for any dwelling-house.

Variation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, where in any notice in writing to any person in pursuance of this paragraph a maximum

price is fixed in relation to the sale of sandstone, or a maximum rate is fixed for the supply of the service of supplying sandstone and from such sandstone the laying or construction of foundations for dwelling-houses, I declare the maximum price at which such specified goods may be sold, or the maximum rate at which such specified service may be supplied, to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1950.

Prices Control Order No. 627.

Motor Spirit.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 627.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 165, as amended by Prices Control Orders Nos. 357, 403 and 413, is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. "Prevailing price" means, in relation to the sale of motor spirit by any person by retail, the price at which that person sold motor spirit by retail on 17th September, 1948, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no such sale was made by that person on that date upon substantially the same terms and conditions, then the last preceding date upon which such sale was made by that person upon substantially the same terms and conditions.

Maximum Retail Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which motor spirit may be sold by any person by retail to be the prevailing price plus an amount calculated at the rate of 8d. (eight pence) per gallon.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any motor spirit specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 628.

Tallow.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 628.

Revocation.

2. Commonwealth Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 2955 and 2963, published in the *Commonwealth Government Gazette* on the 12th day of May, 1947, and the 20th day of May, 1947, respectively, are hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

"edible beef tallow" includes beef premier jus, beef dripping and edible beef oleo-stearine;

"edible mutton tallow" includes mutton premier jus, mutton dripping and edible mutton oleo-stearine;

"edible mixed tallow" means any edible animal fat or mixture of edible animal fats, but not including edible beef tallow, edible mutton tallow, butter, margarine or pure lard;

"Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth,

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which the kinds and grades of tallow specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold to be—

(a) in respect of sales in the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified in the Schedule to this Order plus the actual cost of the container;

(b) in respect of sales outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified in the Schedule to this Order plus the actual cost of the container—

(i) less, where the cost of transport from the place of manufacture to the Perth Metropolitan Area exceeds the cost of transport from the place of manufacture to the point of delivery, the amount of such excess; or

(ii) plus, where the cost of transport from the place of manufacture to the point of delivery exceeds the cost of transport from the place of manufacture to the Perth Metropolitan Area, the amount of such excess.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which tallow specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 629.

Clothing, Garments, Apparel and Drapery—Sales by Retail.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 629.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 511 is hereby revoked.
3. Nothing in this Order shall apply to—
 - (a) footwear;
 - (b) hessian and Liverpool twill cloth.

Definitions and Interpretation.

4. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—

“allowance for freight, packing and insurance” means in relation to the sale of any specified goods which have been purchased by a retail trader from a wholesaler or a manufacturer within the Commonwealth of Australia, the percentage of the cost of those goods as specified in the Second Schedule to this Order according to the point of delivery of those goods to the retail trader, and the situation of the retail trader's place of business;

“cost” means in relation to the sale of any specified goods by a retail trader—

- (a) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler or manufacturer within the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—

- (i) the purchase price paid or payable by the retail trader for those goods, after the deduction of any trade discount, but before the deduction of any cash discount, and
- (ii) sales tax thereon (if any);

“landed cost” means in respect of any specified goods purchased by a retail trader from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount together with inland carriage, outside packing, overseas office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3¼ per centum of the invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before the deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and ⅘ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission Levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store, or from wharf to bond, of such goods);

“G.P.O.” means General Post Office;

“P.O.” means Post Office;

“manufacturer” means a person who by his own labour or that of his employees, or by handing out the work to any other person, manufactures, or causes to be manufactured, any specified goods;

“point of delivery” means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods which have been purchased by a retail trader from a wholesaler or manufacturer within the Commonwealth of Australia, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying those specified goods to his store passed to that retail trader from the person from whom the retail trader purchased such goods;

“retail trader” means a person who purchases or imports any specified goods in a manufactured state and resells or offers for sale such goods by retail;

“specified goods” means clothing, garments, apparel and drapery including, without limiting the generality thereof, collars, handkerchiefs, scarves and ties, being declared goods;

“wholesaler” means a person who purchases or imports any specified goods in a manufactured state and resells such goods by wholesale;

the expression “nearest G.P.O.,” when used in relation to any point of delivery, or to any retail trader's place of business, shall be deemed to refer to the General Post Office at Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, Brisbane or Perth, or the Post Office, Launceston, whichever is the nearest in a straight line to such point of delivery or to such retail trader's place of business, as the case may be.

Maximum Retail Prices.

5. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order issued prior to this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any specified goods, other than those set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order, may be sold by a retail trader to be—

- (a) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler within the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—

- (i) the cost thereof;
- (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order; and
- (iii) allowance for freight, packing and insurance;

- (b) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from the manufacturer of those goods within the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—

- (i) the cost thereof;
- (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order; and
- (iii) allowance for freight, packing and insurance;

Provided that no allowance for freight, packing and insurance may be included in any maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph in any case where the point of delivery is within a radius of 50 miles from the retail trader's place of business;

- (c) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—

- (i) the landed cost thereof;
- (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order.

- (2) Where any maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order—

- (a) does not exceed 5s. and is not an exact number of halfpence—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward halfpenny;
- (b) exceeds 5s. and does not exceed 10s., and is not an exact number of pence—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward penny;
- (c) exceeds 10s. and does not exceed £1 and is not an even multiple of 3d.—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward 3d.;
- (d) exceeds £1 and is not an even multiple of 6d.—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward 6d.

Certain Hand Knitting Wools—Maximum Retail Prices.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which specified goods being hand knitting and mending wools of the types and descriptions specified in the First Column of the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by retail to be the price specified for that wool in the Second Column of that Schedule.

Discounts.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a retail trader who sells specified goods has customarily allowed any difference in price—

- (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
- (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of specified goods; or
- (c) in respect of sales of specified goods under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment.

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of those goods shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities, or under such conditions, or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Records to be kept of Purchases.

8. Every retail trader who sells or offers for sale specified goods shall keep, in respect of such goods and in addition to proper books and accounts required to be kept by him by law or for his own purposes, a book or books containing the following particulars:—

- (a) A full description of those goods.
- (b) The date of the delivery of those goods into his store.
- (c) The name and address of the person from whom he purchases those goods.
- (d) (i) In respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler or a manufacturer within the Commonwealth of Australia, the point of delivery and the cost of those goods; or

- (ii) in respect of specified goods imported by the retail trader from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia—the landed cost of those goods, and

(e) sales tax thereon (if any):

Provided that it shall be deemed to be sufficient compliance with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph if, at the time of such sale or offer for sale, the retail trader has in his possession or control an invoice or docket delivered to him in relation to such goods containing the particulars specified in subparagraphs (a), (c), (d) and (e) of this paragraph.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

9. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail any goods the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall attach to or display with those goods a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by subclause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any goods shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods, and as to be properly associated with such goods.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any of the goods covered by this Order and which are specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1951.

Prices Control Order No. 630.

Firewood—Perth Metropolitan Area.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, George Robert Marshall Garratt, Acting Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 630.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 404, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 440, is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

Maximum Wholesale Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which firewood of the descriptions specified in the First Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale for delivery in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the price specified therein.

Maximum Retail Prices.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which firewood of the descriptions specified in the Second Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) in respect of sales for delivery at the purchaser's premises—the price specified in that Schedule according to the quantity of firewood comprised in the sale;
- (b) in respect of other sales—the price so specified, less 3d. per cwt. in each case.

Delivery of Invoices or Dockets.

6. Every person who sells firewood by wholesale or by retail in the Perth Metropolitan Area shall deliver with that firewood an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) His name and place of business;
- (b) the name and address of the purchaser of that firewood;
- (c) the date of the sale of that firewood;
- (d) a description of the firewood sold;
- (e) the weight of the firewood sold;
- (f) the price per ton or per cwt. at which that firewood is sold.

Exhibition of Price List.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail any firewood, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place

of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of businesses, in the form of a price list and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of that firewood.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which firewood specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold in the Perth Metropolitan Area by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
