The Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1950, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act; and whereas a local authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole, or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification and may alter, amend and repeal any by-laws so made or adopted; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series "A" have been prepared in accordance with the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1944, and amended from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board, being a local health authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the said Model By-laws, doth

hereby resolve and determine that the said Model By-laws shall be amended in the following manner:—

Part 1—By-law 29.

(e) No owner or occupier of any property situated within the area of the district as prescribed in the Schedules hereto shall keep or allow to be kept on such property any poultry exceeding the total number of 24.

(f) For the purpose of this by-law, "property" shall mean and include all the land within that area owned or occupied by any one person as owner, tenant, lessee or otherwise, and includes any number of adjoining lots under the control of such owner or occupier.

The Schedules.

Schedule 1.

Commencing at the intersection of Seventh Road and Rowley Road; thence Southerly along the latter road to the South-East corner of lot 18 of Part Canning Location 31; thence Westerly along the Southern side of the latter lot and continuing Westerly to a point seven chains from the Western boundary of Rowley Road; thence North-Westerly to the South-Western corner of lot 10; thence North-Westerly along the boundary of lots 10, 11, reserve No. 21152, and lot 1 to Forrest Road; thence North-Easterly along the latter to Seventh Road; thence North-Westerly along Seventh Road for a distance of five chains; thence North-Easterly along a line parallel to and five chains distant from Forrest Road to Fifth Road; thence along the latter road to Robin Hood Avenue; thence along the latter avenue and along Dale Road to the North-West corner of lot 83; thence along the Northern boundary of lot 83 and continuing to Abbey Road; thence Northerly along Abbey Road to the Jandakot railway line; thence along the latter and the South-West railway line to Orchard Avenue; thence along the latter and the Western and Northern boundaries of lot 13 and then following the Narrogin Brook to the Albany Highway; thence Southerly along the latter to its intersection with the South-West Highway; thence along a line parallel and five chains distant from the South-Eastern side of the latter to road No. 4592; thence Westerly along John Street to the South-Western railway and Southerly along the latter to the starting point.

Schedule 2.

A strip of land commencing at the Narrogin Brook and bounded by lines parallel to and five chains distant on either side of the Albany Highway running Northerly to Fourth Avenue, Kelmscott; thence continuing on the Eastern side of the same parallel line to Turner Road, and on the Western side running Westward along Fourth Avenue to the South-Western railway, and thence Northerly along the said railway to Turner Road.

York Municipal Council—Resolution.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1952, a local authority may of its own motion by resolution make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted; and whereas the York Municipal Council, being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act, did adopt the Model By-laws described as Series "A" and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of November, 1944, together with amendments thereto: Now, therefore, the York Municipal Council doth hereby amend the said adopted by-laws by inserting after by-law 11 in Part VII, a new by-law to stand as by-law IIA.

Part VII—By-law 11A.

The owner or occupier of a place used for or in connection with the sale, manufacture, preparation, storage or packing of any food for sale, shall not receive or place therein any article of clothing which has been so received or placed for the purpose of being dry cleaned or laundered at that or any other place.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of section 240 of the Health Act, 1911-1952, and on the advice of the Advisory Committee constituted under section 216 of the Act, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder the Food and Drug

Regulations, 1951, made under the Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st day of June, 1951, and amended by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of August, 1951, the 14th day of December, 1951, and the 17th day of October, 1952.

The abovementioned regulations are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 6 is amended—
 - (i) by deleting paragraph (b) of subregulation (3);
 - (ii) by adding after the word "zinc" at the end of subregulation (1) the words "except as provided for in subregulation (4) of this regulation";
 - (iii) by adding after the word "metal" at the end of subregulation (4) the following words "except that liquid glucose, honey and similar saccharin substances may be held in galvanised iron drums of not less than ten gallons capacity without contravention of this regulation if the zinc content of the glucose does not exceed two-sevenths grain of zinc (calculated as Zn) per pound of glucose."
2. Regulation 31 is amended by inserting after subregulation (7) a new subregulation (7A) as follows:—
 - (7A) Vitaminised margarine means margarine conforming to the standard for margarine and fortified with not less than 550 international units of vitamin "A" and not less than 60 international units of vitamin "D" per ounce.
3. Regulation 34, subregulation (2), is amended by substituting for the words "Unfit for Infants" in line two the words "Unsuitable for Babies except on Medical Advice."

NURSES REGISTRATION ACT, 1921-1952.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Nurses Registration Act, 1921-1952, has been pleased to amend in the manner mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, the Nurses Registration Regulations, 1946, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of February, 1947, and amended from time to time thereafter.

Schedule.

The abovementioned regulations are amended by adding a new Part VII—Nursing Aides' Training Schools and Appendix IX.

Part VII.

Division 1—Nursing Aides' Training Schools.

1. The board of management, proprietor, or other controlling authority of an institution, may apply to the Board to have the institution prescribed as a nursing aides' training school, and shall, with the application, furnish to the Board the names and qualifications of the persons who will constitute the teaching staff of the institution.
2. An institution may be prescribed by the Board as a nursing aides' training school if the institution fulfills the following conditions:—
 - (a) The matron of the institution is a registered nurse and approved by the Board for the purpose.
 - (b) The buildings, equipment, and other facilities provided in the institution are adequate for the training of nursing aides.
 - (c) A course of training is provided at the institution for a minimum period, exclusive of sick leave and leave other than ordinary leave, of one year.
 - (d) The daily average number of patients at the institution is at least twenty occupied beds.
 - (e) The proportion of registered nurses to trainees at the institution is considered by the Board sufficient to ensure adequate supervision of the trainees' duties.
 - (f) Provision is made at the institution for trainees to receive practical instruction in the wards of the institution from the matron or other registered nurse.
 - (g) Provision is made at the institution for systematic courses of instruction in theoretical and practical nursing during the period of training by the matron or other registered nurse or other lecturers, in accordance with the curriculum and syllabus prescribed in Appendix IX to these regulations.

- (h) Provision is made at the institution for the issue to trainees of certificates at the conclusion of their final course of lectures that they have attended the systematic courses of lectures and received practical instruction in accordance with the curriculum and syllabus prescribed in Appendix IX to these regulations, and have passed an examination therein.
- (i) The institution is being conducted and managed in an efficient manner.
- (j) The management of the institution undertakes to furnish annually to the Board a report in accordance with the Form No. 4 in Appendix IX to these regulations containing the required information in regard to particulars therein mentioned, and also undertakes to furnish to the Board such information as it may at any time require regarding the trainees and their training.

3. If at any time in the opinion of the Board its requirements in regard to the training of nursing aides as prescribed in these regulations are not being complied with in a prescribed nursing aides' training school the Board may after giving to the Board of Management, proprietor, or other controlling authority of the institution prescribed as a nursing aides' training school not less than two months' notice of its intention so to do, remove the name of the institution from its list of prescribed training schools.

4. The following is a list of institutions in this State prescribed by the Board for the time being at which the training of nursing aides may be undertaken:—

Royal Perth Hospital.
District Hospital, Merredin.

Division 2—Qualifications for Trainees.

5. Applicants for admission as trainees into a prescribed training school for nursing aides shall be at least 17 years of age.

6. Application shall be made to the matron of the training school or, in the case of Government hospitals prescribed as a nursing aides' training school to the Principal Matron.

7. The application shall be in the handwriting of the applicant and signed by the applicant and shall be accompanied by—

- (a) the applicant's certificate of birth;
- (b) three personal references in respect of the applicant;
- (c) a certificate as to the physical and mental fitness of the applicant from a legally qualified medical practitioner, and
- (d) a certificate showing that the applicant has obtained general education at least equal to a sixth standard certificate of the Education Department, or a certificate of the applicant having passed an examination in general education conducted by the Board.

8. Subject to compliance with regulations 5, 6 and 7 by the applicant, each applicant when admitted to a training school as a trainee shall enter the school on two months' probation.

9. (1) Training shall be continuous.

(2) The period during which a trainee has broken her training owing to illness or for other reasons satisfactory to the Board, shall be made up so that she completes the full period of training as prescribed by these regulations.

(3) Where the break is for a period exceeding one month, she shall in addition, undergo a further one weeks' training for each month of the period of the break.

10. Where a trainee has ceased training at any one prescribed training school, whether of her own accord or through dismissal, the Board shall have power to determine whether the trainee shall be permitted to enter another prescribed training school and to decide the period, if any, of the previous training, and the examinations that shall be credited to her.

Division 3—Examinations.

11. The Board shall hold an examination for enrolment three times yearly, in March, July, and November unless otherwise arranged by the Board.

12. The examination shall be based on the subjects in the syllabus of training prescribed in Appendix IX to these regulations, and shall consist of—

- (a) a simple written test, and
- (b) a test of practical efficiency in the wards of the trainees' own training schools by examiners appointed by the Board.

13. A trainee may not sit for an examination for enrolment until she has completed the period of training prescribed in Appendix IX to these regulations.

14. Trainees for admission to an examination for enrolment shall make application to the secretary of the Board on a form to be provided by the Board, not later than one month before the date of the examination.

15. The application shall be accompanied by the prescribed examination fee and a statement signed by the matron of the institution where the applicant is training showing—

- (a) the date on which training commenced;
- (b) particulars of any period during which, apart, from ordinary or holiday leave, the trainee was absent from duty;
- (c) that the applicant has attended the prescribed course of lectures and passed the necessary examination; and
- (d) that she has had the practical experience prescribed by these regulations.

16. A trainee who has failed to pass an examination for enrolment shall, unless she receives an exemption from the Board, sit for the next examination immediately following the one at which she has failed, and if she fails a second time may be called on to undergo such further training not exceeding a period

of three months as the Board may approve before again presenting herself for examination, and in that case shall sit for the next examination after the end of the further period of training.

Division 4—Enrolment of Nursing Aides.

17. A trainee who has passed the examination for enrolment and has otherwise complied with the requirements of these regulations, and a person who has completed not less than fifteen months' training, including experience in the nursing of sick children, in a prescribed general nurses' training hospital and who has passed the examination for enrolment, shall, upon payment of the prescribed fee, receive a certificate to that effect signed by the chairman and secretary of the Board, and also, upon payment of the prescribed fee, the prescribed Nursing Aide's badge which shall be worn by her when on duty as a nursing aide.

18. A person who has passed the First Year Professional Examination conducted by the Board and who has completed not less than fifteen months' training, including experience in the nursing of sick children, in a prescribed training hospital for nurses, may make application to the Board in writing, supported by references from the matron of her training hospital and two other reputable persons, to be enrolled as a nursing aide.

19. A person applying for enrolment as a nursing aide under section 5 (5e) of the Act, may be enrolled as a nursing aide if she can furnish to the satisfaction of the Board—

- (a) evidence that she has had not less than two years' whole time experience in nursing under the supervision of a trained general nursing staff in an approved hospital or institution; or not less than three years' whole time *bona fide* practice in the nursing of the sick, including not less than six months' whole time training or experience under the supervision of a trained general nursing staff in an approved hospital or institution;
- (b) evidence of good character.

20. A person enrolled as a nursing aide under the provisions of regulation No. 18 and regulation No. 19 of these regulations shall, upon payment of the prescribed fee, receive a certificate to that effect signed by the chairman and secretary of the Board, and also, upon payment of the prescribed fee, the prescribed Nursing Aides' badge which shall be worn by her when on duty as a nursing aide.

21. Every enrolled nursing aide who desires to apply for re-enrolment under the provisions of section 11 (1) of the Act, shall make application to the Board on the prescribed form and lodge therewith the fee of one shilling prescribed by section 11 (2) of the Act.

22. A copy of a certificate, or a duplicate badge, may be issued to a nursing aide upon payment of the prescribed fee, if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Board that the original certificate or the original badge, as the case may be, has been lost or accidentally destroyed.

Penalties for Breaches of the Regulations.

23. A person contravening any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable, unless otherwise provided for, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

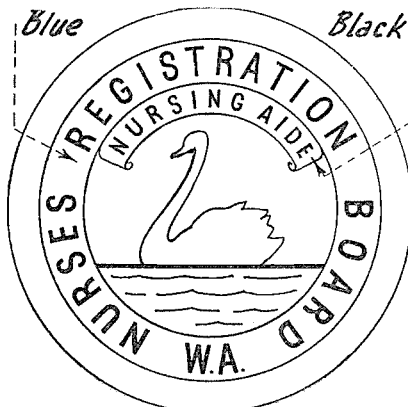
An enrolled nursing aide and no one else shall wear a badge called "a nursing aide's badge," in the design shown and described hereunder:—

It shall be a circular, metal badge of silver, 1 1/16in. in diameter containing an inner blue band 1/8in. in width and being approximately 3/32in. from the edge of the badge. On the blue band shall be contained, in silver, the words "Nurses Registration Board, W.A."

On the top and within the blue band there shall be a black quadrant approximately 3/32in. in width and bearing the words, in silver, "Nursing Aide."

The centre of the badge shall be cut out with the exception of a black swan mounted on a sea of silver.

On the back of the badge there shall be a pin fastener.

Regulation No. 2 (g).

Theoretical and Clinical Training.

Simple applied lectures in:—

- Hospital Ethics and Etiquette.
- Personal Hygiene and Maintenance of Health.
- The Structure and Functions of the Body.
- Simple Nursing Procedures covering details outlined in separate Schedule.
- Elementary Nutrition and Feeding of Patients.
- Care of Infant and Child.
- First Aid.

Preliminary Training School:—

All trainees to be admitted to a Preliminary Training School for a period of four weeks, with as much practical demonstration as is possible carried out on the ward.

Block Periods:—

Subsequent lectures to be given in block periods, total theoretical instruction being six weeks. Provision also to be made for revision towards the end of the year.

Clinical Training must be such that the nursing aide is adequately trained to perform the duties outlined above.

Procedure Books must be kept by each trainee and presented at the final examination.

This training must not take the place of any part of the curriculum of the trainee general nurse.

Four weeks in Preliminary Training School with many practical demonstrations on the ward:—

- Sweeping, dusting, cleaning bathroom, pan room, pantry, steriliser, sterilising room.
- Carbolising, bed making, giving bed pans and urinals.
- Sponging, oral toilets, hair, teeth.
- Temperature, pulse, and respiration.
- Urine, charts, lotions, medicines.
- Counter-irritants.
- Bandaging.
- Enemata.
- Collection of specimens.
- Positions.
- Last offices.
- Asepsis.
- Simple dressings.
- First Aid.

Order of teaching and number of weeks to be left to tutor.

Lectures:—

- General Nursing.
- Elementary Hygiene.
- Elementary Anatomy and Physiology.
- Invalid Cookery, practical demonstrations (no examinations).
- Infectious Nursing, including pulmonary tuberculosis.
- Feeding and Bathing Sick Children.
- First Aid.

Part III.

SYLLABUS.

Regulation No. 2 (g).

All subjects are to be taught in a simple and essentially practical manner.

Introduction.

Short review of the value of nursing and its place in the community.

The qualities nursing requires in a recruit and advice as to the management of her life as a nurse.

The nurse's responsibility towards individuals and property.

The patient as an individual and the effect of illness on behaviour.

The general plan of a hospital; care of property and equipment.

Body Structure and Functions in Health—Elementary Hygiene—The Laws of Healthy Living—The Maintenance of Health.

An elementary knowledge of:—

The structure of the human body.

The functions of the body, applied to the normal.

Nutrition.—Purpose of food; types of food and accessory food factors; preparation and serving of food; principles and methods of simple cookery.

Hygiene.—The laws of healthy living as these affect the individual and the community and are applied to the home; the maintenance of health; the importance of promoting good health; the factors which cause deterioration in health and how these may be dealt with by the individual, in the family and in the community.

First Aid.

The principles and practice of first aid in the street, the home and the hospital.

General Nursing—Care of Patients—Routine Nursing Procedures—Handling of Equipment.

Equipment.—Handling and care of equipment in common use, including bed accessories and utensils.

Routine Nursing Procedure.—Preparation and making of beds and cots; positions used in nursing; admission of patients; immersion baths and fully sponging; care of mouth, skin, hair, nails, hands and feet; the treatment of verminous patients; the giving and removing of sanitary utensils; care of helpless and incontinent patients; prevention of bedsores; taking temperature, pulse and respiration rate; serving meals and feeding helpless patients; preparation of simple food and drinks necessary in illness; care of ambulant patients; transfer and discharge of patients; care of the dying and Last Offices; disposal of patient's property after death; care and custody of medicines; giving medicines; safe custody of poisons, i.e., disinfectants; preparation of lotions in common use; observations and disposal of urine; faeces, sputum and vomit; collection of specimens; simple urine test; giving and receiving reports; writing ward reports; duties of night nurse.

Special Nursing Procedures.—Preparation for, and method of carrying out the following:—Sponging patient; swabbing and bathing eye, except after eye operations; preparation for examination of throat; compresses, fomentations, poultices, liniments and ointments; preparation for application of plaster of paris; administration of oxygen, and of dry and moist inhalations, preparation for examination of vagina and rectum; giving enemas and rectal washouts; giving rectal saline; passing of flatus tube; the use and care of common surgical appliances; surgical cleanliness and surgical nursing care; asepsis and anti-sepsis; sterilisation of articles in common use; "scrubbing up"; disinfectants in common use; disinfection; preparation for surgical dressings; performing simple dressings; preparation of patients for and care of patients recovering from minor operations; emergencies; procedure in case of accidents in the ward.

The Nursing Duties and Attention Required During Illness—The Main Features of Disease.

Introduction.—The characteristics of the body in health; the factors which contribute to or cause ill-health; the importance of the early recognition of the signs and symptoms of disease.

Infection.—Cause; predisposing factors; modes of transmission of infection.

Diseases of Social Importance.—Information the community should have in regard to tuberculosis, venereal disease and cancer, and the legal position of the nurse.

Immunisation.—How immunity is acquired; information parents should have regarding the protection of their children against the diseases for which artificial immunisation is available.

Nursing Care in Disease.—The symptoms and signs met with in chronic diseases and disorders which commonly affect the various systems of the body and the nurse's duties, as regards nursing care and observations; general care of the comfort of patients; prevention of bedsores; the importance of providing occupation and of getting patients up; special aspects of disease in old age and in the chronically ill.

Nursing Care of Sick Children.—The symptoms and signs of minor ailments and the common infections of childhood; routine nursing care and observation; bathing, feeding, clothing and importance of habit training of infants and children.

Characteristics of Disease.—Mode of infection; preventive measures; general nursing care of patients with special reference to pulmonary tuberculosis and the common infectious fevers.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1950.

Bayswater Local Health Authority.

Model By-laws—Part I.

Amendment of By-laws.

P.H.D. 415/45, Ex. Co. No. 604.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1950, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws: Now, the Bayswater Road Board being a local health authority and having adopted Model By-laws Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927, and other subsequent dates as its by-laws for the Bayswater Health District, doth hereby amend its said by-laws as follows:—

By adding after by-law 35 of Part I of Model By-laws a new sub-heading as follows:—

Repairs to Houses.

35. (a) The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathroom, lavatories attached to or used in connection therewith in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and in particular shall:—

1. Repair or replace any roof or part thereof which shall become in disrepair.
2. Repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp.
3. Replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein.

4. Repair and replace with new material where necessary any verandah or the roof, floor supports or other parts thereof which may become in disrepair.

5. Repair and replace where necessary any steps or handrails thereof which may become in disrepair.

6. Repair or replace any flashings which may become in disrepair.

7. Replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair.

8. Repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or missing.

9. Keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks.

10. Replace or repair all skirtings, architraves, and fixtures, which may become a harbourage for vermin.

11. Keep all walls and ceilings and the plaster and wall paper thereon in good repair, and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wall paper which may become dilapidated or in disrepair.

12. Refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease to fit properly.

13. Repair or replace with new any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and reglaze any windows which may become broken or cracked.

14. Keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act and regulations and by-laws made thereunder.

15. Keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all the requirements of the Fire-writers' Association of W.A.

16. Retain all natural lighting free from any obstructions which would reduce the natural lighting below the ratio of one square foot of lighting to each square foot of floor area.

Northam Municipal Council.

Model By-laws—Part 1.

Amendment of By-laws.

P.H.D. 1599/48.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1950, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws: Now, therefore, the Northam Municipal Council, being a local health authority and having adopted Model By-laws Series "A" as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1944, and amended from time to time thereafter, doth hereby amend the said adopted by-laws as follows:—

By adding after by-law 35 of Part 1 of the Model By-laws Series "A" a new subheading, as follows:—

Repairs to Houses.

35A. The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathrooms, lavatories attached to or used in connection therewith in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and in particular shall—

- (1) repair or replace any roof or part thereof which shall become in disrepair;
- (2) repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp;
- (3) replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein;
- (4) Repair and replace with new material where necessary any verandah or the roof, floor supports, or other parts thereof which may become in disrepair;
- (5) repair and replace where necessary any steps or handrails thereof which may become in disrepair;
- (6) Repair or replace any flashings which may become in disrepair;
- (7) Replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair;
- (8) Repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or be missing;
- (9) keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks;
- (10) replace or repair all skirtings, architraves and fixtures, which may become a harbourage for vermin;
- (11) keep all walls and the plaster and wall paper thereon in good repair, and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wall-paper which may become dilapidated or in disrepair;
- (12) refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease to fit properly;
- (13) repair or replace with new, any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and re-glass any windows which may become broken or cracked;
- (14) keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of the

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947, and regulations and by-laws made thereunder;

- (15) keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the requirements of the Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A.;

- (16) retain all natural lighting free from any obstruction which would reduce the natural lighting below the ratio of one square foot of lighting to each 10 square feet of floor area.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1952, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority under any of the provisions of the Act; and whereas as a local authority may, of its own motion, by resolution adopt the whole, or any portion of such by-laws with or without modification; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series "A" have been prepared in accordance with the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1944, and amended from time to time thereafter: Now, therefore, the Kalgoorlie Road Board, being a local health authority within the meaning of the Act, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said Model By-laws, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1944,

together with the amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* on 26th January, 1945, 30th November, 1945, 20th December, 1946, 24th October, 1947, 23rd December, 1949, 10th February, 1950, 24th March, 1950, 29th December, 1950, 22nd June, 1951, 17th August, 1951, 2nd November, 1951, 16th May, 1952, and 31st December, 1952, shall be adopted without modification, and doth hereby prescribe the following scale of fees as applied to Schedule D of Part IX of the said adopted by-laws.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1950.

Midland Junction Municipality.

WHEREAS under the Health Act, 1911-1950, the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a local authority; and whereas Model By-laws described as Series "A" have been prepared and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th December, 1944, and amended from time to time thereafter; and whereas a local authority may adopt the whole or any part of the said Model By-laws with or without modification: Now, therefore, the Midland Junction Municipality, being a local authority within the meaning of the said Act, doth hereby resolve and determine that the Model By-laws described as Series "A" and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th December, 1944, together with the amendments thereto published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th January, 1945, 30th November, 1945, 20th December, 1946, 24th October, 1947, 10th February, 1950, 24th March, 1950, 29th December, 1950, 2nd November, 1951, and 16th May, 1952, shall be adopted with the modification as follows:—

Schedule of Amendments and Modifications to Model By-laws.

Part I.—General Sanitary Provisions.

1. By adding a new by-law after by-law 1B of Part I to be known as by-law 1C and to read as follows:—

Water Closets.

1C. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any water closet which does not comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) The internal measurements shall be not less than 4ft. 8in. x 3ft. x 7ft. 3in. to the top of the top plate.
- (b) The walls shall be of stone, brick or concrete, provided that where a water closet is incorporated in a main structure it may be constructed of other material.
- (c) The roof shall be of galvanised iron, or other impervious material of similar strength and impermeable properties.
- (d) The floor shall be of impervious material, and shall have a uniform fall of 1 in 30 from back to front and its upper surface shall be not less than 6in. above the level of the ground adjoining.
- (e) It shall have a door which shall be hung in a proper manner.

2. By-law 3 is amended by adding a new paragraph after paragraph (b) to stand as paragraph (c) and to read as follows:—

- (c) The owner, contractor and builder of any premises or any other place or lot where work is being carried out shall maintain the panstead within the earth closet or privy in a flyproof condition.

3. By-law 4A, paragraph (1) is amended by deleting the words "eighty-one" wherever occurring and substituting therefor the words "ninety-nine."

4. By-law 4A paragraph (1) subparagraph (a) is amended by deleting the words "Which shall be not less than 6ft. wide and not less than 6ft. long" and inserting the words "which shall have an area of not less than 36 square feet. Provided that no wall shall be less than 5ft. 6in. in length," and by deleting the words "Either a shower bath or" occurring in the third line.

5. By adding after subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of by-law 4A of Part I a new subparagraph to be known as subparagraph (c) and to read as follows:—

- 4A. (c) At least one sink to be installed in the kitchen or scullery. Such sink to be properly supported at a suitable height, and to be so constructed as to facilitate the draining of all excess water from utensils on to an approved impervious surface which shall have a fall sufficient to allow such water to be drained back into such sink.

6. By-law 4A, paragraph (3) of Part I is amended by deleting the words "four inches" occurring in the seventh line and substituting in

lieu thereof the words "two inches" and by deleting the figure "50" occurring in the ninth line and inserting the figure "42"; also by deleting the word "eight" occurring in the tenth line and inserting the words "seven feet three inches."

7. By adding a new by-law after by-law No. 4B, as follows:—

4C. In relation to cooking facilities to be provided in houses or public places or private places in accordance with the provisions of section 99 of the Act, the following provisions shall apply:—

(1) Every house used for human habitation shall be provided with—

(a) a wood cooking stove properly installed to provide for the escape of smoke through a properly constructed brick chimney, or

(b) a gas or electric cooking stove.

Where a stove operated by gas or any type of oil fuel is used for cooking or heating purposes, the waste products of combustion shall be conducted by an approved flue to the outside air without creating a nuisance. And where in any house common cooking facilities are used by more than three separate family units, a separate stove shall be provided for each three family units or part of that number.

(2) The stove or stoves provided in accordance with paragraph (1) hereof and all brickwork, chimneys or approved flues, recesses and other parts thereof shall at all times, whilst such house is occupied or used or available for occupation or use, be kept and maintained in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use.

8. By deleting by-laws 12, 13, 14 and 14a, and inserting therefor the following:—

Rubbish Receptacles to be Provided.

12. (a) Every premises shall be provided with a receptacle for holding refuse. When necessary, an inspector may direct that a premises shall be provided with two or more such receptacles, and such premises shall forthwith be provided with the number of receptacles specified. The owner and occupier of such premises shall severally be responsible for providing such receptacle or receptacles.

(b) In addition, every premises whereon perishable refuse and/or slops (other than liquid waste) accumulates or is likely to accumulate, shall be provided with a receptacle or receptacles, sufficient for holding such perishable refuse and slops. The owner and occupier shall severally be responsible for providing such receptacle or receptacles.

(c) A receptacle shall be of metal not thinner than 24 gauge. Its capacity shall not be less than 2½ cubic feet nor more than 4 cubic feet, and so constructed as to be watertight. It shall be provided with two handles and have a tight fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of the bin.

(d) Such receptacles shall be purchased by the owner or occupier from the local authority; provided that on receipt of the written application of any owner or occupier the local authority may exempt such owner or occupier from procuring such receptacle from the local authority and may allow such owner or occupier to provide such receptacle subject to the condition that such receptacle shall conform to the requirements of paragraph (c) of this by-law.

(e) For the purpose of this by-law, the terms "perishable refuse" and "slops" do not include liquid waste.

Refuse to be Deposited in Receptacles.

13. The occupier of every premises shall cause all refuse and all perishable refuse and slops to be deposited in the appropriate recep-

tacle and shall maintain such receptacle or receptacles in a thoroughly clean and efficient condition, and in a condition to satisfy the requirements of by-law 12, and he shall when required by an inspector thoroughly cleanse and disinfect any such receptacle.

Receptacles to be Kept Covered and Emptied Weekly.

14. Every occupier shall cause every receptacle to be covered with its lid at all times, except when the lid is removed for the purpose of placing the refuse within the receptacle, and at such times the lid shall be immediately replaced. Every such receptacle shall be emptied once weekly or so much more frequently as the inspector may direct.

Person Authorised to Empty Receptacles.

14A. No person other than an employee of the local authority or a contractor licensed by the local authority shall remove the whole or any part of the contents of any receptacle provided for night soil, urine, refuse, perishable refuse and slops or liquid waste; provided that on receipt of written application from the occupier of any premises the local authority may permit such occupier to dispose of his own refuse (except nightsoil, urine, perishable waste and slops or liquid waste) subject to the condition that the means of disposal of such refuse shall be specified in such application and be to the satisfaction of an inspector. When such permission has been granted, such occupier shall dispose of such refuse at least weekly or so much more frequently as an inspector may direct by the means specified and to the satisfaction of the inspector; provided, further, that such permit may be varied or cancelled from time to time.

9. By deleting the word "or" after the word "washhouse" in the second line of by-law 21 of Part I, and by adding the words "or trade" after the word "domestic" in the second line of by-law 21 of Part I.

10. By inserting the words "owner or" before the word "occupier" in the first line of by-law 23 of Part I.

11. By adding to subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of by-law 23 the following words:—"the owner or occupier executing any of the works in this by-law specified, and also any person actually carrying out such work on his behalf, shall be responsible for the submission of the aforesaid plan for approval. No such work or works shall be commenced until such approval has been obtained."

12. By-law 23, paragraph (1), subparagraph (e) is amended by deleting this subparagraph and inserting the following words:—"Every system used for the disposal of liquid refuse shall be effectively ventilated by means of an induct ventilator of 4in. diameter, provided with fine mesh gauze and cast iron grating, such ventilator to be erected to a height of 1ft. above ground level; and an educt ventilator made of galvanised iron and of 4in. diameter and carried up to a height of not less than 18ft. or 4ft. above the eaves of each house. The position of such ventilators to be to the satisfaction of the inspector."

13. By adding a paragraph after paragraph (1) of by-law 23 of Part I to be read as paragraph (1A) as follows:—

(1A) By discharging into a French drain, when so required by the Health Inspector, which shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) A sketch plan showing the design, situation and construction, together with the connections with such French drain, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the inspector.

(b) It shall be constructed of agricultural drain pipes of not less than 4in. diameter, laid in a straight line with open butt joints and completely surrounded with not less than 9in. of broken blue metal or other natural stone of similar impermeable qualities, of not more than 3in. gauge and not

less than 2in. gauge. The surface of the drain shall be covered with gravel or earth.

- (c) The house fittings shall be to the satisfaction of the inspector, and each such fitting shall be discharged over an open gully with a water sealed trap. A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by the inspector and shall be situated where directed by the inspector.
- (d) The dimensions of the trench in which the drain is laid shall be determined by an inspector.
- (e) Every system used for the disposal of liquid refuse shall be effectively ventilated by means of an induct ventilator or 4in. diameter provided with fine mesh gauze, and a cast iron grating, such ventilator to be erected to a height of 1ft. above ground level; and an educt ventilator made of galvanised iron, and of 4in. diameter and carried up to a height of not less than 18ft. or 4ft. above the eaves of each house. The position of such ventilators to be to the satisfaction of the inspector.
- (f) Whenever ordered by an inspector, such French drain shall be emptied, cleansed and disinfected in such manner and within such time as is specified in the requisition.

14. By adding after the number (1) the number (1A) in by-law 23, paragraph (3) of Part I.

15. By adding the words "A grease intercepting trap of approved design and dimensions shall be installed at such premises as is considered necessary by an inspector, and shall be situated where directed by the inspector. Such grease trap shall be maintained in a clean and efficient working condition at all times" after the word "Trap" in by-law 23, paragraph (1) subparagraph (c) of Part I.

16. Part I is amended by adding new by-laws to be read as by-laws 24c and 24d to read as follows:—

Transport of Livestock.

24C. No person having the control or management of a vehicle in which livestock is being transported shall park such vehicle, unless it be thoroughly clean, within the limits of the Municipality of Midland Junction.

24D. No person having the control or management of a vehicle in which livestock has been transported shall park such vehicle within the limits of the Municipality of Midland Junction until such vehicle has been thoroughly cleansed.

The provisions of paragraph 24C and 24D shall not apply to a vehicle while parked at or within a recognised sale or slaughter yard for the purpose of loading or unloading livestock.

17. By-law 26 of Part I is amended by inserting the words "or owner" after the word "occupier" occurring in the first line.

Paragraph (a) of this by-law is amended by deleting the figures "20" occurring in the first line, and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "30"; and by adding after the word "dairy" occurring in the second line, the words "nor nearer than 10ft. to the boundary of land not in the same occupation."

Subparagraphs (b) and (c) of this by-law are deleted and inserted in lieu thereof the new subparagraphs to be read as follows:—

- (b) It shall have walls constructed of concrete, brick, stone, wood or galvanised iron; and
- (c) It shall have a roof constructed of corrugated iron, corrugated asbestos, tiles or similar impervious material.

18. By deleting the word "dwelling" in the second line of by-law 29, paragraph (b) and adding the words "or poultry" after the word "pigeons" occurring in the second line of by-law 29, paragraph (b) of Part I. By adding two new paragraphs to by-law 29 of Part I, to read as follows:—

- (e) No person shall keep more than 20 head of fowls, or six turkeys or six ducks or geese, upon any residential lot of land of an area of quarter of an acre or less. No

person shall keep any poultry in excess of the numbers enumerated above without having first received the written approval of the local health authority specifying the number of head of poultry which may be kept thereon.

- (f) The floors of the poultry house shall be constructed of cement, trowelled to a smooth finish, and laid with a fall of 1 in 50 to the front. The fences of the poultry runs shall be constructed of 6ft. galvanised wire netting, supported by uprights of 3in. x 2in. jarrah, or equivalent thereof, set at 8ft. centres with 2ft. in the ground.

19. By adding the words "or the owner of any dead animal" after the word "animal" in the first line of by-law 30 of Part I.

20. By adding after by-law 32 of Part I a new by-law to be known as by-law 32A, and to read as follows:—

Repairs to Houses.

32A. The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathrooms, sanitary conveniences attached to, or used in connection therewith, in good order and condition, and properly repaired and fit for use, and in particular shall—

- (a) repair or replace any roof or part thereof which shall become in disrepair;
- (b) repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp;
- (c) replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein;
- (d) repair and replace with new material where necessary any verandah or the roof, floor supports or other parts thereof which may become in disrepair;
- (e) repair and replace where necessary any steps or handrails thereof which may become in disrepair;
- (f) repair or replace any flashings which may become in disrepair;
- (g) replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair;
- (h) repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or be missing;
- (i) keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks;
- (j) replace or repair all skirtings, architraves and fixtures which may become a harbourage for vermin;
- (k) keep all walls and the plaster and wall paper thereon in good repair and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wall paper which may become dilapidated or in disrepair;
- (l) refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease to fit properly;
- (m) repair or replace with new, any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and reglaze any windows which may become broken or cracked;
- (n) keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act and Regulations and By-laws made thereunder;
- (o) keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the requirements of the Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A.;
- (p) retain all natural lighting free from any obstruction which would reduce the natural lighting below the ratio of one square foot of lighting to each 10ft. of floor area.

21. By inserting a new subparagraph in Part I to be known as subparagraph 41 (e) as follows:—

- (e) Where any house is not provided with an ample supply of clean wholesome water, the owner of the premises shall cause such house to be properly provided with a supply, either by connecting to any existing water main, constructing a well, or providing rain water tanks of not less than 1,000 gallons capacity, such work to be carried out to the satisfaction of the inspector.

Part IV.

22. By adding two new subparagraphs to by-law 17 of Part IV, to be known as subparagraphs 17 (h) and 17 (i), to read as follows:—

(h) He shall not deposit any full, partly filled or empty bottle, jar, can, drum or crate which is normally used for the distribution of either pasteurised or raw milk or cream, on any street, road, footpath, right-of-way, or upon any other private or public thoroughfare or land.

(i) He shall immediately remove all portions of any glass container which may be broken by him from any street, road, footpath, right-of-way or other private or public thoroughfare or land.

Part VII.

23. By adding the words "or owner" after the word "occupier" in the first line of each of paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 of Part VII.

24. Add a new by-law after by-law 7 of Part VII to be read as by-law 7A as follows:—

7A. The occupier of every such premises shall comply with all such directions as shall be given in writing by an inspector for the purpose of protecting all food for sale from contamination by flies or dust.

25. By deleting the words "nine inches" and substituting therefor the words "two feet" in the third line of by-law 12 of Part VII.

26. By addition of a by-law as follows, in Part VII to read as by-law 12A of Part VII:—

12A. No person shall deposit any vegetable or other food of any kind intended for sale for human consumption upon any street, road, footpath, right of way, or upon any other private, public thoroughfare or land.

27. By-law 20 (a) of Part VII of the said by-laws is repealed and a new by-law to be known as by-law 20 (a) of Part VII is inserted as follows:—

20 (a) No person shall sell or permit to be sold any food, not otherwise packed unless such food is completely wrapped or packed so as to be protected from contamination. Clean, new paper only shall be used for such packing or wrapping and, such paper shall have no writing or printing thereon, except upon the outside thereof. Provided that vegetables may be wrapped in clean newspaper obtained direct from the publishers thereof and not previously sold or used for any purpose.

28. By-law 50 paragraph (a) is amended by deleting the word "October" occurring in the second line and inserting in lieu thereof the word "January."

29. By-law 51 paragraph (b) is amended as follows:—

(a) By deleting the word "October" occurring in the third line and inserting in lieu thereof the word "January," and by deleting the words "five shillings" occurring in line five and inserting the words "one pound."

(b) Paragraph (c) is amended by deleting the words "thirtieth day of September" occurring in the second and third lines and inserting in lieu thereof the words "thirty-first day of December."

30. By-law 54, paragraph (b) is amended by deleting the words "thirtieth day of September" occurring in the second and third lines and inserting in lieu thereof the words "thirty-first day of December."

32. By the addition at the end of such by-laws of a new part, to stand as Part X, as follows:—

Part X—Morgues.

1. Any place for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, identification or other lawful purposes before burial or cremation, shall be licensed annually. The fee for such license shall be £2.

2. No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless—

(a) the interior surface of all walls is covered with glazed tiles or other material of similar impermeable qualities, so as to be non-absorbent and washable; and

(b) all floors are constructed of granolithic or other material of similar impermeable qualities, having a fall to an outlet discharging over a trapped gully; and

(c) the premises are ventilated by direct communication to the outer air. Such ventilators to be in the ratio of 24 square inches of inlet and 24 square inches of outlet of uncontrolled ventilating area to each 100 square feet of floor area. The situation of the ventilating openings and the general arrangement of the ventilation shall be to the satisfaction of the inspector.

3. No such license shall be granted in respect of any room, the dimensions of which are less than 10ft. x 9ft. x 10ft. high.

4. No such license shall be granted in respect of private premises unless the site thereof is approved by the local authority or if the same are within 20ft. of any dwelling house.

5. Every person applying for the license of a place for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead shall apply for such license during the first week of January each year in the form of Schedule "A" hereto. Provided that if the license for any year shall commence on or after the first day of July in any year, then the application shall be required to pay only one-half of the prescribed fee.

6. Whenever the local authority licenses any place for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead the local authority shall supply to the person who has applied for such license a certificate in the form of Schedule "B" hereto.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 5 of 1953.

Registered 20th April, 1953.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 13th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, between the Western Australian Gold Mines Supervisors' Association Industrial Union of Workers, (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and Lake View and Star Limited (hereinafter called "the Employer") of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Gold-mining Underground Supervisors' Agreement, 1952."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the goldmining industry and shall operate over the area comprised within the Yilgarn, Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, Dundas, Phillips River, East Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, Mt. Margaret, East Murchison, Murchison, Yalgoo, Peak Hill and Gascoyne Goldfields and the area outside those goldfields in Western Australia comprised within the 14th and 26th parallels of latitude.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from the 25th day of January, 1952.

5.—Rate of Wage.

(a) Basic wage at the rate of £10 10s. 11d. per week.

(b) Industry Allowance.—The employer shall pay to his workers the industry allowance prescribed by Award No. 11 of 1946, as amended or replaced from time to time.

(The margin herein prescribed is deemed to include any district allowance which might otherwise have been payable.)

6.—Hours.

(a) The number of hours usually and customarily worked at the date of this Agreement shall be the hours prescribed by this Agreement.

(b) The ordinary working hours referred to in subclause (a) above shall be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive.

7.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked beyond the ordinary hours prescribed in clause 6 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) All work done on Saturdays, Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 8 hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

8.—Holidays.

Subject to clause 7 (b), the following shall be paid holidays:—Christmas Day, Easter Monday, Labour Day, and one additional day in each calendar year to be nominated by the employer. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to three (3) weeks' annual leave on full pay, or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid a sum proportionate as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer; provided that where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he will not be entitled to the benefits of this clause. Provided, further, that by agreement between the employer and the worker, leave may be allowed to accumulate for two (2) years.

(b) The amounts to be paid under subclause (a) shall be calculated at the rate prevailing at the time the payment is made.

10.—Shift Work.

When on night shift, a worker shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate.

11.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) A week's notice of intention to terminate the employment shall be given on either side.

(b) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(c) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of the Agreement.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

12.—Payment for Sickness.

Payment for sickness or accident shall be at the employer's discretion.

13.—No Reduction.

Any worker who has been prior to the date of this Agreement in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than that prescribed by the Agreement heretofore in force shall not by reason of this Agreement suffer any reduction in the amount by which such higher rate of pay exceeded the amount formerly prescribed; such excess amount shall not be affected by this Agreement.

14.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
