### PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1951.

Prices Control Order No. 722.

Prepared Stock and Poultry Foods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantine Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

#### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 722.

#### Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 602 is hereby revoked.

#### Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“bushel” means 20 lb.;

“ton” means 2,000 lb.;

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“cost of transport” in relation to any sale of any prepared stock or poultry food, means the cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to transporting such food: Provided that such cost of transport shall not be allowed unless it is recorded on an invoice for the food delivered to the seller;

“point of delivery” means, in relation to the sale of prepared stock or poultry food by any person, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges passes to the purchaser from the person from whom such food was purchased;

“by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of prepared stock or poultry food, that such prepared stock or poultry food is sold to

the purchaser for the purpose of resale and shall also be deemed to apply to sales to users who purchase at each delivery a total of not less than one ton;

“by retail” means, in relation to any sale of prepared stock or poultry food, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;

“cost per ton into store” means the price paid or payable per ton for the prepared stock or poultry food, plus the cost of transport from the point of delivery to the seller to the seller’s store.

#### Maximum Wholesale Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by wholesale to be the sum of—

(a) the cost per ton into store of the wholesale seller and

(b) (i) where sold ex store, the margin specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, or

(ii) where delivered to the purchaser’s premises or free on rail or free on wharf, the margin specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, plus 12s. 6d. per ton, or

(iii) where delivered free on board ship, the margin specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, plus 22s. 6d. per ton.

#### Maximum Retail Price.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by retail in the original container to be the sum of—

(a) the cost per ton into store of the retail seller, and

- (b) (i) where sold ex store, the margin specified in the third column of the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store;
- (ii) where delivered to the purchaser's premises, or free on rail or free on wharf, the margin specified in the third column of the Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, plus 12s. 6d. per ton;
- (iii) where delivered free on board ship, the margin specified in the third column of the Schedule to this Order, plus 22s. 6d. per ton.
6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by retail in any quantity less than that packed in the original container to be the price set out in subparagraph (b) (ii) of paragraph 5, irrespective of the point of delivery.

#### Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any prepared stock or poultry food specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

#### PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1951.

##### Prices Control Order No. 723.

##### Fish, Imported.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

##### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 723.

##### Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 17, as amended by Prices Control Orders No. 208 and 215, is hereby revoked.

##### Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“imported fish” means fish (other than canned fish) imported from sources outside Western Australia;

“landed cost” means the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount, together with inland carriage, outside packing, London office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3¼ per cent. of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and

bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and ⅓ of one per cent., respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of current standard master carriers' rates); “point of delivery” means, in relation to the goods specified in this Order, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in relation to such goods passed to the purchaser from the person from whom such goods were purchased.

#### Maximum Wholesale Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any imported fish may be sold by wholesale to be the sum of the following:—

- (a) Landed cost.  
(b) Margin at the rate of 15 per centum of (a).

#### Maximum Retail Price.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any imported fish may be sold by retail to be the sum of the following:—

- (a) The maximum wholesale selling price as fixed by paragraph 4 of this Order.  
(b) Cost of transport actually incurred by the retail seller and properly attributable to conveying the goods from the point of delivery to him to his premises; and  
(c) margin at the rate of 25 per centum of the sum of (a) and (b).

#### Exhibition of Prices.

6. (1) Every person who sells or has for sale by retail imported fish shall exhibit in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the following particulars:—

- (a) Retail selling prices of each lot or variety of fish which is from time to time displayed or offered for sale at such place or places of business, and  
(b) the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of that fish.

(2) (a) The approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding subparagraph in relation to retail selling prices shall be a separate price card or cards specifying the price per pound weight or the total weight and the total price in relation to each such variety of fish offered for sale as aforesaid, which properly associates such prices with each such lot or variety of fish, and (b) the approved form for the notice or notices referred to in the last preceding subparagraph in relation to the maximum prices fixed by the provisions of this Order for the sale of fish shall be such form as otherwise complies with regulation 51 of the regulations.

#### Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which imported fish of any variety specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to that person.

##### Prices Control Order No. 724.

##### Baby Carriages—Sales by Retail.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

##### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 724.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 530, insofar as it relates to sales of perambulators and baby carriages other than by manufacturers or by wholesale, is hereby revoked.

## Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“baby carriages” includes perambulators, chariots, strollers, prams, pramettes, pusher pramettes, and pushers;

“cost” means in relation to baby carriages not imported by the seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia—the purchase price paid or payable for those baby carriages after deduction of any trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount, plus packing and insurance charges and cartage actually incurred, and the cost of transporting (if any) such baby carriages from the point of delivery to the seller's premises and attributable to such baby carriages and recorded on invoices delivered in relation thereto.

For the purpose of this subparagraph—

“cost in transporting” means freight charges, provided that where more than one freight service operates, the lowest freight rate only shall be allowed;

“point of delivery” means the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying those goods to the seller's store passed to the seller from the person from whom such goods were purchased;

“landed cost” means in relation to baby carriages imported by the seller from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia—the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for those goods to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount, together with inland carriage, outside packing, overseas office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3½ per centum of the invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and ⅓ of one per centum, respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charge for costing, or any percentage surcharge on cost), cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of the maximum rate fixed to the Western Australian Road Transport Association (Inc.) for the cartage from wharf to store or from wharf to bond of such goods).

## Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which baby carriages may be sold by any person by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of baby carriages which have been imported from a source outside Australia by the retail trader, the sum of—
  - (i) the landed cost thereof; and
  - (ii) 40 per centum of such cost;
- (b) in respect of baby carriages which have been purchased by the retail trader from a manufacturer within the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—
  - (i) the cost thereof; and
  - (ii) 40 per centum of such cost;
- (c) in respect of baby carriages which have been purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler within the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—
  - (i) the cost thereof; and
  - (ii) 30 per centum of such cost.

## Exhibition of Price Tickets.

5. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail, any baby carriages shall attach thereto or display in relation thereto a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any label or ticket required by subparagraph (1) of this paragraph to be attached to or displayed in relation to any goods shall be in such form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those goods, and as to be properly associated with such goods.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any baby carriage specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

## Dripping.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 725.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 555 is hereby revoked.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“dripping” means any edible animal fat, or mixture of edible animal fats, other than butter, margarine, or pure lard;

“print” means, in relation to the sale of dripping, that such dripping is packed in greaseproof paper or packet carrying the trade name and address of the manufacturer, and is pre-wrapped.

## Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices (including, where any container is supplied therewith, the cost of such container) at which dripping may be sold, to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which dripping specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
