COMMISSION APPOINTING THE HONOURABLE SIR JOHN PATRICK DWYER, K.C.M.G., TO BE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, Passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, appointing the Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of the Supreme ELIZABETH R. Court of the State of Western Australia, to be Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

## Dated 8th April, 1952.

Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland the British Dominions beyond the Seas Queen, Defender of the Faith: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Our State of Western Australia, Greeting:

WE do by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet appoint you, the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Lieutenant-Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

And further, in case of the death, incapacity, or removal of Our Governor of Our said State, or of his departure from Our said State, We do hereby authorise and require you to administer the Government thereof, with all and singular the powers and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent and authorities contained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending or substituted for the same, and according to such Instructions as Our said Governor, for the time being both already said Governor for the time being hath already received, or may hereafter receive from Us or

through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in Our said State.

And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects of Our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this eighth day of April, 1952, in the First Year of Our Reign.

POLICE ACT, 1892-1945. Section 9.

Police Department, Perth, 21st May, 1952.

#### Order.

- 1. IN order that the Governor in exercise of the power of appointment of inspectors, sub-inspectors and other officers of police, conferred by section six of the Police Act, 1892-1945, and in exercise of the discretion of approval, conferred by section seven of that Act, to the appointment of non-commissioned officers, may best give effect to promoting and maintaining the control, management, discipline and efficiency of the Police Force for the discharge of the several duties thereof and for the purpose of preventing neglect and abuse, referred to in section nine of that Act, the Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the power conferred by the lastmentioned section, with the approval of the Minister, required by that section, makes the following order to take effect on and after the 23rd day of May, 1952, and to supersede Item 113 of the "Regulations and Instructions for the Government and Guidance of The Police Force of Western Australia" published in the Government Gazette of the 4th day of December, 1944.
- 2. The provisions of this order apply to General Uniform Police, as well as to the Criminal Investigation Department, referred to in Item 34 of the Regulations and Instructions, but do not prejudice or otherwise affect the exercise of the discretionary power—to appoint commissioned officers; or to withhold approval of the appointment of non-commissioned officers, conferred upon the Governor by sections six and seven of the Police Act, 1892-1945, nor the exercise of the discretionary power—to appoint so many non-commissioned officers and constables of different grades as the Commissioner deems necessary for the preservation of peace and order, conferred upon the Commissioner by section six of that Act.
- 3. There shall be a Board of Examiners, comprising a legal practitioner, and two other persons all of whom shall be appointed by the Commissioner.
- 4. From time to time, at times appointed by the Commissioner, examinations shall be conducted in accordance with this order.
- 5. Whenever requested by the Commissioner the Board of Examiners shall set and mark the examination papers.
- 6. The Commissioner shall arrange for the holding and supervision of the examinations and shall cause such notice of intention to hold examinations as will afford members of the Force reasonable opportunity of candidature.
- 7. Two standards of examination shall be held, one for candidates seeking qualification for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (3rd Class) and one for those seeking qualification for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (1st Class).
- 8. Each standard of examination shall be on the following subjects:—reporting, arithmetic, orthography, geography of Western Australia, and such Statutes as for the time being are enumerated in circular instructions issued by the Commissioner.
- $9.\,$  A candidate shall be credited with a pass if he gains sixty per centum of the marks allotted to each subject.
- 10. If a member of the Force has not, before the day on which this order takes effect, passed in all subjects, or does not, after that day, pass in all subjects at an examination, he may elect to be a candidate at such subsequent examination or examinations as he chooses, until he does pass in all subjects.
- 11. If, before the day on which this order commences to take effect, a member of the Force has already passed in all subjects, except mental arithmetic, he shall nevertheless be credited with having passed in all subjects, at the time when the results of the examination held next in succession to that day take effect.
- 12. A member of the Force shall not be eligible as a candidate for examination for qualification for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (1st Class) unless and until he has completed at least 10 years of service as a constable and has passed the examination qualifying him for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (3rd Class).
- 13. A member of the Force shall not be eligible as a candidate for examination for qualification for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (3rd Class) unless and until he has completed at least five years' service as a constable.
- 14. The Commissioner shall keep a record of members of the Force who have passed all subjects in examinations qualifying them for appointment to the grade of Sergeant (1st Class) or Sergeant (3rd Class) as the case may be.
- 15. (a) Subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of this order the following provisions of this order apply in respect of appointments to the grades of Inspector (3rd Class), Sergeant (1st Class), Sergeant (2nd Class) and Sergeant (3rd Class).
  - (b) A member of the Force shall not be promoted—
    - (i) to the grade of Sergeant (3rd Class) unless and until he has passed the examination qualifying him for appointment in that grade;

- (ii) to the grade of Sergeant (1st Class) or to any higher grade unless and until he has passed the examination qualifying him for appoint-
- ment to the grade of Sergeant (1st Class);
  (iii) if he is not of strictly sober habits, energetic, trustworthy and
- suitable in every other respect for promotion;
  (iv) if during the preceding two years of his service he has been convicted of a serious breach of discipline or serious neglect of duty;
  (v) if being a constable or non-commissioned officer he is not prepared
- to be transferred to the place where his services would be required in case of his promotion.
- (c) There shall be a Promotions Selection Board comprising the Chief Inspector as Chairman and two other Inspectors to be appointed from time to
- time by the Commissioner.

  (d) Where an appointment is to be made, the Commissioner shall cause to be published in the *Police Gazette* notice of intention to make the appointment inviting applications from members of the Force desirous of being considered suitable to be appointed.
- (e) The Promotions Selection Board shall inquire into the qualifications of applicants, who, if required by the Board to do so, shall attend before the Board for examination and questioning as to suitableness for appointment and the Board shall recommend to the Commissioner such member or members of the Force as the Board considers most suitable for the appointment or the appointments as the case may be.
- (f) If in the opinion of the Board two or more applicants are of equal
- efficiency the Board shall recommend the applicant holding the higher grade.

  (g) When inquiring into the qualifications of candidates the Board shall
- (g) When inquiring into the qualifications of candidates the Board shall collect all information possible from such sources as are available to the Board and when an applicant holding higher grade is rejected, shall state in writing the reasons for the rejection.

  (h) While paying due regard to seniority and good conduct the Board shall give preference to applicants who have displayed superior intelligence, zeal and integrity in the discharge of their duties as members of the Force, the intention being that preference shall be given to meritorious service and efficiency rather than to seniority but less efficient service
- efficiency rather than to seniority but less efficient service.

  (i) In this order, "efficiency" means special qualifications including aptitude for the discharge of the duties of the office to be filled as evidenced by merit and good and diligent conduct during previous service.
- (j) The Commissioner may require an applicant to be medically examined by a Government Medical Officer and certified as physically fit to carry out his duties in any part of the State and if upon such examination the applicant is certified otherwise, the Promotions Selection Board shall not recommend the applicant.
- The Commissioner shall cause the names of the applicants recommended to him by the Promotions Selection Board to be published in the Police Gazette and within 14 days from the date of that publication an applicant who considers he should have been recommended; or the Commissioner of Police or his nominee if the Commissioner considers that a recommendation should not have been made or that a different recommendation should have been made, may appeal against the recommendation to the Promotions Appeal Board mentioned in paragraph 18 of this order stating the grounds of the appeal in writing and the latter Board shall thereupon, or so soon thereafter as is reasonably practicable, hear and determine the appeal.
- 17. If there is no appeal, the Commissioner shall submit the recommendation of the Promotions Selection Board through the Minister to the Governor, tegether with the Commissioner's own recommendation regarding the Board's recommendation.
- (a) The Promotions Appeal Board shall comprise the Commissioner of Police as Chairman and the commissioned officers of Police for the time
- being available with the exception of—

  (i) the members of the Promotions Selection Board;

  (ii) the commissioned officer in charge of the Northern Police District.

  (b) Inspectors holding brevet rank may sit on the Promotions Appeal Board and give advice and opinions, but shall not have a vote in determining the decision of that Board.
- (a) Each of those Boards may, subject to the succeeding subparagraphs of this paragraph, regulate its own procedure and may inform itself on any matter it considers relevant in such manner as it thinks just and may act according to equity and good conscience and the substantial merits of the case without regard to technicalities or legal forms and shall not be bound by any laws or rules of evidence.
- (b) The Promotions Appeal Board shall permit the General Secretary of the Western Austalian Police Union to attend proceedings of that Board both
- while the appellant is presenting his case and when the Board is delivering its decision, but in the capacity of an observer only.

  (c) The Promotions Appeal Board may permit in person an applicant who has appealed—to appear before the Promotions Appeal Board; to conduct his own appeal; to question any member or members of the Promotions Selection Board as to the reason who has not recommended; and to question and the provisions of preserve has in accordance with the provisions of preserve 20 of this Inspector who has, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 20 of this order, made a report concerning the applicant, as to its contents.
- (d) The Promotions Appeal Board shall permit the Commissioner of Police in person or his nominee—to appear before the Promotions Appeal Board; to conduct an appeal lodged by the Commissioner or his nominee; to oppose an appeal brought by an applicant; or to invite the attention of the Board to anything arising out of or in relation to any appeal to the Board which in his opinion is relevant or material to any matter to be decided by the Board.
- (e) The Commissioner shall submit the decision of the Board through the Minister to the Governor together with the Commissioner's own recommendation regarding the Board's decision.

- (f) In exercise of the discretion referred to in paragraph 2 of this order the Governor may disregard the decision or the recommendation or both.
- 20. (a) The Inspector-in-Charge of a district or branch shall by frequent personal intercourse acquaint himself with the character, conduct and efficiency of every member of the Force serving under him and shall at the end of every period of three months submit to the Commissioner a separate report on every member of the Force who is serving under him in the district or branch and who appears to him to be likely to be eligible for promotion during the next period of five years.

(b) The report shall be strictly impartial and shall deal with the member's ability, the degree of efficiency with which he discharges his duties, his character as exemplified by his conduct both when on duty and when not on duty

and his degree of tact, intelligence, zeal and integrity.

(c) The provisions of this paragraph do not preclude an Inspector-incharge of a district or branch from forwarding at any time a special report to the Commissioner relating to any such member, whom he considers worthy of

promotion because of very exceptional merit and ability.

(d) If an Inspector-in-charge who has submitted a report discovers any cause for modification of the report, he shall immediately submit a further report to the Commissioner accordingly.

- (e) If the report of the Inspector-in-charge contains anything derogatory to a member of the Force, the Commissioner shall cause it to be brought to the notice of that member so that he shall have an opportunity of refuting what
- (f) All such reports shall be produced at the hearing by the Promotions Appeal Board of appeals relating to a member of the Force in respect of whom the reports are made and the member shall be at liberty to peruse the report and question the Inspection submitting the report regarding its contents.
- In no case shall representations from persons not connected with the Police Department have any influence in procuring the promotion of any member of the Force.
  - 22. Without prejudice to the provisions of paragraph 2 of this order-
    - (a) commissioned officers may be promoted to the grades of Inspector (1st Class) and Inspector (2nd Class) on the recommendation of the Commissioner to the Minister submitted to the Governor;
    - (b) a member of the Force may be specially promoted on the recommendation of the Commissioner to the Minister submitted to the Governor on the grounds of the very exceptional ability and merit of the member and notwithstanding that the member has not passed the prescribed examination.
- 23. A member of the Force is entitled to time off to attend sittings for examinations and hearings before the Promotions Selection Board and the Promotions Appeal Board and to the appropriate return fare if for any of those purposes he is required to travel from the place where he is stationed.

In the event of the Court of Arbitration increasing the ratio of the female basic wage to the male basic wage, the margins herein prescribed for females shall be adjusted as follows:—

(a) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is equal to, or greater than, the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically reduced by the same amount as the basic wage is so increased.

(b) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is less than the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically deleted.

(c) In the case of junior female workers, the percentage of the female basic wage and the margins prescribed herein shall be automatically reduced by a sum and/or percentage sufficient to enable the rates to remain constant.

These amendments will operate as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the 5th day of May, 1952.

Delete the following clause which was inserted by Amending Order 298 (100) of 1951:—

In the event of the Court of Arbitration increasing the ratio of the female basic wage to the male basic wage, the margins herein prescribed for females shall be adjusted as follows:—

(a) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is equal to, or greater than, the increase in the female basic wage,

- such margin shall be automatically reduced by the same amount as the basic wage is so increased.
- (b) Where the margin prescribed herein for adult females is less than the increase in the female basic wage, such margin shall be automatically deleted.
- (c) In the case of junior female workers, the percentage of the female basic wage and the margins prescribed herein shall be automatically reduced by a sum and/or percentage sufficient to enable the rates to remain constant.

#### Clause 11.—Overtime.

Add to clause 11 the following subclauses:-

(1) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(m) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

- (n) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.
- (o) An employer shall not insist upon an employee working overtime where the employee declares he is not free to work and discloses a good reason to the employer to support his declaration. No employee shall be dismissed or in any way whatsoever prejudiced in his employment by reason of his refusal to work overtime where he has satisfactorily disclosed he is not free to work. Any dispute arising under this subclause shall be heard and decided by the Board of Reference.

Clause 15.—Union Chapel Delegates.

Delete clause 15 and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

## 15.—Union Chapel Delegates.

Delegates chosen from the chapel of workers (but not more than three) shall be allowed the necessary time in working hours to interview the employer or his representative for the purpose of discussing industrial matters; the time of any interview shall be so fixed as not to delay the publication of the newspapers.

# Clause 26.—Sick Pay.

Add to clause 26 the following:-

This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
