WHEREAS by the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 31st day of July, 1952.
