Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941.

Capel-Boyanup Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 103/52.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1941, the Governor may by Order in Council, constitute any defined portion of the State a drainage district; specify the boundaries of such district; and assign a name to such district; and whereas under section 9, subsection (1) the Minister may exercise within any district all the powers and authorities except the power to borrow money, and shall have all the immunities conferred by this Act on a board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby constitute a drainage district, having the boundaries described in the schedule hereto, and assign the name of the Capel-Boyanup Drainage District thereto, and doth direct that the Minister shall exercise all the powers and authorities and have the immunities conferred by section 9, subsection (1).

Schedule.

Capel-Boyanup Drainage District.

All that portion of the land bounded by lines starting from the Westernmost corner of Stirling Estate Lot 213 and extending generally North-Easterly along the North-Western boundaries of lots 213, 225, 224, 223, 222, 221, 219 and 220 and onwards to the Western boundary of Wellington Location 47; thence Northerly along that boundary to the Southernmost corner of Stirling Estate Lot 198; thence generally North-Westerly and Easterly

along boundaries of that lot to the North-Westernmost corner of Wellington Location 47 aforesaid; thence North-Easterly along the North-Western boundary of that location to the South-Western side of road No. 60; thence generally South-Easterly along that side to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 708; thence Northerly and Easterly to and along boundaries of location 708 and 348 and onwards to the Western boundary of location 3328; thence Northerly along that boundary to a point in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 180; thence Easterly along that prolongation to the Eastern boundary of Wellington Location 3329; thence Southerly along that boundary and onwards to the North-Eastern boundary of location 2358; thence South-Easterly along the North-Eastern boundaries of locations 2358, 3904, Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 283 and the Northern boundaries of Wellington Location 2553 to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 48; thence Northerly and Easterly to and along boundaries of lots 48, 366 and 46 to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of lot 137; thence Northerly to and along that boundary to a point in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of lot 35; thence Easterly and Southerly to and along boundaries of that lot and onwards to and along the Eastern boundaries of Boyanup Suburban Lot 73, Town Lots 74 and 83 to the North-Western side of Payne Street; thence South-Westerly along that side to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the North-Eastern boundary of Suburban Lot 19; thence South-Easterly and Southerly to and along the Eastern boundaries of that lot and onwards to the Southern side of Trigwell Road; thence Easterly along that side to the North-Western corner of Wellington Location 54; thence Southerly and Easterly along boundaries of that location to the South-Western side of the Bridgetown-Boyanup Railway Reserve; thence South-Easterly along that side to the Easternmost corner of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 395; thence generally South-Westerly along boundaries of that lot to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Western boundary of lot 393; thence Southerly and Westerly to and along boundaries of lots 393 and 101 to the North-Eastern corner of lot 110; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of lots 110, 109 and Wellington Location 1957 to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern boundary of Boyanup Agricultural Area Lot 104; thence Southerly to and along that boundary to the Northern boundary of lot 217; thence Easterly, Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that lot to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern boundary of Wellington Location 3829; thence Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly, again Westerly, again Southerly and again Westerly to and along boundaries of locations 3829, 4485, 3833, 4502 and 3811 and onwards to the Eastern boundary of location 994; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that location to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Easternmost boundary of location 4364; thence Southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the North-Eastern side of road No. 894; thence generally North-Westerly along that side to a point in prolongation Northerly of the Easternmost boundary of location 2504; thence Southerly, Westerly, Northerly, again Westerly and again Northerly to and along boundaries of that location to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of location 4365; thence Westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the Western boundary of location 4421; thence Northerly along boundaries of locations 4421 and 3783 and onwards to the North-Eastern side of road No. 894 aforesaid; thence North-Westerly along that side to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Eastern boundary of location 930; thence Northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the Northern side of a one-chain road along a Southern boundary of location 2921; thence Westerly along that road and onwards to the Western side of East Road; thence Southerly along that side to the Northern side of Ommanney Road; thence Westerly along that side to the South-Eastern side of Withers Road; thence North-Easterly along that side to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northern side of Jenkin Road; thence Westerly to and along that side and

onwards to the Eastern boundary of Capel Suburban Lot 45; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that lot to its South-Western corner; thence Southerly, Westerly and Northerly to and along boundaries of Stirling Estate Lot 29 and onwards to the South-Western corner of lot 28; thence Westerly and Northerly to and along boundaries of lots 27, 25, 23 and 21 and onwards to the Southern boundary of lot 36; thence Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of that lot to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of lot 43; thence Westerly, Northerly and Easterly to and along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the Western boundary of lot 37; thence Northerly and Easterly along boundaries of lots 37, 38, 39 and 41 and onwards to the Westernmost boundary of Wellington Location 392; thence Northerly along the Western boundaries of locations 392, 204 and 47 aforesaid to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of Stirling Estate Lot 218 and thence Westerly and generally North-Westerly to and along the Southern boundaries of lots 218, 217, 216, 215, 214 and 213 to the starting point as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D. W.A. 33351.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ADMISSION OF ENGINEERING CADETS AND ARCHITECTURAL CADETS IN THE PUBLIC WORKS, WATER SUPPLY, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE DEPARTMENT AND THE METROPOLITAN WATER SUPPLY, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE DEPARTMENT.

1.—Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must not be more than 21 nor less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to his character.

When forwarding his application, each candidate shall attach a completed questionnaire on the printed form obtainable at the office of the Public Service Commissioner.

2.—Qualifications.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—Applicants must have passed the Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics A and B, Physics and one other subject preferably Chemistry.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—Applicants must have passed the Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematics A and B, Physics, and at least one of the following subjects:—Applied Mathematics, Chemistry, Drawing, Geology, or have passed an approved equivalent examination.

All applicants will be required to produce evidence of examinations passed by them.

3.—Selection.

Applications for vacancies will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement. Selection of applicants considered suitable for appointment will be made by a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner, the Permanent Head and the Director of Works, or their nominees.

4.—Probation.

Every cadet shall be article to the Director of Works or the Principal Architect, as the case may require, for the term hereinafter prescribed, but his appointment in the first instance will be subject to a period of 12 months' probation. Before the expiration of the period of probation, the Permanent Head shall report to the Public Service Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties, and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report, the Commissioner will confirm, or annul the appointment.

5.—Term of Cadetship.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—A cadet shall serve for an aggregate period of two years in the Department. For the purpose of determining this period, the sum of all University vacations spent by the cadet in training in the Department shall be counted. Leave without pay will be granted to cover the University terms.

A cadet who, after following part of the University course is forced to relinquish it without proceeding to a degree, shall, if so required, serve an aggregate period of five years in the Department. He shall satisfy the Director of Works that he has entered upon a course of study to enable him to pass one of the examinations referred to in regulation 6 (a) as soon after the abandonment of the University course as may be possible.

Portion of the time spent in the Department shall be in the office for the purpose of receiving instruction in the preparation of engineering drawings, computations, specifications, designing, office methods and general engineering work. The remainder of the term shall be spent in the field on engineering surveys, and the design, construction and maintenance of engineering works, or a short course in the workshops, according to the branch of work to which he is allotted.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—A cadet shall serve for a period of five years. Immediately upon appointment he will be required to enrol as a student in the Diploma Course of Architecture at the Perth Technical College. This course will require two years' full-time and three years' part-time attendance at the College. Leave without pay will be granted to cover the cadet's attendance at the Diploma Course.

The whole of the period of the Cadetship not required in attendance at the Perth Technical College shall be spent in service with the Department. During the time to be spent in the Department, the cadet will receive general practical instruction in designing, drafting, construction, quantities, specifications, and the work of an architect generally. Portion of the time will be spent in the field in the supervision of construction and maintenance work, and in carrying out architectural surveys.

(c) General.—Time served with the Department prior to appointment as a cadet may be counted towards the qualifying period at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner on the recommendation of the Director of Works.

6.—Final Examinations.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has fulfilled one of the following conditions:—

Civil Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
- (ii) Passed sections "A" and "B" of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London.
- (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.

Mechanical Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
- (ii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.
- (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London.

Electrical Engineering Cadets—

- (i) Obtained the degree of Bachelor of Engineering in the University of Western Australia.
- (ii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Engineers of Australia.
- (iii) Passed the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, London.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—No cadet shall be considered to have completed his cadetship until he has fulfilled all of the following conditions:—

- (i) Obtained the Diploma in Architecture at the Perth Technical College.
- (ii) Obtained registration under the provisions of the Architects Act, 1921.
- (iii) Been admitted as an Associate Member of the Royal Institute of British Architects, London; or the Royal Australian Institute of Architects.

7.—Extension of Term.

If, at the end of the prescribed term of his cadetship, a cadet has not succeeded in fulfilling the conditions of completion set out in regulation 6, his cadetship may be extended at the discretion of the Public Service Commissioner for a further period not exceeding two years.

8.—Student Membership.

(a) Engineering Cadets.—A cadet, as soon as he is qualified by age, shall become a student member of either the Institution of Civil, Mechanical or Electrical Engineers, London, or the Institution of Engineers, Australia.

(b) Architectural Cadets.—During the first year of his cadetship, a cadet shall become a student member of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects.

9.—Progress and Conduct.

At any time after a cadet has completed one year of the prescribed term of service, if, in the opinion of the Permanent Head of the Department, his progress and/or general conduct have not been satisfactory, his cadetship may be cancelled on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

10.—Regulations.

During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and regulations relating to the permanent staff, as far as these may be applicable. The period of his cadetship shall not be considered as any part of a term of service for which long service leave may be granted.

11.—Remuneration.

(a) The remuneration of cadets during periods of service in the Department shall be at the following rates:—

- First year cadets—65 per cent. of the basic rate.
- Second year cadets—77½ per cent. of the basic rate.
- Third year cadets—92½ per cent. of the basic rate.
- Fourth year cadets—£15 margin over the basic rate.
- Fifth year cadets—£65 margin over the basic rate.

Provided that advancement from year to year shall be subject to satisfactory progress report from the University or Perth Technical College authorities and the receipt by the Public Service Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head of the Department as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the cadet.

(b) For the periods of leave without pay granted to the cadet subsequent to the 1st January, 1952, in order to attend the University or the Perth Technical College as the case may be, a sustenance allowance at the rate of £3 10s. per week shall be paid to the cadet: Provided that payment may at any time be suspended by the Public Service Commissioner on receipt of an unsatisfactory report from the University or Perth Technical College authorities or the Permanent Head.

No payment shall be made for any period of leave without pay granted for purposes other than to attend during terms at the University or Perth Technical College as the case may be, or for any periods of absence from class in respect of which the cadet is unable to furnish a satisfactory explanation.

12.—Allowances.

(a) A cadet while in camp where a cook is provided will be paid a daily allowance at a rate determinable by the Public Service Commissioner.

(b) When a cadet is employed away from his headquarters an allowance, at such rates as may be approved by the Public Service Commissioner, may be paid as compensation for—

- (i) any extra cost of living involved where no camp with a cook is provided;
- (ii) any extra cost for transport necessarily incurred.

13.—Service.

A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his cadetship shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of four years, at the salary prescribed by industrial agreement between the Public Service Commissioner and the Civil Service Association for the first nine months and thereafter in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged.

14.—Agreement.

Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these regulations an agreement in the form, or to the effect, of Appendix No. 1 hereto shall be executed by such person, his legal guardian, the head of the Department concerned and one surety to be determined and approved by the head of the Department concerned.

Appendix.

No. 1.

THIS indenture made the day of one thousand nine hundred and between (a) of (b) in the State of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the cadet"), of the first part, (c) of (b) in the said State (d) the (e) of the cadet (hereinafter with his executors and administrators referred to as "the Guardian") of the second part, (f) of (b) in the said State (d) (hereinafter with his executors and administrators referred to as "the Guarantor") of the third part and (g) the (h) for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter with his successors in office referred to as "the (i)") of the fourth part witnesseth that the said parties hereto do hereby mutually agree and declare as follows:—

1. The cadet of his own free will and accord, with the consent of the guardian, hereby places and binds himself to serve the (i) as an (j) for the term of five years from the day of one thousand nine hundred and and for any additional period required to satisfactorily complete his cadetship under and subject to the regulations governing the admission of Engineering Cadets and Architectural Cadets in the Public Works, Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department and the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department as approved by the Governor in Council and published in the *Government Gazette* of the day of 19....., and any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

2. The cadet will during the said term well and truly serve the (i) as an (j) and will in all respects and at all times observe, perform and comply with the obligations on the part of the cadet contained in the said regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

3. When the cadet shall have satisfactorily completed his cadetship and obtained his certificate of qualification he will if required so to do serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of four years in accordance with and subject to the provisions contained in regulation 13 of the said regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

4. That if from any cause whatsoever the cadet shall fail to satisfactorily complete his cadetship as required by these presents, or shall fail to

observe, perform and comply with the obligations on the part of the cadet contained herein, and in the said regulations, or shall fail to comply with the provisions of clause 3 hereof, or shall be required to leave the course of cadetship or subsequent employment in the State Public Service during the term herein specified, by reason of misconduct, idleness, disobedience, non-attendance, irregular or unpunctual attendance, want of interest in work, or immoral conduct, then in such cases the guardian and the guarantor, the parties of the second and third parts hereof, shall jointly and severally be liable for and forthwith on demand shall pay to the (i) as ascertained damages and not by way of penalty for such breach of failure a sum of money equivalent to the sum total of all sustenance allowance payments made to the cadet by the Crown as specified in regulation 11 (b) of the said regulations.

5. In consideration of the premises the (i) will during the said term take and accept the cadet and employ him and instruct him or cause him to be employed and instructed as an (j) under and in accordance with the said regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

33.—Stock Water for Use Outside Irrigation District.

If surplus water is available for persons who desire to water their stock whose land is not in the Irrigation District, then the scale of charges in by-law 32 or by-law 35, whichever is appropriate, shall apply; by-law 30 (surcharge for out of appropriate zone period) also applies and the provisions of by-law 32 regarding surcharge shall be complied with.

35.—Pipe Supply Services.

(1) For land whether rated for ordinary irrigation or not, or whether situated within or without an Irrigation District, the Minister may grant permission for consumers to take water by means of a powered pump or windmill or may instal a pipe to which may be connected the consumer's distribution system, or may provide other works, to facilitate supplies for the purposes and subject to the respective annual charges and conditions as set out hereunder:—

(c) For stock watering—free if to rated property, and taken in zone period, or otherwise obtained at no cost to the Department, but if a special service is necessitated and agreed to by the Minister, a special service fee of 15s. per service shall be charged. Otherwise £2 8s.

(d) For either household or dairy purposes or for both such purposes £2 8s.

(2) Water supplied under clause (d) may be used for garden purposes without further charge, provided such garden does not exceed an area of one half an acre.

(3) Where it is necessary for the Minister to instal a pipe or provide other works to facilitate supplies to any consumer such consumer shall meet the capital cost of such works, plus a lump sum to be determined by the Minister, sufficient to meet future maintenance charges on such works.

(4) Written application shall be made for each or any of the aforementioned services.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Quairading Road Board.

THE Quairading Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of the by-laws the following words have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(A) "Board" means the Quairading Road Board.

(B) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the third day of September, 1939 and the third day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All employees of the Board shall after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from 1st February, 1936, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

4. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid (a) their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average daily rate of pay over the preceding 12 months; (b) the Board may at its discretion either, (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of this long service leave.

5. Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' service. After the completion of the first 10 years, employees will then be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.

Parking By-laws.

THE Three Springs Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1951, published in the *Government*

Gazette on the 2nd day of November, 1951, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following by-laws regulating the parking of vehicles in the townsites of Kadathinni and Three Springs within the Three Springs Road District:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in regulations 105 and 106 of the Traffic Regulations, 1936, no person shall park any motor car or utility on the Western side of Railway Road, except at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb, and it will not be permissible for any trucks or semi-trailers to be parked on any portion of the Western side of Railway Road. All vehicles must be parallel parked on the Eastern side of Railway Road.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in regulations 105 and 106 of the Traffic Regulations, 1936, no person shall park any vehicle in any portion of Hall Street, Maley Street, or Station Street, except at an angle of 45 degrees to the kerb.

3. Notwithstanding any regulation or by-law requiring or permitting the parking of vehicles at an angle to the kerb, no person shall park any vehicle in any road within the Town Ward of the Three Springs Road District so that any part of such vehicle is more than 15ft. distant from the kerb, measured at right angles to the kerb.

4. Wherever the local authority has inscribed the words "No Parking" in any space in any street, no person shall park any vehicle over or partly over the space occupied by such inscription.

5. No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand at any time on a public road or in a public parking place in such a manner as to cause a double line of parking, or otherwise so to hamper or prevent the withdrawal of any other vehicle from the place where it is parked.

6. Penalty for breach of any of the foregoing by-laws, not more than £20.
