NATIVES (CITIZENSHIP RIGHTS) ACT, 1944-1951.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under the provisions of the Natives (Citizenship Rights) Act, 1944-1951, has been pleased to amend, in the manner set out in the Schedule hereunder, the Natives (Citizenship Rights) Act, 1944 Regulations made under the Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 14th day of September, 1945.

SCHEDULE.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:-

1A. In these regulations-

"Board" means a Natives (Citizenship Rights) Board constituted pursuant to the provisions of the Natives (Citizenship Rights) Act, 1944-1951.

2. Insert after regulation 2 a new regulation 2A as follows:-

2A. An application by a responsible parent to include children not of full age in a Certificate of Citizenship shall be in Form 7 in the Appendix to these regulations.

3. Delete regulation 3 and insert in lieu thereof a new regulation 3 as follows:-

3. An application for a certificate of citizenship shall be supported by a statutory declaration in Form 2 in the Appendix to these regulations.

Regulation 4 is amended by adding after the word "thereon" in line four the following words:—"No fee is payable upon an application made in pursuance of regulation 2A of these regulations."

5. Regulation 5 is amended by substituting for the figures and words "60 clear days" in line four the words "one month".

6. Regulation 7 is amended-

- (i) by substituting for the word "magistrate" in lines one and four the
- (i) by substituting for the words "he" and "his" in line one the words "it" and "its" respectively; and
 (ii) by adding at the end of regulation 7 the following:—"Should the following:
- application granted by the Board be for the inclusion of children in the certificate of a responsible parent, the certificate shall be endorsed by the members of the Board accordingly. No fee is payable for the endorsement."

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1952.

(Registered 12th August, 1952.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1949, this 11th day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, between the Swan Brewery Company Limited, the Emu Brewery Company Limited, and the Stirling Brewery Limited, all of Perth (hereinafter called "the Employers") of the one part, and the Metro-politan and South-Western Federated Engine Drivers' and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, being an industrial union of workers Arbitration Act, 1912-1949 (hereinafter called "the Union") of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions and provisions set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed and complied with according to the true intent and meaning thereof, by the parties hereto.

1.—Definitions.

(a) "Engine-driver" shall mean and include a worker who operates or drives any engine or engines the motive power of which is either steam, gas, air, oil, water, compressed air or electricity.

(b) "Fireman" shall mean a worker employed in a stokehole, attending a steam boiler or suction gas generator over 6 h.p.

(c) "Greaser" shall mean a worker who is employed mainly in oiling engines or shafting, and who assists the engine-driver as required.

2.—Wages Schedule.

(a) The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons em-ployed by such employers in the capacities under-mentioned shall up to the 27th day of April, 1952, be the rates provided by Industrial Agreement No. 13 of 1950, subject to any variations in the basic wage declared since the date thereof, and as on and from the 28th day of April, 1952, as follows:—

(b) Engine-drivers, firemen or greasers who shall be employed on boiler cleaning work, cleaning in-side of pasteuriser, or bottle soaker, shall receive payment at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour for all time so employed, in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

3.-Hours.

(a) Forty hours, consisting of eight hours per day from Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, shall constitute a week's work for engine-drivers, firemen and greasers who shall commence work not before and greater where any day, and the employer may require any engine-driver, fireman or greaser, to start work at any time after that time. Where one shift only is worked such shift shall begin not later than 8 Any alteration to the working hours shall a.m. be by mutual arrangement.

(b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires shall be included.

4.-Shift Work.

- (a) Workers may be employed-
 - (i) on "regular shift work" that is in regular rotation from week to week on two or three shifts spread over 16 or 24 hours respectively day shift to be worked from 7.30 a.m. to not later than 3.30 p.m., afternoon shift from 3.30 p.m. to not later than 11.30 p.m., and night shift from 11.30 p.m. to not later than 7.30 p.m.;

(ii) on "casual shift work" that is on one weekly shift only casual day, afternoon and night shifts to start and finish at the time respectively referred to in the preceding paragraph.

(b) In the case of both regular and casual shift work the first shift of the week will begin on Sunday at 11.30 p.m. and the last shift of the week shall finish at 11.30 p.m. on Friday duty. Rosters shall be posted on Friday in each week and shall show the starting and finishing times of each worker during each week. Particulars relating to starting and finishing, times shall be rigidly adhered to.

(c) The provisions contained in the previous subclause of this clause may be varied by mutual agreement between any employer and the Union.

(d) All workers employed on regular shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 5 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay for any week during which they work afternoon shift and an allowance equal to 10 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay for any week during which they work night shift.

(e) All workers employed on casual shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of their ordinary weekly wage for any week during which they work afternoon shift and $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of their ordinary weekly wage for any week during which they work night shift.

(f) The additional allowances mentioned in subclauses (d) and (e) hereof shall be taken into consideration in calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond eight hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this agreement.

5.—Overtime.

(a) The following overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half:---

- All time up to four hours worked-
 - (i) over eight hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;
 - (ii) before the starting time of 5 a.m. mentioned in clause 3 (a);
- (iii) in the case of shift workers outside rostered starting and finishing times;
- (iv) on Saturday.

(b) All overtime in excess of four hours worked during the periods referred to in subclause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

6.—Record.

Each employer shall keep a record of the name of each worker, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, and wages paid to each worker, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any other person appointed by the Union during working hours.

Each worker shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

7.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

8.—Holidays.

All holiday shifts shall rotate. If no work be done ordinary rates shall be paid for holidays. If work is performed on a holiday time and a half rates shall be paid in addition. The extra rates shall be computed on an hourly basis at the rate applicable to the day on which the time is worked. The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are— New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Show Day, Sovereign's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Annual Picnic Day.

In case any of the above holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

9.—Annual Bonus.

The employer shall pay each employee receiving wages under this Award, a week's pay by way of bonus in the last week in December in each year. Any employee leaving the employer's service for reasons other than misconduct, dishonesty, or neglect of duty before the payment of such bonus in any year shall, when leaving, be paid a pro rata payment in lieu thereof; any employee who shall not have been in the employ of the employer for a year in the first week in December shall receive a part of his week's pay bearing the same proportion to a week's pay as the period of his service bears to a year.

10.—Annual Leave.

Each employee on completion of twelve (12) months' service shall be granted three (3) weeks' annual leave, two weeks on double pay and one week on single pay, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the workers and the employers. The annual leave shall be in addition to the holidays mentioned in clause 7 hereof.

On termination of services of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than three (3) months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of two and one-twelfth $(2 \ 1/12$ th) days' pay for each completed month of service.

On termination of service of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than one month, but less than three months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of one and one-quarter $(1\frac{1}{4})$ days' pay for each completed month of service.

Relieving engine-drivers and firemen shall be paid for annual holidays pro rata to the length of time they have been employed on the higher rates.

11.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All employees who from time to time shall complete 25 years of continuous service with an employer shall be given Long Service Leave. Such Long Service Leave shall be taken at the conclusion of 25 years' continuous service and shall comprise 13 weeks' leave of absence for recreational purposes.

(b) Should an employee who has completed fifteen years of continuous service be retired compulsorily on medical grounds on the advice of a medical officer appointed by the employer or by reason of being over the employer's retiring age or die before completing 25 year's continuous service, there shall be paid by the employer to such employee or to his dependants as the case may require a sum of money bearing the same relation to 13 weeks' pay at his rate as his service with the employer bears to 25 years. "Dependant" shall mean the widow and/or children under the age of 16 years, or any child in fact dependent, of any employee and, in the case of a single employee shall mean such dependant (if any) as such single employee may in writing notify to the Company during his lifetime, accompanied by proper proof of actual dependency.

(c) Continuous service shall include any interval spent on service with Her Majesty's Armed Forces during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged, and shall also include any interval spent during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged with any National Service into which an employee is compulsorily drafted for defence purposes.

(d) Unless otherwise agreed in individual cases, Long Service Leave shall be taken at such period as shall be mutually agreed upon within two years of it becoming due. In default of agreement it shall be taken at such time within such period of two years as the employer shall determine.

(e) Except in the cases of an employee who, at the time he becomes eligible for Long Service Leave, is of an age exceeding sixty, all Long Service Leave, shall be taken by way of actual holiday and not by way of payment in lieu thereof on retirement. An employee who at the time he becomes eligible for Long Service Leave is beyond 60 years of age shall have the option of taking actual holiday under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised by a notice in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for Long Service Leave.

(f) Employees on Long Service Leave shall, while on such leave, continue to be paid at the actual rate (exclusive of overtime or other allowance) enjoyed by them at the commencement of such leave. Except in special circumstances payment shall be at the same times as during normal employment but may be made by cheque by mutual arrangement.

(g) It shall be a condition of every employee's taking Long Service Leave that he (or she)—

- (i) shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave;
- (ii) shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of the leave; and(iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay
- (iii) shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with Long Service Leave pay.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) above (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a medical officer appointed by the employer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

(h) In order to avoid manning difficulties, the Long Service Leave of employees who become entitled to the same in the first year of operation of the scheme shall be taken during such periods during the first two years of the scheme as shall be mutually agreed upon and in default of agreement at such times as the employer may decide.

(i) For the purpose of computation and allotment of Long Service Leave all Long Service Leave shall be deemed to become due on the 1st October next following the completion of the periods of 15 and 25 years' continuous service.

(j) The employer shall have the right in cases of emergency to recall any employee from Long Service Leave, in which case the unexpired leave shall be made up on some mutually convenient date.

(k) In order to avoid confusion and embarrassment employees whilst on Long Service Leave shall not, without the prior permission of the officer in charge of the particular establishment visit any of the premises of the employer except for the purpose of collecting pay or transacting genuine business with the employer's officers. Social visits shall not be indulged in. "Establishment" means any brewery, cooperage, or workshop, but does not include hotels or annual picnics or sports or usual weekly competitive sporting activities.

(1) The benefits of Long Service Leave shall be in addition to all benefits at present or hereafter to be enjoyed by employees.

(m) In the event of any Governmental or similar Long Service Leave Scheme being introduced for industry as a whole, the parties concerned shall meet to consider alterations necessary in order to adjust the scheme to such new conditions.

(n) Notwithstanding anything in this clause contained no employee nor his legal personal representative shall be entitled to any of the benefits by this clause conferred in any of the following circumstances—

- (i) When, in the opinion of the directors of an employer an employee has committed fraud upon the employer or any defalcation in relation to the employer or breach of trust or similar act prejudicially affecting or likely to so affect business or interests of the employer and is dismissed.
- (ii) If the employee shall become a bankrupt or insolvent debtor within the meaning of any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Western Australia or shall assign, alienate or charge his benefits hereunder or any part thereof or attempt to do so or if through his own act or default or by operation or

process of law the same shall become vested in or payable to some other person, firm or company.

12.—Engagement.

(a) The engagement between the employer and employee, except casual hands, shall be weekly, and may be terminated by a week's notice from either party, except in the case of the employee absenting himself without leave, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of other misconduct or of the works of the employer being stopped through fire or tempest when such agreement may be terminated immediately.

13.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) An employee who is unable through sickness or accident to attend his duties, shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty.

(b) An employee shall be entitled to sick pay in respect of any period of absence on account of sickness after the 1st day of January, 1948, on the basis of one half-day's pay for each completed month served with the employer between the said 1st day of January, 1948, and the date of the commencement of such absence provided that in calculating the amount due to an employee in respect of any particular period of absence through sickness there shall be deducted therefrom any sum or sums previously paid to him hereunder.

(c) The term "sickness" shall not include any case where the employee is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) No employee shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof of his sickness satisfactory to the employer. This proof shall be in the form of a medical certificate if the absence is for three days or more. The employer shall have the right at any time to have the employee examined by a doctor on behalf of the employer.

(e) Except as aforesaid, an employee shall not be entitled to payment for time lost through sickness or accident.

14.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees engaged in the brewing industry as engine-drivers, firemen and greasers, in the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

15.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of one year from the 29th day of November, 1951.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 19 of 1951.

Between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Ap-plicant, and F. W. Wright & Co. Ltd., and others, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Com-missioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pur-suant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, and all other powers therein en-abling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

3.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed in the Chaffcutting industry in the area comprised within the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia: Provided it shall not apply to employers or their workers engaged in connec-tion with chaffcutting plants the output of which does not exceed ten (10) tons per day of eight hours: Provided further that it shall not apply to any workers who are covered by any other Award of the Court of Arbitration or any Industrial Agreement registered under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years from the date hereof.

5.—Hours.

(i) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.

(ii) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours, Monday to Friday inclusive.

(iii) The ordinary hours of work shall be performed between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, inclusive: Provided that these starting and finishing times may be varied by agreement between the employer and the worker: Provided further, that the employer and the worker may

mutually agree upon the time to be allowed for partaking of meals or time (if any) taken off for smoke-ohs, both of which shall be at the workers' expense.

(iv) Nothing in this clause shall apply to cooks.

6.—Wages.

Cooks shall be paid seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per week for each extra carter and/or other worker outside the normal team for whom he cooks.

7.—Overtime.

All work performed in excess of the daily hours specified in Clause 5 (iii) hereof, or such hours as may be substituted therefor, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

All work performed on a Sunday or any of the holidays prescribed by Clause 8 shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Provided that nothing in this Clause shall apply to cooks.

Notwithstanding anything contained herein-

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

8.—Holidays.

(a) Except in the case of cooks, the following days or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to Clause 7, be allowed as holidays without de-duction of pay, namely New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Satur-day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) Cooks shall, in lieu of holidays, be allowed threequarters $(\frac{3}{4})$ of a day's pay for each completed month of service.

(c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

9:—Allowance.

An allowance of twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per week shall be paid in lieu of Annual Leave and as compensation for the casual nature of the work.

10.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept time and wages record wherein shall be я. entered:-

(i) The name of each worker to whom this Award applies.

11. Accommodation.

(a) Suitable tents, with fiys, shall be provided by the employer for the workers free of charge. The tents to remain the property of the employer.

(b) Each worker shall be provided with a stretcher free of charge. Workers shall be responsible for any damage done to stretchers, fair wear and tear excluded. Such stretchers shall remain the property of the employer.

(c) A hurricane or other suitable lamp with oil shall be provided for each tent.

(d) A portable kitchen with stove and dining requisites shall be supplied by the employer.

12. Orders for Payment.

The employer shall, on the order of the worker, pay out of any amount due to such worker any amount which may be due to the Union.

13.—Deduction for Keep.

(a) The employer shall be entitled to deduct for keep an amount representing $33\frac{1}{3}$ per cent. of the basic wage.

(b) Where a worker notifies the employer on the day immediately preceding the week-end that he does not desire board and lodging for any portion of the week-end, the amount of board and lodging as provided for in (a) of this clause shall be reduced proportionately.

14.—Termination of Employment.

Two (2) days' notice shall be required on either side to terminate the employment of a worker.

15.—Payment of Wages.

When required, wages shall be paid weekly, and, on receipt of one week's notice from the worker, the employer shall pay in cash on the job the whole or, at the option of the worker, any portion of the wages due to such worker.

16.—Medical Chest.

An edequate first aid kit shall be provided on the job by the employers.

17.—Sundry Duties.

Pitching and striking tents, cleaning up all loose hay and chaff round the cutter and travelling from one location to another, shall be included in the work paid for.

18.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or stoppage of work through the breakdown of the employer's machinery if such breakdown has caused a stoppage of work for two (2) hours or more, or if weather conditions are such as to cause a stoppage of work for two (2) hours or more, but this clause does not apply to a stoppage in work caused by dampness of the atmosphere or due to excessive moisture in the grain or straw.
