Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 761.

Prices Control Order No. 763.

Scrap Brass.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 763.

Maximum Price.

2. I fix and declare the maximum price at which Scrap Brass of any of the types or descriptions specified in the First Column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person, to be the price per lb. specified opposite to such type or description in the Second Column of that Schedule.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any Scrap Brass specified in a Notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to

whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by Notice in writing to that person.

Prices Control Order No. 764.

Scrap Lead.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 764.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 369 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. "Battery" means a secondhand, used or scrap lead acid-type electric storage battery.

"Scrap lead" means scrap lead other than pig lead and includes a secondhand, used or scrap battery or parts thereof.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price, inclusive of delivery to the purchaser's premises, at which scrap lead may be sold by any person to be the price specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which scrap lead specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
