PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1951.

Notice—Declaration No. 77.

I, ARTHUR VALENTINE RUTHERFORD ABBOTT, Attorney General and Minister of the Crown for the time being charged with the administration of the Prices Control Act, 1948-1951, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 14 of the said Act and the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, do hereby revoke Declaration No. 72, dated the 17th day of October, 1952, made under the said Act, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of October, 1952, in so far as it relates to the goods specified in the Schedule to this Declaration No. 77.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1951.

Prices Control Order No. 776.

Portland Cement (Grey).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 776.

Definitions and Interpretations.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“cement” means Portland Cement (Grey);

“cost” means—

- (a) in relation to cement imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia—the aggregate of the purchase price paid or payable for that cement to the overseas supplier after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount, together with inland carriage, outside packing, overseas office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3½ per centum of the invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount), bill of lading and shipping charges, insurance, freight

(but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates), exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rate and $\frac{3}{8}$ of one per centum respectively), duty and primage, wharfage, stacking, harbour dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy, Customs entry and Customs agents' charges (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost);

(b) in relation to cement imported from a source within the Commonwealth of Australia, the aggregate of—

(i) the purchase price paid or payable to the interstate supplier for that cement after deduction of any trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount;

(ii) insurance, freight, exchange, wharfage, stacking charges and shipping agents' charges;

"Perth Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office at Perth.

Sales by Wholesale.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement may be sold within the Perth Metropolitan Area by wholesale by any person to be—

(a) in respect of cement manufactured by Swan Portland Cement Ltd., Rivervale, Western Australia—the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of cement imported from sources within the Commonwealth of Australia—

(i) the cost thereof;

(ii) 15 per centum of such cost; and

(iii) cost where actually incurred of transporting the cement from wharf to wholesaler's store at a rate not exceeding 15s. per ton;

(c) in respect of cement imported from sources outside the Commonwealth of Australia—

(i) the cost thereof;

(ii) 20 per centum of such cost; and

(iii) cost where actually incurred of transporting the cement from wharf to wholesaler's store at a rate not exceeding 15s. per ton.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement may be sold by a wholesaler whose place of business is situated outside the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the sum of—

(a) the price fixed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order;

(b) the cost actually incurred in transporting the cement to the wholesaler's premises, provided such cost is properly recorded in his books of account.

Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement may be sold within the Perth Metropolitan Area by retail to be—

(a) in respect of cement manufactured by Swan Portland Cement Ltd., Rivervale, Western Australia—the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order for sales by retail;

(b) in respect of cement imported into Western Australia, the sum of—

(i) the wholesale price paid or payable for the cement;

(ii) 5 per centum of such price.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which cement may be sold by retail by any person whose place of business is situated outside the Perth Metropolitan Area to be the sum of—

(a) in respect of cement manufactured by Swan Portland Cement Ltd., Rivervale, Western Australia, the sum of—

(i) the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order for sales by retail;

(ii) the cost actually incurred in transporting the cement to the retail seller's store, provided such cost is properly recorded in his books of account;

(b) in respect of cement imported into Western Australia, the sum of—

(i) the wholesale price paid or payable for the cement;

(ii) 5 per centum of such price;

(iii) the cost actually incurred in transporting the cement to the retail seller's store, provided such cost is properly recorded in his books of account.

Maximum Rates—Delivery.

7. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the service of the delivery of cement to the purchaser's premises may be supplied by any seller of such goods to be the rate set out in the Second or Third Schedule to this Order, as the case may be, according to the quantity of cement and distance to which it is delivered.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where any person who sells cement has customarily allowed any different in price—

(a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;

(b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of cement; or

(c) in respect of sales of cement under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment,

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of that cement shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities, or under such conditions, or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Variation of Maximum Prices or Rates by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which cement, or the maximum rate at which the service of the delivery thereof specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may respectively be sold or supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
