To the Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice and Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia:

WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the State: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer as from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the State and during such absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be
Granted to Employees of the Melville Road
Board.

L.G. 830/52.

THE Melville Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of the by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Melville Road Board.

"Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Board, and who are in the regular and full-time employ of the Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with the Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from 1st January, 1936, be entitled to three months' long service leave, and no long service leave shall be granted to an employee without a qualifying period of 10 years being first completed.

3. (a) The Board may grant long service leave to an employee of the Board who has been granted long service leave for 10 years' continuous service if, before a further period of 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Board's service owing to having reached the retiring age of 65 years, or is retired on the grounds of ill-health, or dismissed through staff retrenchments, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted *pro rata*.

Provided that no such grant shall be made to an employee of the Board who prior to completing a further period of 10 years' continuous service resigns his employment with the Board.

(b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

4. An employee dismissed by the Board for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

5. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

6. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

7. In the event of the retirement or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board is empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his retirement or death, or if the Board after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

8. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave. (b) The Board may, at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

9. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

(a) No person in charge of any vehicle shall park or permit such vehicle to be parked in Bayley Street between the intersection of that street with Renou Street on the Eastward and Moran Street on the Westward, or in Lefroy Street between its intersection with Woodward Street on the Southward and Sylvester Street on the Northward, at other than an angle of 45 degrees from the kerb of the footpath.

(b) No person in charge of any vehicle shall park or permit such vehicle to be parked in Bayley Street between the Coolgardie Town Park gates (reserve No. 3255) and the end of the Park fence in a Westerly direction on occasions when notices prohibiting parking in this section are conspicuously exhibited.

(c) Any person who does or permits any act contrary to these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Schedule.

THE STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Regulations Relating to the Issue of Debentures and Inscribed Stock.

1.—Interpretation.

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression—

“The Commission” means The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia;

“the Chairman” means the Chairman for the time being of the Commission, and includes the Deputy Chairman;

- “the Registrar” means the Registrar of Stock for the time being appointed as such by the Commission;
- “the Office” means the principal administrative offices of the Commission at Perth.
- “debentures” mean debentures created and issued by the Commission under The State Electricity Commission Act, 1945-1952, and any amendments of that Act;
- “stock” means inscribed stock created and issued by the Commission under the provisions of the State Electricity Commission Act, 1945-1952, and any amendments of that Act;
- “stock ledger” means the ledger of the Commission in which the stock held is recorded or inscribed;
- “stock holder” means the person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger of the Commission in respect of any stock;
- “Schedule” means the schedule to these Regulations.

2.—Debentures.

A debenture shall be in accordance with Form No. 1 of the Schedule.

3.—Applications for Debentures.

An application to purchase debentures shall be in a form approved by the Commission. This form shall be completed and signed by any person desiring to purchase debentures and shall be transmitted by him to the Registrar.

The applicant shall also at the same time pay the full amount of the purchase price for the debentures or an amount by way of deposit as approved by the Commission. The Commission shall, as soon as may be convenient after the receipt of the purchase money in full, issue to the applicant the required debentures. The balance of the purchase money due on any application payable by instalments for debentures shall be paid in accordance with the terms of the application and the prospectus. A receipt for the debentures shall be given by the purchaser.

4.—Inscription of Stock.

Minimum Holding—Except with the approval of the Commission to the contrary, stock shall be inscribed or remain inscribed only in amounts of £10 or some multiple of £10.

5.—Applications for Stock.

An application for stock shall be in a form approved by the Commission. This form shall be completed and signed by any person desiring to purchase stock and shall be transmitted by him to the Registrar. The applicant shall also at the same time pay the full amount of the purchase price for the stock or an amount by way of deposit as approved by the Commission. In the case of a joint account, the application shall set forth the names in the order in which they are to appear in the stock ledger. The Commission shall, as soon as may be convenient after the receipt of the application, proceed to allot the required stock. The balance of the purchase money due on any application payable by instalments for stock shall be paid in accordance with the terms of the application and the prospectus.

6.—Interim Receipt and Allotment.

On receipt of the application the Registrar shall cause to be sent to the applicant an interim receipt for any payment made. After allotment and payment in full for the stock, the name of the allottee together with the amount of stock allotted and such other matters and particulars as the Registrar may deem necessary, shall be inscribed in the stock ledger.

7.—Exchange of Debentures for Stock or of Stock for Debentures.

(1) Where a person desires to exchange debentures held by him for stock or *vice versa*, he shall transmit to the Registrar an application in the form approved by the Commission and shall lodge therewith the debentures or (as the case may be) if required by the Registrar the certificate of inscription of the stock held by him, and thereupon the Registrar shall allot stock or (as the case may be) allot and issue debentures in accordance with such application and the debentures lodged with such application shall be cancelled.

(2) For the purpose of exchange as aforesaid, the value of the stock and debentures shall be taken as par, and the exchange effected on that basis, and on every such exchange the appropriate entries shall be made in the stock ledger.

(3) Before delivering any debentures which are issued in exchange for stock, the Registrar shall cause the overdue interest coupons to be cut off and cancelled.

(4) A person who applies to exchange stock for debentures shall, if so required by the Registrar, pay the cost of printing the debentures issued to him as a result of such application.

8.—Certificate of Inscription of Stock.

At the request of the stockholder the Registrar may issue a Certificate of Inscription of Stock in a form approved by the Commission and such certificate shall be delivered only to the person whose name is inscribed in the stock ledger as the holder of the stock for which the certificate is issued, or to his attorney, or to a member of a recognised Stock Exchange who represents such stockholder, or to a person authorised in writing by the stockholder to take delivery of such certificate.

9.—Companies, Firms and Corporations.

Stock may be inscribed in the name or names of one or more persons, not exceeding four, or in the name of a registered company or other corporation, but the Registrar shall first be furnished with a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation, or Act of Parliament, or Royal Charter or other instrument under which such company or corporation is established, together with a certified specimen of the seal of the company or corporation, a duly verified copy of any regulations, by-laws or resolutions governing the mode of affixing the seal, and the full names and specimen signatures of all persons authorised to sign documents in connection therewith. The document containing such information shall, unless the Registrar otherwise decides, be signed and sealed in the presence of an officer of the Registry. The Registrar shall cause such document to be affixed in the Signature Register and thereafter it shall not be necessary for an officer of the Registry to witness the affixing of such seal.

If from any cause any such authorised person is substituted by another person, notification in writing and under seal shall be given by the Company or Corporation to the Registrar.

Firms shall not be registered as such, but in the names of the individual partners.

10.—Friendly Societies, Industrial Unions, Industrial Organisations or Incorporated Associations.

Stock may be inscribed in the name of any friendly society or industrial union of employers or industrial union of workers or other industrial organisation which the Registrar is satisfied is registered under the laws of any State or of the Commonwealth or any branch of a friendly society, industrial union or industrial organisation so registered or in the name of any organisation or body incorporated under the provisions of the Associations Incorporations Act, 1895-1947, and its amendments. The Registrar shall be supplied by any union, organisation, society or body in whose name stock is inscribed under this regulation with a certificate in the form approved by the Commission containing the names and signatures of two or more persons who are appointed to sign any document relating to stock inscribed in the name of such union, organisation, society or body. Certificates, receipts and other documents relating to stock inscribed under this regulation shall be issued only to such person or persons as are appointed in that behalf and no transactions in relation to stock inscribed in accordance with this regulation shall be effected unless such transactions are authorised by the persons so appointed and the Commission shall be under no liability in respect of any such transaction which is or purports to be so authorised. Whenever any person is appointed to replace a person authorised in accordance with the certificate, there shall be furnished by the union, organisation, society or body to the Registrar a fresh certificate in accordance with this regulation.

11.—Change of Address.

Any change of address of a stockholder shall be forthwith notified by him in writing to the Registrar.

12.—Verification of Ledger Entries.

Every entry in the stock ledger shall be initialled by the Registrar or such officer of the Commission as the Commission shall from time to time appoint, and such ledger shall be audited from time to time by any officer appointed for that purpose by the Auditor General of the State.

13.—Only Persons whose Names are Inscribed Recognised as Owners.

The Commission and Registrar shall, for all purposes, be entitled to regard the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the stock ledger as the true and absolute owners and holders of the stock in relation to which such name or names is or are so inscribed, and all receipts, acquittances, discharges, releases and documents whatsoever executed by such person or persons in relation to such stock, or the interest thereon, shall be deemed for all purposes and against all persons to be documents duly executed by the person or persons entitled to such stock or interest, as the case may be.

14.—Trusts not Recognised.

No entry of any trust shall be made in the stock ledger, and the Commission and Registrar shall be entitled to treat the person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger in respect of any stock as the absolute owner or owners thereof and accordingly shall not be bound to recognise any equitable or other claim to or interest in such stock on the part of any other person.

15.—Receipts of Joint Stockholders.

The receipt of any one stockholder or of his attorney or agent duly authorised by the stockholder in that behalf in the case of stock inscribed in more than one name for any interest or for any document relating to such stock shall be a full and sufficient discharge to the Commission in respect thereof, but with regard to the payment of principal a discharge shall be given by all stockholders in a joint account.

Transfer of Stock

16.—Transfer Books and Form.

(1) The Registrar shall keep at the office of the Commission books to be called "Transfer Books" wherein all transfers of stock or any part thereof shall be entered and registered, which entries shall be numbered in such manner as the Commission shall determine and all transfers shall be in accordance with Form No. 2 in the schedule.

(2) The transfer shall be signed by the parties making and accepting such transfers; if any such party or parties be absent the transfer shall be signed by his or her attorney or attorneys thereunto lawfully authorised in that behalf.

(3) Every such transfer shall pass the right to all interest becoming due and payable after the date of registration thereof, so that the Commission shall not be under any necessity to apportion any such interest as between the transferor and the transferee.

(4) Every party to the transfer shall sign the transfer of stock form in the presence of a witness.

(5) The witness shall be a Justice of the Peace, Commissioner for Affidavits, Commonwealth or State Commissioner for Declarations, notary public, solicitor, member of recognised stock exchange, an officer of the Registry, a bank manager (who shall sign as such and add the bank stamp). Such witness shall state the capacity in which he has attested the signature.

(6) A person (not being an officer of the Registry) shall not attest the signature to a transfer and acceptance unless the person signing is personally known to the person witnessing the transfer.

17.—Marking of Form of Transfer of Stock.

The Registrar may at the request of the owner mark a form of Transfer of Stock which has been properly executed by the owner with the words "Stock Held Against this Transfer for £..... for a period of 14 days from.....". Where a form of Transfer of Stock is so marked the Registrar shall refuse to give effect to any dealing in stock to which the transfer relates within the period of 14 days in respect of the amount of the inscription so marked, except in completion of the marked transfer. Nothing in this regulation shall prevent the owner from surrendering to the Registrar a marked form of Transfer of Stock for cancellation within the period of 14 days provided that the form of Transfer of Stock has not been executed by a transferee.

A form of Transfer of Stock may be registered at any time within 14 days after the time the Registrar has marked it notwithstanding that the transferor after executing the transfer has died, become bankrupt or insolvent. After the expiry of the period of 14 days the Registrar shall refuse to register the transfer if he has had notice of the death, bankruptcy or insolvency of the transferor.

18.—Transfer After Notice of Intention to Redeem.

Where debentures or stock have been issued for a period which may be determined whether at any time or at one of several dates by the Commission by notice, such notice may in default of other provisions in the relevant prospectus be given by advertisement appearing at least six months before the intended date of determination in a daily newspaper published in each of the capital cities of the Commonwealth, and no transfer of the debentures or stock after the publication of such advertisement shall affect the right of the Commission to redeem the debentures or stock at the date so notified.

19.—Transfers to be Lodged on a Transfer Day.

Every transfer of stock shall be lodged at the office on a transfer day; the transfer days will be Monday to Friday inclusive in each week from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 3 p.m., except when any of those days fall on a bank holiday.

20.—Stock Ledger to be Closed.

The Registrar shall cause the stock ledger and transfer books to be closed for a period not exceeding 14 days next before any of the days on which interest on the stock is payable and the persons who on the day the books are so closed are inscribed as holders of stock shall be entitled to receive the interest next payable thereon.

21.—Entries in Stock Ledger.

As soon as possible after the registration of any transfer or transmission of stock the amount of stock transferred or transmitted shall be debited in the proper account in the stock ledger and shall be forthwith credited in the ledger to the account of the person or persons to whom it shall have been so transferred or transmitted and the Registrar shall cause the said stock ledger to be compared with the transfers and applications to ascertain that all the business transacted has been duly and properly entered and recorded.

Upon receipt of a request in writing from a stockholder so to do, the Registrar may amend the stock ledger if he is satisfied that any stock has been inscribed incorrectly in the stock ledger owing to a mistake in any document. If the Registrar so requires, the stockholder shall furnish a statutory declaration of the circumstances to support the request to amend the mistake.

22.—Joint Stockholders.

Stock may be transferred into the name of one or more persons not exceeding four and the full name, address and description of each shall be given.

23.—Inspection of Stock Ledger.

A stockholder or his attorney, on production of authority in writing shall be at liberty to inspect his account in the stock ledger at all reasonable times.

Transmission of Stock.

24.—Only Executors or Administrators Recognised.

(a) The executors or administrators of the estate of a deceased stockholder (not being one of several joint stockholders) shall be the only person or persons recognised by the Commission as having any title to the stock inscribed in the name of such deceased stockholder.

(b) In the case of the death of any one or more of the joint holders of any stock, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognised by the Commission as having any title to or interest in the stock.

The death may be proved by the production of probate of the will, letters of administration or certificates of death and, if required by the Registrar, by a statutory declaration by some disinterested person as to the identity of the deceased with the owner.

On completion of the proof of death in a joint account, the stock and interest thereon shall be registered in the name of the survivor or survivors.

On the death of the last survivor in a joint account, the death shall be proved as in the case of an owner on sole account and steps shall be taken by the Registrar to inscribe the stock in the name of the executor or administrator of the last survivor.

25.—Transmission—Evidence of.

(1) Where stock has become transmitted in consequence of the death, bankruptcy or insolvency of any stockholder or by any lawful means other than by a transfer under these regulations, the application for registration of the transmission shall be lodged with the Registrar and shall be in accordance with Form No. 3 in the schedule and shall be authenticated by a statutory declaration in writing.

(2) The declaration shall—

- (a) state the manner in which the stock shall have been so transmitted;
- (b) state the name of the party to whom such stock shall have been so transmitted;
- (c) identify the applicant as the said party;
- (d) be signed and made by the party and by some creditable person approved by the Registrar;
- (e) if made in Western Australia, be witnessed by a Commissioner for taking Affidavits in the Supreme Court of Western Australia, a Commissioner for taking Declarations, or a Justice of the Peace;
- (f) if made outside the State of Western Australia, be witnessed by a notary public or British Consul or Vice Consul.

The person who witnesses the declaration shall certify to the identity of the persons making the declaration.

(3) The Registrar may in addition require the application to be authenticated in such other manner as he shall require.

(4) If the transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any testamentary instrument or by intestacy, the probate of the will or the letters of administration or an office copy thereof, shall, together with the declaration be produced to the Registrar, and if the transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any bankruptcy or insolvency, the adjudication or order of sequestration or an office copy thereof respectively shall, together with the declaration be produced to the Registrar.

(5) The Registrar may require all probates, letters of administration, orders of sequestration, vesting orders or other like orders to be left at the Registry at least two clear days before the stock affected by them may be dealt with.

(6) Particulars of all such documents shall be entered in a register.

26.—Persons Entitled to be Registered on Transmission.

(a) A person becoming entitled on transmission in the manner aforesaid may either himself be registered as the holder of the stock so transmitted, or instead of being himself registered may, if approved by the Registrar, make such transfer of the stock as the stockholder from whom the same was transmitted could have made, and any such transfer shall be accompanied by such evidence in proof of the title of the transferor as the Registrar may reasonably require.

(b) The Registrar shall require the signatures of persons who claim transmission of stock by virtue of their appointment as executors, administrators or trustees, to be verified to his satisfaction, by a disinterested person approved by the Registrar.

(c) Where the Registrar is satisfied that stock is inscribed in the name of a person whose property is required by law to be placed in the hands of the Public Trustee or other officer charged with the duty of administering the estates of deceased persons or missing persons or persons under disability the Registrar may upon receiving a sufficient indemnity from the Public Trustee, Public Curator or other officer, transfer the stock to the name of the Public Trustee, Public Curator or other officer.

27.—Marriage of Female Stockholder.

On the marriage of a female owner of stock her name and description shall be altered in the stock ledger with respect to stock standing in her name solely or jointly after lodgment with the Registrar of a request in the form approved by the Commission stating in full the name of her husband. The stockholder shall, if the Registrar so desires, lodge with the Registrar for inspection her marriage certificate or a certified copy of such marriage certificate, together with such other proof as the Registrar may reasonably require.

28.—Powers of Attorney.

- (a) If the Registrar is satisfied that a power of attorney has been properly executed and attested and that the signatures thereto are genuine, the Registrar may act upon the authority contained therein.
- (b) The Registrar may act on any power of attorney which in his opinion contains full power to act for any purpose in relation to stock.
- (c) Where a power of attorney relates to stock in a joint account, it shall be signed by all the owners.
- (d) The Registrar may require a power of attorney to be left at the Registry at least two clear days before it is acted upon.
- (e) Particulars of every power of attorney left at the Registry for notation shall be entered by the Registrar in a register.

29.—Interest.

Interest on stock shall be paid by one of the following methods:—

- (1) Except as hereinafter provided or unless otherwise instructed by the stockholder, payment shall be made to the stockholder by cheque sent by ordinary prepaid letter through the post, addressed to the stockholder or the owner whose name in a joint account is first inscribed in the stock ledger at his address last notified to the Registrar before the closing of the stock ledger or to some person nominated in writing by the stockholder. Cheques shall be crossed "Not Negotiable" and shall be made payable to the order of the payee.
- (2) By payment into an account in a bank within the Commonwealth at the risk of the stockholder under the following conditions:—
- (a) A stockholder who desires interest on stock owned by him to be paid to the credit of a bank account shall complete and sign an authority in the form approved by the Commission. In the case of a joint account, the owner whose name is first inscribed in the stock ledger may sign the form, or the form may be signed by all the owners.
- (b) Applications for payment into a bank account shall be lodged at the Registry at least 14 days before the interest is due and the instructions therein shall remain in force although the stock may have been added to or partly transferred.
- (3) Where stock is inscribed solely in the name of an infant, interest on such stock may be paid as directed by the stockholder or, at the discretion of the Registrar, may be paid to the infant's parent or guardian whose receipt shall be a valid discharge.
- (4) Where stock is inscribed in the name of an infant jointly with one or more other persons, the interest thereon may be paid to the infant jointly with that other person or those other persons or, at the discretion of the Registrar, may be paid to the infant's parent or guardian jointly with that other person or those other persons.
- (5) Interest on stock inscribed in the name of an infant, or in the name of a person of unsound mind, jointly with others not under legal disability, may be paid as directed by the stockholders other than those under a disability, and without the concurrence of the infant or person of unsound mind, upon sufficient proof of legal disability being lodged with the Registrar.

Where, under the conditions of the issue of any loan the Commission has provided that the first payment of interest on any stock shall be made to the person to whom the stock was originally allotted, then the original allottee shall for the purpose of the first payment of interest be deemed to be the stockholder or owner under this regulation.

30.—Repayment of Principal.

Stockholders may by agreement with the Registrar arrange for repayment, when due, of the principal sum into a bank account.

31.—General.

- (1) The Registrar shall take all necessary steps to secure specimen signatures of all stockholders. The signatures to all forms lodged at the Registry after the application for stock has been received shall be tested by comparison with the specimen signatures.
- (2) Where any person is unable to sign his name, instruments required for the purposes of these regulations shall be executed by him and attested in such manner as the Registrar requires.
- (3) The Registrar may, if he deems fit, forward to the stockholder a notice of dealing in the form approved by the Commission on any application received by him relating to stock inscribed in the name of such owner and the Registrar shall not register the transaction until sufficient time has elapsed for a reply to be received.
- (4) All possible precautions shall be taken by the Registrar for the security of the stock to its owner and to guard against fraud or improper transactions. Erasures shall not be made in the stock ledger. Errors shall be ruled through and correct entries made.
- (5) No person other than the officer or officers appointed by the Auditor General to audit transactions and the Registrar and officers of the Commission immediately engaged on inscribed stock business and approved by the Registrar shall have access to any books, forms or other records.
- (6) All officers so appointed or approved shall not divulge any information coming to their knowledge in the course of their duties, except as necessary in the transaction of business or as required by law.

Between State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers Industrial Association of Workers; and the Metropolitan and South Western Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, Applicants, and the State Electricity Commission of Western Australia, Respondent.

HAVING heard Mr. R. A. West on behalf of the State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Mr. H. Iles on behalf of The Metropolitan and South Western Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia and Mr. A. B. Stannard on behalf of the Respondent and in pursuance of a remission to me by the Court of Arbitration and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, I hereby order and declare that Award No. 86 of 1948, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the terms of the attached schedule.

Schedule.

3.—Definitions.

(a) Engineering Section:

Delete existing definitions and insert in lieu thereof:—

(1) "Pattern Maker" means a tradesman who makes patterns and appurtenances thereof of any materials, used in the production of castings.

(2) "Electrical Tradesman" means a tradesman holding the requisite license under the Electricity Act, 1945, who performs the work of one or more of the following tradesmen; electrical fitter, electrical installer, armature winder.

(3) "Lineman" means a worker engaged (with or without labourers assisting) in erecting poles, towers, etc., for electric wires, or erecting wire or cables on poles, towers, etc., or over buildings or tying it or them to insulators or joining or insulating it or them, or doing any work on electric poles, towers, etc., off the ground, or doing any other work in connection with wiring and fixing which does not require the possession of an installer's license under the regulations made pursuant to the Electricity Act, 1945.

(4) "Tradesman" means a worker, not being an apprentice, who in the course of his employment works from drawings or prints, or makes precision measurements or applies general trade experience, and includes a first-class machinist.

(5) "Instrument Fitter (Power Station)" means a tradesman employed at a power station engaged upon repairing, testing and adjusting of any type of mechanical or electrical instruments used in the operation of steam driven turbo-alternators, boilers and their auxiliaries or electrical relays.

(6) "First-class machinist" means a tradesman who is partly or wholly engaged in setting up and operating the following machines:—Lathe, boring machine, milling machine, planing machine, shaping machine, slotting machine, and grinding machine.

(7) "Second-class machinist" means an adult not engaged as a tradesman and who is not required to work from drawings or prints required to be scaled and/or measured from drawings or prints, or to make precision measurements, but who is engaged in operating or in the setting up and operating of machines enumerated in the definition of "first-class machinist" or who is engaged operating a key-seating machine, or a second-class brass finisher or as a pipe fitter on low pressure work.

(8) "Third-class machinist" means a machinist, not being a process worker, who operates any machine set up by a tradesman or any machine the setting up of which does not require the knowledge or skill of a second-class machinist.

(9) "Meter Fixer" means a worker employed in the fixing and removing of meters who for the purpose of carrying out his work is not required to possess an Installer's License under the regulations made pursuant to the Electricity Act, 1945.

(10) "Meter Tester—First Grade" means a worker whose work consists of:—

- (a) Placing polyphase electricity meters in position and connecting them up to a supply for the purpose of testing their accuracy or registration in conjunction with a master meter or other checking device; and
- (b) Adjusting a regulating screw or other regulating device on the meter in order to secure uniformity of the speed of the meter under check with the checking device within the prescribed limits; and
- (c) Noting or recording the speed of the meter under check.

"Meter Tester—Second grade" has the same meaning as "Meter Tester—First grade" except that it shall be read and construed as applying to single phase meters instead of polyphase meters.

(b) Engine-driving Section.

(i) (2) "Auxiliary Plant Attendant"—Add the following words after "station," "East Perth Power Station, and the boilers South Fremantle Power Station."

(ii) (3) "Boiler Cleaner"—(b) Add the following after the word "blowers," "on 'A' Station boilers East Perth only."

(iii) Insert the following:—

(8) "Boiler controller" means a worker responsible for the safe and efficient working of and the maintenance of steam pressures and temperatures of up to four boilers whose controls are grouped on one panel at South Fremantle Power Station.

(9) "Assistant boiler controller" means a worker stationed on the operating floor of the boiler house South Fremantle Power Station who carries out the following duties in conjunction with the boiler controller (a) operate remote controlled soot-blowers; (b) attend to oil burners; (c) hand control feedwater when necessary; (d) attend to coal weighers; (e) operate transfer conveyors; (f) attend to mill feeders; (g) operate blowdown valves under instructions; (h) prepare boiler plant for service under instructions; (j) assist and relieve boiler controller as required.

(10) "Hoist attendant" means a worker whose duty it is to attend to the operation, lubrication and cleaning of skip hoist, coal screens, coal crushers and chutes to belt conveyors and stockpile at South Fremantle Power Station.

(11) "Tippler attendant" means a worker responsible for the removal of coal from railway trucks by means of the tippler and shall include the operation, lubrication and cleaning of a tippler plant at South Fremantle Power Station.

(12) "Coal belt attendant" means a worker whose duty it is to operate the belt tipplers over the station bunkers, attend to the magnetic separators, attend to the running, lubrication and cleaning of the rubber belt conveyor system at South Fremantle Power Station.

(13) "Greaser driver" means a worker on shift work whose duties include the driving of the shift vehicle, plant greasing and general operating assistant on the junior grades at South Fremantle Power Station.

(c) General.

Delete items 2 and 3 and insert in lieu thereof:

(2) "Permanent worker" means a worker other than a casual worker employed under the terms of this award."

(4) Delete figure (4) and insert in lieu thereof (3).

6.—Contract of Service

Delete the existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:

(a) No permanent worker shall leave the department until the expiration of fourteen (14) days written notice of his intention to do so, without the approval of the Commission.

(b) Except in the case of summary dismissal for misconduct, peculation, or theft, fourteen (14) days written notice shall be given by the Commission to any permanent worker and the reason for dismissal shall be stated in such notice.

(c) The Commission shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by a union or the unions parties to this award or by a union or unions affiliated with it or them or by any other association or union associated with it or them or through the breakdown of the Commission's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the Commission cannot reasonably prevent.

10.—Public Holidays.

Subclause (a): After the word "Boxing Day" add the following:—

"but at the option of the employer any employee may be granted Show Day in lieu of Sovereign's Birthday provided he makes application to his Officer-in-Charge.

17.—Overtime and Sunday Work.

Sub-clause (g) (i). Delete the words "two-shillings (2s.)" and insert in lieu thereof "three shillings (3s.)"

Sub-clause (g) (iv). Delete the words "two shillings (2s.)" and insert in lieu thereof "two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)"

24.—Height Money.

Delete existing clause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

Employees not in receipt of the power station allowance prescribed in clause 27 when working on or from temporary stages, planks or ladders at a height of fifty feet or more above the ground floor level shall be paid one and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day extra whilst so employed. This clause shall not apply to linemen.

27.—Allowances, Special Provisions, etc.

Item 6.

Insert words "second grade" after the word "a" in second line.

Item 7.

(i) Insert words "meter fixers" after word "assistants" in first line.

(ii) Insert words "or ankle" after word "Knee" in second line,

(iii) A lineman, after twenty (20) years' service as a lineman, and over fifty-five (55) years of age who is not able to perform his usual occupation as a lineman and who is engaged on work under this award which provides a lesser rate of pay shall retain his linemen's rate of pay whilst so engaged.

(iv) While driving earth boring machines and or pole erecting tripod linemen's assistants shall receive three shillings (3s.) per day extra.

(v) Linemen in the City Maintenance Gang while working on mains maintenance or erection of steel poles within the area bounded by Spring Street, George Street, the Railway Line, Lord Street, Victoria Avenue and the Swan River; shall be paid 1s. per day extra.

(vi) All Meter Fixers shall be supplied with Tool Bags.

(vii) All tools required by Meter Fixers, Linemen and their assistants shall be supplied by the Department.

(viii) Employees working with outside line gangs shall be attached, where possible, to the gang nearest his place of residence.

Delete items 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 and insert in lieu thereof the following:

Item 9. In addition to any other allowance which may be payable, the following allowance shall be paid—

(a) to workers engaged on boiler cleaning work—one shilling (1s.) per day extra;

(b) to workers under the direct control of the Power Production Engineer employed in classifications 17 to 44 of the Wages Schedule in power houses of installed capacity of 12.5 m.w. or more on operation work on power station plant—three shillings (3s.) per week extra.

Item 10. Workers when temporarily—

(a) using tar or joderlite;

(b) working in water over their ankles if not provided with rubber boots;

(c) engaged on concrete work

shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra, provided this shall not be applied to a worker whose margin already provides for this work; and

(d) workers getting wet while engaged in cleaning screens at South Fremantle Power Station shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day extra, provided this shall not be applied to a worker whose margin already provides for this work.

(a) Each worker covered by this award shall be supplied with two sets of overalls annually after six months' continuous service.

(b) Each worker shall sign an acknowledgement on receipt thereof, and on leaving his employment shall return same to the Commission.

(c) During the time they are on issue to the worker he shall be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, fair wear and tear attributable to ordinary use excepted.

Item 12.

Tradesmen, wiremen and/or apprentices in the 4th and 5th year of their apprenticeship, and assistants under the direct control of the Power Production Engineer employed in operating power houses of installed capacity of 12.5 megawatts or more, on maintenance and operation of such power stations shall be paid 12s. per week extra and apprentices other than in their 4th and 5th year of apprenticeship 6s. per week extra.

This allowance shall be deemed to include all allowances included in clause 27 other than sub-clause 8 (b).

Item 13.

Except where otherwise expressly provided, not more than one of the foregoing allowances or extra rates shall be paid at any one time, and where more than one allowance or extra rate applies, only the highest shall be paid.

Item 14.

The foregoing allowances and extra rates shall be paid irrespective of the times at which the work is performed and shall not be included in the calculation of overtime or other penalty rates.

28.—Leading Hands.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 17 of 1952.

Registered 23rd December, 1952.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, of Western Australia, this 8th day of December, 1952, between the Western Australian Local Governing Bodies' Officers' Association Union of Workers (hereinafter called the Association) of the one part, and the Kalgoorlie Road Board (hereinafter called the Board) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area.

The Agreement shall extend over and include the boundaries of the Kalgoorlie Road District and any premises or land upon which any undertakings of the Board are being carried on.

2.—Scope.

The Agreement shall apply to all officers in the employment of the Kalgoorlie Road Board, but shall not include Health Inspectors.

3.—Preservation of Existing Rates and Conditions.

An officer who at the date of the making of this Agreement is in receipt of a higher rate of salary, remuneration or allowance, or any of whose conditions of employment is superior to any prescribed in this Agreement, shall not have his salary, remuneration or allowance or conditions of employment adversely affected as a consequence of this Agreement.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Year." For the purpose of this Agreement, the term year shall mean the statutory period determined as being the financial year for a road board.

(b) "Permanent Officer." A permanent officer, for the purpose of this Agreement, is one who is appointed by resolution of the Board and is given notice of such appointments in writing under the hand of the Secretary.

(c) "Temporary Officer" shall mean a worker engaged by the day and paid subject to the provisions of clause 5 (f).

(d) "Revenue." (1) For the purpose of this Agreement, revenue shall, except as provided in subclauses (2) and (3) hereof, deem to mean all moneys received by the Board from all sources, including moneys received from the Main Roads Department, State Housing Commission, or any other Government Department or instrumentality, or any other contribution for the construction and maintenance of any road, culvert, bridge or similar undertaking.

(2) Moneys received by way of loan or trust and moneys received from the realisation of real estate and other fixed assets of a capital nature shall not be deemed to be revenue within the meaning of this Agreement.

(3) Revenue from electric light undertakings, or any other trading concern or public utility, shall be deemed to be only the net profit on such undertakings or works after providing for all expenses, provided that for ascertaining the salary of a Secretary or any Engineer who is responsible for such undertakings or work, such net profit shall not in any case be deemed to be less than one-half of the total receipts from such undertakings or works.

(4) At any particular time during the continuance of this Agreement, "revenue" shall mean the revenue calculated according to the foregoing provision as shown by the accounts of the Board for the financial year preceding the time in question.

(e) "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Board, Local Board of Health, Vermin Board, Water Board, Sanitary or Drainage Board, or the person who may combine the duties of all of these positions.

(f) "Engineer" shall mean an officer of the Board (excepting a foreman or overseer) qualified by training or experience who is required to prepare estimates and specifications, and to set out, supervise, control or inspect any outside work of the Board.

(g) "Board" shall mean and include the Kalgoorlie Road Board, Local Board of Health and Vermin Board.

(h) "Works Foreman or Overseer" shall mean an officer of the Board who is required under the direction of the Engineer to supervise, control and inspect the outside work of the Board.

(i) "Traffic Inspector" shall mean an officer appointed as such by the Board, whether his employment is solely by the Board or conjointly with any other local authority.

(j) "Association." Association shall mean the West Australian Local Governing Bodies' Officers' Association.

5.—Salaries.

The following shall be the minimum rate of salaries payable to officers governed by this Agreement.

6.—Grading.

When the revenue of the Board exceeds £22,000 per annum, an officer of such Board shall be appointed to the position of—

- (a) (1) Assistant Secretary, or
- (2) Accountant, or
- (3) Chief Clerk.

- (b) Classified Clerical Officers.—Where in the opinion of the Board the duties performed by an officer warrant his appointment as a Classified Clerical Officer, the Board may allot him to the grade which it considers appropriate. Should he be dissatisfied with the classification, the matter shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

7.—Payment of Salaries.

Salaries shall be paid at least fortnightly.

8.—Acting in Higher, Dual or Multiple Capacity.

(a) Where an officer other than the Secretary performs the duty of a position higher than that in which he is generally employed for a term exceeding one month, he shall be paid from the end of that time while performing any such duty, at a rate not less than the minimum salary awarded for the higher position.

(b) Where any officer regularly carries out the duties of or occupies a dual office, he shall be paid the salary pertaining to the higher office.

(c) Where any officer carries out the duties of or occupies more than two of the following positions, he shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the salary to which he would otherwise be entitled under this Agreement.

Secretary-Engineer-Traffic Inspector.
Vermin Inspector-Building Surveyor.

9.—Resignations and Dismissals.

Terms of Appointment.

Subject to the provisions of the relevant Act or Acts for the time being in force, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) An officer being a Secretary or Engineer shall not, without the approval of the Board, resign from his position until the expiration of one month's notice of his intention so to do. All other officers shall be required to give one week's notice.

(b) Clause 8 (b).—One month's notice shall be given by the Board to an officer whose services are no longer required, provided that this paragraph shall not apply to cases for summary dismissal for misconduct of any nature, including criminal misconduct.

10.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Except as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c), the hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday, both inclusive, with a break for one hour for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(b) The hours mentioned in paragraph (a) may be varied by agreement between the Board and the Association, and where the duties appertaining to any office cannot be efficiently carried out within the prescribed hours, then in default of such agreement the hours of work shall be determined by the Registrar of the Court. Provided, however, that the officer or officers concerned shall not be required to work (except subject to the provisions of the next following clause) a greater number of hours than those included in the hours specified in the said paragraph (a).

(c) The hours of duty of Foreman and Overseer and other officers who exercise control over non-clerical workers shall be the same as the men over whom they exercise control.

(d) The hours of duty of Traffic Inspectors shall not exceed 38 hours per week without payment of overtime, provided, however, that the Board and the Traffic Inspector may, by mutual arrangements, agree on the hours to be worked.

11.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), all work done outside the hours specified in clause (9) hereof shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Attendance at meetings shall be deemed as overtime on the following basis:—

(1) Attendance at one works committee and one ordinary meeting of the Board per month on the part of the Secretary and/or Engineer shall not be deemed to be overtime as provided in paragraph (a) above.

(2) Attendance at other meetings outside the normal working hours shall, as applied to the Secretary and/or Engineer be deemed to be overtime and such overtime as has been worked shall be allowed as time off duty during the following pay period.

(3) All other officers shall be paid for at overtime rates as prescribed in subclause (a), (d) and (e) of this clause.

(4) Provided, however, that where any Traffic Inspector is required to attend any meetings, such attendance shall be considered as part of his hours of duty as prescribed in clause 10 (d).

(c) A statement of overtime shall be submitted at each meeting of the Board containing particulars of all overtime alleged to have been worked since the expiration of the preceding meeting by an officer. No claim for overtime shall be payable or other allowance made, therefore, after three months from the expiration from the time when the overtime is alleged to have been worked, unless the statement relating thereto hereinbefore referred to has been furnished to the Board.

(d) An officer required to work overtime for more than two (2) hours before his usual starting time or more than two (2) hours after his usual ceasing time shall receive an allowance of five shillings (5s.) for any meal required, provided that a Saturday, Sunday or holiday shall be regarded as an ordinary working day for the purpose of this subclause.

(e) When an officer other than a departmental head or executive officer is required to be on duty on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 12 or on Saturdays or Sundays he shall be paid as follows:—

Saturday—As in paragraph (a) above, and
All other time—Double time.

(f) A minimum of two (2) hours shall be paid when overtime is worked.

12.—Holidays.

The following holidays shall be granted and paid for, namely, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Boulder Cup Day and Kalgoorlie Cup Day, where such days occur on a usual working day, Foundation Day, Queen's Birthday, Australia Day and Anzac Day and all days gazetted as Bank Holidays and any other day or days which may be proclaimed as a public holiday in the Board's district or may be proclaimed as a holiday for persons employed in the public service or under the Public Service Act or the Government of Western Australia.

13.—Annual Leave.

(a) All officers shall be entitled to and shall take a minimum of three weeks annual recreation leave (exclusive of intervening holidays) on full pay. The leave shall be taken at a time mutually convenient to the officer and the Board at any time within six months of it becoming due.

(b) By agreement between the Board and any of its officers leave may be allowed to accumulate up to and including a period not exceeding that allowed for two years' service.

(c) An officer not completing one year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of leave in proportion to the length of his service.

(d) Clause 11 (d) Any officer, after proper inquiry at which he is represented, who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the provisions of this clause.

14.—Long Service Leave.

1. Continuous service means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or

an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board provided that an employee who was employed on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Commonwealth of Australia or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Board shall after each period of ten years' continuous service as a permanent full-time employee thereof commencing from the 1st day of January, 1936, be entitled to thirteen weeks' long service leave and the employee shall be entitled to full pay for the said thirteen weeks.

3. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board which will as far as possible meet with the wishes of the employee but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

4. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year unless otherwise decided by the Board.

5. In the event of the resignation, retirement or death of an employee the Board shall pay to such employee (or in the case of death to his personal representatives, or if there be none to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under this Agreement to grant such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed the Board shall authorise the payments to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this Agreement have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

6. An employee dismissed by the Board except in the matter of retrenchment shall not be paid any sum pursuant of the preceding clause.

7. Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

8. The Board may at its discretion, either (a) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave or (b) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

9. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave but are to form part of the long service leave.

10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this clause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease payments or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Provided that where an employee leaves the service of the Board who has served continuously for at least three years next before his retirement shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* for the period of his employment.

15.—Sick Leave.

All officers shall receive pay as follows. Ten (10) days' full pay for each year of service with a maximum of 60 days on production of a medical certificate.

16.—Travelling Allowance.

(a) All reasonable out-of-pocket and travelling expenses incurred by an officer in discharge of his duties shall be paid at least once a month by the Board. The method and mode of travelling or the vehicle to be supplied shall be mutually arranged between the Board and the officer concerned: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall impose an obligation on any officer to provide a method of conveyance at his own expense, nor shall it be a condition precedent to the appointment of an officer that he shall provide his own conveyance.

(b) When by agreement an officer supplies his own means of conveyance he shall as a minimum be paid a mileage allowance to cover all expenses, in accordance with the terms of the following schedule.

Provided that an officer may be paid in lieu of payment according to the above scale a mileage allowance calculated on an annual basis of an amount mutually agreed upon and payable on an appropriate monthly basis unless otherwise agreed to.

17.—Camping Allowance.

An officer required to work in the field shall be paid an allowance of eight shillings (8s.) per night while in camp.

18.—Instruments.

The Board shall provide and maintain all instruments and equipment.

19.—Preference to Seniority on Promotion.

Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office preference to fill such vacancy may be given to the senior officer of the department, regard being had to his efficiency and long service.

20.—Record.

(a) A readily intelligible record shall be kept by the Board containing the following particulars:—

- (1) Name of each officer.
- (2) The class of work on which the officer is engaged.
- (3) The hours worked each day.
- (4) The salary (and overtime if any) paid to each officer.

(b) Such record shall be signed by the officer and shall be open for inspection during office hours by the Union secretary or an accredited representative and such person may take extracts therefrom.

21.—Financial Statement.

The financial statements of the Board shall be made available to the inspection of the secretary of the Union and a copy shall be supplied to the Union upon request.

22.—Over-age or Under-standard Officers.

Where any over-age or under-standard officer is to be employed the salary of such officer shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

23.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952. There

are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement the functions of:—

- (1) Adjusting any matters of difference that may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them.
- (2) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

24.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years.
