IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 (2) of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby declare as follows:—

(1) That the period from 5 o'clock in the afternoon of December 20, 1952, to May 31, 1953, shall be an open season in respect of wild ducks in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the road districts specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) That the period from 5 o'clock in the forenoon of December 21, 1952, to May 31, 1953, shall be an open season in respect of wild ducks in that part of the State not included in the areas specified and defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.

First Schedule.

Northampton, Upper Chapman, Geraldton-Greenough, Irwin, Mingenew, Three Springs, Carnamah, Dandarragen, Moora, Gingin, Victoria Plains, Chittering, Wannaru, Swan, Mundaring, Darling Range, Armadale-Kelmscott, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Mandurah, Murray, Drakesbrook, Marradong, Harvey, Capel, Dardanup, Collie Coalfields, Preston, Balingup, Greenbushes, Bridgetown, Upper Blackwood, Busselton, Augusta-Margaret River, Nannup and Manjimup Road Districts.

Second Schedule.

(a) The whole of the area within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office at Perth.

(b) All municipalities and townsites within the boundaries of the South-West Land Division.

(c) The whole of the Rockingham Road District.

(d) The whole of the waters of Lakes Leschenaultia and Seppings and Bambang, Wagin, Nambung, Mungala and Nannerup Lakes and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the shore of the said lakes.

(e) The whole of the waters of Leschenault, Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the shores of the said estuaries.

(f) The whole of the waters of the Vasse, King and Kalgan Rivers, and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the banks of the said rivers.

(g) The whole of the waters of Oyster Harbour and Princess Royal Harbour and all those portions of land lying within a radius of 20 chains of the shores of the said harbours.

(h) The whole of the area of the Yanchep Caves Reserve, No. A9868.

(i) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

(j) The whole of the area lying within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, from 1st January, 1953, until 31st December, 1955, inclusive.

First Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards North of Robbs Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards South of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

Second Schedule.

That area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards North of the jetty fronting Douro Road, South Fremantle, to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards South of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 1897/15—That reserve No. 16099 (Murray Location 865) should vest in and be held by the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

*Corr. No. 1120/17, Vol. 2—That reserve No. 22905 (Kondinin Lots 162 to 167 (inclusive) and lot 190) should vest in and be held by the Kondinin Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned road boards in trust for the purposes mentioned, with power to the said road boards, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserves for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act, shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres 3532/98.—That reserve No. 6028 (Boulder Lot 85) should be granted in fee simple to the trustees for the time being of The Independent Order of Oddfellows Boulder City Lodge, to be held in trust for the purpose of an Oddfellows' Hall.

Corres. No. 807/44—That reserve No. 22447 (Manjimup Lot 169) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Royal Antediluvian Order of Buffaloes Grand Lodge of Western Australia under the Grand Lodge of England to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hall Site.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to be held in trust for the abovementioned purposes, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

(a) 12-in diameter, 9-in. diameter, 6-in. and 4-in. diameter reticulation pipe sewers with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith.

(b) A brick and tile pumping station and a reinforced concrete well together with an 8½-in. diameter reinforced concrete rising main and a 12-in. diameter reinforced concrete submain and other apparatus connected therewith, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 7725.
