WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Adminis-tration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a reserve for natives should be declared at Jigalong: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare an area of about 170,000 acres at Jigalong, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

#### Schedule.

Eastern Division—No. 23431 (Natives Jigalong Mission)—Schedule.—The area of Crown land bounded by lines commencing at a point 50 links East of the 615-mile peg on the No. 1 Rabbit Proof East of the 615-mile peg on the No. 1 Rabbit Proof Fence and extending East about 1,150 chains; thence South about 1,200 chains; thence West about 1,500 chains to the Eastern boundary of reserve No. 11461; thence North and West respectively along boundaries of said reserve No. 11461 to the South-East side of reserve No. 12297; thence gen-erally North-Easterly and Northerly along the said side of the lastmentioned reserve to the starting point (about 170,000 acres). (Plan 90/300.)

The Child Welfare Act, 1947-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Ex. Co. 1498, C.W.D. 599/46.

WHEREAS by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1950, it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council establish special courts to be called Children's Courts and may by Order in Council from time to time determine the area in and for which each Court shall exercise jurisdic-tion; and whereas by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1950, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any posticular Children's Court and may determine the particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members: Now, there-fore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby establish a Children's Court at Wit-tenoom, to exercise jurisdiction over the area constituting the Wittenoom Police District and doth hereby appoint the persons named in the Schedule hereto to be members of the Children's Court at the place mentioned:----

## Fire Brigades Act. 1942-1951. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 179/52, Ex. Co. No. 1503.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951, that the municipal and road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act are for the purposes of the Act constituted fire districts by the names as in the said Schedule stated, and that the Governor may, by Order in Council, *inter alia*, unite the district of or portions of the district of two or more local authorities with any portion or portions of another or others into one fire district by such name as the Governor into one fire district by such name as the Governor may think fit; and whereas it is deemed to be desirable and expedient to enlarge the Bunbury Fire District as mentioned in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by adding portion of an area which has been annexed to the Munici-pality of Bunbury: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby for the purposes of the Act reconstitute the Bunbury Fire District as mentioned in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by including in the Bunbury Fire District as part thereof portion of an area which has been annexed to the Municipality of Bunbury and which is more particularly defined Bunbury and which is more particularly defined and described in the Schedule hereunder.

## Schedule.

## Extension of Bunbury Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the North-Eastern corner of Wellington Loca-tion 4167 (reserve 19633), a point on the present district boundary, and extending South-Westerly along the South-Eastern boundary of that location

to the North-Western side of West Road; thence North-Easterly along that side and onwards to the North-Western side of Minninup Road; thence South-Westerly along that side and onwards to the centre line of Moore Road; thence Easterly along that centre line to the Eastern side of Lattrelle Road; thence Southerly along that side to the Northern side of Timperley Road; thence Easterly along that side and onwards to an Eastern side of the Bussell Highway; thence Northerly along that side to the Southern side of Nuytsia Avenue; thence Easterly along that side to the North-East-ern corner of location 4354 (reserve 153); thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of that location to a South-Western corner of location 494; thence Easterly along the Southern boundary of that location and onwards to and along the South-ern boundaries of lots 9 to 17, inclusive, of loca-tion 493 to the latter lot's South-Eastern corner; thence Northerly along the Eastern boundaries of lots 17 and 18 and onwards to the South-Western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence North-Westerly along that side to its intersection with the South-Western side of Picton Road; thence North to the North-Eastern side of Ficton Road; thence North to the North-Eastern side of the aforemen-tioned railway reserve; thence North-Westerly along that side to a point in prolongation South-erly of the Eastern boundary of lot 2, as shown on Land Titles Office Deposited Diagram 2699; thence Northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the Southern side of Strickland Street; thence Easterly along that side and onwards to a point in prolongation South-Easterly of the North-Eastern side of Preston Street; thence North-Westerly to and along that side and onwards to and along the North-Eastern boundaries of lots 47 to 34, inclusive, and 28, as shown on Land Titles Office Deposited Plan 3734, to the latter lot's North-Eastern corner, a point on the present dis-trict boundary, and thence generally Westerly, generally Southerly and again generally Westerly along that district boundary to the starting point.

A By-law of the Municipality of Bunbury made under Section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947, and numbered fifteen for Regulating Long Service Leave.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Bunbury order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this by-law the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

"Council" means the Bunbury Municipal Council.

"Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Council, provided that an employee who was employed by the Council on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Council, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All employees of the Council shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing from the 1st day of November, 1951, be entitled to three months' long service leave, provided that there shall be credited to each employee who was employed by the Council prior to the 1st day of November, 1951, two-fifths (2/5ths) of the total number of months which they have served in continuous service in the employment of Council and that the 10-year qualifying period mentioned in this paragraph shall, wherever applicable, be reduced accordingly by the number of months which is determined by such credit. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Council, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

3. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Council.

4. In the event of the resignation, retirement, or death of an employee, the Council may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Council was empowered under this by-law to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Council, after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Council.

5. An employee dismissed by the Council, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding paragraph.

6. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Council may, at its discretion, either (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (ii) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

7. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

8. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Council. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave. Provided, however, that the Council may grant long service leave to an employee of the Council if, before a period of 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the council's service owing to having reached the retiring age, or who, because of circumstances beyond his control, such as illness, accident, death or retrenchment, is unable thereby to carry on his employment, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted pro rata.

9. The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be in the ratio of not exceeding 1 3/10ths weeks for every completed year of service which qualified the employee for such long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

10. The Council hereby expressly reserves the right to either retard or advance by a period of one year, the date on which any employee may be required to take his or her long service leave.

  - (i) by deleting the word "Cut" in paragraph (b); and
  - (ii) by deleting paragraph (c).
- 2. Regulation 5F is amended—
  - (i) by deleting definitions "Cut standard" and "Fall standard"; and (ii) by inserting a new definition of "Standard" as follows:
    - "Standard" grade shall consist of mature oranges, which have been carefully picked or clipped from the trees, and which are of normal shape, clean and of the appearance common to the variety, sound, of reasonably even orange colour, none of which is disfigured over an area exceeding 10 per centum of the total superficial area of the individual fruit and none of which shall be dry; at least 75 per centum of the oranges shall retain the buttons; provided that with Navel oranges marketed after the 16th July of any year, at least 50 per centum shall retain the button. When oranges are clipped from the trees, the stalks shall be smoothly cut level with the buttons.

3. Delete Regulation 5G and insert in lieu thereof a new regulation 5G as follows:-

5G. In this division in respect of oranges-

- (a) "Dry", used in relation to an orange, means that the weight of the juice extractable (by means of rotating the halves of a freshly divided orange on a conical glass lemon squeezer under hand pressure only and squeezing the resultant juice with moderate pressure through a strainer of not less than 30 meshes to the lineal inch) is less than 33 per centum of the total weight of the orange.
- (b) "Mature", used in relation to an orange, means that the fruit shall have developed an orange flavour in the juice or be in such a condition that the quantity of N/IO soda solution required to neutralise the acidity content of ten of not less than five oranges taken at random from any box or boxes bearing a similar mark shall be not more than 30 cubic centimetres.
- (c) "Disfigured", used in relation to an orange means dis-figured by scars, scratches of the skin, excessive navel segments, cavities, punctures or blemishes due to any insect or fungus pest, hail marks or oil stains.
- (d) "Sound", means not over-ripe, not soft, not wilted and free from excessive bruising or physical injuries affecting the keeping quality of the fruit.
- (e) "Clipped" in relation to oranges, means cut from the tree, with stalk trimmed smooth by means of a sharp, bluntnosed clipper or by any other approved means.
- (f) "Disease" means any abnormal condition of or in oranges, and includes any condition arising from functional dis-orders, or caused by, or due to the presence, operation, development or growth of any insect, fungus, bacterium or virus.

4. Insert after regulation 5H a new regulation 5HA as follows:-

5HA. All oranges other than those graded as "Factory—First Grade" or "Factory—Second Grade" shall be firmly and fully packed in containers approved under the Fruit Cases Act, 1919-1933.
