WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1947 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Council has requested that certain lands named and described in the Schedule hereunder which have been used for streets or ways within the City of Perth, be declared public highways: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, except as

therein stated; and whereas it is in the section provided, *inter alia*, that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that he has established a fund for insurance against the liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under the liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt the employer from the operation of the section; and whereas Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch), of 168 St. George's Terrace, Perth, is an employer within the meaning of the Act and as such subject to the provisions of section 13, and having duly made application under and in accordance with the Act and the regulations made and in force thereunder for exemption from the operation of the section, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the Act to pay compensation to workers employed by it and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, 3½ per cent. Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock of the value of five thousand pounds (£5,000) which securities are duly charged with all payments to become due under such liability as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by section 13 of the Act, doth hereby exempt the said Australian Iron and Steel Limited (Perth Branch) from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 25th day of January, 1955.

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1952.

THE following copy of an order of the Arbitration Court regarding the quarterly adjustment of the basic wage is published for general information:—

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION
OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in the matter of Part VII of the said Act—Basic Wage.

The 27th Day of January, 1953.

Basic Wage.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the above Act and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby adjusts and amends the basic wage declarations made on the 7th day of December, 1950, and the 28th day of November, 1951, so as to read and have effect as follows:—

Adults.

(1) Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth:—

(4) The wages being paid to these workers will be altered proportionately, if and when necessary, to the alterations in the basic wages above declared by the application of the percentage where percentages are fixed in the Award or Industrial Agreement and by direct proportion where the amount and not percentage is prescribed.

Contract of Employment.

(5) Payment shall be pro rata where the term of employment is for less than one (1) week.

This order shall take effect from and inclusive of the date hereof: Provided that payment of the amounts by which the basic wages have been increased by virtue of this order may at the employer's option be delayed until the end of the first pay period which commences after this date.

The above regulations are amended as follows:—

(a) By deleting the whole of lines 7 and 8 of regulation 113.

(b) By revoking regulation 137 and substituting in lieu thereof the following new regulation:—

137. (1) The provisions of this regulation are subject to the provisions of section 31 of the Traffic Act, 1919, as amended.

(2) A person shall not drive a vehicle, other than a motor wagon, road tractor, locomotive, traction engine or vehicle fitted with iron or steel tyres, on any road or portion of a road within the metropolitan area at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour:

Provided that on any of the roads or portions of a road specified in the Twelfth Schedule to these regulations the maximum speed limit for such a vehicle may be 35 miles per hour and no person shall drive the vehicle at a speed exceeding that limit.

(3) A person shall not drive a vehicle, other than a motor wagon, road tractor, locomotive or traction engine or vehicle fitted with iron or steel tyres on any road or portion of a road contained within any limits of a town which are situated outside the metropolitan area at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour.

(4) When passing any hospital or school, or when travelling into, on, or across any of the intersections or junctions of roads specified in the Thirteenth Schedule to these regulations a person shall not drive a vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour.

(5) Subject to the provisions of subregulations (2), (3) and (4) a person shall not drive on any road or portion of a road any motor omnibus (all the tyres of which are pneumatic) at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour.

(6) A person shall not drive on any road or portion of a road any motor wagon or road tractor specified in column 1 of the tabulation hereunder at a speed exceeding the maximum speed limit prescribed therefor and appearing opposite thereto in column 2 of the tabulation:

Column 1.	Column 2.
For a Motor Wagon or Road Tractor.	The maximum speed limit shall be.
(1) Of a gross weight not exceeding 4 tons	40 miles per hour.
(2) Of a gross weight exceeding 4 tons	30 miles per hour.
(3) Drawing a trailer or semi-trailer	25 miles per hour.
(4) When travelling over any bridge	15 miles per hour.

Provided that, where a lower maximum speed than is specified in the above tabulation is prescribed by this or any other regulation for motor wagons, road tractors, or any other vehicle on any road, no person shall drive a motor wagon or road tractor on such road at a speed in excess of such lower maximum speed.

(7) A person shall not drive a locomotive, traction engine, or vehicle fitted with iron or steel tyres on any road at a speed exceeding 8 miles per hour.

(c) By adding a third proviso to Regulation 84 as follows:—

Provided also that where the driver of a vehicle on any road is making a right hand turn, or has given the signal indicating his intention to turn his vehicle to the right, it shall not be an offence against this regulation if the driver of any other vehicle on the road overtakes the firstmentioned vehicle on its left hand side and continues along that road, after having first taken all necessary precautions to ensure that the road is sufficiently clear for that purpose.

(d) By adding the Twelfth and Thirteenth Schedules to the Act as follows:—

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 2 of 1953.

Registered 19th January, 1953.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 28th day of November, One thousand Nine hundred and Fifty-two (1952), between the State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part and the Municipality of Geraldton (hereinafter called "the Employer") of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations herein

after appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Engineers (Linesmen) (Geraldton Municipal Council) Agreement".

2.—Arrangement.

4. Area.
5. Term.
6. Definitions.
7. Contract of Service.
8. Hours of Duty.
9. Overtime.
10. Holidays.

16. Wages.

3.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the workers provided for in Clause 16 hereof who are employed by the employer.

4.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area within the jurisdiction of the Geraldton Municipal Council Electricity Department in connection with the distribution of electrical energy.

5.—Term.

The term of the Agreement shall be for a period of twelve months from the date hereof.

6.—Definitions.

"Linesman" means a worker engaged with or without labourers assisting erecting poles for electric wires or erecting wires or cables on poles or over buildings or tying it or them to insulators or joining or insulating it or them, or doing any work on electric poles off the ground or doing any other work in connection with wiring and fixing which does not require the possession of an installer's license under the regulations made pursuant to the Electricity Act, 1945.

"Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than one (1) week.

7.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side given on any day, or (if the employer terminate it) by payment of one week's pay, except—

- (i) in the case of a casual worker when one (1) hour's notice shall suffice; and
- (ii) for the first month of employment, when the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice or a day's pay shall be sufficient

(b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 11, or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Agreement.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such cases wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

8.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours.

(c) The starting and finishing times provided for in subclause (a) hereof may be altered by mutual agreement between the employer and his workers.

9.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours, and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in Clause 10 (a) shall be paid for at double time rates, except in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery, which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, when the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

(c) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

(d) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until he gets his meal.

(e) When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour or (in the case of a day-worker) after 6 p.m., whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

(f) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

(ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

10.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to Clause 9 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

11.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

12.—Special Rates and Provisions.

(a) A leading hand placed in charge of—

- (i) not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid eleven shillings (11s.) per week extra;
- (ii) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid twenty-two shillings (22s.) per week extra;
- (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid thirty-two shillings (32s.) per week extra.

(b) No linesman shall be allowed to work off the ground on live wires without an assistant.

13.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker (including an apprentice) cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

14.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

15.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for less than half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.
