Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of section 14 of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921, as amended by Acts No. 29 of 1923 and No. 7 of 1936, the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislature of any part of the Queen's Dominions or other competent authority, for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State, by Order in Council, extend the said Act to that part of the Queen's Dominions; and whereas the Governor is satisfied that such reciprocity has been accorded by the Colony of Singapore: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the said Colony of Singapore.

Companies Act, 1943-1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 28 (1) of the Companies Act, 1943-1951, that no company shall be registered by a name which is identical with that by which an association in existence is already incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1895, or in the opinion of the Registrar, so nearly resembles that name as to be calculated to deceive, and whereas by subsection (7) proviso (a) of section 28 where in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be

inequitable or unreasonable to require any company formed or incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of this Act applies to change its name, style, title or designation before complying with requirements of the said Part) it is in the circumstances of the particular case expedient, the Governor may, notwithstanding anything in section 28 or section 30 of the Companies Act, 1943-1951, authorise the Registrar to accept for filing the documents and particulars specified in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 329 of the Companies Act, 1943-1951: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (7) proviso (a) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1951, doth hereby authorise the Registrar to register The Institute of Quantity Surveyors (Australia) as a foreign company.
