WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Onslow: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare reserve No. 23500 comprising about 10 declare reserve No. 23500 comprising about 10 acres, and more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of three years as from date of publication in the Government Gazette.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and

prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 23586 for Flora and Fauna (Avon Location 27483) should be placed under the control of the Tammin Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Tammin Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

- 5. (1) Where there are primary noxious weeds upon any land a notice in writing may be served on the owner or occupier of the land by the Minister or the Chief Weed Control Officer directing him not to move from the land—
 - (a) any stock;
 - (b) any animals until they are shorn immediately prior to being removed from the land;
 - (c) any hay, chaff, fodder or grain made or produced from any crop grown on the land.

(2) Where a notice has been served in accordance with subregulation (1) of this regulation the owner or occupier of any land so served with the notice shall not move any stock or animals from the land or any hay, chaff, fodder or grain made or produced from any crop grown on the land without first having obtained authority in writing so to do from the Chief Weed Control Officer.

(3) Any owner or occupier of any land who contravenes this regulation is guilty of an offence.

Penalty: For a first offence—twenty pounds and for any subsequent

offence-fifty pounds.
