WHEREAS it is provided by section 186 of the Health Act, 1911-1950, that the term "offensive trade" means and includes, *inter alia*, any trade declared to be offensive by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation declare to be offensive trades by this Proclamation, declare to be offensive trades, under and for the purposes of the said Act, any of the trades, businesses or occupations usually carried on, in, or connected with the undermen-tioned works or establishments, that is to say:— Premises where poultry is killed, plucked, hung, dressed or cleaned.

WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request

of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public high-way, and such land shall thereupon and thence-forth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Perth Now of hereafter in force; and whereas the Perth City Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule here-under which has been acquired for a street or way within the Municipality of City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclama-tion declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclaand such land shall, from the date of this Procla-mation, be asolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 115 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1951, that the expres-sion "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days

therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 2nd day of June, 1952, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of section 115 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1951, and all shops (except those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule and registered small shops) and warehouses shall be closed.

Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947. Municipality of Bunbury. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 842/52. WHEREAS it is provided by subsection 1 (b) (iii) of section 480 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, that a Council may with the approval of the Governor expend out of the ordinary revenue of the Municipality any sum or sums not exceeding the aggregate 10 per cent. of such ordinary revenue for providing all forms of tourist propaganda both within the district and elsewhere in connection with or in relation to any tourist resort within the district of the Council; and whereas the Municipality of Bunbury are desirous of expending the sum of £250 from its ordinary revenue for tourist propaganda purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power vested in him in the said section of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Municipality of Bunbury to expend from its ordinary revenue the sum of £250 for tourist propaganda purposes.

Traffic Act, 1919-1951. Collie Coalfields Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

 - (iv) Twenty-one to thirty-two caravans or camps-three bathrooms for each sex and two laundries comprising each, one copper and two washing troughs.
 - (d) by inserting a new subparagraph (v) as follows:-
 - (v) For each succeeding twelve or part of twelve caravans or camps over 32-one additional bathroom for each sex and one additional laundry comprising one copper and two washing troughs.
 - For the purpose of the above a shower cubicle may be considered as a bathroom.

4A. No owner or occupier of land shall permit or suffer any caravan or camp to remain on any site at a greater distance than 150 feet from any of the sanitary conveniences and bathrooms and laundries as provided for in regulation 3 of these regulations.

- 3. Regulation 8 is amended by deleting paragraph (c).
- 4. Insert after regulation 8 a new regulation 9 as follows:-

9. Where a Local Authority has provided and defined land for caravan parking areas within its own district it shall provide and maintain in the areas sanitary conveniences, cooking, bathroom and laundry facilities and facilities for rubbish disposal on a scale corresponding to that set out in Regulation 3 of these Regulations.

(iv) Such consent may be granted absolutely or subject to any conditions or limitations that may be considered necessary, and neither the Council nor the Mayor and Town Clerk, as the case may be, shall be obliged to state any reasons for the granting or refusal thereof.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906-1947. City of Subiaco-By-law 6.

A By-law of the City of Subiaco under Section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and numbered 6 for prescribing Districts for the Location of Industry, Business and Residence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Subiaco order as follows:—

1. The area comprising the City of Subiaco District and all lands within its gazetted boundaries are hereby classified into districts for residential, business and industrial purposes.

2. (1) The industrial district shall comprise those lands described in Schedule 1 hereto and lots or parcels of land on which industries are established at the date of this by-law.

(2) Within such industrial district the following uses and buildings, and no others are permitted:---

- (a) Any of the uses and buildings permitted in the residential or business districts other than fish shops.
- (b) Any work, manufactory, industry or use not permitted in the business district, other than noxious trades as defined in the Health Act, 1911-1950.

3. (1) The business district shall comprise those lands described in Schedule 2 hereto, and lots or parcels of land on which business premises are erected at the date of this by-law.

(2) Within such business district the following uses and buildings, and no others are permitted:—

(a) Any of the uses permitted in the residential district.

- (b) Fish shops, but subject to the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1950.
- (c) Theatres, halls, clubs and places of amusement; offices, banks and hotels; fire stations, police stations, post offices and public buildings; shops, salesrooms and showrooms for the conduct of retail or wholesale business; workrooms (connected with retail business) in which not more than 50 per cent. of the total area is devoted to workrooms; garages, petrol selling stations and service stations; black-smithing and woodyard businesses; such other accessories as the Council may determine.

4. (1) The residential district shall comprise those lands described in Schedule 3 hereto.

(2) Within such residential district the following uses and buildings and no others are permitted:—

Residences, parks and other recreational uses; churches and schools.

5. Any person who shall erect any building in contravention of this by-law or who shall use any building or land in contravention of this by-law, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$.

6. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this by-law shall be made not later than six months from the date on which this by-law is first published in the *Government Gazette*.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 14th day of December, 1951, the Governor, acting under section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, empowered the Municipality of Geraldton to exercise as a power to make by-laws to have effect within its municipal district any power of making regulations conferred upon the Governor by the provisions of the said Act: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and the said Order in Council, the Municipality of Geraldton makes the following by-laws to have effect within the Municipal District in respect of which it is constituted.

1. The Municipality of Geraldton may, subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948.

2. Any dog seized pursuant to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, shall be held and disposed of in manner provided in this by-law:---

(a) Subject to compliance with the first proviso to section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, such dog may be destroyed or sold by an authorised officer

of the Municipality at any time after the expiration of 48 hours from the time of seizure, unless the owner thereof or a person authorised by him shall have paid the fees hereinafter provided for, and shall have taken delivery of the dog, and upon any such sale the purchaser shall become the lawful owner of the dog.

(b) No owner or person authorised by him shall be entitled to release of a dog while any such fees shall remain unpaid in respect of the dog.

(c) No owner or person authorised by him shall be entitled to release of a dog at a time outside the normal working hours of the authorised officer in charge of the pound.

(d) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore con-tained, but subject to the first proviso to section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, such dog may be deof the Dog Act, 1903-1948, such dog may be de-stroyed at any time upon authority from the Town Clerk of the Municipality if, in the opinion of the Town Clerk, it is too savage or noisy to be kept, or is suffering because of injury or sickness. (e) A person applying for release of any such dog shall prove to the satisfaction of the authorised

officer in charge of the pound the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery. Such officer may accept such proof as he considers satis-factory, and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Municipality in respect of a delivery pursuant thereto. 3. The respective fees to be payable in respect

of the seizing, care, detention and destruction of dogs seized as aforesaid shall be as follows:-

(a) The seizure of any dog—five shillings.
(b) The care and detention of any dog—two shillings and sixpence for each period of 24 hours from the seizure and for any fractional part of (c) The destruction of any dog—five shillings.
(c) The destruction of any dog—five shillings.

Such fees shall be the liability of the owner of the dog in respect of which the same are payable and shall be a debt due by such owner to the

4. If the Municipality shall at the request of the owner destroy any dog, whether seized as afore-said or not, such owner shall pay to the Munici-

pality a fee of five shillings. 5. The proceeds of the sale of any dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall be the property of the Municipality and receipt of such proceeds shall not relieve the owner of liability for fees. 6. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure,

care, detention or destruction of any dog shall not relieve the owner of liability to a penalty under any other provision of this by-law.

No person shall release any dog from a pound except in accordance with these by-laws. 8. No person shall obstruct or hinder any em-

ployee of the Municipality or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the Dog Act, 1903-1948, or these by-laws. 9. There is imposed by this by-law, as an abso-

9 There is imposed by this by-law, as an abso-lute prohibition, an obligation on the owner of any dog that the dog shall not enter or be in any of the places in this by-law prescribed, unless on a leash held by a person.

The following places are prescribed:-

(a) Every street, road, public reserve, public park, foreshore and sea beach within the area bounded by the Southerly side of Eleanor Street from Lewis Street to Cathedral Avenue, thence by the Westerly side of Cathedral Avenue to Marine Terrace, thence by the Southerly side of Marine Terrace to Gregory Street, to the municipal boundary running along Champion Bay, thence along such boundary to a point thereon due North of the starting point, and thence to the starting point.

(b) The area bounded on the Northerly side by the municipal boundary from the Easterly boundary of reserve No. 20606 along Champion Bay to the nearest point on such boundary to the harbour breakwater, thence by a line running due South for parallel to the said municipal boundary to a point two and one-half chains due South of the starting point, and thence to the starting point.

By-laws for the Management, Use and Letting of Canning Road Board Hall Buildings.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, the Canning Road Board doth hereby make the following by-laws for the management, use and letting of the Canning Town Hall, East Cannington Hall and Riverton Hall and Buildings.

Interpretation Clauses-In the construction of these by-laws "Hirer" shall mean any person making application or arrangements for the hire of

any hall, room, furniture, or crockery, or to whom the use of same is granted; "Board" shall mean the Canning Road Board; "Building" shall mean any hall, room, corridor, or any part of any hall or room under the control or management of the Canning Boad Board Road Board.

The rent of any hall or any part thereof, or 1 furniture, or crockery, shall be as set forth in Schedule hereto.

2 Applications for the hire of any building, furniture, or crockery shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time such building, furniture, or crockery is required. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring the building, furniture, or crockery shall be given in such application.

3. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day time rates shall be between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. Night time rates shall commence at 7 p.m.

4. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit with the Secretary an amount estimated to cover hall hire and any damage that may occur during the term of the engagement.

The hirer shall be responsible for any damage to the building, fittings, furniture, or crockery while in his use or charge, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damage as assessed by the Board.

6. The hirer shall, when the use of any hall crockery is allowed, as soon as possible after the term of the engagement, deliver all such crockery in a clean and sound condition, and any article not accounted for or in a cracked condition must be paid for at current rates.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building, furniture or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any arrangements made for the hire of any building, furniture or crockery.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building, furniture or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may without considering the priority of the applica-tion, determine to which applicant the building may be granted.

10. The hirer of the building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Act, and any other Act in force for the time being, applicable to such hiring and use of buildings. in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of the building. In the event of the use of any building being prevented under this by-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss on demogra incurred by the bing. or damage incurred by the hirer.

No spirituous liquors, wine, ale or other intoxicating drink shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of the engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

No smoking of tobacco, cigarettes or cigars 12. or other matter shall be permitted in the building, except by permission from the Board.

13. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter any building.

14. No person shall in any part of any building enter or be-

- (a) allowed to enter in any part of any building while intoxicated:
 - (b) guilty of any misbehaviour whatever.

15. No person shall-

- (a) damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of any building;
- (b) use profane or improper language in any building or within hearing of persons using same:
- (c) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything calculated to produce a riot, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in any building.

The hirer of any building shall be responsible 17. for-

- (a) maintaining good order and seeing that patrons comply with these by-laws;
- (b) any damage done to any building, fittings, furniture, fixtures, crockery ware, or other property of the Board.

No person shall remove or replace any elec-18 trical fitting without the permission of the Board.

The Secretary or other duly authorised officer 19. of the Board, or a police officer, shall be permitted to have ingress to any building or any part thereof during the term of the engagement, and every facility shall be given them for the enforcing of these by-laws.

20. Hirers may decorate any hall, using only fixtures specially provided for that purpose, and no person shall drive a nail into part of the walls, windows, fioors, doors, etc.

21. Decorations may be done in daylight free of charge, when the hall is not otherwise engaged, of charge, when the nam is not otherwise engaged, and at such times as the Board may permit. If the decorations are done at night, such charges may be made as the Board determines. All decorations must be removed from the premises within 24 hours from the commencement of the hiring period.

22. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

Board; "Board Room"—shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time; "District"—the district under the jurisdiction of the Mandurah Road Board; "Secretary"—the Secretary-Engineer of the Board. All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of the Secretary.

The duties of the Secretary shall be:-

(a) To attend all Board meetings.

(b) To attend committee meetings, when requested.

(c) To take notes for minutes and prepare reports of committees.

(d) To conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, and as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes.

(e) To answer questions on the Board's business. (f) To prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year.

(g) To supervise the preparation of the ratebooks and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the engineer or foreman, in accordance with the Board's resolutions.

(h) To summon the members to Board and committee meetings.

(i) To keep all books up to date, in accordance
with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board.
(j) To check all accounts sent in to the Board,

(j) To check all accounts sent in to the Board, and to see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.

(k) To report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

(1) To pay into the bank weekly, or as much more often as is required, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or more.

the aggregate to the sum of £5 or more. (m) To act, when required, as inspector in connection with the administration of all Statutes coming within the jurisdiction of the Board.

connection with the administration of all Statutes coming within the jurisdiction of the Board. (n) To see that no payment to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officers as may be acting temporarily in that capacity.

(o) To obey readily and cheerfully all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.

(p) To see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and to report as to such matters to the Board.

(q) To report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is capable of performing the duties allotted to him.

(r) To exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

(s) To see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts, and regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts.

(t) To be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and to see that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

(u) To keep in the safe all current books and legal documents when not in actual use, and to retain one key of the safe for office use, and to deposit the duplicate with the Board's bankers in the joint name of the Chairman and Secretary

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of the Board; to have locked in the safe at the end of each day such of the Board's moneys as remain unbanked; to have entered in the bank deposit book full details of all cheques and other moneys, and to obtain a proper deposit receipt therefor.

Duties of Engineer.

3. The duties of engineer shall be:----

(a) The engineer shall have the control of men, works, plant, and all property of the Board and shall issue instructions to the foreman, and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should the foreman be guilty of insubordination or disobedience, or be found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, the engineer shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary, shall suspend the foreman and report the matter to the next meeting of the Board.

(b) To prepare necessary plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all materials to be employed in such works; and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called. (c) To see that the work of cleaning and repair-

(c) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.

(d) To see that no labourers are engaged but those that are able bodied.

(e) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.

(f) To see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.

(g) To attend all Board and committee meetings if required.

(h) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board.

(i) To supply monthly, or as required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

4. (a) The collector shall collect moneys that may be due to the Board, issuing receipts on the Board's printed forms for payment and entering particulars of all payments in the book provided by the Board for that purpose.

(b) The collector shall make his financial report and payments to the Secretary at least every three days.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any officer under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more newspapers circulating in the district calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. 6. The election of all officers shall be conducted

6. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands unless a ballot be demanded. 7. The commencing salary or allowance

7. The commencing salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases before making the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present. 8. All complaints against servants of the Board

8. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaints not made in accordance with this by-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

9. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings adjourned. 10. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these by-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under section 131 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices of such special meetings shall have notified thereon the special business for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive at least seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting was called: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with a ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under section 144 of the Act, and the standing orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first complied with.

11. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board once in each month, on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

12. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper.

No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is present.

13. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from any part of such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

14. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

Voting.

15. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, under section 133 of the Act, and such Chairman shall not have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meeting.

16. (a) The minute book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board shall be entered by the Secretary. Minutes of the special or ordinary meeting shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of the proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

(b) Pasting or otherwise permanently affixing the minutes of the meeting of the Board to the leaves of the minute book shall be equivalent to the entry therein, and the reading of the minutes may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies thereof at least three days before the holding of such meetings, as provided under section 140 of the Act.

Standing Orders.

17. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any).

(b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

(c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members of the Board.

(d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.

tions contained therein. (e) Reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.

(f) Reports of sub-committees and officers and members.

(g) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.

(h) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment.

(i) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

(j) Motions of which previous notice has been given.

(k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under by-law 18).

(1) General business.

(m) Notice of motions.

18. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the standing orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all other.

Petitions.

19. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting same.

Tenders.

20. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

Order of Debate—Speakers must not Digress.

21. A member when speaking shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Correspondence.

22. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary. No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

Consideration of Reports.

23. (a) If, in a report of a committee, distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation.

(b) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

24. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

In the absence of a member who has placed 25 a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

26. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

27. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be Withdrawn without Consent. 28. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Formal Motion.

28A. Any member may move—(a) that the question be now put; or

(b) that the Board proceed to the next business.

On being seconded such motion shall be put immediately without debate.

Amendment may be Moyed.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

30. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

31. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

32. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Further Amendment may be Moved on Amended Question.

If an amendment has been carried the 33 question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How Subsequent Amendments may be Moved.

34. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

35. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under con-sideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member again to move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment, when Entitled to Priority.

36. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be Given.

Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply and if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put Without Argument. 38. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

39. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions except by permission of the Board.

Mode of Addressing Board.

40. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman and speak to each other by their official designation as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker Not to be Interrupted if in Order.

No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided.

Limitation as to Number of Speeches.

The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion, and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than five minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of Questions.

43. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

Upon a division being so called for, the 44. question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

Chairman may repeat Question.

45. The chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of Disorder.

Any member who at any meeting of the 46. Board or any committee commits a breach of any by-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss or uses any language which according to the common usage of gentlemen would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

47. (a) The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the chairman be disagreed with, then the usual parliamentary procedure may be adopted

Members Called to Order more than Once.

48. Any member who, having been called to order by the chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this by-law, or for any breach of decorum shall, upon the request of the chairman withdraw from the board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Disorder.

50. If disorder arise at any meeting, the chair man may adjourn the meeting for a period of 15 minutes and quit the chair. The Board, on resuming shall, on question being put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

51. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the by-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be sub-52. mitted to the finance committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account shall be part to the create of the Doard's account at such bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's bank or Treasury account must be signed by the chairman and any one member of the Board and in all cases countersigned by the secretary of the Board.

53. Subject to clause 4 (b) of these by-laws all moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant or clerk, be paid to the secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

Urgent Work.

54. In the case of emergency the following amounts may be expended by the persons men-tioned:—Chairman, up to $\pounds 10$; secretary and/or engineer, up to $\pounds 10$, which expenditure shall, if found correct, be confirmed by the next ordinary meeting

Unauthorised Expenditure.

55. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these by-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this by-law by such person.

Common Seal.

56. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Offences, Omissions or Neglects.

57. Any person guilty of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding 10 pounds, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done:-

 (a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, or windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under the control of the Board.

(b) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.

Preservation of Trees.

58. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub, or plant standing from its place any tree or shrub, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away or remove cut of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done. damage so done.

Gates Across Roads.

59. No person shall place a gate across any road without having first obtained the permission of the Board, and every such gate must not be less than 12ft. wide and to be well hinged and have proper catches, and must be erected to the satisfaction of the Board, and in accordance with section 189 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948. An annual fee of 5s. shall be paid in respect of each and every gate.

Lighting.

60. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

Water Supply.

61. Any person who shall injure or destroy any public well, bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage for water, or any machinery, appliances, or pro-perty used in connection therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and also shall pay to the Board the num of such approximately applied to the place of t the Board the sum of such damages.

the Board the sum of such damages. 62. Any person who shall waste, or allow to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in a public bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. 63. No person shall pollute or cause to be pol-luted any public water course, pool, tank, reservoir, or other public water within the district. 64. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well or any gate of any enclosure surround-

of any well, or any gate of any enclosure surroundof any well, of any gate of any enclosure surround-ing any dam or other water supply under the con-trol of the Board, shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws and notwithstanding any remedy for damages so caused shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5. 65. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for *bong fide* camping

watering of stock thereat, or for bona fide camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Watercourses.

66. No person shall cause or allow any obstruction in any watercourse, waterchannel, creek, or other water passing through or adjoining or abutting on his property, either by construction of permanent or temporary weirs or dams, or by allowing any accumulation of rubbish, soil, sand, or dead or growing scrub, or timber, and shall at least once in every year so clean and maintain such watercourses, waterchannels, or creeks so as to retain their full natural discharging capacity.

Sand and Timber.

67. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a license shall forfeit and

68. The owners of vacant townsite lots within the district, shall, when required by the Board, clear such lot of trees, shrub, or undergrowth, wholly or partially, and within such time as may be directed by the Board. Penalty for breach not exceeding £5.

Depasturing of Cattle.

Any person who shall turn loose, or suffer **6**9. o9. Any person who shall turn loose, or suffer any kind of animal belonging to him or under his control to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground, or reserve of the district, without written permission of the Board, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

70. (a) The owner of any animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall not permit such animal to be ridden or allowed to stray on any road, unfenced land, or reserve, within the district. Any animal so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed without notice and at the owner's expense.

(b) The owner or driver of any such animal shall be liable, if convicted, of a breach of this by-law, to a penalty not exceeding £10, and not less than £2.

Straying Stock.

71. No owner or person having the custody or control of any animal shall cause, permit, or suffer such animal to stray on any road, public reserve, or other public place, or on any unfenced land abutting thereon within the boundary of the district.

72. (a) Any contravention of by-law 71 shall be an offence punishable under these by-laws, if the animal is a bull, boar, or stallion, by a fine not exceeding £20, and not less than £2.

(b) In any other case, by a fine not exceeding £10, and not less than 10s.

73. Provided that by-law 71 shall not apply in the case of stock whilst in the charge of the town ranger duly appointed by the Board.

Crossing Places.

74. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any public way requir ing access thereto with horse or vehicle from such street to such land across any existing footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary.

Public Pound, etc.

75. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound, fence, gate, lock, shed, trough, or other premises, the property of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

76. Any person who shall break, obliterate, deface or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by the Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882, or any subsequent amendments thereof shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

77. Any person who shall release or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law, and shall be on conviction liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Poundage, and Driving Charges.

78. The following charges as poundage fees and driving charges within the area under the control of the Board in respect of cattle impounded for trespass upon any road, track, right-of-way or reserves within the area under the control of the Board shall be:-

Maximum charge to one owner, £5.

79. No person shall at any one time drive more than five head of cattle, sheep, horses, goats, or pigs, or any other animals on or along any thoroughfare in that part of Mandurah bounded by and including Hackett Street, George Street, Pinjarra Road, and Mandurah Terrace, between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 3 p.m. on any day.

Damaging Property.

80. Any person who-

- (a) Cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) erects any structure without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water-table of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) Draws upon any road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachments trails or drags upon a road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

Any person who draws upon any road any 81 vehicle the wheel or wheels which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

To Protect Bridges from Fire,

82. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board), or who shall place any rushes or other infiammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1, and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees Falling Across Road.

83. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper pre-caution against such fire spreading.

84. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon any road or track, or any other property under the control of the Board without the permission of the Board.

Park Lands, Reserves and Recreation Grounds.

85. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes excepting as otherwise provided for in these by-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings or trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds or reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for each such occasion, and comply with the provisions of these by-laws and any regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

86. The person or persons or club receiving the exclusive right referred to in by-law 88 may charge the public for admission to the sports or amuse-ments for which the exclusive right to use the ground is granted.

87. No horses, cattle or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands, or recreation grounds without

the written permission of the Board. 88. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner; and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police officer or officer of the

Board. 89. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves on a Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

90. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, nor carry on any games, or boxing, or other similar shows, nor use any firearms, except with the express sanction of the Board, and any pay-

91. Such charge shall not exceed two shillings and six pence for each adult and one shilling for each child under 15 years of age; children under five years when accompanied by an adult shall have free admission. All vehicles shall pay one

shilling each. 92. The Board, or any person duly authorised, may make charges for admission to any reserve or defined portion thereof.

93. Such person to whom the use of any reserve is given for picnic sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding £5 shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish. After the removal of such rubbish to the satisfaction of the Board, the deposit shall be returned, less any actual expense which the Board may have incurred in the removal of such rubbish. 94. No person shall damage or deface the walls

or fittings of any public convenience or shelter shed, or injure any tree, shrub or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds or reserves. Any person offending against this by-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Foreshore.

95. Boats.—No person is permitted to anchor any rowing boat, yacht or launch within a distance of 43 yards from the foreshore retaining wall between the town jetty and the peninsula footbridge.

96. No person shall moor any boat to any part of the bathing pavilion jetty.

Public Reserves-Camping.

97. In the construction of this by-law and bylaws 98 to 123 inclusive, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Camp" means camp as defined under the Camps and Caravan Regulations made under the Health Act, 1911-1950, and, published in the Government Gazette on the 16th December, 1949.

"Camping Area" means an area set aside and marked out by the Road Board for camping on a reserve.

'Inspector'' means an inspector or other officer authorised by the Board to be an inspector.

"License" means a license issued.

"Licensee" means the person named in a license as the person to whom the license is issued.

"Reserve" means a public reserve as defined in section 5 of the Road Districts Act.

98. No person shall camp on any reserve within the townsite of Mandurah, except on that site set aside for this purpose, by the Board.

99. No person shall place a caravan, tent or other structure on any reserve for the purpose of letting or hiring same for gain or reward, without the written consent of the Board.

(a) No person shall camp on any reserve 100. except in a caravan tent or other shelter approved by an inspector or upon a camping area for which

there is current a license on which he is named. (b) No person shall be entitled as of right to obtain a license.

101. The receipt for rental due for the period of occupation of the camping site by the person named thereon, shall be the license referred to in by-law 100 (a). 102. The fees set out in by-law 118 hereto shall

be paid to the Board in advance for a license.

103. No person other than an inspector shall enter on a camping allotment when it is occupied except by the permission of the licensee.

104. A licensee shall not permit any part of his camp or anything used in connection therewith to encroach or to be placed outside the limits of his camping allotment.

105. A licensee shall take care that neither he nor any person occupying his camping area shall

waste water supplied by the Board. 106. A licensee shall at all times maintain his camping allotment in a clean and tidy condition. 107.

(a) No refuse or rubbish shall be buried or scattered on the reserve. (b) A licensee shall cause all refuse or rubbish

from his camping allotment forthwith to be placed in one of the receptacles provided by the Board for that purpose.

108. (a) No person shall injure any property of (b) A licensee shall be liable to the Board for

all damage to the Board's property on his camping allotment caused during his occupation thereof.

109. A licensee shall not permit any animal or captive bird to create a nuisance on any camping area.

110. Every person occupying a camping allot-ment shall obey the reasonable directions of an inspector.

111. An inspector shall be entitled to enter a camping allotment at all reasonable times for the purpose of these by-laws.

112. A licensee shall on demand produce his license to an inspector.

113. No person shall misconduct himself or indulge in any noisy riotous or indecent conduct or use any indecent or improper language or offend against decency as regards dress in or near any camping allotment.

114. (a) All persons occupying a camping area shall use the sanitary conveniences provided by the Board.

(b) No private conveniences shall be permitted

on any camping area. 115. No person shall cause any damage to any tree, shrub, grass or fixture in or near to a camping area

116. If in his opinion, it is desirable to do so, the secretary may at any time, without notice, revoke a license either totally or as regards any person named therein. No person shall have any right to damages or compensation by reason of any such revocation. Any person so named may appeal to the Board against the decision of the secretary, but such decision by the secretary shall

operate until amended by the Board. 117. Upon the termination of his license a licensee shall vacate his camping allotment and shall leave the same clean and tidy.

118. The fees for camping on a reserve shall be 2s. 6d. per day or 15s. per week. 119. No camp shall be erected within 15ft. of

any other camp or roadway.

Ī20. A camping allotment shall be used for not more than one vehicle, tent and cooking facilities or two tents and cooking facilities and shall not exceed an area of 25ft. x 30ft.

121. No person shall occupy the same site on a camping area for a period exceeding three weeks

122. The camping area shall be used for the purpose of temporary camping only, and no per-manent structure shall be erected on the reserve.

123. Every person offending against any of the provisions of by-laws 97 to 123 inclusive, shall be liable for every such offence on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Stall, Hawkers, etc.

124. No person, unless he be a holder of a stall license issued by the Board and shall have paid the prescribed fee therefor, shall place or erect within the district any movable, temporarily fixed, or fixed stall, including any vehicle used or in-tended to be used as a stall for the sale of any meat, game, poultry, fruit, vegetables, food or any

articles or merchandise, in or near any street or way, or in or on any footpath, right-of-way or reserve. The Board reserves the right to allocate the position to be occupied by any such stall or stand. The fees for a stall or stand shall be a maximum of £5 per week. License must be produced on demand to any police officer or officer of the Board.

125. No person shall hawk, peddle, or cry food-stuffs or wares of any description within the district unless he shall be the holder of a hawker's license issued by the Board. Provided that nothing in these by-laws, shall read to apply to any storekeeper registered under the Shops and Factories Act within the district who may be fulfilling by delivery bona fide orders for the goods of his business or store, nor to any ratepayer or occupier of the district who may be disposing of the bona fide primary products of his or her property nde primary products of his of her property situated within the district. Licenses must be pro-duced on demand to any police officer or officer of the Board. The fees for a hawker's license shall be 20s. per annum.

126. Neither stall licenses nor hawkers' licenses are in any way transferable, either by way of loan, gift, sale or assignment.

Appointment of Employees.

127.(1) The Secretary of the Mandurah Road Board is hereby authorised, acting for and on behalf of the Board, to employ any casual or weekly servant required by the Board, in connec-tion with any works, but shall report the fact of the employment of any such servant to the Board at its meeting next following such employment, and the Board shall be deemed to have ratified the employment of any such servant, and such employment may be continued unless at such meeting the Board by resolution directs that the employment of the servant shall be discontinued.

(2) The authority given by the by-law shall be supplementary to and shall not derogate from the power of the Chairman of the Board under section 211 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948.

Penalties.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers 128. any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

129. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these by-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

130. All general by-laws which obtained in this district previous to this date are hereby repealed. Passed and adopted by resolution of the Man-

durah Road Board on the 21st day of April, 1952.
