Licensing Act, 1911-1951.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, JOHN PATRICK DWYER, Lieutenant Governor.

[L.S.] By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act 1911-1951, is as follows:—

- (2) No licensee shall in the Goldfields district.-
 - (a) have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of liquor; or
 - (b) sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises,

at any time before nine o'clock in the mornday in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license.

Provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, by proclamation extend or reduce the hours in any licensing district or part of a district within the Goldfields district, and this subsection shall have effect as so modified, but any such proclamation may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, be varied or revoked by a subsequent proclamation.

And whereas the Licensing Court on the 20th day of March, 1952, made a recommendation to the Governor in respect of those hours. Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on that recommendation of the Licensing Court do hereby proclaim as follows:-

(1) The holder of a license mentioned in the First Schedule to this proclamation in re-spect of premises in any of the licensing dis-

tricts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this proclamation, being districts within the Goldfields district, shall not—

have or keep the licensed premises open for sale of liquor; or

sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon the licensed premises;

upon-

(a) Anzac Day, the twenty-fifth day of April;

> Good Friday; or Christmas day;

whether those respective days fall on a Sunday or any other day of the week

at any time;

(b) Sunday-

except during two periods, one of which shall be between 10.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and the other of which shall be between 3 p.m. and 6 p.m.

and then only during either period if the liquor is sold otherwise than by the bottle or in a bottle:

(c) any day of the week, other than a day mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs (a) and (b)

except between 9 a.m. and 11 p.m.

(2) This proclamation does not prejudice the operation in the licensing districts men-tioned in that Second Schedule of the provi-sions of the Licensing Act—

relating to the holders of licenses other than those mentioned in that First Schedule; or contained in section 44, and in subsections (3) and (4) of section 121 and in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 122 of that Act.

Publican's general license, hotel license, waysidehouse license.

Avon (for Westonia only), Yilgarn, Kalgoorlie, Coolgardie, Kanowna, Menzies, Ravensthorpe, Mt. Leonora, Mt. Margaret, Cue, Murchison and Mt. Magnet.

The Constitution Act. 1889. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 3044/11.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys in connection with War Service Land Settlement should be vested in Karl Thomas Lutz (Superintendent): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest, and the same is hereby vested in Karl Thomas Lutz accordingly.

Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:-

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909.

(a) A six-inch reticulation pipe sewer with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith.

(b) A brick and tile ejector station and reinforced concrete well, together with a four-inch reinforced concrete rising main, and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 7654.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 16th day of May, 1952.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902-1951.

Amendment of Regulations.

THE Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, acting pursuant to section 65 of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902-1951, hereby amend the regulations made by them and in force under the said Act, as published in the Government Gazette of the 5th day of September, 1934, and amended from time to time thereafter (reprinted by the Government Printer with all amendments to the 5th day of October, 1951), and since further amended by notices published in the Government Gazette on the 9th day of November, 1951, the 14th day of December, 1951, and on the 18th day of January, 1952, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by inserting the following new Regulation No. 101a.

Regulation No. 101a.

Functions aboard Vessels.

- (1) The Master, owner or agent of any vessel shall not, without the written permission of the Commissioners, permit or cause to be permitted, any social or other function to be held on such vessel which—
 - (i) shall necessitate the provision of shore services more than ordinarily provided for the regulation of land traffic and parking of vehicles within the port;
 - (ii) shall necessitate the provision of special water-craft services for the control and patrolling of waterways within the port;
 - (iii) shall cause or is likely to cause interference with cargo handling or other operations within the port;
 - (iv) shall necessitate special control at points of ingress and egress to and from the wharves, and to the roadways, waterways or other areas within the port; or
 - (v) shall necessitate special policing or firewatching on land and waterways within the port.

- (2) The Master, owner or agent of any vessel shall, as the case may be, make application in writing to the Commissioners for permission to hold any such social or other function at least seven clear days before the date on which it is intended to hold the social or other function.
- (3) The Commissioners may grant or refuse permission to hold any social or other function for which written permission is required under paragraph (1) of this regulation.

Drivers' and Conductors' Licenses.

15. (a) The kind or kinds of vehicles in respect of which drivers' licenses may be granted and issued are classified as hereunder:—

As to Motor Vehicles other than Passenger Vehicles.

A. (i) Any motor car.

(ii) Any motor wagon of an unladen weight of 40 cwt. or less.

- B. Any motor wagon of an unladen weight exceeding 40 cwt.
- C. (i) Any motor cycle (with or without side car attachment) not exceeding 125 c.c.
 - (ii) Any motor carrier not exceeding 125 c.c.
- D. (i) Aay motor cycle (with or without side car attachment) exceeding 125 c.c.
 - (ii) Any motor carrier exceeding 125 c.c.
- E. Any motor tractor.

As to Passenger Vehicles.

Kind of Vehicle.

F.

Any omnibus.

- G. Any taxi car.
- (b) The holder of a license to drive a motor vehicle shall not drive on any road a motor vehicle other than one of a kind or class in respect of which the license is held.
- (c) Anything in this regulation to the contrary notwithstanding, a person shall not drive any passenger vehicle unless such person or any person travelling therein as a conductor or attendant is the holder of a valid conductors' license.
- 16. (1) Every application for a license to drive a motor vehicle (or for any addition to such license) or to act as a conductor pursuant to section 23 of the Act or for an extraordinary license pursuant to section 24A of the Act shall be made in writing on a form to be provided by the Commissioner of Police or a member of the Police force authorised to grant and issue any such license.
- (2) Every license to drive a motor vehicle, or act as a conductor, every extraordinary license and every application therefor shall be in a form previously determined by the Minister and published in the *Gazette*. Provided that this subregulation shall not affect any driver's or conductor's license issued prior to the publication of this regulation in the *Government Gazette*, so long as such license remains in force.
- 17. (1) Every applicant for a license to drive a motor vehicle shall, if required, prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police or an examiner duly appointed by him the efficiency of his eyesight and hearing.
- (2) The Commissioner of Police or member of the Police force acting with his authority may refuse to grant a license to drive a motor vehicle to any person who fails to prove the efficiency of his eyesight and hearing when required under the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation.
- 18. (1) The Commissioner of Police or a member of the Police force authorised to grant and issue extraordinary licenses may in his discretion refuse to grant and issue an extraordinary license to any applicant—
 - (a) until the applicant has proved to the reasonable satisfaction of the Commissioner of Police or member of the Police force as the case may be, that the applicant is, subject to such limitations and conditions as may be imposed under the Act and these regulations, qualified to drive the motor vehicle or the kind of motor vehicle for which the extraordinary license is required; or
 - (b) on any grounds for which an extraordinary license may be suspended or cancelled.
- (2) The Commissioner of Police or a member of the Police force acting with his authority may in his discretion suspend for any period or cancel any extraordinary license issued to any person who, in his opinion is, or whom he suspects on reasonable grounds to be, unfit to hold such license on account of habitual addiction to alcoholic drink or drugs to such an extent as to render such person a danger to public safety when in control of a motor vehicle on the road, or mental incapacity or physical disability; or who in his opinion is not of good character, or for any breach of the conditions or limitations subject to the observance of which the extraordinary license is issued. A license while so suspended or cancelled shall be of no effect.
- (3) The Commissioner of Police or any member of the Police force acting with his authority may in his discretion impose conditions subject to the observance of which authority to drive on roads pursuant to an extraordinary license may be exercised. Such conditions and any other limitations which may be imposed pursuant to the Act or these regulations shall be specified in the extraordinary license.
- (4) (a) Every extraordinary license shall, subject to the provisions of the Act and these regulations, remain in force for any period stated in such license, not exceeding twelve months from the date on which it was issued.
- (b) The validity of any extraordinary license may be extended for any period not exceeding twelve months from the day on which it was issued: Provided that such extension is endorsed on the license by the Commissioner of Police or member of the Police force acting with his authority.
 - (5) A fee of five shillings shall be payable for every extraordinary license.
- (6) Any person to whom an extraordinary license has been issued pursuant to the provisions of the Act and these regulations, shall not drive on any road any motor vehicle—
 - (a) at any time or in any locality other than as specified in such license;
 - (b) other than the motor vehicle or the class of motor vehicles in respect of which the license was issued;
 - (c) otherwise than in compliance with such other limitations and conditions, if any, specified in such license.

- 19. (1) (a) Every applicant for a license to drive a motor passenger vehicle shall, if required by the Commissioner of Police or examiner appointed by him, submit himself to, and pass a medical examination as to his mental and physical fitness to drive such a vehicle. Such examination shall be made by a medical practitioner nominated or approved by the Commissioner of Police;
- (b) The Commissioner of Police or member of the Police force acting with his authority may, subject to the provisions of section 23 (1) of the Act, refuse to grant a license—
 - (i) to drive a motor passenger vehicle to any person who fails to pass the medical examination referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation; or
 - (ii) to act as a conductor of a motor passenger vehicle to any person who fails to establish that he is a fit and proper person to hold the license.
 - (2) No person shall-
 - (a) act as a conductor of any passenger vehicle unless he is duly licensed for the purpose;
 - (b) employ or permit any person to act as a conductor of any passenger vehicle owned by him or under his control who is not duly licensed as aforesaid and who is not in possession of the appropriate license.
- (3) No person under the age of twenty years shall apply for or be granted a license to act as a conductor of a passenger vehicle.
 - 20. Anything in these regulations to the contrary notwithstanding-
 - (a) a person under the age of 17 years shall not drive any motor vehicle on a road except under the authority of an extraordinary license;
 - (b) a person under the age of 20 years shall not drive any motor vehicle of a kind specified in class B as contained in regulation 15 except under the authority of an extraordinary license;
 - (c) a person under the age of 21 years shall not drive any motor vehicle of a kind specified in class F or G as contained in regulation 15.

Provided that this regulation shall not affect the validity of any license to drive a vehicle granted and issued prior to the gazettal of this regulation.

- 21. Any appeals under subsection (1) and (5) of section 23 and subsection (3) of section 24 of the Act shall be subject to and governed by the provisions of Part XII of these regulations.
 - (b) By revoking regulations 22 and substituting in lieu thereof the following:—
 - 22. (1) (a) No person shall use on any road a vehicle the license in respect of which is held in contravention of the provisions of any Act or these regulations;
 - (b) If any license is lawfully suspended or cancelled or has been obtained by misrepresentation or fraud, or is held in contravention of the provisions of any Act or the regulations, the license holder shall, on demand by a Traffic Inspector or member of the Police force, deliver up such license forthwith.
 - (2) (a) The holder of any license shall, within seven days after every change of his address or place of business as stated in the license give notice thereof in writing to the Licensing Authority which granted the license, and shall produce the license to the said Licensing Authority for the new address or place of business as the case may be to be endorsed thereon.
 - (b) In the case of a license to drive a motor vehicle or any extraordinary license the notice referred to in paragraph (a) of this subregulation may be given, and the license produced for endorsement, at any Police Station.
 - (c) By deleting Forms Nos. 14, 15, 16 and 17 in the Second Schedule thereof.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Chittering Road Board.

THE Chittering Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—
 - (a) "Board" means the Chittering Road Board.
- (b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days nor an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board. Provided that an employee required to serve full time in the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia in time of war or emergency shall have such time counted as continuous service with the Board.
- 2. All employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of January, 1941, be entitled to three months' long service leave. Long service leave is to be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employees, but the Board may require the employee to take his leave by giving not less than three months' notice.
- 3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in the continuity of service, provided that the period of absence shall not be longer than three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

- (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.
 - (b) The Board may, at its discretion, either-
 - (i) pay an employee his salary or wages periodically during long service leave, or
 - (ii) pay to an employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service
- Employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of 10 years' After the completion of the first 10 years, employees shall be entitled to pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.
- In the event of resignation, retirement, or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or, in the case of death, to his personal representative, or, if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant such employee at the date of resignation, retirement, or death; or, if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would, under this by-law, have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.
- 7. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.
- Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 4 of 1952. (Registered 9/4/52.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1921-1950, this 1st day of April, 1952, between the West Australian Shop Assistants' and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), of the one part, and the Honourable the Treasurer for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "employer"), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto, as follows:—

This Agreement shall be known as the Storemen (Government Stores) Agreement, and shall supersede Industrial Agreement No. 30 of 1937, as varied by No. 60 (301) of 1947, and as further varied by No. 33 of 1948.

3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

-Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to persons employed by the Treasurer on classifications prescribed in clause 9 under the direct control of the Controller of Stores, and shall be limited in its effect to the following localities within the metropolitan area,

(a) Government Stores Buildings.—So much of Government Reserve $B_{\uparrow}1153$ as forms part of Perth Town Lot P10 (Murray Street, Perth).

(b) North Fremantle Government much of Government Reserve \uparrow 11069 as forms part of North Fremantle Lot NF31 (John Street).

-Being part of old Customs (c) Fremantle Store.-Office building on old Customs Crown Reserve at corner of Cliff and Dalgety Streets, Fremantle.

(d) Government Bulk Stores, Royal Street, East Perth.

(e) No. 19 Wool Store, East Fremantle.

Hours.

(a) The week's work shall consist of forty (40) hours.

(b) The ordinary hours of work shall be eight (8) hours from Monday to Friday, inclusive, and shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 5.15 p.m.

(c) The lunch interval shall not be less than forty-five (45) minutes, nor more than one (1) hour, which shall be given between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(d) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

6.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be overtime, and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual stopping time, and thereafter double time.

(b) All work performed on Saturday shall be paid at time and a half for the first four hours

and double time thereafter.

(c) For all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, double time rates shall be paid. For any work performed on other gazetted Public Service holidays, equivalent time off shall be granted.

(d) In the computation of overtime, each day's

work shall stand by itself.

7.—Holidays, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave.

(a) The following holidays shall be observed as holidays and be paid for, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, also any other holidays gazetted under the Public Service Act and applying within the area of this Agreement.

(b) In addition to the above, two weeks on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall, after the completion of one month's continuous service, be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of

service.

(c) A worker entitled to holidays under this clause shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker shall take his holiday: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

(d) Long service leave shall be granted in accordance with the conditions applying to Con

accordance with the conditions applying to Government full-time wages employees generally and in accordance with any amendments thereto, as may be made from time to time.

8.—Interpretations.

(a) "Storeman in charge" shall mean a storeman appointed as such by the employer to take charge of a section, department or store, and who is directly responsible to the Controller of Stores,

or his deputy.

(b) "Head storeman" shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in

charge of one or more men.

(c) "Storeman working singly" shall mean a storeman working where no other storeman is em-

ployed in the establishment.

(d) "Despatch hand" shall mean a worker who may handle goods or receive goods from depart-ments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages, and for the proper branding and marking thereof, and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes and cart notes.

(e) "Packer" shall mean a person who packs goods for transport.

9.---Wages.

(h) Whilst so engaged, casual hands shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

10.-Meal Allowance.

When a worker is required to continue after the usual finishing time for more than one hour, he shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for the purchase of any meal required.

11.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

12.-Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors, with the exception of junior packers, shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors, and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof.

Provided that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every

four senior packers.

(b) Where no female assistant in receipt of the full adult wage is employed, one junior female assistant may be employed.

Where one senior female assistant is employed,

two junior female assistants may be employed. Where two senior female assistants are employed,

three junior female assistants may be employed. Where three senior female assistants are employed, four junior female assistants may be em-

Where four senior female assistants are employed,

five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter, the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

(c) In this clause, the word "senior" shall mean a person of twenty-one years of age or over.

13.—Record Book.

The wages sheets of the Department will be open for inspection by the secretary or other accredited representative of the Union at the head office of the Controller of Stores during ordinary business hours.

14.—Contract of Service.

(a) Employment shall be weekly, and a week's notice shall be given by the worker or the employer to terminate the engagement or a week's wages be

paid in lieu of same.
(b) In cases of dismissal for misconduct or dereliction of duty, such notice shall not be due and wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.

15.—Board of Reference.

In the event of a dispute arising upon any matter shown in this Agreement, the point in dispute shall be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the Department, a representative of the Union, and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by such representatives; failing their agreement, the Industrial Registrar of Western Australia shall be chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

16.—Preference. Preference of employment shall be given to

24A. No person shall use for the transport of any butchers' or slaughterhouse wastes any vehicle used in the transport of food, drugs or any matter intended to be used for the packing or handling of food and drugs.

24B. No person shall collect, remove or engage in the transport of any butchers' or slaughter-house wastes unless—

- (1) the vehicle used for the purpose is a powered vehicle and shall have—
 - (a) (i) a compartment for holding wastes, the compartment to be comprised of a fioor and four walls made of sheet metal being not less than 3 feet high from fioor level; and
 - (ii) all joints in the compartment soldered, welded or brazed and made water tight; and
 - (iii) all loading doors, when loading doors are provided, fitted to the rear or left side of the vehicle only and the loading doors shall be tight fitting; and
 - (iv) the compartment completely covered with a tarpaulin which shall be carried over the walls and secured to the outside thereof at least 1 foot from the top; or
 - (b) a metal bin with a tight fitting lid in which any butchers' or slaughterhouse wastes shall be placed;
- (2) the vehicle and all bins, tarpaulins, bags and other accessories are thoroughly cleansed on each day on which they are used and maintained in good order at all times;
- (3) all butchers' or slaughterhouse wastes are loaded, transported or delivered so as not to cause a nuisance.
