Suspension of Prohibited Times.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Hon. Minister for Lands, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by section 9, subsection (3)

of the Bush Fires Act, 1937-1950, has approved of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited times made under section 9, subsection (1) of the said Act so far as such declarations extend to any land used for railway purposes by the Midland Railway Company of Western Australia Limited for the period from the 13th October, 1952, to the 12th December, 1952, inclusive. Any burning undertaken on railway land under the provisions of this suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

At least three men shall be constantly in attendance at every fire until it has been completely extinguished, including all smouldering logs, timber, disused sleepers and other inflammable material.
