IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western

Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of three years as from and inclusive of February 18, 1952.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1949, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule

hereto for a period of three (3) years from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

All that portion of the Gascoyne River (near Carnarvon) lying South of a line drawn due East from the North-East extremity of Babbage Island and all that portion of Western Australian waters within a radius of one-half a mile of the South entrance to the Gascoyne River.

The waters of all creeks within a distance of five miles due North of the Carnarvon jetty and the waters of all creeks South of the Carnarvon jetty to the Southerly bank of Oyster Creek and all those portions of Western Australian waters within a radius of one-quarter-mile of the entrances to the aforesaid creeks.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, this 16th day of January, 1952, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Land Act, 1933-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 142/40.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other persons or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 22166 for Children's Playground at Lake Grace (Lot 40) should be placed under the control of the Lake Grace Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned reserve under the control of the Lake Grace Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Corr. No. 2185/50—That reserve No. 23214 should vest in and be held by the Kalamunda and Districts Travelling Infant Health Clinic in trust for the purpose of an Infant Health Clinic.

Corr. No. 1279/16—That reserve No. 23383 should vest in and be held by the Darling Range Road Board in trust for the purpose of a Civic Centre.

Corr. No. 15012/99—That reserve No. 7548 should vest in and be held by the Katanning Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned road boards in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of section 13 of the said Act and as such subject to the provisions of the said section 13, has duly, in accordance with the regulations made under the said Act, made application for exemption from the operation of section 13 aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its said liability under the said Act and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond for £5,000, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred

by the said Act, doth hereby exempt the said The National Bank of Australasia Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, for a period expiring on the 31st day of December, 1953.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902-1951.

Amendment of Regulations.

C.S.D. 362/51; Ex. Co. No. 125.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, acting pursuant to section 65 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902-1951, hereby amend the regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of September, 1934, and amended from time to time thereafter (reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments to the 5th day of October, 1951), and since further amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of November, 1951, and on the 14th day of December, 1951, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder:—

THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT,

IN pursuance of section 30 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, the Premium Rates Committee, having considered the basis formulated by the Workers' Compensation Board, has determined that the adjusted maximum premium rates to be charged for insurance in respect of all insurance risks under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1949, shall be as set out in Schedule A attached hereto. The Committee has further determined that the adjusted maximum premium rates enumerated hereunder shall be applicable to all new policies effected to operate as from and after the 1st day of January, 1952, or renewals due on or after that date, except such as have expired prior to the date of publication in the *Government Gazette* of this notice.

2. In the event of an insurer being required for the first time to insure workers whose employment does not fall within any existing classification, such insurer shall be entitled to charge such rates as it may deem reasonable upon consideration of the rates of the closest existing comparable classifications and all other available information, provided, however, that—

(a) any such rate shall be subject to review by the Premium Rates Committee; and

(b) such insurer shall, within seven days of accepting the risk, notify the Secretary of the Premium Rates Committee in writing of the facts, together with the rate charged and the reasons therefor.

3. Insurers are permitted to charge for any period not exceeding 12 months, a minimum premium of fifteen shillings (15s.) or the premium chargeable on a £25 wage sheet at the rate prescribed for the classification, whichever is the greater, with the exception of householders the minimum premium for which is 10 shillings.

PLANT DISEASES ACT, 1914-1950.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the provisions of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1950, has been pleased to amend, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, and amended from time to time thereafter.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 9 (*Government Gazette* 8/6/51) is amended—

- (i) by inserting after the word "plants" in line 2 the words "excepting seeds";
- (ii) by inserting after paragraph (s) a new paragraph (t) as follows:—
(t) flowers, for every thousand or part of a thousand in one consignment—1s.

2. Regulation 52 (*Government Gazette* 16/9/21) is amended by inserting after the definition of "orchard" a definition of "seed" as follows:—

"seed" means any part of the plant by which it is reproduced sexually and in case of seeds to which or to clusters of which any fruit or part thereof normally adheres, such fruit or part thereof so adhering shall be deemed to form part of the seed.
