 - (2) to examine and report on the administration of the Kindergarten Union of Western Australia Incorporated with particular reference to-
 - (a) finance, and
 - (b) policy with respect to new Kindergartens;
 - (3) to examine the present method of subsidising Kindergartens through the Kindergarten Union of Western Australia Incorporated and, if possible, to make recom-mendations for an improved method of rendering financial assistance;
 - (4) to examine and make recommendations with respect to the standards governing-
 - (a) Kindergarten buildings and facili-
 - (b) scale and type of equipment, and
 - (c) staffing.

And I hereby appoint you the said Sir Robert Ross McDonald, Q.C., to be Chairman of the said Royal Commission.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, be a Royal Commission within the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902, as reof the Statutes for the year 1928, and that you shall have the powers of a Royal Commission and of the Chairman thereof under that Act. And I hereby request you as soon as reasonably may be to report to me in writing the result of this your Commission.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:— That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of long lines or set lines for a period of three years from August 26, 1952, to August 25, 1955.

Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters extending along the foreshore between the North Mole at Fremantle and Triggs Island (near Scarborough) and to a width of one mile to sea.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

J. Bond and of any person or persons appointed temporarily to act in the place of such officer, and the cancellation of the appointment of J. C. Hutchinson.

Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1951, it is provided, inter alia, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the Commismissioners appointed under the provisions of the Act, by Order in Council, inter alia, repeal, vary or amend any of the provisions of any previous order relating to any district; divide any district into sub-areas; define the boundaries of any sub-areas; and alter the boundaries of any sub-area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, doth hereby amend the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of April, 1951, whereby the Harvey Irrigation District was constituted and divided into three sub-areas—

- (a) by altering the boundaries of Sub-area No. 2 as follows:—
 - (i) Adding thereto the area defined in the First Schedule hereto.
 - (ii) Deleting therefrom the area defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (b) by adding a new sub-area to be known as the Harvey Irrigation District Sub-area No. 4, the boundaries of which are defined in the Third Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made under section 8 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd day of March, 1951, at pages 468 and 469, the Collie Municipal District was constituted a road district under the name of Collie Town Road District, and united with the Collie Road District to form a new Road District under the name of the Collie Coalfields Road District; and whereas it is necessary that, in order to preserve the rights of those persons who were ratepayers of the two districts at the time of the union, the Governor should, in accordance with the provisions of section 10 of the said Act, adjust and finally determine certain questions relating to loan rating and the application of moneys paid or to be paid into a Reserve Fund; Now, therefore, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:-

 - (b) As to £3,000, in acquiring as a site for an abattoir, Wellington Location 2396 and portion of Wellington Location 1127, being the whole of the land comprised in Certificate of Title, Volume 1068, Folio 282, subject to the condition that if it shall be found unnecessary or undesirable to use the said land as a site for an abattoir, and it is sold, the moneys arising from the sale shall be paid into and form part of the Reserve Fund Account beforementioned.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Swan Road Board.

L.G. 946/52.

THE Swan Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1948, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. In the interpretation of these by-laws, the following words shall have the meaning assigned to them hereunder:—
 - (a) "Board" means the Swan Road Board.
 - (b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two (2) days, or an aggregate period of more than ten (10) days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.
- 2. All employees of the Board shall after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of January, 1945, be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave. Long service leave is to be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take his leave by giving not less than three (3) months' notice.
- 3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in the continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not be longer than three (3) months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.
- 4. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.
 - (b) The Board may, at its discretion, either-
 - (i) pay to an employee his salary or wages periodically during long service leave, or
 - (ii) pay to the employee in advance the sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave.

- 5. (a) Subject to clause (b) hereunder, employees shall not be entitled to long service leave until the completion of ten (10) years' service. After the completion of the first ten (10) years, employees will be entitled to a pro rata payment if they leave the service of the Board before the next period is completed.
- (b) The Board may, at its discretion in special circumstances, grant long service leave *pro rata* to an employee who has completed five (5) years' continuous service.
- 6. In the event of resignation, retirement or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative, or if there be none, to his dependant) as um of money equal to his salary or wages for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of salary or wages which would under this by-law have been granted to the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board
- 7. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.
- 8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.
