HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950, has been pleased to make the Fauna Pro-tection Act Regulations, 1952, set forth in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fauna Protection Act Regulations, 1952.

2 These regulations are divided into parts as follows:-----

Part 1-Licenses.

Part 2-Royalties.

Part 3-Caging of Fauna.

Part 4-Honorary Wardens.

Part 5-Control of Sanctuaries.

Part 6-Sale of Immature Fauna.

Part 7-Miscellaneous Provisions.

Appendix-Forms.

Part 1-Licenses.

3.-Persons Required to be Licensed.

All persons taking kangaroos for food purposes, or taking fauna which is causing damage to property, or taking fauna for the purpose of gain or reward, or buying, selling or otherwise dealing in the skins of marsupial fauna, or buying, selling or otherwise dealing in fauna other than marsupial fauna, or taking fauna for scientific or zoological purposes, or importing into or exporting from Western Australia any live fauna, shall hold a license in accordance with regulation 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12, as the case requires.

4.-License to take Kangaroos for Food Purposes only.

(1) Every license issued to take kangaroos for food purposes shall be in Form "A" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee to be paid for every such license shall be five shillings.

(3) Every such license shall authorise the taking of not more than one kangaroo during each week of the term of the license.

(4) Within one month of the expiration of any such license the holder shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of Kangaroo taken during the term of the license and the locality where such kangaroos were taken, together with particulars of disposal of the skins of such kangaroos.

5.-License to take Fauna Causing Damage to Property.

(1) Every license to take fauna which is causing damage to property shall be in Form "B" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) Every such license shall expire on the date stated therein.

(3) The fee for every such license shall be five shillings.

(4) Within one month of the expiration of any such license the holder shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of fauna taken during the term of the license and the locality where such species was taken, together with particulars of disposal of such fauna.

6.-License to take Marsupials for Gain or Reward.

(1) Every license to take marsupial fauna for the purpose of gain or reward shall be in Form "C" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee to be paid for every such license shall be two pounds.

(3) No such license shall authorise the taking of any marsupial fauna which is protected for any period of time throughout the whole or part or parts of the State during such period of time and in such part or parts, or during a close season for any such fauna.

(4) Within one month of the expiration of any such license the holder shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of fauna taken during the term of the license, and the locality where such species was taken, together with particulars of disposal of such fauna.

7.-License to Buy, Sell, or in any other way Deal in Skins of Marsupial Fauna.

(1) Every license to buy, sell or otherwise deal with skins of marsupial fauna for the purpose of gain or reward shall be in Form "D" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee to be paid for every such license shall be five pounds.

(3) No such license shall be construed so as to authorise any agent of the holder or any person who is not an employee of the holder to operate under such license.

(4) The holder of every such license shall keep a book of record in Form "J" in the Appendix to these regulations and immediately the skin of any marsupial fauna is received for sale enter in such book the name and address of the person from whom such skin was received, and the number of the license held by such person, together with particulars of the disposal of such skin.

(5) The holder of every such license shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna, a monthly return in Form "K" in the Appendix to these regulations.
(6) The holder of every license issued under this regulation shall exhibit

the said license in a prominent position at his place of business.

8.-License to take Fauna other than Marsupials for Gain or Reward.

(1) Every license to take fauna other than marsupial fauna for the purpose of gain or reward shall be in Form "E" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee to be paid for every such license shall be two pounds.

(3) No such license shall authorise the taking of any fauna which is protected for any period of time throughout the whole or part or parts of the State during such period of time and in such part or parts, or during a close season for such fauna.

(4) Within one month of the expiration of any such license the holder shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of fauna taken during the term of the license and the locality where each such species was taken, together with particulars of disposal of such fauna.

9.—License to Buy, Sell, or in any other way Deal in Fauna other than Marsupials.

(1) Every license to buy, sell or otherwise deal in fauna other than marsupial fauna for the purpose of gain or reward shall be in Form "F" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee to be paid for every such license shall be five pounds.

(3) The holder of every such license shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna, a monthly return in Form "L" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(4) The holder of every license issued under this regulation shall exhibit the said license in a prominent position at his place of business.

10.-License to take Fauna for Scientific or Zoological Purposes.

(1) Every license to take fauna for scientific or zoological purposes shall be in Form "G" in the Appendix to these regulations.
(2) No fee shall be chargeable in respect of any such license.
(3) Every such license shall endure for such period, not exceeding twelve

nonths, as the Minister may determine. (4) Within one month of the expiration of every such license, the holder

shall furnish to the Chief Warden of Fauna a return setting out in full detail the number of each species of fauna taken during the term of the license, and the locality where such species was taken, together with particulars of disposal of such fauna.

11.—License to Export Live Fauna.

(1) Every license to export live fauna from Western Australia shall be in Form "H" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) The fee for every such license, other than a license issued to the Acclimatisation Committee appointed under the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898, shall be one pound. No fee shall be payable in respect or any license issued

(3) No such license shall be issued unless the exporter satisfies the Chief Warden of Fauna that the appropriate authority of the State or country to which the fauna is proposed to be exported approves of the importation of such fauna to such State or country.

(4) A separate license shall be held in respect of each parcel of live fauna intended to be exported.

(5) No person shall accept for carriage any live fauna intended for export unless the consignor is the holder of a license issued under this regulation.

12.—License to Import Live Fauna.

(1) Every license to import live fauna into Western Australia shall be in Form "I" in the Appendix to these regulations.

(2) No such license shall be issued unless the importer satisfies the Chief Warden of Fauna that the appropriate authority of the State or country from which the fauna is intended to be imported approves of the export of such

fauna from such State or country. (3) The fee for every such license, other than a license issued to the Acclimatisation Committee appointed under the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898, shall be one pound. No fee shall be payable in respect of any license issued to the said Acclimatisation Committee.

(4) A separate license shall be held in respect of each parcel of live fauna intended to be imported.

13.—Application for and Duration of Licenses.

(1) Every application for licenses in pursuance of these regulations shall be made in writing to the Chief Warden of Fauna and shall set out the residential address of the applicant and shall be signed by the applicant.

(2) Every license issued in pursuance to regulations 4, 6, 7, 8, and 9, shall be for a period of twelve months from the date of issue and no longer.

Part 2-Royalties.

(1) Skins of all marsupial fauna other than possums, grey kangaroo 14. and red kangaroo, are exempt from payment of royalty. (2) The following are the rates at which skins of marsupial fauna taken

in Western Australia are charged with payment of royalty:-

15. Every skin of marsupial fauna charged with or exempt from the pay-ment of royalty shall be branded with the brand in Form "M" in the Appendix to these regulations.

Part 3-Caging of Fauna.

16. Every person having fauna in captivity or consigning fauna for sale shall comply with the following conditions:-

-Birds (other than Emus and Similar Large Birds).

(1) Birds kept in captivity or consigned for sale shall be housed in cages of box type totally enclosed at top, sides and bottom, the front of which shall be of wire.

(2) Proper ventilation shall be provided in all cages.

(3) Perches in cages shall not be placed immediately above one another and shall be so arranged that droppings shall not fall on birds when perched. (4) Roosting perches, with a clearance of at least two inches from the roof, shall be provided in all cages. In addition one or two perches shall be provided for use as steps in moving up or down. In the case of cages containing only one bird one perch shall be considered sufficient.

(5) All perches in a cage shall be constructed of wood, and shall be round in shape and of a size suitable for the bird or birds housed in such cage.

(6) Sufficient space shall be provided in all cages to enable birds contained therein to roost comfortably without overcrowding, as follows:— (a) When caged for transport, the space which shall be allowed for

(7) Sufficient drinking vessels and food receptacles shall be placed in front of all cages and in such a position that no perches are immediately above them.

B.—Animals (such as Kangaroos, Wallabies and the like) and Large Birds (such as Emus).

(1) Animals (such as kangaroos, wallabies and the like) and large birds (such as emus) shall be allowed sufficient room to enable them to turn completely around and to stand erect at full height in the cage and to obtain free movement therein.

(2) Sufficient drinking vessels and food receptacles shall be placed in all cages.

Part 4-Honorary Wardens.

(1) An honorary warden may taken possession and control of any 17. fauna which the honorary warden on reasonable grounds believes to be involved in the commission of an offence, and any weapon, instrument, illegal device or other thing or means, which the honorary warden on reasonable grounds believes has been used, is being used, or is about to be used by the offender for the commission of the offence, and deliver them into custody of a member of the Police Force to be dealt with according to law.

(2) When an honorary warden on reasonable grounds suspects a person is committing or has committed an offence against the Act or regulations he may require the person to give to him the person's name and address.

(3) An honorary warden may require any person to produce any license issued to him under these regulations.

(4) No person shall-

- (a) refuse to produce any license issued to him pursuant to the pro-visions of this Act or regulations when required to do so by an honorary warden;
- (b) refuse to state his name or address when lawfully required to do so by an honorary warden;
- (c) state a false name or address to an honorary warden when lawfully required by an honorary warden to give his name and address:
- (d) use abusive language to an honorary warden.

(5) It shall be the duty of every honorary warden to report quarterly to the Chief Warden of Fauna in relation to the condition of the fauna in the municipal or road district in which he resides, and of his activities as an honorary warden.

Part 5-Control of Sanctuaries.

(1) The control of all sanctuaries proclaimed under the Fauna Pro-18. tection Act, 1950, shall be vested in the Fauna Protection Advisory Committee. (2) No person shall take any fauna on a sanctuary proclaimed under the

Fauna Protection Act, 1950, without authority in writing of the said Committee.

(3) No person shall, except under the authority of the said Committee, operate or discharge any firearm or throw or discharge any stone or other missile on any part of a sanctuary.

Part 6-Sale of Immature Fauna.

19. No person shall sell, or consign, offer, or expose for sale any egg of any protected fauna or any young native fauna not fully fledged or able to stand, or not able to feed unaided.

Part 7-Miscellaneous Provisions.

20.—Illegal Devices for Taking of Fauna.

(1) No person shall take or attempt to take any fauna with any gun, other than such a gun as is habitually raised at arm's length and fired without other support from the shoulder, or with any gun to which a silencing device is fitted.

(2) No person shall use traps or decoy-traps for the capture of ducks.
(3) No person shall use a spot-light, electric torch or lantern of any kind

for taking any wild duck. (4) No person shall drive any bird over shooters by means of motor vehicles, aircraft, power boat or other means.

(5) No person shall use, apply, or expose bird-lime or any viscid substance in such manner or in such circumstances that the same may catch or ensnare any bird.

21.—Marking of Wild Fauna.

No person shall mark any species of wild fauna, protected or unprotected, by means of bands, rings, coloured dyes, or any other means having the object of identifying particular individuals, except by the permission in writing of the Chief Warden of Fauna, who may specify any conditions to be observed by the persons so authorised.

22.—Inspection of Books.

Any warden may at any reasonable time inspect the book of record in Form "J" and make extracts therefrom.

23.—Disposal of Certain Fauna.

The skins of any marsupials taken under the authority of licenses issued pursuant to regulations 4 and 5 may be disposed of for the purpose of gain or reward.

24.—Skins Consigned for Sale.

Every person consigning for sale skins of marsupial fauna shall attach to the package of such skins a label on which is legibly written the name and address of the consignor and the number of the license under the authority of which the skins were taken.

25.—Purchase of Certain Fauna Illegal.

No person licensed pursuant to regulations 7 and 9 shall purchase any fauna from, or receive for sale on behalf of, or deal in fauna received from, any person who is not the holder of a license issued in acordance with these regulations.

26.—Bag Limit for Ducks.

No person shall in any portion of the State take or attempt to take wild ducks by any means whatsoever in any quantity greater than fifteen in any one day.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 6 of 1952.

Registered 16th May, 1952.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, this 18th day of April, 1952, between the Chairman and Members of the Kalgoorlie Road Board (hereinafter termed the employer) of the one part and the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Road Board Labourers' Union of Workers, being a Union of Workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1912-1935 (hereinafter termed the employees) of the other part; whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

Casual hands employed for less than one week to receive 1s. per day above the rate specified for the particular work on which they are engaged.

Men working with tar, bitumen, colas or other road-making compounds to receive 1s. 2d. per day above the ordinary rate paid them as dirt money.

Men tarring sanitary pans to be paid 1s. 2d. per day over the rate paid to sanitary workers, such as stagemen.

2.—Hours of Labour.

Generally.—The hours of labour for all employees (except stablemen) shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week, divided as follows:—

On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays work shall commence at 7.30 a.m. and continue with three-quarters of an hour for dinner, and finish at 4.15 p.m. Provided always and it is hereby mutually agreed, that in the event of any essential services having to be attended to on a Saturday, employees to be called in rotation to perform such services, and the time so worked shall be taken off by the employee during the week.

Should more than four (4) hours be worked on a Saturday, all the time over the four (4) hours to be paid for at overtime rates.

In the event of a dispute arising as to what constitutes essential services having to be attended to, the matter to be referred to the Conciliation Committee provided for in this agreement, who shall have power to decide same, and the decision arrived at shall be binding on both parties.

3.—Week's Work.

On Mondays to Fridays inclusive, eight (8) hours excluding lunch time shall comprise the week's work.

4.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the hours herein stated, each day's work to stand by itself, shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for at the following rates:—

- For the first two (2) hours after the ordinary time for ceasing work—Time and a quarter.
- After the two (2) hours and up to four (4) hours—Time and a half.
- After the first four (4) hours and until the ordinary time for re-commencing work— Double time.
- Any employee called back to work after leaving the job at the completion of the hours set out in this agreement, shall be paid at double time rates for all time worked until the ordinary time for re-commencing work.
- All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rates.
- Sundays, for the purpose of this clause, shall be from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday.

When an employee is working outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the registered office of the Kalgoorlie Foad Board, he shall be paid 7s. 6d. per day, in addition to his ordinary wages, as campingout allowance.

6.—Drinking Water.

The employer shall provide free, sufficient drinking water for all employees working away from home.

7.—Tent Accommodation.

The employer shall provide housing or tent accommodation of the following dimensions for its employees when working outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the registered office of the Kalgoorlie Road Board:—

For one man a tent 6ft. x 8ft. with suitable fiy. For two men a tent 8ft. x 10ft. with suitable fiy. Employees to pay 1s. per week for the use of same.

8.—Shifting Camp.

All shifting of camp to be done in employer's time.

9.—Travelling Time.

In the case of employment at a distance of seven miles from the registered office of the Kalgoorlie Road Board, all the time during which the employee is travelling to and from the place of employment shall be treated as time of duty, and paid for in addition to time of actual work. This clause to mean starting work on a new job and returning to the Board's office on completion of such work

to the Board's office on completion of such work. When going to a job in the bush, all reasonable goods and camping outfits to be collected at their homes and delivered at their homes on the completion of the job.

10.—Employees to Visit Homes at Weekends.

When men are working over a radius of seven miles from the Board's office, a truck to be provided for the purpose of obtaining stores at Kalgoorlie at the weekends.

Employees to have the right of returning to their homes in same, in rotation, to the capacity of the said truck.

11.—Employees to be Conveyed to and from Work.

When working five (5) miles or more, but under seven miles, from the Road Board office, men to be conveyed both ways by the Board, and in the Board's time, or to be allowed travelling time.

12.—Attendance on Horses.

Any employee having to feed and attend their own horses shall be paid 1s. per day extra. When an employee is temporarily driving two or more horses in a team, no extra payment above the amount stated will be paid while feeding and attending such horses comprising the team.

13. Any employee who has to feed and attend horses on Sundays or holidays within a radius of seven miles of the Board's office shall be paid double time rates at his ordinary pay for all time worked.

14. All employees when out of the district (outside a radius of seven miles of the Board's office), having to remain in charge of stores or material on a Sunday shall receive the rate set out in this agreement for stablemen for that day's work, one man only being necessary to remain in charge of a number of horses.

Employees to receive ordinary rates for Saturday and Sunday.

15. Where six (6) or more horses are engaged, a stableman to be employed on full time.

16.—Holidays (Public).

Every employee shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, either Boulder or Kalgoorlie Cup Day.

Employees compelled to work on such days shall be paid at double time rates.

Casual hands in the employ of the Board for more than one week continuously shall be entitled to those five (5) public holidays should those days fall due during the period of their employment. When a public holiday included in this Agreement falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday or Tuesday to be observed as a holiday.

17.--Holidays (Annual Leave).

Every employee shall in addition to Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day and either Kalgoorlie or Boulder Cup Day, be allowed three weeks' holiday including fifteen (15) working days on full pay once in each year.

Employees working less than twelve (12) months shall be allowed one and one-quarter $(1\frac{1}{4})$ shifts holiday pay for each month employed, provided that should the employment be terminated before the end of a month, he shall be paid a proportionate amount as holiday pay for such portion of month worked.

For the purpose of this clause, twenty (20) days to be calculated a month.

No holiday pay will be granted unless employee is one month in Board's employment.

If a holiday, as above defined, occurs during a period of sickness or accident of an employee, full pay shall be granted to the employee provided a satisfactory medical certificate be or has been furnished to the Board by or on behalf of such employee and that such period of sickness has not been of more than one month's duration at the time when such holiday occurs.

17a.—Long Service Leave.

(1) All full-time workers after serving the Chairman and members of the Kalgoorlie Road Board continuously for ten (10) years will be entitled, subject to the following conditions, to three (3) months' long service leave on full pay, to be granted at the convenience of the employer.

In regard to workers engaged at the date of this agreement, with the Kalgoorlie Road Board, continuous service as from 1st January, 1936, shall be deemed to be service for the purpose of this agreement, provided that full-time service with the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September, 1939 and the date of this agreement shall be deemed to be service for the purpose of this agreement. Provided also that any employee leaving the service of the employer, who has served continuously for at least three years next before his retirement, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata for the period of his employment. No period or periods of continuous service shall count for the purpose of calculating long service leave if the worker is out of the employ of the Kalgoorlie Road Board for any period exceeding six months at any one time.

(2) Workers will be similarly entitled to a further period of three months' long service leave for every subsequent 10 years' service.

(3) Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. During long service leave no worker shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this condition will be followed by dismissal.

(4) Workers shall be paid their salary in advance at the rate of pay equal to the average daily rate over the preceding twelve (12) months.

(5) Any worker who is eligible for long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service of the employer, shall be paid for such long service due.

(6) If a deceased worker would have been entitled to long service leave at the date of his death the amount of payment in lieu thereof shall be paid on claim to the next of kin.

(7) District allowance will not be paid during the period of long service leave, except when the worker or abovementioned dependants of the worker remain in the district.

18.—Annual Leave Mixed Functions.

Any employee who has been engaged on mixed functions during the year, when his annual leave falls due, shall be paid for such leave at a rate computed on the average weekly earnings of such employee for the twelve months preceding such leave.

19.—Sick Pay.

After six (6) months' service, a worker shall-be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health at the rate of one (1) day's pay for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill health shall be limited to six (6) days' pay in each calendar year.

Sick pay not availed of may accumulate to the extent of a maximum of eighteen days to be drawn upon at such times as absence on account of sickness warrants, but the said eighteen days shall be the maximum which can be claimed in any one year irrespective of the years worked without a sick claim. Provided that if the employment is determined no payment shall be made for sick leave not taken. This clause shall not apply where the employee is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

An employee shall not be entitled to receive sick pay from his employer for any time lost through results of an accident not arising out of, or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default. No employee shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for a period of three (3) days or more.

20.—Oilers.

Oilers of a suitable size to be provided for men having to work in the rain.

21.—Aprons.

Two aprons each per year to be provided for use of the drivers, offsiders and stagemen in the Sanitary Department if required.

Goggles and respirators to be provided to all men employed at rock-crushing plant or men carting metal therefrom.

Two (2) pairs of boots to be supplied to stagemen per year if required.

Two (2) suits of overalls and two (2) pairs of boots per year to be provided to men working with tar, colas or any other tar compounds, if required.

22.—Mixed Functions.

Any employees using tradesmen's tools and doing the work of a tradesman shall be paid the ruling rate in the district for the class of work on which he is employed, and in the case of an employee taking the place of a higher-paid employee, or doing work classed at a higher rate of pay, such employee shall be paid the higher rate of wages. If employed at the higher rate of wages for two or more hours he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that shift.

23.—First-aid Outfits.

The Board shall at depots and stables provide full and complete first-aid outfits for the use of employees and shall from time to time keep same renewed and in proper order. When men are working in the bush, each outfit to comply with St. John Ambulance Association. On other small jobs a small emergency outfit to be provided.

24.—Full Payment for Shift.

After beginning a shift, employees shall not be paid for less than a full shift unless they leave of their own accord, or dismissed for misconduct.

25.—Inspection of Time and Pay Sheets.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be be allowed to collect union dues outside the office, and shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relative to any employee affected by this Agreement, and make extracts therefrom at the convenience of the staff officers.

26.—Order of Employment.

In the event of the full complement of men not being required, men shall be employed in rotation.

27.-Services not Required.

Any employee turning up to work at the usual starting time, if his services are not required, and unless previously notified, he shall be paid for two hours at the ruling rate.

28.—Preference to Unionists.

All employees must become members of the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Road Board Labourers' Union of Workers within three (3) weeks of being engaged, the Union agreeing to accept as members any employee of the Board.

This clause to mean only those employees provided for in this Agreement and schedule of wages herein, and not to tradesmen and enginedrivers.

29.—Contracts let by Board.

In all contracts let by the Board for work to be performed, the rates of pay and conditions of work as set out in this Agreement shall be embodied in the conditions of contract.

30.-Rights and Privileges.

Any employee at the date of the signing of this Agreement, who is in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed, or in receipt of any privilege or allowance other than herein provided, shall not suffer by reason of this Agreement any reduction in the amount which such employee was receiving or loss of any privilege or allowance.

31.---Seniority.

All things being equal, seniority to be given for all positions for promotion, or positions carrying a higher rate of pay.

32.-Conciliation Committee.

In the event of any new class of work being introduced, not provided for in this Agreement, a conciliation committee, consisting of two members of the Board, and two members of the Union, with an independent chairman, shall meet and decide the rates of pay and conditions appertaining to such work such work.

33.—Interpretation Clauses.

For the purpose of this Agreement, the terms used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

Motor truck drivers in the Sanitary Department. Means one who is driving the truck and collecting pans containing nightsoil from house to house, also collecting liquid wastes from hotels, laundries, and other premises, also urine in pans and tanks.

Vanmen and Slopmen.-Means men engaged collecting pans containing nightsoil from house to house, also liquid wastes from hotels, laundries and other premises, also urine in pans and tanks, but does not drive the truck. This interpretation to apply to offsiders to sanitary drivers.

Mean cleaning Septic Tanks.—To mean men engaged cleaning out septic tanks and soak wells, but not merely pumping liquid from the septic tank and soak wells.

Stagemen.-Means one who is engaged cleaning pans at the cleansing stage, and loading nightsoil in trucks and tanks to be carried to the trenches.

Trenchmen.-Means one engaged after the trenches have been ploughed, who covers with earth or other material nightsoil deposited in same, also who digs and cleans the trenches.

Ploughmen at the Sanitary Depot.-Means one who ploughs trenches for the reception of nightsoil and any other land required.

Rubbishmen driving motor truck.-Means one who performs the double duty of driving the truck and picking up rubbish.

Rubbishmen.—Means one who is engaged collect-ing rubbish which has been deposited by householders in boxes and other receptacles, also rubbish thrown in the streets and right-of-ways, but does not drive the truck.

Men tarring pans.-Means those engaged tarring pans in use, after being cleaned, or new pans before use.

Concreters .-- Means one who does any concrete work under the direction of the engineer or foreman

Spreaders.—Is one who is engaged spreading metal or other material on new works being reconstructed, or men engaged levelling or spreading after the scarifier, but shall not include horsedrivers or motor drivers spreading their own loads or doing patching work.

Casual Hand .- Means anyone employed by the Board for less than one week.

Labourer not Scheduled.—Means one who is engaged on any class of work as a labourer not otherwise specified in the Agreement.

Minimum Wage.-The minimum wage shall be two hundred and nineteen shillings and eightpence per week of forty (40) hours. Notwithstanding that the rate is expressed in a weekly amount, it is hereby declared that the contract of service is a daily contract.

Week's Work .--- On Mondays to Fridays inclusive, eight hours excluding lunchtime, shall comprise the week's work.

Terms of Agreement.—This Agreement shall come into force on the day of the date herein, and shall remain in force for the period of three (3) years thence next ensuing, and thereafter subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935, and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Eastern Goldfields District.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Indus-THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, this 8th day of May, 1952, between the Chief Secretary for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister") of the one part, and the Western Australian Gaol Officers' Union of Workers, Fremantle (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), of the other part, witnesseth:—

1.—Title.

3.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of two (2) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

4.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall operate throughout the State of Western Australia and shall apply to all members of the West Australian Prison Service enumerated in Clause 22 hereof.

5.—Definitions.

(a) The definitions referred to hereunder, shall apply only for the purpose of this Agreement and shall not be taken to conflict in any manner whatsoever with the general orders and regulations dealing with the control and management of the Prison Service of Western Australia.

(b) "Officers" shall include all employees except probationers and temporary employees.

(c) "Probationer" shall mean an employee not permanently appointed but undergoing instruction and proving his suitability for permanent employment.

(d) "Employees" includes officers, probationers, guards and temporary employees.

(e) "Practicable" means practicable in the fair and reasonable opinion of the Comptroller General, provided that if any dispute arises as to whether in any case such opinion is fair and reasonable, the matter shall be referred to the Court of Arbitration.

(f) "Temporary Employee" shall mean one appointed for an emergency and whose service does not exceed a period of three months at any one time.

6.—Allowances.

(a) All permanent employees for whom quarters are not provided shall be entitled to a lodging allowance of £29 per annum.

(b) Pardelup-Officers employed at Pardelup shall be entitled to an allowance of £12 per annum.

(c) Employees working outside the South-West Land Division shall be paid District Allowance as prescribed in the Public Service Regulations.

7.—Relieving.

(a) An officer called upon to relieve a Senior Officer will not be entitled to the salary of the senior position unless the period of relief exceeds seven days. If the period of relief continues beyond seven days, an allowance being the difference between the salary of the position relieved and the salary of the officer concerned shall be paid from the commencement of the relieving period.

(b) Outstations.—When temporarily transferred from his permanent station to an outstation for the purpose of relieving thereat, an employee shall be paid an allowance at the rate of 2s. 6d. per day extra.

8.—Clothing.

Uniforms shall be provided by the Minister on the following scale:

One full uniform, including one pair of boots or shoes each six months.

One cap, covers and badge every two years.

One macintosh and helmet every three years.

One overcoat every five years. One extra set of uniform buttons after six months service.

Leggings, sneaks and buttons to be supplied when considered necessary by the Comptroller General.

Temporary employees shall be provided with second hand uniforms and one pair of boots or

9.—Special Allowances.

shoes.

An officer rostered for disciplinary duties in the workshop shall be paid an allowance of 1s. per day whilst so employed.

10.—Duty Roster.

(a) A weekly duty board shall be posted up by 11.0 a.m. each Friday to cover duties for the fol-lowing week—Monday to Friday—and shall be adhered to as far as possible by the Department.

(b) Any rostered day off which is granted in lieu of a public holiday shall be clearly shown on the duty board.

11.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours may be construed to mean eighty (80) per fortnight.

(b) Such hours shall be worked in continuous shifts when practicable, of eight (8) hours each shift. Such hours shall include a meal break of twenty (20) minutes each shift, during which the officer shall be on call.

(c) Guards shall take such meal break whilst on duty and not leave their posts.

(d) (i) The employer (or respondents to this Agreement) may require any worker to work reas-onable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirements.

(ii) The Union or worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

12.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of the ordinary daily hours as rostered for any shift shall be classed as overtime and be paid for at a rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter: Provided that if an Officer is called back on a rostered day off and cannot be granted a day off in lieu during the current pay period, he shall be paid at time and a half for the first four shall be paid at time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) An officer called out for duty for any purpose outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours or at overtime rates, whichever is the greater, provided that such work, exclusive of meal time is not continuous with his shift.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) Excepting employees mentioned in clause 15, three weeks' annual leave shall be granted to all officers and probationers for each year of service.

(b) An employee with more than one month's service, who may resign or be dismissed, except when the dismissal is due to misconduct, shall be entitled to the same proportion of three weeks' annual leave as his period of service bears to one calendar year.

(c) As far as practicable, one month's notice shall be given to the officer concerned, of the date of commencement of his annual leave.

14.—Public Holidays.

The following public holidays or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be granted as paid holidays: New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

Any employee required to work on any of these days shall receive a day off duty in lieu at the convenience of the officer in charge. Any days not so taken at the time when the officer's annual leave is commenced, shall be added to the annual leave.

15.—Special Holiday Provisions.

Employees stationed at Pardelup or stationed North of 25 deg. South Latitude, shall be granted 28 days annual leave in addition to the Public Holidays prescribed in clause 14: Provided that employees stationed North of 25 deg. South Latitude, may if they desire, be granted 56 days leave biennially in lieu of annual leave, and in that event, shall also be granted full first class steamer fare to Fremantle or other port in the State, for himself, wife and children under the age of 16 years.

16.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Permanent empoyees shall be granted long service leave under the provisions of Public Service Regulations,

(b) Prison guards shall receive long service leave in accordance with the Long Service Leave conditions applying to Government wages employees.

(c) Any employee who has served at least 12 months continuously and who is retired through ill-health, shall be paid for long service leave prorata to the date of leaving the prison service.

(d) When practicable, three months' notice of the commencing date of long service leave shall be given to all employees.

(e) If a deceased employee who had served continuously for at least 12 months before his death leaves a widow or children, dependant mother or dependant invalid sister, payment pro-rata of long service leave up to the date of such employee's death shall be granted to such widow or dependants.

17.—Sick Leave.

When an employee is bound to his house by illness arising from causes not within his control, sick leave shall be granted in accordance with the following, on production of satisfactory medical certificates.

- (a) Probationers—Not exceeding two weeks on full pay in any year.
- (b) Officers—In each period of three years not exceeding a total of three months' leave on full pay, and three months on half pay.
- (c) Sick leave with pay will not be granted when the illness is due to the workers own neglect or misconduct.

18.—Medical Attention.

Officers shall receive medical attention as provided in Prison Regulations.

19.—Preference to Unionists.

Where a worker other than a member of the Union is engaged, such worker shall within fourteen (14) days of engagement, make application for membership of the Union and complete such application.

20.—Escorts.

(a) Officers on escort duty to Pardelup or elsewhere shall be paid an allowance at the rate of 4s. per meal and 3s. 6d. per bed per day. The allowance for bed shall not be paid where a sleeping berth is provided at the expense of the Department.

(b) Officers on escort duty shall be paid an allowance of 1s. 6d. per prisoner per day to cover the cost of the provision of tea.

21.—Water Rates.

Water rates shall be paid by the Minister where officers occupy quarters provided by the Department.
