PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRONER, Governor. ILL.S.] By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Hanry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1951, is as follows:—

- (2) No licensee shall in the Goldfields district (a) have or keep his licensed premises open for sale of liquor; or
 - (b) sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises,

at any time before nine o'clock in the morning or after eleven o'clock at night upon any day in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license

Provided that the Governor may, on the recom-Provided that the Governor may, on the recom-mendation of the Licensing Court, by Proclamation extend or reduce the hours in any licensing district or part of a district within the Goldfields district, and this subsection shall have effect as so modified, but any such Proclamation may, on the recommen-dation of the Licensing Court, be varied or revoked by a subsection proclamation by a subsequent Proclamation.

And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the 7th day of May, 1952, the hours were extended in specific districts being districts within the Goldfields district.

district. And whereas the Licensing Court, on the 15th day of January, 1953, made a recommendation to the Governor in respect of those hours. Now, therefore I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on that recommendation of the Licensing Court, do hereby vary the Proclamation dated the 7th day of May, 1952, by deleting from the licensing district of Kal-goorlie, mentioned in the Second Schedule of that Proclamation, the publicans' general licenses in re-spect of premises known as the Boulder Block Hotel, the Fimiston Hotel and the Westralia Hotel, and do hereby proclaim as follows: do hereby proclaim as follows:-

(1) The holders of publicans' general licenses in respect of premises known as the Boulder Block Hotel, Fimiston, the Fimiston Hotel, Fimiston, and

have or keep the licensed premises open fc' the sale of liquor; or sell any liquor or permit or suffer any lique, to be drunk or consumed in or upon the license

whether those respective days fall on a Sunday or any other day of the week at any time;

and then only during either period if the liquor is sold otherwise than by the bottle or in a bottle;

- (c) Saturday, except between the hours of midnight (Friday) and 12.30 a.m. and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 11 p.m.;
- (d) any other day of the week other than a day mentioned in the foregoing paragraphs (a), (b) and (c)

except between the following times:-

Monday, 9 a.m. to 12 midnight;

Tuesday, 12 midnight to 12.30 a.m.; 9 a.m. to 12 midnight;

Wednesday, 12 midnight to 12.30 a.m.; 9 a.m. to 12 midnight;

Thursday, 12 midnight to 12.30 a.m.; 9 a.m. to 12 midnight;

Friday, 12 midnight to 12.30 a.m.; 9 a.m. to 12 midnight.

(a) This Proclamation does not prejudice the operation of the provisions of the Licensing Act—contained in section 44, and in subsections
(3) and (4) of section 121 and in paragraphs
(a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 122 of that Act

in respect of the holders of the publicans' general licenses referred to in paragraph (1) of this Proclamation.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any species of crayfish, by means of craypots, in the whole of that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto, from 16th March to 15th August, 1953 both days inclusive 1953, both days inclusive.

The whole of that part of Western Australian waters enclosed by a line drawn from Six Island to Five Island in the Pelsart Group of Houtman's Abrolhos, thence South-West from the South-Westernmost extremity of Five Island to the reef running generally North-Westerly on the Western-most side of the said Group, thence generally North-Westerly along that reef to a point due West of the Westernmost extremity of Six Island thence of the Westernmost extremity of Six Island, thence from that point to the said extremity, and thence along the foreshore of such Island to the point of commencement.
